#### **CLEMSON'S NCAA TOURNEY HISTORY**

- The Tigers played in their 43rd all-time NCAA regional when it competed in the 2018 Clemson Regional.
- The 43 appearances are fifth most in NCAA history, trailing only Texas (59), Florida State (56), Miami (Fla.) (45) and Oklahoma State (44).
- Clemson has been to the NCAA Tournament every year since 1987 except one (2008), or 31 of the last 32 years.
- Clemson is one of only six schools in the nation to play in the NCAA Tournament each of the last 10 seasons.
- The others are Cal State Fullerton, Florida, Florida State, Texas A&M and Vanderbilt.
- Clemson has made nine super regional appearances, with its last in 2010.
- The Tigers have made 12 trips to the College World Series, with its last in 2010.
- Clemson has a 120-93 record (.563) in NCAA Tournament games.

#### NCAA TOURNAMENT RECAP

- Clemson hosted an NCAA regional for the 16th time in history in 2018.
- Clemson was one of only four schools (Florida, Florida State, Texas Tech) to host a regional each of the last three years (2016-18).
- The Tigers had a 2-2 record in the Clemson Regional, defeating Morehead State and St. John's.
- Clemson hit .254 with 22 runs, six doubles, four homers, a .379 on-base percentage and four steals in four games.
- Ryan Miller (P), Drew Wharton (OF), Kyle Wilkie (C), and Chris Williams (1B) were named to the All-Tournament
- Miller was 1-0 with a 3.38 ERA and six strikeouts against two walks in 8.0 innings pitched over two relief appearances.
- Wharton was 6-for-15 (.400) with three RBIs, five runs and a .500 on-base percentage.

- Wilkie was 7-for-16 (.438) with a double, homer, five RBIs, two runs and a steal.
- Williams was 5-for-13 (.385) with a double, homer, six RBIs, three runs and a .556 on-base percentage.

### **ACC TOURNAMENT RECAP**

- Clemson had a 2-1 record in the ACC Tournament at Durham, N.C., from May 23-26.
- The Tigers defeated Notre Dame 21-4 and Miami (Fla.)
   7-1 before falling to No. 7 Florida State 5-4 in the semifinal round.
- The Tigers set the ACC Tournament record for runs in an inning with 17 in the fourth inning against Notre Dame on May 23.
- In the 17-run fourth inning, Logan Davidson became the first Tiger in history to hit a home run from both sides of the plate in one inning.
- Clemson also set a school ACC Tournament record for batting average (.472) in a game against Notre Dame.

- Seth Beer earned All-ACC Tournament honors by going 5-for-11 (.455) with three doubles, a homer, four RBIs and a .600 on-base percentage.
- Logan Davidson earned All-ACC Tournament honors by going 4-for-15 (.267) with two homers, a double, seven RBIs and three runs.
- Chris Williams earned All-ACC Tourney honors by going 7-for-10 (.700) with three homers, two doubles, 10 RBIs and a .786 on-base percentage.
- Williams, who was also one of four national players-ofthe-week by Collegiate Baseball, tied Clemson's ACC Tournament record with 10 RBIs.

#### **QUICK HITS**

- Clemson, Dallas Baptist, Florida, Louisville and Texas Tech are the only five schools to win 42+ games each of the last three seasons.
- The Tigers, who had four eight-game winning streaks in 2018, had their most wins (47) since 2006.
- Clemson was 31-3 when outhitting the opponent and 13-12 when getting outhit.

#### **ATTENDANCE**

- Clemson averaged 4,984 fans per home date (34), the eighth-highest figure in the nation and first in the ACC.
- The 4,984 figure set a Clemson record for average home attendance. The previous record was 4,810 fans per home date in 2007.
- Clemson has had a top-20 national figure in average attendance 25 straight seasons and a top-15 figure 17 years in a row.

#### **POLLS**

- Clemson was ranked as high as No. 12 in the nation by Perfect Game in the final poll.
- Clemson has been ranked in the top 25 by at least one poll for 45 straight weeks dating to 2016.

