CLEMSON'S NCAA TOURNEY HISTORY

- Clemson played in its 40th all-time NCAA regional when it participated in the Fullerton Regional.
- The 40 appearances are fifth most in NCAA history, trailing only Texas (57), Florida State (53), Miami (Fla.) (44) and Oklahoma State (41).
- Clemson has been to the NCAA Tournament every year since 1987 except one (2008).
- The Tigers have been to the NCAA Tournament 28 of the last 29 years.
- Clemson is one of only 11 schools in the nation to play in the NCAA Tournament each of the last seven seasons.
- The others are Arkansas, Cal State Fullerton, Florida, Florida State, Miami (Fla.), Oregon State, Rice, Texas A&M, Vanderbilt and Virginia.
- Clemson has made nine super regional appearances in the 17 years since the format began in 1999.
- The Tigers have made 12 trips to the College World Series.
- Clemson has a 113-87 record (.565) in NCAA Tournament games.
- Clemson was 68-47 (.591) under head coach Jack Leggett in NCAA Tournament play, including a 40-9 record (.816) in home NCAA Tournament games.
- Leggett took the Tigers to the NCAA Tournament 21 times in the 22 years he was Clemson's head coach.

NCAA TOURNAMENT RECAP

- Clemson had an 0-2 record in the Fullerton (Calif.) Regional, trailing to No. 18 Arizona State 7-4 and Pepperdine 10-8.
- The Tigers rallied from a 7-0 deficit against the Waves to take an 8-7 lead in the seventh inning, but fell short by two runs.
- Clemson hit .296 with three doubles, one triple, nine walks and three steals.
- Steven Duggar (OF) and Eli White (SS) were named to the all-tournament team. Duggar was 4-for-8 and White was 4-for-9.

ACC TOURNAMENT RECAP

- Clemson had a 1-2 record in the ACC Tournament at Durham, N.C. The Tigers beat No. 1 seed Louisville 7-2.
- Clemson hit .245 with four doubles and two steals. Reed Rohlman (6-for-12) and Tyler Krieger (4-for-10) led Clemson at the plate.
- The pitching staff had a 2.16 ERA, .163 opponents' batting average and 30 strikeouts against 12 walks in 25.0 innings pitched.

QUICK HITS

- Lefthanders (7) combined to pitch 57.8 percent of the 549.0 innings pitched by Clemson in 2015.
- Two Tigers (Matthew Crownover, Zack Erwin) pitched 100+ innings in a season for the first time since 2002.
- Chris Okey (C) and Eli White (SS) were the only Tigers to start every game at the same position in 2015.

WINNING SEASONS THE NORM

- The Tigers have had a winning record every year since 1965.
- With its 32-29 record in 2015, Clemson had a winning record for the 51st season in a row.
- That 51-year winning streak spans just two head coaches, Bill Wilhelm (29 seasons) and Jack Leggett (22 seasons).
- Clemson's 51-year streak is the third-longest active streak in the nation, trailing two ACC schools (Florida State 68, Miami (Fla.) 58).
- Clemson has had a non-losing record, which includes seasons with equal number of wins and losses, every season since 1958.
- Bill Wilhelm took over as head coach of the Clemson program in 1958, therefore the Tigers have not had a losing record since he took over.
- Clemson's 58-year streak of non-losing records is tied for the second-longest active streak in the nation, trailing only Florida State (68).

ATTENDANCE

- Clemson averaged 4,251 fans per home date (28), the ninth-highest figure in the nation and second most in the ACC.
- Clemson has a top-20 national figure in average attendance 22 straight seasons and a top-10 figure 14 years in a row.

ACC STANDINGS

- Clemson (16-13) finished fourth in the Atlantic Division standings behind Louisville (25-5), Notre Dame (17-13) and Florida State (17-13).
- Clemson finished fifth in the overall ACC standings.
- Clemson finished with a winning ACC regular-season record for the 21st time in 22 seasons under head coach Jack Leggett.

TOP-25 & TOP-10 WINS

- Clemson had an 8-5 record against top-25 teams and a 7-4 record against top-10 teams in 2015.
- Clemson had a 4-0 record against top-10 teams on opponents' home fields (Florida State 3, South Carolina 1).
- Only four of the 11 games against top-10 teams were played at Clemson.
- Clemson swept No. 8 Florida State in three games in Tallahassee from May 14-16. It was the Seminoles' first series sweep at home since 2006.
- Clemson hit .287 with a .977 fielding percentage against top-25 teams. Steven Duggar hit a team-high .385 with 17 RBIs versus top-25 teams.
- The Tigers had a 3.32 ERA and .229 opponents' batting average against top-25 teams.

