OXFORD (MISS.) REGIONAL PARTICIPANT

CLEMSON'S NCAA TOURNEY HISTORY

- The Tigers played in their 44th all-time NCAA regional when it competed in the 2019 Oxford Regional.
- The 44 appearances are fifth most in NCAA history, trailing only Texas (59), Florida State (57), Miami (Fla.) (46) and Oklahoma State (45).
- Clemson has been to the NCAA Tournament every year since 1987 except one (2008), or 32 of the last 33 years.
- Clemson is one of only five schools (Florida, Florida State, Texas A&M, Vanderbilt) to play in the NCAA Tourney each of the last 11 seasons.
- Clemson is one of only 13 schools to play in the NCAA Tournament each of the last four seasons under Head Coach Monte Lee.
- The others are DBU, Florida, FSU, LSU, Louisville, Mississippi State, NC State, Oklahoma State, So. Miss, Texas A&M, Texas Tech and Vandy.
- Clemson has made nine super regional appearances, with its last in 2010.
- The Tigers have made 12 trips to the College World Series, with its last in 2010.
- Clemson has a 121-95 record (.560) in NCAA Tournament games.

NCAA TOURNAMENT RECAP

- The Tigers were 1-2 in the Oxford Regional, defeating Illinois 8-4 before falling to No. 12 Mississippi 6-1 and Jacksonville State 9-2.
- Clemson hit .257 with 11 runs, four doubles, three homers, a .385 on-base percentage and no errors in three games.
- Kyle Wilkie was 7-for-13 (.538) with a homer, double, four RBIs and a walk.
- Davis Sharpe pitched 6.2 innings, allowing three hits, one unearned run and one walk with four strikeouts to earn the win against Illinois.

ACC TOURNAMENT RECAP

- Clemson had a 1-1 record in the ACC Tournament at Durham, N.C., with games on May 21 and May 23.
- Boston College defeated the Tigers 7-5 in 11 innings before Clemson downed No. 7 Louisville 7-1.
- The Tigers hit .253 with a 3.15 ERA and .167 opponents' batting average.
- Mat Clark, who allowed just one hit, retired the first 22 batters and took a no-hitter into the ninth inning in the win over the Cardinals.
- Clark was named to the All-ACC Tournament team as one of two starting pitchers.
- Jordan Greene went 4-for-6 with an RBI, two runs and a walk in two games.

QUICK HITS

- Clemson had a 9-8 record against top-25 teams, all of which were in the top 16. The Tigers were also 6-3 against top-10 teams.
- Sixteen of Clemson's 26 losses were by one run, two runs or in extra innings, including eight one-run losses.
- A total of 25 Tigers started at least one game in 2019.

ATTENDANCE

- Clemson averaged 4,735 fans per home date (30), the 10th-highest figure in the nation and second in the ACC.
- The 4,735 figure was fifth highest in school history.
- Clemson has had a top-20 national figure in average attendance 26 straight seasons and a top-15 figure 18 years in a row.

POLLS

- Clemson finished the season unranked in all the polls after spending the first half of the season ranked in the top 25.
- The Tigers were ranked in the top 25 by at least one poll for 55 straight weeks from May 9, 2016 to April 15, 2019.

NCAA STAT FINISHES

- Clemson finished in the top 25 in the nation in three stat categories, while Sam Hall finished in the top 25 in stolen bases.
- Clemson was 11th in the nation in homers (82) and 14th in homers per game (1.34).
- Clemson was tied for 24th in the nation in double plays (52).
- Sam Hall was tied for 19th in the nation in steals (30).

ACC STANDINGS

- Clemson finished in fourth place in the ACC Atlantic Division standings with a 15-15 league mark.
- Overall in the ACC standings, Clemson tied for seventh place with Duke (15-15).
- Clemson's ACC schedule was tied for second toughest among the 14 teams based on the combined ACC record of teams it did not face (40-50).
- Clemson has had a non-losing ACC regular-season record 11 years in a row and 46 of the last 47 years.

WINNING SEASONS THE NORM

- The Tigers have had a winning record every year since 1965.
- With its 35-26 record in 2019, Clemson had a winning record for the 55th season in a row.
- Clemson's 55-year streak is the third-longest active streak in the nation, trailing two ACC schools (Florida State 72, Miami (Fla.) 62).
- Clemson has had a non-losing record, which includes seasons with equal number of wins and losses, every season since 1958.
- Bill Wilhelm took over as head coach of the Clemson program in 1958, therefore the Tigers have not had a losing record since he took over.
- Clemson's 62-year streak of non-losing records is tied for the second-longest active streak in the nation, trailing only Florida State (72).