#### **NCAA STAT FINISHES**

- Clemson finished in the top 25 in the nation in six stat categories, while two Tigers combined to finish in the top 25 in six categories.
- Clemson was second in the nation in homers per game (1.56) and tied for third in homers (98).
- Clemson was fifth in the nation in winning percentage (74.6) and seventh in wins (47).
- $\bullet$  Seth Beer was fifth in the nation in homers (22).
- Chris Williams was tied for 12th in the nation in RBIs (72) and tied for 17th in homers (18).

#### **ACC REGULAR-SEASON CO-CHAMPIONS**

- Clemson (22-8) won 12 of its last 13 ACC regularseason games and tied for first in the overall ACC standings with North Carolina.
- It marked the first time the Tigers at least shared the ACC regular-season title since 2006.
- Clemson's 22 ACC regular-season wins were its most since 2006, when it was 24-6.
- Including ACC Tourney games, Clemson was 24-9 against ACC teams, the best mark among all ACC teams.

- Clemson won its first ACC Atlantic Division title since 2010, when it shared the division title with Florida State with an 18-12 record.
- It was the Tigers' first outright ACC Atlantic Division championship since 2006.
- Clemson won eight of 10 ACC series. It marked the first time the Tigers won eight ACC series since 2006.

#### WINNING SEASONS THE NORM

- The Tigers have had a winning record every year since 1965.
- With its 47-16 record in 2018, Clemson had a winning record for the 54th season in a row.
- Clemson's 54-year streak is the third-longest active streak in the nation, trailing two ACC schools (Florida State 71, Miami (Fla.) 61).
- Clemson has had a non-losing record, which includes seasons with equal number of wins and losses, every season since 1958.
- Bill Wilhelm took over as head coach of the Clemson program in 1958, therefore the Tigers have not had a losing record since he took over.
- Clemson's 61-year streak of non-losing records is tied for the second-longest active streak in the nation, trailing only Florida State (71).

#### **ROAD WARRIORS**

- Clemson had a 15-5 road record and 13-2 record in ACC road games, a big reason the Tigers had a 22-8 overall ACC record.
- The Tigers won all five ACC road series for the first time in program history.
- Clemson won a Tiger-record 11 ACC road games in a row to close the regular season, including sweeps at Wake Forest, Virginia and Pittsburgh.
- The Tigers recorded three ACC road sweeps for the first time since 1995.
- Clemson won its last 10 road games. The Tigers will enter the 2019 season with the nation's longest active road winning streak.

#### ONE-RUN SUCCESS

- Clemson had a 16-6 record in one-run games, setting the school record for one-run wins. The previous mark was set in 2016 (14-6 record).
- Clemson played 26 games decided by one or two runs and was 20-6 in those games.
- The Tigers swept William & Mary in three one-run games to start the season, then swept Virginia on the road in three one-run games in April.
- Clemson's two series sweeps with three one-run wins were the first two times in school history that happened.
- Clemson had six walkoff hits, including walkoff home runs by Jordan Greene (Florida State, May 7) and Grayson Byrd (Austin Peay, May 13).
- The Tigers are 39-16 (.709) in one-run games in Monte Lee's three seasons as head coach at Clemson.

## TIGERS TIED FOR THIRD IN NATION IN HR

- Clemson had 98 home runs in 63 games, good for 1.6 per game, in 2018. The 98 homers were third most in Tiger history.
- The Tigers tied for third in the nation in homers and only trailed Tennessee Tech (135) and Florida (100).

- Clemson was 25-4 when it hit at least two home runs in 2018
- Clemson's 98 home runs were the most in the head coach Monte Lee era (2016-18), besting the 2016 total (75), and the most since 2002 (112).
- Seth Beer (22), Chris Williams (18), Logan Davidson (15), Grayson Byrd (9) and Patrick Cromwell (7) and Drew Wharton (7) led the team.

#### **BULLPEN STRONG**

- Tiger relievers combined for a 25-7 record, 21 saves, a 3.11 ERA and .227 opponents' batting average in 280.2 innings pitched in 2018.
- The bullpen also had 285 strikeouts against 135 walks.
- The 21 saves tied for second most in Tiger history and the most since totaling a school-record 26 saves in 2002.