CLOSE LOSSES

- Clemson outscored the opposition by 83 runs (386-303) (+1.4 runs per game) in 2015.
- Clemson started the season 3-3 in one-run games, but was 1-5 in its last six one-run games.
- Clemson also lost six two-run games and four three-run games, therefore 18 of its 29 losses were by three runs or less.
- The Tigers were 13-8 in their last 21 games against ACC teams. The eight losses were by 16 runs. The 13 wins were by 65 runs.
- In the last 21 games against ACC teams, Clemson outscored opponents 130-81. Clemson was 4-7 in its first 11 games against ACC teams.

ROAD BATS

- Clemson hit nine points higher in games away from home compared to home games in 2015.
- In 31 games away from home (16-15 record), the Tigers hit .292, led by Reed Rohlman's .352 batting average.
- In 30 games at home (16-14 record), Clemson hit .283, led by Reed Rohlman's .360 batting average.
- Clemson averaged 7.1 runs per game away from home compared to 5.5 runs per game at home.

DOUBLE-DIGIT COMEBACK WIN

- Facing Furman at Fluor Field in Greenville, S.C. on May 12, Clemson trailed 10-0 after two innings, but rallied to win 23-15.
- Clemson scored three in the third, two in both the fourth and fifth and four in the sixth, then eight in the seventh to take the lead.
- The Tigers added one run in the eighth inning and three runs in the ninth inning, as Clemson scored in each of the last seven innings.
- Tiger batters totaled 22 hits, 15 walks and two hit-by-pitches, meaning 39 Tigers reached base safely, including six times by Steven Duggar.
- Chris Okey went 3-for-6 with two homers and three RBIs, Tyler Krieger went 4-for-6 with three RBIs and Weston Wilson added three hits.
- Ten Tigers totaled at least one hit and scored at least one run.
- Furman used 11 pitchers, who combined to throw 282 pitches in the nine-inning game that lasted 4:42.
- It was the most runs scored by the Tigers since May 18, 2006, when they defeated Wake Forest 26-1.

HISTORIC SWEEP IN TALLAHASSEE

- Clemson swept No. 8 Florida State in a three-game series at Tallahassee, Fla. from May 14-16 by a combined score of 20-7.
- It was Clemson's first-ever three-game sweep in Tallahassee.
- With Clemson leading 9-1, Florida State scored five of its seven runs in the series in the last inning of the final game.
- The Tigers won by scores of 4-1, 7-0 and 9-6, as it was their first and only three-game ACC sweep of the season.
- Clemson handed Florida State its first three-game series sweep at Dick Howser Stadium since 2006.
- Clemson had a 21-scoreless-innings-pitched streak during the three games.
- Florida State had a 27-4 home record in 2015 entering the series.

LAST BUT NOT LEAST

- Nine Tigers had at least one plate appearance as the No. 9 batter in the order in 2015.
- Those nine players combined to hit .305, fourth-highest among all spots in the batting order.
- Tyler Slaton was 8-for-14 (.571) with three walks and a .647 on-base percentage in four games in the nine-hole.

THREE TIGERS NAMED ALL-AMERICANS

- Junior lefty Matthew Crownover, sophomore catcher Chris Okey and freshman outfielder Reed Rohlman were named All-Americans.
- The three All-Americans were the most by a Tiger team since 2006, when that team also had three (Tyler Colvin, Josh Cribb, Andy D'Alessio).
- It marked the first time since 2006 that Clemson had two first-team All-Americans (Crownover, Okey).
- Crownover was a first-team pick by Collegiate Baseball, becoming the first Tiger pitcher to earn first-team honors since 1996 (Kris Benson).

NOTES

- Okey was a first-team selection by NCBWA, becoming the first Tiger catcher to earn All-America honors since 1997 (Matthew LeCroy).
- Rohlman was a third-team All-American by College Sports Madness and a first-team freshman All-American by Baseball America and NCBWA.
- Rohlman became just the second Tiger freshman ever and first since 2005 (Taylor Harbin) to be named an All-American.