POWER & SPEED SURGE

- In 2018, Clemson hit 98 homers, tied for third in the nation, but many of those players who contributed to that total departed.
- Clemson totaled 82 homers in 61 games in 2019, good for 1.3 per game. The Tigers were second in the nation in that category in 2018 (1.6).
- Clemson hit a home run in 13 consecutive games, the last two games of 2018 and the first 11 contests of 2019.
- The 13-game streak tied a Tiger record. From March 21 to April 12, 1966 and March 31 to April 17, 1996 Clemson also had a 13-game streak.
- Fourteen Tigers accounted for the 82 homers. Grayson Byrd led the team with 16 homers, while Logan Davidson was second with 15 home runs.
- Clemson has showed a penchant for stealing bases in 2019. The Tigers had 91 steals, an average of 1.5 per game.

- Thirteen Tigers accounted for the 91 steals. Sam Hall led the team with 30 steals and Logan Davidson was second with 17 stolen bases.
- The 91 steals were the most by Clemson since 2013, when it totaled 111 steals.

YOUTH SERVED

- Clemson relied on many freshmen and sophomores to contribute in 2019.
- The weekend rotation predominantly featured two freshmen (Davis Sharpe, Keyshawn Askew) and a sophomore (Mat Clark).
- Two of the Tigers' best relievers were sophomore righthander Holt Jones and sophomore lefthander Sam Weatherly.
- Six freshmen (Bryar Hawkins, Davis Sharpe, James Parker, Elijah Henderson, Adam Hackenberg, Chad Fairey) started at least eight games.
- Five sophomores (Sam Hall, Bryce Teodosio, Kier Meredith, Bo Majkowski, Michael Green) started at least eight games.

SCORING STREAK

- Clemson scored at least one run in all 61 games in 2019 to extend its streak to 106 games.
- The 106-game streak is the eighth-longest active streak in the nation.
- The last time Clemson was shut out was on March 16, 2018, when No. 10 NC State blanked the Tigers 4-0 at Doug Kingsmore Stadium.
- Eastern Kentucky (161), Oklahoma State (136), New Orleans (126), Kentucky (119) and Louisiana (117) have the five-longest active streaks.
- Illinois State (113) and Nevada (108) also have longer streaks than Clemson, which has the ACC's longest active streak.
- The Clemson record for longest streak scoring at least one run is 232, set between May 10, 1982 to May 3, 1986.

LONGEST GAME IN CLEMSON HISTORY

- Georgia defeated Clemson 3-2 in 20 innings in Athens on April 16 in the longest game in both Bulldog and Tiger history.
- The previous longest game in Tiger history was 19 innings in an NCAA Tournament game against Fordham at New Britain, Conn. on May 26, 1988.
- Clemson scored two runs in the sixth and Georgia scored two runs in the seventh before the Bulldogs scored a walkoff run in the 20th inning.
- The game lasted six hours and 33 minutes and ended at 1:35 a.m.
- Clemson's seven pitchers combined for a school-record 24 strikeouts, besting the previous mark of 23 set against Elon on Feb. 24, 2017.
- Tiger pitchers combined to allow just nine hits (eight singles, one double) and one earned run in a schoolrecord 19.1 innings pitched.
- Grayson Byrd and Bryar Hawkins tied the school record with nine at-bats apiece in the game.

FAMILY CONNECTIONS

- Clemson had several players with family ties to current and former pro athletes as well as former Tigers.
- Grayson Byrd's father, Paul Byrd, was a righthander at Louisiana State and played 14 seasons (1995-02,04-09) in the major leagues.
- Logan Davidson's father, Mark Davidson, played at Clemson in 1982 and played six seasons (1986-91) in the majors with the Twins and Astros.
- Chad Fairey's uncle, Burke Fairey, played baseball at Clemson (1985-88) and his grandfather, Jim Fairey, played six MLB seasons (1968-73).