#### TIGERS FIELDED AT RECORD RATE

- Clemson committed only 60 errors in 63 games, good for a .975 fielding percentage to set a school record.
- The previous Tiger record for fielding percentage in a season was .973, set in 2012.
- Clemson was errorless in 29 games and had one error in 16 games, meaning it had less than two errors in 45 of the 63 games.
- The Tigers were 35-10 when committing less than two errors and 12-6 when committing two or more errors.
- No Tiger infielder committed more than eight errors in 2018.
- Clemson infielders combined to commit only 30 errors, including only three by first basemen.

#### **SENIOR LEADERS**

- Clemson relied in large part on four seniors in the heart of the lineup to achieve its 47-16 record in 2018.
- Patrick Cromwell, Robert Jolly, Drew Wharton and Chris Williams were in the middle of the lineup for most of the season.
- They combined to total 36 doubles, a triple, 33 homers and 156 RBIs.

#### SEVEN TIGERS PICKED IN MLB DRAFT

- Seven Tigers were selected in the 2018 MLB draft, tied for 13th most in the nation and tied for third most in the ACC.
- Seth Beer was picked in the first round (No. 28 overall) by Houston. He was Clemson's first first-round pick since 2012 and 14th in history.
- Ryley Gilliam, Ryan Miller and Chris Williams were drafted on day two.
- Jake Higginbotham, Drew Wharton and Mitchell Miller were drafted on day three.
- Monte Lee has had 19 players drafted in his three seasons as head coach at Clemson.
- Three of those 19 players was drafted twice, meaning a Tiger has been drafted 22 times in Lee's tenure at Clemson.
- One more Tiger has signed a free-agent contract as well.

## TIGERS RECOGNIZED FOR APR SCORE

• Baseball was one of seven Tiger programs in the top-10 percent of their sport in the eligibility, graduation and retention metric.

- It was the second year in a row the Clemson baseball program was lauded by the NCAA for its APR.
- · Clemson was one of only three ACC institutions (Notre Dame, Virginia Tech) to earn recognition for baseball.

#### **GRADUATES**

- Five Tiger players and two student assistants received their degrees during commencement ceremonies in Littlejohn Coliseum on May 10,11.
- Outfielders Robert Jolly and Drew Wharton and infielder Adam Renwick graduated with a degree in parks, recreation & tourism management.
- Infielder Patrick Cromwell graduated with a degree in communication.
- Lefthander Alex Schnell graduated with a degree in construction science & management.
- Student assistant coaches Mark Davidson (history) and Ben Paulsen (business management) graduated as well.

#### PRO INFLUENCE

- Clemson had several current and former players on its roster who have MLB ties.
- Both Tiger student assistant coaches, Mark Davidson and Ben Paulsen, were former Tigers who went on to play in the majors.
- · Davidson, father of Tiger shortstop Logan Davidson, played at Clemson in 1982 and played six MLB years (1986-91) with the Twins and Astros.
- Paulsen, Clemson's first-base coach, played at Clemson from 2007-09 and played three years (2014-16) with the Rockies.
- Grayson Byrd is the son of righthander Paul Byrd, who played 14 years with the Mets, Braves, Phillies, Royals, Angels, Indians and Red Sox.
- Carson Spiers is the nephew of former Tiger infielder Bill Spiers, who played 13 MLB seasons and is currently a Tiger football staff member.
- Bo Majkowski is the son of Don Majkowski, who played 10 years as a quarterback in the NFL with the Packers, Colts and Lions.

#### THREE TIGERS NAMED ALL-AMERICANS

- Junior outfielder Seth Beer, junior righty Ryley Gilliam and sophomore shortstop Logan Davidson were all All-Americans by Baseball America.
- Beer was a first-team pick, Gilliam was a second-team selection and Davidson was a third-team pick by Baseball America.
- · Clemson tied for the second-most All-Americans by Baseball America.
- Beer joined Rusty Adkins (1965-67) as the only Tigers in history to be a three-time All-American.
- Beer became just the fourth Tiger in history to be a twotime, first-team All-American, as he was a first-team selection in 2016.
- · Beer was also named a first-team All-American by ABCA, College Sports Madness, Collegiate Baseball, D1Baseball and NCBWA.
- Spencer Strider was named a freshman All-American by Collegiate Baseball.