SIX TIGERS NAMED TO ALL-ACC TEAM

- Six Tigers earned First, Second or Third-Team All-ACC honors, third most by an ACC team.
- Matthew Crownover (SP) and Chris Okey (C) earned First-Team All-ACC honors.
- Crownover became the first Tiger lefthander to earn First-Team All-ACC honors since 1995 (Jason Dawsey).
- Okey became the first Tiger to be named the First-Team All-ACC catcher since 1997 (Matthew LeCroy).
- Tyler Krieger (DH/UT) and Reed Rohlman (OF) were named Second-Team All-ACC.
- Steven Dugger (OF) and Eli White (SS) earned Third-Team All-ACC honors.
- Five of Clemson's nine position players earned All-ACC honors.
- Crownover, Dugger and Krieger all earned All-ACC honors for the second time in their careers.

ALL-ACC ACADEMIC TIGERS

- Juniors Matthew Crownover and Steven Dugger were two of four Tigers named All-ACC Academic. They earned the honor for the third time.
- Freshman Chase Pinder and sophomore Eli White both earned All-ACC Academic team accolades for the first time.
- To be eligible, a student-athlete must record a 3.0 GPA the previous semester and maintain a 3.0 cumulative GPA during his academic career.

SEVEN TIGERS PICKED IN MLB DRAFT

- Seven Tigers were selected in the 2015 Major League Baseball draft, tied for 16th most in the nation and tied for most in the ACC.
- Zack Erwin (4th round), Tyler Krieger (4th round), Steven Dugger (6th round) and Matthew Crownover (6th round) were drafted on day two.
- Brody Koerner (17th round), Clate Schmidt (32nd round) and Eli White (37th round) were drafted on day three.
- Jack Leggett had 108 players drafted in his 22 seasons (1994-15) as head coach at Clemson.
- A total of 19 of those 108 players were drafted twice, meaning a Tiger was drafted 127 times in Leggett's tenure at Clemson.
- Fourteen more Tigers signed a free-agent contract under Leggett as well.

GRADUATES

- Three Tiger players and one coach received their degrees during commencement ceremonies in Littlejohn Coliseum on May 8.
- Righthanders Patrick Andrews (mechanical engineering), Brody Koerner (accounting) and Jake Long (economics) received their degrees.

- Student assistant coach Taylor Harbin, who played at Clemson from 2005-07, received his degree in parks, recreation & tourism management.

TIGERS SET SPRING GPA RECORD

- Clemson set a spring semester record with a 3.04 GPA in 2015.
- A total of 23 players made the school's academic honor roll (3.0 GPA or higher), most in program history.
- The 23 honor roll members were second most for a semester in program history, trailing only the 24 by the 2009 team in the fall of 2008.

READY IN A PINCH

- Clemson had a steady lineup most of the season, but the players who were called upon off the bench performed well.
- Ten Tigers came off the bench in the field in 2015, and those 10 combined to hit .250 (23-for-92) with seven doubles and 15 RBIs.
- Robert Jolly was 5-for-13 (.385) with a double, three RBIs and four runs in 13 games off the bench.
- Drew Wharton was 6-for-16 (.375) with a double, six RBIs and two runs in 18 games off the bench.
- Glenn Batson was 5-for-18 (.278) with three doubles, five RBIs and three runs in 13 games off the bench.

LEFTY DUO

- Lefty starters Matthew Crownover and Zack Erwin provided a strong 1-2 punch on the mound in 2015.
- The duo combined to allow 180 hits, 58 earned runs (2.42 ERA) and 53 walks with 200 strikeouts in 215.2 innings pitched.
- Crownover was 10-3 with a 1.82 ERA and .183 opponents' batting average, while Erwin was 7-4 with a 3.04 ERA and only 16 walks allowed.

LEGGETT BY THE NUMBERS

- In 36 overall seasons, head coach Jack Leggett has 1,332 wins, ninth most in Division I history and fifth most among 2015 coaches.
- He won his 1,300th career game in Clemson's 3-2 walkoff win over No. 3 Miami (Fla.) in the ACC Tournament in Greensboro, N.C. on May 22.
- His 955 wins as head coach at Clemson (1994-15) were seventh most in the nation during that span.
- He led Clemson to a winning ACC regular-season record 21 times in his 22 seasons.
- He had 244 top-25 wins, 135 top-10 wins and 65 top-five wins as head coach at Clemson.