NOTES

- Adam Hackenberg's brother, Christian Hackenberg, was a quarterback at Penn State between the 2013 and 2015 seasons.
- Ryne Huggins' father, Mike Huggins, played three seasons (1986,87,89) at Clemson and had a 4-3 record and four saves in 41 relief outings.
- Bo Majkowski's father, Don Majkowski, played football at Virginia, then played 10 years (1987-96) in the NFL, totaling 12,700 passing yards.
- James Parker's father, Tim Parker, was a pitcher at Clemson in 1987,88,90 and was a third-round draft pick by the Chicago Cubs.
- Carson Spiers' cousin, Will Spiers, was a sophomore starting punter on Clemson's 2018 national champion-ship team.
- Carson Spiers' father, Michael Spiers, hit .301 with 16 homers, 110 RBIs and 32 steals in 184 games over four seasons (1988-91) at Clemson.
- Carson Spiers' uncle, Bill Spiers, played three seasons (1985-87) at Clemson and played 13 seasons (1989-01) in the major leagues.
- Carson Spiers' grandfather, Bud Spiers, hit .254 with seven homers and 44 RBIs in three seasons (1956-58) at Clemson.

TIGERS RECOGNIZED FOR APR SCORE

- Baseball was one of six Tiger programs in the top-10 percent of their sport in the eligibility, graduation and retention metric for 2017-18.
- It was the third year in a row (2015-16, 2016-17, 2017-18) the Clemson baseball program was lauded by the NCAA for its APR.
- Clemson was one of only 17 Division I baseball programs recognized in each of the three most-recent reports.
- Clemson was one of only four Power Five Conference baseball programs recognized in each of the three most-recent reports.
- Clemson was one of only two ACC schools (Notre Dame) to earn recognition for baseball for 2017-18.
- Clemson was one of only 15 Division I baseball programs to receive a perfect 1,000 score for 2017-18.
- Clemson was one of four Power Five Conference baseball programs (Michigan Northwestern, Notre Dame) to receive a 1,000 score for 2017-18.
- Clemson earned a perfect 1,000 score for the second year in a row in 2017-18.

GRADUATES

- Five Tiger players and one student assistant coach received their diplomas during commencement ceremonies in Littlejohn Coliseum on May 9.
- Infielder Justin Hawkins and student assistant coach Will Lamb, who played at Clemson (2009-11), graduated with a degree in communication.
- Infielder and outfielder Grayson Byrd graduated with a degree in parks, recreation & tourism management.
- Righthander Brooks Crawford graduated with a degree in sports communication.
- Shortstop Logan Davidson graduated with a degree in management in only three years.
- Righthander Bo Gobin graduated with a degree in marketing in only three years.
- Second baseman Jordan Greene played the season as a graduate student after graduating in Aug. 10, 2018 with a degree in economics.
- Righthander Luke Sommerfeld was a graduate transfer from Saint Louis.

ALL-AMERICA HONORS

• Grayson Byrd was named a third-team All-American by Collegiate Baseball, becoming the 62nd All-American in Clemson history.

- Davis Sharpe was a first-team freshman All-American by Baseball America, D1Baseball and Perfect Game.
- Davis Sharpe was also a freshman All-American by Collegiate Baseball and second-team freshman All-American by NCBWA.
- Logan Davidson was named a first-team Academic All-American by CoSIDA, the third in Tiger history and first since 2012 (Phil Pohl).

SIX TIGERS NAMED TO ALL-ACC TEAM

- Six Tigers earned First, Second or Third-Team All-ACC honors, tying for most in the ACC with Florida State, Georgia Tech and Louisville.
- Grayson Byrd (OF) earned First-Team All-ACC honors. It was the second time Byrd was named All-ACC.
- Logan Davidson (SS) and Davis Sharpe (SP) were Second-Team All-ACC selections. It was Davidson's second career All-ACC honor.
- Mat Clark (SP), Carson Spiers (RP) and Kyle Wilkie (C) were Third-Team All-ACC picks. It was Wilkie's second career All-ACC honor.

SEASON REVIEW STORY

The 122nd edition of Clemson baseball saw the Tigers jump out to a 24-7 record and 11-3 ACC mark. But the Tigers, who registered their 55th consecutive winning season, staggered down the stretch. Nevertheless, Clemson fought its way to its 11th NCAA Tournament appearance in a row, one of only five schools that can make that claim.

Led by fourth-year Head Coach Monte Lee, the Tigers finished the season with an overall record of 35-26 and an ACC mark of 15-15. Clemson was at its best against the top competition, with a 9-8 record against top-25 teams and 6-3 mark versus top-10 foes. That included a three-game sweep of No. 3 North Carolina and three wins in four games against a top-10 Louisville squad.