#### SIX TIGERS NAMED TO ALL-ACC TEAM

- Seth Beer (OF) and Ryley Gilliam (RP) earned First-Team All-ACC honors. It was the third time Beer was named All-ACC
- Gilliam became the first Tiger relief pitcher to earn First-Team All-ACC honors since 1998 (Scott Clackum).
- Logan Davidson (SS) was a Second-Team All-ACC pick.
- Grayson Byrd (DH/UT), Kyle Wilkie (C) and Chris Williams (1B) were Third-Team All-ACC picks.

- To be eligible, a student-athlete must record a 3.0 GPA the previous semester and maintain a 3.0 cumulative GPA during his academic career.
- Davidson was a CoSIDA Academic All-District selection

#### **BEER HAD 56 CAREER HOME RUNS**

- Junior Seth Beer had 18 homers in 2016, 16 home runs in 2017 and has 22 homers in 2018, meaning he had 56 career homers.
- His 56 career homers were fourth in Tiger history. He led all 2018 players in the nation in career home runs despite being a junior in 2018.
- He was named one of 32 semifinalists for the Dick Howser Trophy, the award he won as a freshman in 2016
- He hit .301 with 22 homers, 11 doubles, 54 RBIs, 64 runs, a .456 on-base percentage and a steal in 63
- He led the ACC in homers and slugging percentage
- He reached base via a hit, walk or hit-by-pitch in 58 of the 63 games in 2018.
- He reached base via hit, walk or hit-by-pitch in 23 straight games from March to April.
- He hit one homer in each game of the Georgia Tech series, then did the same in the Boston College series and Pittsburgh series.

# **CROMWELL GOT ON BASE**

- Senior Patrick Cromwell emerged as one of Clemson's top on-base players in 2018.
- He hit .224 with seven homers, six doubles, 26 RBIs, 36 runs, a .349 on-base percentage and a steal in 58 games (53 starts).
- He had a .955 fielding percentage, committing only eight errors in 176 chances, and made many highlightreel plays at third base.
- He hit the game-tying, solo homer in the ninth inning against Winthrop on Feb. 27, a game the Tigers went
- He went 3-for-5 with two two-run homers against Miami (Fla.) on April 13.
- He went 3-for-5 with two homers, a double and four RBIs at Pittsburgh on May 17.

 In his career, he hit .219 with six doubles, nine homers, 31 RBIs, 42 runs and a .340 on-base percentage in 91 games (74 starts).

#### **DAVIDSON A COMPLETE PLAYER**

- Sophomore shortstop Logan Davidson was steady both at the plate and in the field in 2018.
- He was named to the Brooks Wallace Award Watch List.
- He hit .292 with 18 doubles, 15 homers, 46 RBIs, 60 runs, 43 walks, a .408 on-base percentage and 10 steals in 63 games.
- He had a 15-game hitting streak and 20-game on-base streak from April to May.

- His 11 saves tied for third most in Tiger history and were the most since Matt Vaughn had 11 saves in 2008.
- He was one of 41 players named to the NCBWA Stopper-of-the-Year Watch List in April.
- He was named an NSCA Strength & Conditioning All-American, the first in program history, in 2018.
- He was 3-3 with a 1.41 ERA, .165 opponents' batting average and 54 strikeouts against 22 walks in 38.1 innings pitched over 27 outings.
- In 13 ACC regular-season outings, he had nine saves and allowed nine hits and one run (0.41 ERA) with 31 strikeouts in 22.0 innings pitched.
- He had a save in five straight appearances in April, only the second Tiger in history to do that (Paul Harrelson in 2002 is the other).
- He became the first Tiger in history to record a save in all three games of a three-game series when he did so at Virginia from April 27-29.
- In his career, he was 9-6 with 15 saves, a 3.19 ERA and 120 strikeouts in 104.1 innings pitched over 69 appearances (six starts).
- His 15 career saves were eighth most in Tiger history.

#### **GREENE PROVIDED SPARK**

- Junior infielder Jordan Greene provided a spark in the lineup during the second half of the season.
- He hit .250 with six doubles, five homers, 21 RBIs, a .398 on-base percentage and eight steals in 48 games (40 starts) in 2018.
- He hit a walkoff solo homer in Clemson's 5-4 win over No. 13 Florida State on May 7, the Tigers' first walkoff homer since 2016 (Seth Beer).
- He hit a walkoff single in the 10th inning in the Tigers'
   4-3 win over Morehead State in the Clemson Regional on June 1.
- In his career, he is hitting .253 with 19 doubles, six homers, 46 RBIs, 79 runs and 16 steals in 145 games (118 starts).