CROWNOVER IN CONTROL

- Junior lefthander Matthew Crownover was 10-3 with a 1.82 ERA and .183 opponents' batting average in 109.0 innings pitched over 16 starts.
- He was one of 16 semifinalists for the National Pitcher-of-the-Year Award and was the only ACC player among the semifinalists.
- He was one of 21 semifinalists for the Golden Spikes Award.
- He allowed just 72 hits and 37 walks with 108 strikeouts as Clemson's Friday starter.
- He became the first Tiger lefthander to total 10 wins in a season since 1996 (Ken Vining).
- His 1.82 ERA was the best mark by a Tiger since 1998 (Scott Clackum) and the best mark by a Tiger starter since 1977 (Brian Snyder).
- His 108 strikeouts were the most by a Tiger since 1996, when Kris Benson (204), Billy Koch (152) and Ken Vining (135) all had at least 135.

- He allowed no earned runs in six of his 16 starts. In the other 10 starts, he gave up a combined 22 earned runs.
- Clemson had an 11-5 record in his 16 starts, all in the first game of weekend series or tournament.
- He was 7-1 with a 1.03 ERA and .176 opponents' batting average in 70.0 innings pitched over 10 ACC regular-season starts.
- He was 4-2 with a 1.60 ERA and .163 opponents' batting average along with 55 strikeouts against 16 walks in eight starts away from home.
- He allowed just one run on two hits in 7.0 innings pitched to earn the win at NC State on March 6.
- He gave up no earned runs and three hits in 8.0 innings pitched to earn the win versus Notre Dame in game one of a doubleheader on March 14.
- He pitched 8.1 innings, allowing five hits and no runs at Virginia Tech on March 20 and was named ACC Pitcher-of-the-Week.
- He yielded no earned runs with eight strikeouts in 7.0 innings pitched to earn the win against North Carolina on April 3.
- He allowed three hits and no runs in 6.0 innings pitched to earn the win at Boston College on April 10.
- He allowed only one run in 7.0 innings pitched to earn the win against No. 3 Louisville on May 2 and was named ACC Co-Pitcher-of-the-Week.
- He yielded one run on five hits in 7.0 innings pitched to earn the win at No. 8 Florida State on May 14.
- In his career, he was 25-12 with a 2.30 ERA, .224 opponents' batting average and 243 strikeouts against 74 walks in 278.1 innings pitched.
- His career ERA (No. 5) and career strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.28, No. 8) were both top-10 Tiger marks.
- His 25 career wins tied for seventh most in Clemson history.

CROWNOVER ACC PITCHER-OF-THE-YEAR

- Junior lefthander Matthew Crownover was named 2015 ACC Pitcher-of-the-Year in a vote by the 14 ACC head coaches.
- He was 10-3 with a 1.82 ERA, .183 opponents' batting average and 108 strikeouts in 109.0 innings pitched over 16 starts in 2015.
- He became the Clemson's first-ever ACC Pitcher-of-the-Year, as the ACC first named one in 2005.
- Kris Benson was the last Tiger hurler to earn ACC Player-of-the-Year honors in 1996.

DUGGAR DYNAMIC

- Junior outfielder Steven Duggar was one of the team's most dynamic players with his speed and strong arm.
- He hit .304 with five homers, 12 doubles, 43 RBIs, a team-high 56 runs, a team-high 54 walks and .432 on-base percentage in 61 games.
- He was 29-for-72 (.403) with three homers, 17 RBIs, 26 runs, 21 walks, a .536 on-base percentage and four steals in the last 19 games.
- He reached base via a hit or walk in 26 of the last 27 games, 59 of the 61 games in 2015 and 61 of the last 63 games dating to 2014.
- He reached base in each of the first 33 games in 2015 and 35 games in a row dating to 2014, then had a 24-game on-base streak later in 2015.
- He had a 13-game hitting streak from April to May.
- He reached base six times via a triple, three walks and two hit-by-pitches in Clemson's 23-15 win at Furman on May 12.
- In his career, he hit .299 with 33 doubles, six triples, eight homers, 109 RBIs, 140 runs and 50 steals in 184 games.
- He started all 184 (183 in right field and one in center field) of Clemson's games from 2013-15.

- He had four outfield assists in 2015 and 18 in his career.

