CLEMSON'S NCAA TOURNEY HISTORY

- Clemson played in its 41st all-time NCAA regional when it competed in the 2016 Clemson Regional.
- The 41 appearances are fifth-most in NCAA history, trailing only Texas (57), Florida State (54), Miami (Fla.) (45) and Oklahoma State (42).
- Clemson has been to the NCAA Tournament every year since 1987 except one (2008), or 29 of the last 30 years.
- Clemson is one of only nine schools in the country to play in the NCAA Tournament each of the last eight seasons.
- The others are Cal State Fullerton, Florida, Florida State, Miami (Fla.), Rice, Texas A&M, Vanderbilt and Virginia.
- Clemson has made nine super regional appearances, with its last in 2010.
- The Tigers have made 12 trips to the College World Series, with its last in 2010.
- Clemson has a 115-89 record (.564) in NCAA Tournament games.

NCAA TOURNAMENT RECAP

- Clemson had a 2-2 record in the Clemson Regional, defeating Western Carolina twice (24-10, 15-3) and falling twice to No. 18 Oklahoma State.
- It marked the first since 2011 Clemson hosted a regional. It was also the Tigers' first national seed (No. 7) since 2006 and fourth overall.
- Clemson tied the Tiger NCAA Tourney record with 24 runs versus Western Carolina on June 3 and set the record with seven homers in that game.
- Clemson hit .312 with 43 runs, four doubles, 12 homers, a .596 slugging percentage, .448 on-base percentage and two steals in four games.
- Seth Beer (OF), Chris Okey (C) and Chris Williams (3B) were named to the Clemson Regional All-Tournament team.
- Beer was 4-for-12 (.333) with two homers, one double, seven RBIs, six runs, five walks, two hit-by-pitches and a .579 on-base percentage.
- Okey was 6-for-12 (.500) with three homers, eight RBIs, a 1.250 slugging percentage, seven runs, seven walks and a .684 on-base percentage.
- Williams was 6-for-15 (.400) with one homer, six RBIs, four runs, three walks and a .474 on-base percentage.

TIGERS WIN ACC TOURNAMENT TITLE

- Clemson won the ACC Tournament title with a 4-0 record, wins over No. 8 Virginia, No. 3 Louisville, Wake Forest and No. 11 Florida State.
- It was Clemson's first ACC Tournament title since 2006 and 10th overall, most among ACC teams.
- It was the first time Clemson went undefeated in the ACC Tournament since 1991.
- All four games had start times of 11 a.m. There were three rain delays that lasted a combined four hours and 48 minutes in the title game.
- Clemson hit .256 with 33 runs, 14 doubles, one triple, seven homers, a .534 slugging percentage, 26 walks and a .395 on-base percentage.

- The pitching staff had a 5.76 ERA, .259 opponents' batting average and 29 strikeouts against 14 walks in 36.0 innings pitched.
- Mike Triller was named ACC Tournament MVP by going 6-for-13 (.462) with five runs, three doubles, two homers and four RBIs in three games.
- Reed Rohlfman earned All-ACC Tournament honors by totaling two homers, one double, four RBIs and four walks in four games.
- Eli White tied a Tiger ACC Tournament record with four doubles, while he went 7-for-17 (.412) in four games.
- Pat Krall earned All-ACC Tournament honors by going 2-0 with one save in four relief appearances. He pitched 5.2 innings, allowing one run.
- Clate Schmidt earned earned All-ACC Tournament honors by tossing 8.2 innings against Louisville, allowing two earned runs to record the win.

QUICK HITS

- Clemson's 44 wins were its most since 2010, when it totaled 45 victories.
- Clemson won each of its last eight games away from home in 2016, including all four games in the ACC Tournament.
- Clemson has scored at least one run in 84 consecutive games dating to its 7-0 loss at Georgia on April 21, 2015.

ATTENDANCE

- Clemson averaged 4,664 fans per home date (35) in 2016, the ninth-highest figure in the nation and first in the ACC.
- Clemson set a Doug Kingsmore Stadium record with a crowd of 6,524 that saw the Tigers' 4-1 win over No. 18 South Carolina on March 6, 2016.
- Clemson has a top-20 national figure in average attendance 23 straight seasons and a top-10 figure 15 years in a row.