#### HALL SHOWED HIS VERSATILITY

- With several Tigers going down due to injury late in the season, freshman Sam Hall made the most of his opportunity to step in and start.
- He displayed the versatility to play in the infield and outfield. He was the starter in left field during the late stages of the season.
- He hit .239 with two homers, four doubles, seven RBIs, 18 runs and eight steals in 25 games (21 starts) in 2018.
- He committed only one error in 43 chances, including none in 17 chances as an infielder.
- He tied Clemson's ACC Tournament record for runs (4) when he went 1-for-1 with two walks and a hit-by-pitch against Notre Dame on May 23.

#### **HENNESSY LED ROTATION**

- Sophomore lefthander Jacob Hennessy was a reliever as a freshman in 2017, but became the Friday starter in 2018.
- He was one of 78 pitchers named to the College Baseball Foundation National Pitcher-of-the-Year Watch List in April.
- He was 4-3 with a 3.91 ERA, .259 opponents' batting average and 54 strikeouts against 14 walks in 71.1 innings pitched over 14 starts.
- He held opponents to a .181 batting average with two outs
- He earned the win against Boston College by allowing just one hit and no earned runs in 6.0 innings pitched on March 29.
- In his career, he is 6-4 with a 3.88 ERA and 91 strikeouts against 25 walks in 102.0 innings pitched over 40 appearances (14 starts).

### HIGGINBOTHAM RETURNED TO MOUND

- Sophomore lefthander Jake Higginbotham was a midweek starter as a freshman in 2016, but suffered an arm injury and missed all of 2017.
- He was 6-1 with a 3.47 ERA, .236 opponents' batting average and 63 strikeouts against 32 walks in 80.1 innings pitched over 16 starts.
- Clemson had a 12-4 record in his 16 starts in the 2018 season.
- He returned to action against William & Mary on Feb. 18 and earned the win in 5.1 innings pitched, allowing just one run on two hits.
- He earned the win against No. 10 Dallas Baptist by allowing just five hits and no earned runs with seven strikeouts in 7.0 innings pitched.
- In his career, he was 9-1 with a 3.80 ERA and 91 strikeouts against 53 walks in 113.2 innings pitched over 24 appearances (23 starts).

#### MEREDITH ADDED SPEED TO LINEUP

- Freshman outfielder Kier Meredith made his Clemson debut at Notre Dame on April 7 after missing the first half of the season due to injury.
- He made an instant impact in the Notre Dame series, going 4-for-10 with a homer, triple, .571 on-base percentage and three steals.
- He hit .195 with a homer, triple, double, five RBIs, eight runs, a .411 on-base percentage and four steals in 13 games (12 starts) in 2018.
- He reached base via a hit, walk or hit-by-pitch in all 12 of his starts in 2018.
- He suffered another injury in April and missed 19 games during the second half of the season.

#### MILLER FILLED KEY RELIEF ROLE

- Senior righthander Ryan Miller was one of Clemson's top relievers during the 2018 season and filled an important role.
- He was 7-1 with four saves, a 2.51 ERA, .234 opponents' batting average and 64 strikeouts in 71.2 innings pitched over 26 relief outings.
- He held opponents to a .184 batting average with two outs.
- $\bullet$  He had 86 groundball outs compared to 53 flyball outs.
- He pitched 4.0 scoreless innings in relief to record the save in Clemson's win over No. 23 South Carolina at Greenville, S.C., on March 3.

#### SPIERS MADE THE JUMP

- Sophomore righthander Carson Spiers saw limited action as a freshman, but he made a big jump as one of the team's top relievers in 2018.

- His cousin, Will Spiers, is the starting punter on the Tiger football team.
- His father, Michael Spiers, hit .301 with 16 homers, 110 RBIs and 32 steals in 184 games as a Tiger from 1988-91.