ERWIN EFFICIENT ON THE MOUND

- Junior lefthander Zack Erwin was a weekend starter all year and exhibited the best control of his career.
- He was 7-4 with a 3.04 ERA and .257 opponents' batting average in 2015.
- In 106.2 innings pitched over 17 appearances (16 starts), he yielded just 16 walks with 92 strikeouts (5.75 strikeout-to-walk ratio).
- He allowed seven hits and one earned run with seven strikeouts in 8.0 innings pitched to earn the win against Wake Forest on March 29.
- He gave up just one earned run and no walks with 11 strikeouts in 9.0 innings pitched in Clemson's 5-4 win over North Carolina on April 4.
- He allowed just five hits and one run with nine strikeouts to earn the win in the second game of a doubleheader against Duke on April 18.
- He allowed five hits and one walk with 11 strikeouts in 8.0 innings pitched to earn the win against Georgia Southern on May 9.
- He gave up only three hits, no runs and no walks with three strikeouts to earn the win at No. 8 Florida State on May 15.
- He allowed just six hits, one run and no walks with 11 strikeouts in 8.0 innings pitched to earn the win against No. 3 Louisville on May 21.
- In his career, he was 16-9 with a 3.50 ERA, .244 opponents' batting average and 186 strikeouts against 64 walks in 239.1 innings pitched.

JOLLY CAUGHT HIS OPPORTUNITY

- Freshman catcher Robert Jolly was 20-for-57 (.351) with three doubles, eight RBIs, 12 runs and a .422 on-base percentage in 25 games.
- He made all 12 of his starts in May as the DH. He got his opportunity to start with Chase Pinder's season-ending injury in May.
- He joined Chris Okey as the only catchers on the 2015 roster.
- He was 4-for-10 (.400) as a pinch-hitter.
- He went 2-for-3 with a double, three RBIs, two runs and a walk against Georgia Southern on May 8. It was his second career start.

KOERNER BLANKED GAMECOCKS

- Junior righty Brody Koerner pitched a four-hit shutout in Clemson's 7-0 win at No. 8 South Carolina on March 2. He also struck out seven.
- His performance enabled the Tigers to win the regular-season series over the Gamecocks for the first time since 2010.
- He won the Bob Bradley Award as Clemson's MVP of the three-game series.
- He was the biggest reason South Carolina did not score a run in a home game for the first time since 1998.
- He became the first Tiger to pitch a shutout in Columbia since 1968 (John Curtis).
- On the season, he was 4-5 with 63 strikeouts against only 22 walks in 62.0 innings pitched over 16 appearances (12 starts).

KRALL TRANSFERRED SUCCESS

- Sophomore lefthander Pat Krall pitched for Temple in 2014, but the school disbanded its program and Krall was eligible in 2015 as a Tiger.
- He had three saves, a 4.03 ERA and 38 strikeouts against only 11 walks in 38.0 innings pitched over a team-high 27 relief appearances.
- He and lefthander Zack Erwin were the tallest Tigers at 6'5".

NOTES

- He posted strong numbers at Temple, as he had an 0.66 ERA and a .181 opponents' batting average in 27.1 innings pitched in 2014.

KRIEGER AMONG LEADERS IN BATTING

- Junior infielder Tyler Krieger hit .339 with 14 doubles, one triple, one homer, 41 RBIs and 14 steals in 61 games.
- He was the everyday starter as the DH before making 24 starts at second base in April and May.
- He led the team lead in on-base percentage (.448) and steals.
- He had two double-digit hitting streaks in 2015, as he had a 13-game hitting streak (including the last two games of 2014).
- He also had an 11-game hitting streak in March.
- He reached base in 27 straight games, which included the last two games of 2014 and the first 25 games of 2015.
- He had 24 multiple-hit games.
- He hit a walkoff single in the 14th inning to give Clemson a 5-4 win over Maine in the first game of a doubleheader on February 21.
- In his career, he hit .312 with 42 doubles, three homers, 100 RBIs, a .404 on-base percentage and 42 steals in 180 games.

LONG FILLED NO. 3 STARTER ROLE

- Senior righthander Jake Long became Clemson's No. 3 starter on the weekend.
- He did not pitch during the first half of the season while recovering from injury, but was healthy during the second half of the season.
- He was 2-1 with a 2.17 ERA, .206 opponents' batting average and 39 strikeouts in 49.2 innings pitched over 13 appearances (seven starts).
- In 19.0 innings pitched over five appearances in ACC regular-season games, he was 1-0 with a 1.89 ERA and .185 opponents' batting average.
- In his two years as a Tiger, he was 5-4 with a 3.83 ERA and .232 opponents' batting average in 105.2 innings pitched over 29 appearances.