The Tigers were ranked in the top 25 in each of the first 10 polls of the season to extend their streak (dating to 2016) to 55 consecutive polls. But unlike the previous three seasons, the Tigers struggled in close games, as 16 of their 26 losses were by one run, two runs or in extra innings.

Clemson turned to many new faces to play vital roles on the 2019 team. A total of 25 Tigers started at least one game, including 16 offensive players who started at least eight games.

The 2019 season marked the first time since 2010 the Tigers totaled at least 80 homers and 80 steals in a season. Fourteen Tigers accounted for the 82 long balls, 11th most in the nation, and 13 Tigers contributed to the 91 steals, their most since 2013. The Tigers hit a home run in each of their first 11 games of the year after hitting a homer in each of their last two games of 2018. The 13-game streak tied a school record.

Leading the way at the plate was senior Grayson Byrd, who was an All-American and First-Team All-ACC selection. Byrd was one of six All-ACC Tigers, tied for most in the league. He hit .316 with 16 homers and 59 RBIs. Byrd also totaled 11 homers in the last 18 games and led the team in batting average, hits (79), homers, RBIs and slugging percentage (.588).

Logan Davidson, the Mitchell Award winner as the team's most valuable player, hit .291 with 15 homers, 55 RBIs and 17 steals while committing only nine errors at shortstop. The Second-Team All-ACC selection had a 56-game on-base streak and became the first Tiger in history to total both double-digit homers and double-digit steals in three different seasons. David-son was also named ACC Baseball Scholar-Athlete-of-the-Year and Clemson's top male ACC Scholar-Athlete for all sports in 2019 thanks in large part to his 3.99 cumulative GPA and graduating in only six semesters. He was a first-team Academic All-American, Clemson's third in history, as well.

Kyle Wilkie earned Third-Team AlI-ACC honors after hitting .307 with six homers and 41 RBIs, while Michael Green sparked the lineup late in the season after missing over half the season with an injury. He ended the season on a 14-game hitting streak, hitting .393 during the streak. Sam Hall added an ACC-high 30 steals, the most by a Tiger since 1994, while starting at least six games at five different positions.

Davis Sharpe and Mat Clark were both in the weekend rotation most of the season and were the most consistent pitchers on the 2019 staff. Sharpe was a Second-Team All-ACC selection, Clemson's first freshman to be an All-ACC pitcher since 2000, and a firstteam freshman All-American. He was 7-4 with a 3.20 ERA, .205 opponents' batting average and a team-high 84 strikeouts in 84.1 innings pitched. He also hit .264 with three homers and 18 RBIs in 38 games on offense, as he was a finalist for the John Olerud Two-Way Playerof-the-Year Award. Clark was a Third-Team All-ACC selection who earned the Stowe Award as the team's most valuable pitcher. Clark, who moved into the weekend rotation in March, was 9-3 with a 3.21 ERA, .202 opponents' batting average and 60 strikeouts in 73.0 innings pitched.

Carson Spiers, a Third-Team All-ACC selection, led the team in appearances (30) and saves (11), as he had a 3.59 ERA, .220 opponents' batting average and 44 strikeouts in 47.2 innings pitched. Spiers also received the Tiger Baseball Award as the team's best leader.

Clemson again received acclaim for its academic prowess, as the program was one of 15 in the nation and one of only two in the ACC with a 1,000 APR score.

The Tigers opened the season on a nine-game homestand and won seven of their first eight games. Clemson won two of three games against South Alabama to open the year. In the doubleheader on Feb. 16, Sharpe made his Tiger debut. In the first game, he tossed 5.0 scoreless innings of two-hit ball with eight strikeouts to earn the win. In the second game, he made his offensive debut and hit two homers with three RBIs. He was a national player-of-the-week and ACC Player-of-the-Week for his efforts.

After a midweek win against Charlotte, Clemson swept Virginia Military in three games. In the second game, Sharpe tossed 6.0 scoreless innings of one-hit ball with 11 strikeouts to earn the win. The Tigers then defeated East Tennessee State 14-3 behind a sevenrun sixth inning.

South Carolina defeated Clemson twice in the annual rivalry series. The Tigers won 11-5 at Fluor Field in Greenville and Hall received the Bob Bradley Award as Clemson's series MVP. He was 5-for-10 with a homer, double, three RBIs, four runs and three steals.