- His uncle, Bill Spiers, hit .325 with 17 homers, 119 RBIs and 60 steals in 173 games as a Tiger from 1985-87, then played 13 MLB seasons.
- His grandfather, Bud Spiers, hit .254 with seven homers and 44 RBIs as a Tiger from 1956-58.

#### STRIDER PITCHED AS TOP FRESHMAN

- Righthander Spencer Strider was Clemson's most impactful freshman in 2018 as a reliever and spot starter.
- He was 5-2 with a save, 4.76 ERA, .215 opponents' batting average and 70 strikeouts in 51.0 innings pitched over 22 outings (six starts).
- He led the team in strikeouts and allowed only 11 extra-base hits.
- In ACC regular-season games, he was 2-0 with a 2.14 ERA and 27 strikeouts in 21.0 innings pitched over nine appearances (one start).

#### WHARTON EMERGED IN FINAL SEASON

- Senior Drew Wharton entered the season with no homers and 20 RBIs in 74 games (22 starts) over three years.
- With the departure of two outfielders from last year's team, he made the most of his chance to contribute in 2018
- He hit .255 with 12 doubles, a triple, seven homers, 41 RBIs and a .337 on-base percentage in 63 games (62 starts) in 2018.
- He hit three long balls, the first three of his career, in the series against No. 10 Dallas Baptist in February.
- He hit a walkoff triple in Clemson's 8-7 win over No. 23 South Carolina on March 4.
- In his career, he hit .245 with 15 doubles, a triple, seven homers, 61 RBIs, 38 runs and nine steals in 137 games (84 starts).

#### WILKIE ON A SECOND-HALF SURGE

- Sophomore catcher Kyle Wilkie was on a second-half surge, just like he was at the end of his freshman year.
- He hit .324 with five homers, 10 doubles, 40 RBIs and a .422 on-base percentage in 62 games (60 starts) in 2018
- He was 49-for-117 (.419) with four homers, six doubles, 25 RBIs and a .496 on-base percentage during his active 29-game hitting streak.
- His 29-game hitting streak is fourth longest in Clemson history.
- Before his hitting streak, he was hitting .212, therefore he raised his batting average 112 points.
- He reached base via a hit or walk in each of the last 39 games of the season.
- He hit .368 with runners on base, .397 with runners in scoring position and .392 with two outs.
- In ACC regular-season games, he hit .317 with two homers, seven doubles, 20 RBIs and a .418 on-base percentage in 29 games.
- As Clemson's catcher, he allowed only 26 stolen bases in 42 attempts.
- In his career, he is hitting .307 with 11 doubles, a triple, five homers, 45 RBIs, 40 runs and a .413 on-base percentage in 86 games.

#### **WILLIAMS POWERED TIGERS**

- Chris Williams was drafted in the 31st round in 2017, but chose to return for his senior season in 2018.
- He was one of the team's best power hitters and saw most of his action at first base in 2018, but also played at catcher.
- He was named to the Johnny Bench Award Watch List in March.
- He hit .281 with 12 doubles, 18 homers, an ACC-high 72 RBIs, 54 runs, a .401 on-base percentage and three steals in 63 games in 2018.

# NOTES

- He committed only three errors in 555 chances, good for a .995 fielding percentage.
- He was 9-for-14 (.643) with two grand slams, 22 RBIs and a 1.071 slugging percentage with the bases loaded in 2018.
- He ended his career on an 11-game hitting streak.
- He hit two grand slams, the first two of his career, in the Miami (Fla.) series on April 13,14.
- In his three-year career, he hit .264 with 31 doubles, 40 homers, 161 RBIs, 117 runs and seven steals in 169 games (157 starts).

- Gossett, who had a 23-9 career record at Clemson, made his major league debut with the Oakland Athletics in 2017.
- Kieboom, who played 141 games at Clemson, made his major league debut with the Washington Nationals in the 2016 regular-season finale.
- Leone, who had a 16-8 career record at Clemson, made his major league debut with the Seattle Mariners in 2014.
- Miller, the 2011 ACC Player-of-the-Year, hit .339 with 36 doubles, eight triples, 16 homers, 135 RBIs and 46 steals in 191 games as a Tiger.