MOYER MISSED

- Sophomore righty Drew Moyer was the closer in the first half of the year, but suffered a shoulder injury in March and was lost for the year.
- In 10.1 innings pitched over 10 relief appearances in 2015, he was 1-0 with two saves, a 1.74 ERA and .250 opponents' batting average.
- He had 15 strikeouts, good for 13.06 strikeouts per nine innings pitched.
- After he was out of action due to injury, Clemson was 2-6 in one-run games and 1-4 in two-run games.
- He held opponents to 1-for-12 (.083) with two outs.
- In his career, he is 6-1 with four saves, a 3.10 ERA and 47 strikeouts in 49.1 innings pitched over 38 relief appearances.

OKEY PRODUCED RUNS

- Sophomore catcher Chris Okey followed up his first year, which saw him among the team leaders in RBIs, with 57 RBIs in 2015.
- He was named one of 20 semifinalists for the Johnny Bench Award in May. The award goes to the nation's best catcher.
- He hit .315 with 16 doubles, one triple, 12 homers, 57 RBIs, 50 runs and three steals in starting all 61 games at catcher.
- He was the catcher for 534 of Clemson's 549 innings on defense in 2015.
- He became the first Tiger since 2012 (Richie Shaffer) to hit double-digit homers.

- His 12 home runs were the most by a Tiger since 2011, when Shaffer hit 13 long balls.
- He had 20 multiple-hit games and 15 multiple-RBI games, including eight games with at least three RBIs.
- In ACC regular-season games, he hit .313 with 10 doubles, five homers, 24 RBIs and 23 runs in 29 games.
- He had a 10-game hitting streak in April, when he was 22-for-42 (.524) with four homers, two doubles, 14 RBIs and 13 runs during that span.
- With two outs in the 10th inning at Virginia Tech on March 20, he blasted a grand slam to give Clemson a 4-0 win.
- He hit two homers at Boston College on April 11. In the series, he was 8-for-14 with a double, three homers and seven RBIs.
- He was named ACC Player-of-the-Week on April 13 by going 13-for-23 with three homers, two doubles, seven RBIs and six runs in five games.
- He led off the eighth inning with a game-winning homer in Clemson's 5-4 win over Georgia Southern on May 9.
- He went 3-for-6 with two homers, three RBIs, two runs and a walk at Furman on May 12.
- In his career, he is hitting .282 with 25 doubles, two triples, 16 homers, 98 RBIs, 77 runs and six steals in starting all 122 games.
- Invited to the USA Collegiate National Team for the summer. It marked the second year in a row he was on the squad.

PINDER PLAYED LIKE A VETERAN

- Freshman Chase Pinder was a starter at second base most of the 2015 season and was also the starting DH.
- He suffered a shoulder injury during the second half of the season and was lost for the year.
- He hit .256 with 18 runs, eight doubles, one triple, three homers, 26 RBIs, a .360 on-base percentage and two steals in 46 games.
- He had 21 walks and six hit-by-pitches against only 22 strikeouts in 160 at-bats.
- He hit .372 with runners in scoring position and .340 with two outs along with 16 two-out RBIs among his 26 total RBIs.
- He had a solid .970 fielding percentage, committing only five errors in 164 chances.
- He hit .282 with two homers, six doubles, 17 RBIs and a .390 on-base percentage in 25 ACC regular-season games.
- He had never played in the infield prior to Clemson, but played second base while Tyler Krieger was injured.

ROHLMAN FIT IN AS FRESHMAN

- Freshman outfielder Reed Rohlman burst onto the scene and took over the starting spot in left field early in the season.
- He hit a team-high .356 with a team-high 17 doubles, three homers, a team-high 58 RBIs and 43 runs in 61 games (59 starts).
- He became the first freshman to lead Clemson in batting average since Brad Chalk, who hit .350 as a freshman in 2005.
- He became the first freshman to lead Clemson in RBIs since Jeff Baker, who had a team-tying-high 64 RBIs in 2000.
- He hit a team-high .404 with runners in scoring position.
- He reached base safely in 29 consecutive games from March to April.
- During his 13-game hitting streak in April, he was 20-for-47 (.426) with four doubles, 11 RBIs, 16 runs and nine walks.
- He led the team in multiple-hit games (26) and multiple-RBI games (17).

- He tossed 3.0 innings to record the save at No. 8 Florida State on May 15. He allowed one hit, no runs and one walk with five strikeouts.