NCAA STAT FINISHES

- Clemson finished in the top 25 in the nation in seven stat categories, while five Tigers combined to finish in the top 25 in 16 categories.
- Clemson was second in the nation in walks (359) and tied for seventh in home runs (75).
- Seth Beer finished in the top 25 in eight stat categories, including third in walks (62) and fourth in on-base percentage (.535).
- Chris Okey finished in the top 25 in three stat categories, including third in RBIs (74).

POLLS

- Clemson was ranked No. 15 in the final USA Today coaches poll, No. 17 by Baseball America and No. 18 by Collegiate Baseball.
- It was the Tigers' first top-25 final ranking since their No. 25 final ranking by USA Today in 2013.
- It was Clemson's first top-15 final ranking since 2010, when it finished ranked as high as No. 4.
- It was Clemson's 33rd top-25 final ranking in history.

ACC STANDINGS

- Clemson (16-14) finished fourth in the ACC Atlantic Division standings behind Louisville (22-8), Florida State (16-10) and NC State (15-13).
- Clemson finished sixth in the overall ACC standings.

WINNING SEASONS THE NORM

- The Tigers have had a winning record every year since 1965.
- With its 44-20 record in 2016, Clemson had a winning record for the 52nd season in a row.
- Clemson's 52-year streak is the third-longest active streak in the nation, trailing two ACC schools (Florida State 69, Miami (Fla.) 59).
- Clemson has had a non-losing record, which includes seasons with equal number of wins and losses, every season since 1958.
- Bill Wilhelm took over as head coach of the Clemson program in 1958, therefore the Tigers have not had a losing record since he took over.
- Clemson's 59-year streak of non-losing records is tied for the second-longest active streak in the nation, trailing only Florida State (69).

HOT ENDING

- Clemson won 11 of its last 13 games of the season, including a 4-0 record in winning the ACC Tournament.
- It marked the first time since 1991 that Clemson won 11 of its last 13 games of the season.
- Clemson's nine-game winning streak entering the NCAA Tournament tied for the longest such streak in school history.
- Clemson also had a nine-game winning streak entering the 1991 NCAA Tournament.
- It was the sixth time Clemson entered the NCAA Tournament on a winning streak of five games or more.
- The Tigers won their first game of the Clemson Regional, extending their winning streak to 10 games.
- The 10-game winning streak was Clemson's longest winning streak overall since it won 11 straight games in April 2013.

- That is how many of Clemson's 64 games were against teams that played in the NCAA Tournament, which equates to 58 percent.
- Clemson had a 21-16 record (.568) in the 37 games against NCAA Tournament teams.
- Clemson was 9-9 against No. 1 regional seeds.
- The Tigers played 12 different teams that were in the NCAA Tournament.

NOTES

- Clemson had the nation's No. 10 strength of schedule according to WarrenNolan.com.

NEVER OUT OF IT

- Clemson had a knack for coming from behind to win games in 2016.
- Of their 44 wins, the Tigers trailed at some point in 24 of the 44 games.
- A total of 19 of Clemson's last 30 wins were come-from-behind victories.
- When leading entering the seventh inning, Clemson was 32-1, while Clemson was 9-17 when trailing entering the seventh inning.
- When leading entering the eighth inning, Clemson was 33-1, while Clemson was 5-18 when trailing entering the eighth inning.
- When leading entering the ninth inning, Clemson was 32-1, while Clemson was 4-17 when trailing entering the ninth inning.
- Those numbers were up from 2015, when Clemson was 1-15, 0-19 and 0-23 when trailing entering the seventh, eighth and ninth, respectively.
- Of the 38 homers allowed by the Tigers in 2016, only three scored more than two runs, a reason Clemson was able to stay in games.
- Clemson had six walkoff hits (Winthrop 3/9, Boston College 3/20, Western Carolina 4/12, Georgia Tech 4/22, Furman 5/4, NC State 5/8).