# **SEASON REVIEW STORY**

In many ways, the 2018 team was Clemson's best since 2006. The Tigers again fell short in the Clemson Regional, but the list of accomplishments is a lengthy one

Led by third-year head coach Monte Lee, Clemson totaled 47 overall wins, 22 ACC regular-season victories, a share of the ACC regular-season title and an outright ACC Atlantic Division championship. Those four achievements were all firsts for the program since 2006.

Clemson had a 24-9 record against ACC teams, the best mark of any ACC team, won eight of 10 ACC series, won all five ACC road series for the first time in history, won its final 11 ACC road games and recorded three ACC road sweeps for the first time since 1995. The Tigers also won 12 of their last 13 ACC regular-season games a had a 15-5 overall road record. The Tigers set school records for one-run wins (16), fielding percentage (.975) and average home attendance (4,984) as well.

Clemson, who was ranked in the top 25 of every poll for the second year in a row and finished ranked as high as No. 12 by Perfect Game, featured a power-hitting lineup that finished tied for third in the nation in homers with 98, third most in Tiger history. Seth Beer led the team and was fifth in the nation in home runs (22), while Chris Williams (18), Logan Davidson (15), Grayson Byrd (9), Patrick Cromwell (7) and Drew Wharton (7) all had at least seven long balls. The Tigers also had a .451 slugging percentage and .379 on-base percentage.

Leading the way at the plate was Beer, who was a first-team All-American in 2018 and became only the second three-time All-American in Clemson history. Beer, also a First-Team All-ACC selection, hit .301 with an ACC-high 22 homers, 11 doubles, 54 RBIs, 64 runs, a .642 slugging percentage and .456 on-base percentage. Davidson was a third-team All-American and Second-Team All-ACC shortstop who batted .292 with 15 homers, 18 doubles, 46 RBIs, 60 runs, a .408 on-base percentage and 10 steals as well as an outstanding .971 fielding percentage.

Two other Tigers put up strong offensive numbers. Kyle Wilkie, a Third-Team All-ACC catcher, hit a teamhigh .324 with five homers, 40 RBIs and a .422 onbase percentage. He ended the season on a 29-game hitting streak and 39 on-base streak, and he only allowed 26 steals in 42 attempts while serving as the catcher in almost every game. Williams, a Third-Team All-ACC first baseman, hit .281 with 18 homers, 12 doubles, an ACC-high 72 RBIs, 54 runs and a .401 on-base percentage. Despite battling an injury during the second half of the season, Byrd earned Third-Team All-ACC honors as well.

Every pitcher who started a game on the mound in 2017 did not return in 2018, but the pitching staff was very consistent. Clemson had a 3.65 ERA, .239 opponents' batting average and 21 saves, tied for second most in school history.

The bullpen was the strongest component of the pitching staff, led by second-team All-America closer Ryley Gilliam. The First-Team All-ACC selection had 11 saves, tied for third most in Tiger history, along with a 1.41 ERA, 165 opponents' batting average and 54 strikeouts in 38.1 innings pitched over 27 relief appearances.

Ryan Miller and Carson Spiers were two long relievers who were also a big reason Clemson was 16-6 in one-run games. Miller was 7-1 with four saves, a 2.51 ERA, .234 opponents' batting average and 64 strike-outs against 17 walks in 71.2 innings pitched over 26 relief appearances. Spiers had four saves, a 2.08 ERA, .149 opponents' batting average and 39 strikeouts in

43.1 innings pitched over a team-high 29 relief outings

Clemson featured the same three starting pitchers for almost every weekend in 2018. Brooks Crawford was 8-2 with a 3.24 ERA, .234 opponents' batting average and 58 strikeouts against only 18 walks in a team-high 80.2 innings pitched over 16 starts. The Tigers were 14-2 in his 16 starts, while his six wins in ACC regular-season games led all league hurlers.

Jake Higginbotham was 6-1 with a 3.47 ERA and .236 opponents' batting average in 80.1 innings pitched over 16 starts. Jacob Hennessy had a 3.91 ERA and 54 strikeouts against only 14 walks in 71.1 innings pitched over 14 starts.

Spencer Strider, who led the team in strikeouts (70), earned freshman All-America and All-ACC Freshman honors as well.

The Tigers, who were seventh in the nation in wins, opened the season with three one-run home wins over William & Mary, marking the first time in school history Clemson won all three games of a series by one run. In the opener, Clemson trailed 4-1 with two outs and the bases empty before rallying for a win on Williams' walkoff single in the 10th inning.