WHITE ADDED AVERAGE

- Sophomore infielder Eli White was the starting shortstop all year thanks in part to his strong arm, but he was also solid at the plate.
- He was one of 47 players named to the Brooks Wallace Shortstop-of-the-Year Award Watch List on April 23.
- He hit .297 with seven doubles, three triples, four homers, 29 RBIs, 44 runs and 11 steals in starting all 61 games at shortstop.
- He hit .356 with runners on base and .351 with runners in scoring position.
- He hit his first career home run, a three-run homer, in Clemson's 6-2 victory over Wake Forest on March 29.
- He went 3-for-4 with two homers, a triple, four RBIs, four runs, a walk and hit-by-pitch in Clemson's 11-3 win at Georgia Tech on April 25.

WILSON SHOWED POWER

- Sophomore infielder Weston Wilson showed his power in 2015 with five homers, one triple, nine doubles and 26 RBIs in 57 games (50 starts).
- He hit .251 with seven steals as the predominant starter at third base.
- He was 23-for-69 (.333) with six doubles, one homer, 11 RBIs and 12 runs in the last 18 games.
- Against No. 10 South Carolina on February 27, he hit two homers with four RBIs in Clemson's 11-4 win.
- He earned ACC Player-of-the-Week honors on March 2 for his three homers and seven RBIs in three games from February 25-28.

SEASON REVIEW STORY

The 2015 season had its ups and downs, including a series win over a top-10 South Carolina team early in the season and a series sweep at No. 8 Florida State to end the regular season. But despite making its 28th NCAA Tournament appearance in 29 seasons and 40th overall, the Tigers finished with just 32 wins and parted ways with head coach Jack Leggett after going 0-2 in the Fullerton (Calif.) Regional.

Clemson's struggles were partly attributed to its inability to win close games, mainly due to its lack of bullpen depth caused by various injuries. Nevertheless, the Tigers battled their way to a fifth-place finish, including only 0.5 games out of a tie for third place, in the overall ACC standings after amassing a 16-13 ACC record and 32-29 overall mark.

The Tigers played their best baseball against the best competition, with their 8-5 record against top-25 teams and 7-4 record against top-10 teams, including a 4-0 mark on opponents' home fields.

Three Tigers earned All-America honors, Matthew Crownover, Chris Okey and Reed Rohlman. It was the first time since 2006 that Clemson had three All-Americans on one team. Crownover and Okey were first-team All-Americans, while Rohlman, who became just the second Tiger freshman to be named an All-American, was a third-team outfielder. Crownover was the first Tiger pitcher to earn first-team All-America honors since 1996, while Okey was the first Clemson catcher to earn first-team All-America accolades since 1997.

For the second year in a row, five of the nine position players earned All-ACC honors. Crownover made it six All-ACC Tigers as a first-team starting pitcher and Okey joined Crownover on the first team. Tyler Krieger and Rohlman were on the second team, while Steven Duggar and Eli White were third-team selections.

The Tigers hit .288 with a .376 on-base percentage and averaged 6.3 runs per game. Rohlman led the team in batting average (.356) and RBIs (58), becoming the first freshman to lead Clemson in those categories since 2005 and 2000, respectively.

Krieger batted .339 with a team-high .448 on-base percentage. Okey, who was third with a .315 batting average along with a team-high 12 homers and 57 RBIs, was the catcher for 534 of the team's 549 innings on defense. In May, he was named to the USA Collegiate National Team for the second year in a row.

The pitching staff had a 4.05 ERA and .252 opponents' batting average. It was headlined by Crownover, the ACC Pitcher-of-the-Year. The lefthander was Clemson's Friday starter all season and registered a 10-3 record with a 1.82 ERA (best by a Tiger since 1998) and .183 opponents' batting average in 109.0 innings pitched over 16 starts. He also totaled 108 strikeouts, most by a Tiger since 1996, and was the only ACC player to total 10 wins.

Zack Erwin, Clemson's No. 2 starter all year, was 7-4 with a 3.04 ERA and 92 strikeouts against only 16 walks in 106.2 innings pitched. His 5.75 strikeout-to-walk ratio was second best in school history.

The season began with West Virginia winning two of three games at Clemson, but the Tigers responded with a five-game winning streak, including a three-game sweep against Maine at Augusta, Ga. Krieger's walkoff single in the 14th inning in the second game of the series gave Clemson a 5-4 win.