ONE-RUN SUCCESS

- Clemson had a 14-6 record in one-run games, breaking the previous school record of 13 one-run wins in 1994 (13-5 record).
- Clemson played 20 games decided by one run, but only six games (3-3) decided by two runs and one game (1-0) decided by three runs.
- From 2010 to 2015, Clemson had just one winning record in one-run games (9-4 in 2013).
- Clemson was 5-1 in extra-inning games in 2016.

MIDWEEK KEY TO WIN TOTAL

- Clemson had a 13-1 record in non-conference midweek games, a big reason the Tigers had 44 wins in the 2016 season.
- It marked the first time since 1977 that the Tigers started the season with a 12-0 record in midweek contests.
- Clemson was 8-1 in midweek home games and 5-0 in midweek road games.
- Clemson's 22-4 record in non-conference games was its best mark since 2011, when it also went 22-4 in non-conference games.
- Clemson had a 16-1 combined record in games on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday.

BACK-TO-BACK TOP-10 SERIES WINS

- Clemson won back-to-back series against No. 3/4 Florida State and No. 9 NC State in May, meaning Clemson won two top-10 series in a row.
- It was the first time since 1994 and just the second time since the ACC went to a three-game series format in 1990 that Clemson did that.
- In 1994, Clemson won two of three games against No. 3 Miami (Fla.) and two of three games against No. 2 Florida State.

START IT UP

- Clemson was successful putting its leadoff batter on base, as that batter hit .276 with a .406 on-base percentage.
- Clemson put at least two leadoff batters on base in 61 of 64 games and at least three leadoff batters on base in 54 of the 64 games.

- Tiger leadoff batters had 79 walks and 22 hit-by-pitches against only 94 strikeouts.
- Seth Beer was 16-for-32 (.500) with 11 walks, two hit-by-pitches and a .644 on-base percentage when leading off an inning.
- Jordan Greene was 8-for-18 (.444) with nine walks against three strikeouts and had a .630 on-base percentage when leading off an inning.

POWER NUMBERS UP

- Clemson hit an ACC-high 75 home runs, its most since hitting 93 in 2010.
- The Tigers hit 35 in 2015, 28 in 2014, 22 in 2013, 44 in 2012 and 48 in 2011, the first year with the new bat standards.
- Clemson's .434 slugging percentage was its best mark since 2011, when it had a .460 slugging percentage.
- Seth Beer led the team with 18 homers, followed by Chris Okey (15), Chase Pinder (11), Chris Williams (8) and Weston Wilson (7).

BULLPEN SOLID

- Clemson's bullpen was solid, as it had a 4.00 ERA and .252 opponents' batting average in 256.1 innings pitched in 62 games.
- The bullpen (15 Tigers) also had a 20-5 record and gave up just 246 hits and 112 walks with 206 strikeouts.
- Pat Krall pitched 59.2 innings, allowing 38 hits, five earned runs (0.75 ERA) and 12 walks with 48 strikeouts over 26 relief outings.
- Alex Eubanks allowed 21 hits, six earned runs (2.13 ERA) and eight walks with 21 strikeouts in 25.1 innings pitched over 12 outings.
- Patrick Andrews gave up 21 hits and six earned runs (2.31 ERA) with 23 strikeouts in 23.1 innings pitched over 19 relief appearances.
- Brooks Crawford allowed 37 hits and 12 earned runs (2.70 ERA) in 40.0 innings pitched (24 relief outings).

THREE FIRST-TEAM ALL-AMERICANS

- Freshman outfielder Seth Beer, junior lefthander Pat Krall and junior catcher Chris Okey were named first-team All-Americans.
- It marked the first time Clemson had three first-team All-Americans in one season.
- Beer was a first-team pick by ABCA, Baseball America, College Sports Madness, D1Baseball, NCBWA and Perfect Game.
- Beer became the first Tiger freshman to be named a first-team All-American.
- Beer became just the third Tiger freshman, joining Taylor Harbin (2005) and Reed Rohlfman (2015), to be named an All-American.
- Okey was a first-team selection by NCBWA.
- Okey, who was a first-team All-American in 2015, became the Tigers' first two-time, first-team All-American since Jeff Baker (2001,02).
- Krall was a first-team All-American by Perfect Game.
- Krall became the first Tiger reliever to earn first-team All-America honors since 1995 (Scott Winchester).