The following weekend, Clemson hosted No. 10 Dallas Baptist and swept the Patriots by a combined score of 24-4, then Wilkie hit a walkoff single in the 10th inning in the Tigers' 9-8 win over Winthrop.

Clemson played its annual series against No. 23 South Carolina, and for the fourth year in a row, the Tigers won the series 2-1. After falling in Columbia 3-2 in game one, Clemson responded with back-to-back wins, including an 8-7 win at Doug Kingsmore Stadium in the finale on Wharton's walkoff triple. Those two victories were the first of Clemson's eight-game winning streak, one of four by the Tigers in 2018.

After midweek wins over Wofford and Michigan State, where the Tigers rallied from a 6-0 deficit with nine runs in the fifth inning in their 9-7 victory at Fluor Field, Clemson began ACC play with a three-game home sweep of Georgia Tech by a combined score of 23-7. The Tigers then upped their season record to 16-1 with a 5-0 home win over Charleston Southern, as Byrd tied a school record with three home runs.

The Tigers suffered a three-game home sweep against No. 10 NC State and a setback at Coastal Carolina before rebounding with two wins in three games at No. 11 Louisville and five victories in a row thereafter, including a three-game home sweep of Boston College and a home win against No. 18 Coastal Carolina.

Clemson won two of three games at Notre Dame in frigid temperatures in early April, but the Tigers suffered a loss against No. 10 Georgia at North Augusta, S.C., two losses in three home games against Miami (Fla.), including losing an eight-run lead in the ninth inning in game one, and a loss at No. 12 Georgia.

But Clemson turned the tide and the bats came alive during the rest of the season. It started with a threegame sweep at Wake Forest, two midweek home wins and another three-game road sweep, this time at Virginia. All three games were one-run victories at Charlottesville, Va., marking the second time during the season and in history the Tigers swept a series with three one-run wins. Gilliam also became the first Tiger in history with a save in all three games of a series.

After five days off for final exams, Clemson suffered a heartbreaking 3-2 loss in 13 innings against a top-15 Florida State team. But Clemson won its biggest series of the year with a 12-7 win in game two and a 5-4 victory in game three on Jordan Greene's walkoff homer, the first by a Tiger since 2016.

After Clemson went 4-1 in five combined non-conference games against Western Carolina, Austin Peay

and Kennesaw State, the Tigers ended the regular season with a three-game sweep at Pittsburgh. In the first game, Clemson hit six home runs, including two each by Davidson and Cromwell. Davidson, a switch-hitter, also became the first Tiger in history to hit a home run from both sides of the plate in one game. With its 4-1 win in the regular-season finale, Clemson tied North Carolina for the best ACC regular-season record in 2018

The Tigers took care of business of Notre Dame and Miami in the ACC Tournament to advance to the semifinal round. Against the Fighting Irish, the Tigers set an ACC Tournament record for runs in an inning with 17 in the fourth inning. It was also the third-most runs in an inning in school history and their most since 1998. Clemson hit four home runs in the frame as well. Not only did Davidson hit a homer from both sides of the plate for the second time in Tiger history six days after doing it the first time, he did it in the fourth inning.

No. 7 Florida State edged Clemson 5-4 to eliminate the Tigers from the ACC Tournament, then Clemson was awarded a regional host for the 16th time in history and third year in a row.

Clemson downed Morehead State 4-3 in its regional opener on Greene's walkoff single in the 10th inning, the Tigers' sixth walkoff hit of the season, but Vanderbilt held on to defeat the Tigers 4-3 in the winners' bracket. After a 9-8 win over St. John's, the Commodores eliminated Clemson on its home field for the second year in a row. Miller, Wharton, Wilkie and Williams were named to the Clemson Regional All-Tournament team

Seven Tigers were selected in the MLB draft after the season, tied for 13th most in the nation. Beer became Clemson's first first-round draft pick since 2012 when he was selected by the Houston Astros. Gilliam (fifth round), Miller (sixth round), Williams (eighth round), Higginbotham (11th round), Wharton (30th round) and Mitchell Miller (31st round) were also chosen in the draft.