The following weekend, the Tigers faced rival South Carolina in a three-game series at three different sites. Weston Wilson hit two homers in Clemson's 11-4 win in the opener at Doug Kingsmore Stadium, then the Gamecocks responded with a 4-1 win at Fluor Field in Greenville, S.C.

Two days later, Brody Koerner pitched a four-hit shutout in the Tigers' 7-0 victory in Columbia to give

Clemson its first series win over the Gamecocks since 2010. Koerner, who won the Bob Bradley Award as Clemson's MVP of the series, was the biggest reason South Carolina did not score a run in a home game for the first time since 1998. He also became the first Tiger to pitch a shutout in Columbia since 1968.

The Tigers opened ACC play during the first full weekend of March at NC State and fell twice in three games. Crownover allowed just one run on two hits in 7.0 innings pitched in the opener to lead Clemson to a 6-4 win.

Notre Dame came to town and won two of three games the next weekend despite another strong outing by Crownover in Clemson's series-opening victory.

Clemson got back on track at Virginia Tech by winning two of three games. In the opener, Okey broke a scoreless tie in the 10th inning with a grand slam in the Tigers' 4-0 victory. Four days later, Clemson exploded for 19 runs in its 19-2 win at Western Carolina.

After Wake Forest won two of three games at Clemson, Chase Pinder's walkoff hit-by-pitch lifted the Tigers to a 5-4 win against Furman. But around Clemson's series win at home over North Carolina, the Tigers suffered a string of five of their losses by one run.

A series at Boston College got the Tigers back on track. Clemson won two of three games, highlighted by Okey's big series. The sophomore was 8-for-14 with three homers, a double and seven RBIs in the series and earned ACC Player-of-the-Week honors.

The series finale in Chestnut Hill started Clemson's five-game winning streak, capped by a rain-shortened, two-game sweep of Duke at Doug Kingsmore Stadium.

The Tigers suffered six losses in their next eight games, including two narrow losses at Georgia Tech. Crownover led the Tigers to a 9-1 win over No. 3 Louisville at home in the first meeting between the two since 1972. But the Cardinals responded with wins in the final two games of the series.

After Clemson downed No. 18 College of Charleston at home by a score of 6-3, the Tigers closed out their home schedule by winning two of three games against Georgia Southern.

The roller-coaster regular season concluded with four memorable games, starting with a 23-15 victory over Furman at Fluor Field. Clemson trailed 10-0 after two innings before mounting a furious comeback. Tiger batters totaled 22 hits, 15 walks and two hit-by-pitches. It was the most runs scored by the Tigers since 2006.

The bats stayed hot as the Tigers faced the Seminoles in Tallahassee. Clemson swept the three-game series by a combined score of 20-7, as five of Florida State's seven runs came in the final inning of the series with the Tigers leading by eight runs. It was the Tigers' first sweep in Tallahassee and Clemson handed the Seminoles their first three-game sweep at Dick Howser Stadium since 2006.

In first game at Florida State, Crownover yielded only one run on five hits in 7.0 innings pitched to earn the win in Clemson's 4-1 victory. Erwin tossed 6.0 strong innings and Taylor Vetzal recorded the save to combine for a four-hit shutout in a 7-0 win in game two. Rohlman totaled a school-record-tying three doubles and four RBIs in Clemson's 9-6 win in the series finale.

Clemson was the No. 5 seed in the ACC Tournament at Durham, N.C. No. 8 Florida State downed the Tigers 3-1 in the Tigers' opener, then Erwin allowed just six hits, one run and no walks with 11 strikeouts in 8.0 innings pitched to earn the win in Clemson's 7-2 victory over No. 3 Louisville. North Carolina topped the Tigers 6-3 in Clemson's final ACC Tournament game.

The Tigers were the last at-large selection to the NCAA Tournament field and were sent to the Fullerton Regional, as the Tigers played their first games in the

state of California since 1993. No. 18 Arizona State rallied for a 7-4 win in the opener. Then against Pepperdine, Clemson trailed 7-0 before storming back to take an 8-7 lead with six runs in the seventh inning. But the Waves scored two runs in the ninth inning to end Clemson's season with a 10-8 win. Duggar and White both earned all-tournament honors.

Seven Tigers were selected in the major league draft after the season. Erwin and Krieger were fourth-round picks, while Duggar and Crownover were sixth-round selections. Koerner (17th round), righthander Clate Schmidt (32nd round) and White (37th round) were also chosen on the final day of the draft. Clemson's seven draft picks tied for 16th most in the nation and tied for most in the ACC.