THREE TIGERS ON ALL-ACC TEAM

- Seth Beer (OF) and Chris Okey (C) earned First-Team All-ACC honors, while Pat Krall (RP) received Second-Team All-ACC honors.
- Beer was the first Tiger freshman to earn First-Team All-ACC accolades since Kyle Parker (2008). Beer also earned All-ACC Freshman honors.

- Utility player Jackson Campana and outfielder Maleeke Gibson graduated with degrees in management.
- Utility player Andrew Cox and righties Garrett Lovorn and Clate Schmidt graduated with degrees in parks, recreation & tourism management.

ANDREWS BEST RELIEVER LATE

- Graduate righthander Patrick Andrews was Clemson's best reliever late in the season.
- In his last 10 appearances (14.1 innings pitched), he allowed nine hits (.191 opponents' batting average) and no runs with nine strikeouts.
- He had a 1-0 record, 2.31 ERA, .250 opponents' batting average and 23 strikeouts in 23.1 innings pitched over 19 relief appearances.
- He allowed just eight walks and four extra-base hits (three doubles, one triple).
- He held opponents to 5-for-28 (.179) with two outs.
- In his career, he has a 4-4 record, two saves, a 3.78 ERA and 77 strikeouts in 95.1 innings pitched over 68 appearances (one start).

BARNES QUIETLY EFFECTIVE

- Sophomore lefthander Charlie Barnes did not overpower hitters, but he had a knack of recording strikeouts.
- He was 6-4 with a 4.66 ERA, .256 opponents' batting average and 84 strikeouts against only 24 walks (3.50 strikeout-to-walk ratio).
- He held opponents to a .209 batting average with two outs.
- He was the only Tiger pitcher to start every game he appeared in and made a team-high 16 starts on the mound in 2016.
- He gave up just six hits, one run and no walks with seven strikeouts at Notre Dame on May 19.

- In his career, he is 7-6 with a 4.40 ERA, .258 opponents' batting average and 107 strikeouts against 32 walks in 118.2 innings pitched.
- He is eighth in Clemson history in career strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.34).

BEER MADE A NAME FOR HIMSELF

- Freshman Seth Beer graduated high school a semester early and starred for Clemson in what should have been his senior year of high school.
- He made 48 starts in right field and 14 starts as the designated hitter. Clemson was 13-1 when he started as the DH.
- He hit .369 with 18 homers, 13 doubles, 70 RBIs, 57 runs, a .535 on-base percentage and one steal in 62 games.
- He was first in the ACC in homers and second in RBIs, slugging percentage (.700), on-base percentage and walks (62).
- He led the team in batting average, homers, slugging percentage, walks, hit-by-pitches (15) and on-base percentage.
- He had 77 combined walks and hit-by-pitches against only 27 strikeouts. Only six of the strikeouts were looking.
- His .700 slugging percentage was the best mark by a Tiger since 2002, when Khalil Greene had an .877 slugging percentage.
- He reached via a hit or walk in each of the last 60 games he had a plate appearance. The only game he did not was his first game.
- He reached base 29 times in 45 plate appearances when leading off an inning.
- In his 30 ACC regular-season games, he hit .365 with nine homers, 33 RBIs, a .712 slugging percentage and .511 on-base percentage.
- He had a team-high six outfield assists.
- He hit his first career home run, a grand slam, against Maine on February 21.
- He hit four homers in Clemson's series win at Wake Forest from March 11-13, becoming the first Tiger since 2006 with four in a series.
- He was one of seven national players-of-the-week by Collegiate Baseball on March 14 after totaling four homers and 10 RBIs in four games.
- He hit a walkoff homer in the 10th to complete Clemson's sweep of No. 22 Boston College on March 20.
- He was named ACC Co-Player-of-the-Week on March 21 after going 10-for-17 (.588) with four doubles, two homers and five RBIs in five games.
- He was named NCBWA National Hitter-of-the-Month for March after batting .431 with nine homers, six doubles and 21 RBIs in 17 games.
- He was named midseason national player-of-the-year and midseason national freshman-of-the-year by D1Baseball and Perfect Game.
- He hit a walkoff single on an 0-2 pitch with two outs in the 11th in the 7-6 win over Furman on May 4.
- He was invited to the USA Collegiate National Team for the summer.