Clemson rebounded with a 4-0 week with a win over Furman at Fluor Field and a three-game home sweep of No. 3 North Carolina by a combined score of 25-9. In the opener, Clemson scored two runs in the ninth inning, with the walkoff run on a balk, to win 3-2, then it blasted the Tar Heels 17-3 behind 20 hits, including four hits each by Hall, Byrd and Bryar Hawkins, the first time three Tigers had four hits in a game since 2003. In the finale, Davidson crushed a two-run walkoff homer in a 5-4 victory.

The Tigers topped No. 11 Coastal Carolina 8-5 at home before Notre Dame won two of three games at Doug Kingsmore Stadium. Clark tossed 7.0 scoreless innings of three-hit ball with seven strikeouts against no walks in Clemson's lone win.

After a 13-1 home win over College of Charleston, the Tigers played their next eight games on the road and had a 7-1 record. Clemson defeated the Cougars in Columbia, then won two of three games at Boston College. In the opener, Sharpe pitched 7.0 scoreless innings of three-hit ball.

The Tigers defeated Charlotte 8-5 in their first game at BB&T Ballpark before sweeping Virginia Tech on the road by a combined score of 32-14. Byrd was 9-for-15 with five extra-base hits, seven RBIs and 10 runs on the week to earn ACC Player-of-the-Week honors. Sharpe, who played a vital role in Clemson's 22-6 start, earned midseason national freshman-of-the-year honors by D1Baseball.

Clemson returned home the following week and fell to No. 4 Georgia 5-3 before winning two of three games against No. 8 Louisville behind strong starting performances by Sharpe and Clark.

After a 2-0 home win over Furman, Florida State turned its season around with a three-game sweep of the Tigers in Tallahassee, the first three losses of an eight-game losing streak. Two days later, Clemson played its longest game in history at No. 4 Georgia, who won 3-2 in 20 innings. Clemson pitchers totaled a

school-record 24 strikeouts in the game that lasted six hours and 33 minutes. The Tigers also suffered a threegame home sweep against Duke and fell to Winthrop.

Clemson snapped the skid with a 7-4 win over Tennessee Tech before winning one of three games at Georgia Tech. In the finale, the Tigers trailed by four runs before rallying for an 11-7 win behind late-inning home runs by Justin Hawkins and Byrd, who was 6-for-14 (.429) with three homers, two doubles and seven RBIs in the series.

After final exams, Clemson split a home-and-home series with Gardner-Webb and split midweek home games against Presbyterian College (8-7 loss) and The Citadel (17-3 win). Byrd went 4-for-4 with two homers, a double, four RBIs and four runs in the win over the Bulldogs.

NC State won two of three games in Raleigh, as the Tigers' lone win was a 4-3 victory in 10 innings, then the Tigers stayed on the road to defeat Coastal Carolina 14-3 behind a grand slam and six RBIs by Byrd.

The Tigers, who averaged 4,735 fans per home date, fifth highest in school history, closed the regular season with two one-run wins in three games over Wake Forest. Green had four hits and three RBIs in Clemson's second win, a crucial victory that secured at least a .500 league record. Byrd added a long ball in each game, as he was a national player-of-the-week and ACC Player-of-the-Week for his efforts.

Clemson was the No. 8 seed in the ACC Tournament at Durham (N.C.) Bulls Athletic Park and fell to Boston College 7-5 in 11 innings, then it defeated No. 7 Louisville 7-1 to all but clinch an NCAA Tournament berth. Clark earned national player-of-the-week honors and was named to the All-ACC Tournament team after earning the win against the Cardinals. He retired the first 22 batters of the game and took a no-hitter into the ninth inning in one of the best pitching performances in Clemson postseason history.

The Tigers were a No. 3 seed in the Oxford (Miss.) Regional and defeated Illinois 8-4 in the opener. Wilkie had four hits and three RBIs, while Byrd contributed three hits, including a homer, and three RBIs. But their season came to an end with losses to No. 12 Mississippi (6-1) and Jacksonville State (9-2). Wilkie was 7-for-13 (.538) with a homer, double and four RBIs in the regional.

Five Tigers were selected in the MLB draft after the season. Davidson became Clemson's 15th first-round draft pick in history when he was selected by the Oakland Athletics with the No. 29 overall pick. Wilkie (12th round), Owen Griffith (20th round), Byrd (24th round) and Brooks Crawford (29th round) were also chosen in the draft.