BEER NATION'S TOP PLAYER & FRESHMAN

- Seth Beer did what no other freshman has ever done. He won the Dick Howser Trophy as national player-of-the-year.
- He became Clemson's third national player-of-the-year, joining righthander Kris Benson (1996) and shortstop Khalil Greene (2002).
- Both Benson and Greene won the Dick Howser Trophy, giving Clemson three winners of that award, tied for most in the nation with Texas.
- He was named one of four finalists for the Golden Spikes Award in June.

NOTES

- He was named national freshman-of-the-year by Baseball America and D1Baseball, Clemson's first freshman in history to earn a national award.
- He was named national co-freshman-of-the-year by Collegiate Baseball and national freshman hitter-of-the-year by NCBWA.

BEER ACC'S TOP PLAYER & FRESHMAN

- Seth Beer was named ACC Player-of-the-Year in a vote by the league head coaches. He was also named ACC Freshman-of-the-Year.
- He became the first freshman to be named ACC Player-of-the-Year, an award that was established in 1969.
- He became the 13th Tiger to earn ACC Player-of-the-Year honors and the first since Brad Miller in 2011.
- He became the third Tiger to earn ACC Freshman-of-the-Year honors and the first since outfielder Patrick Boyd in 1998.

BEER HAD A 26-GAME HITTING STREAK

- Seth Beer had a 26-game hitting streak, tied for fourth longest in Tiger history, from February 20 to April 8.
- During the 26-game hitting streak, he hit .452 with eight doubles, 13 homers, 37 RBIs, 29 runs and a .957 slugging percentage.
- He became the first Tiger freshman with a hitting streak of 20+ games. He also became the 20th Tiger with a hitting streak of 20+ games.
- The streak actually spanned 27 games. Against South Carolina on March 6, he was injured and left the game before his first plate appearance.

BOSTIC CONTRIBUTED AS A JUNIOR

- Junior lefthander Alex Bostic stepped up as a junior to have his best season as a Tiger in 2016.
- He was 4-2 with two saves, a 5.13 ERA, .210 opponents' batting average and 44 strikeouts in 33.1 innings pitched over 26 outings.
- He was tied for second on the team in appearances, one of which was a start.
- In his 25 relief outings, he had a 4.83 ERA, .210 opponents' batting average and 41 strikeouts in 31.2 innings pitched.
- In his 15 appearances at home, he pitched 17.2 innings, allowing just 13 hits (.200 opponents' batting average) with 22 strikeouts.
- He earned the win in the ACC Championship Game against Florida State by tossing 4.0 scoreless innings of one-hit ball with eight strikeouts.

- In his career, he had two saves, a .253 opponents' batting average and 58 strikeouts in 49.2 innings pitched over 49 outings (two starts).

BRYANT A RIGHT CHOICE

- Freshman K.J. Bryant came on in the second half of the season to provide a spark in right field.
- Clemson was 14-1 when he started in right and 1-0 when he started in left, meaning the Tigers were 15-1 when he started in the outfield.
- He hit .257 with two homers, one double, eight RBIs, 18 runs and one steal in 45 games (23 starts).
- In ACC regular-season games, he hit .286 with five runs in 17 games (nine starts).

CRAWFORD EFFECTIVE OUT OF THE PEN

- Freshman righthander Brooks Crawford came to Clemson as both a pitcher and hitter, but he made a home on the mound in 2016.
- In 46.2 innings pitched over 26 appearances (two starts), he was 3-0 with one save, a 3.66 ERA and .254 opponents' batting average.
- In 40.0 innings pitched out of the bullpen, he was 3-0 with a 2.70 ERA, .243 opponents' batting average and 23 strikeouts.
- He only allowed eight of 26 inherited baserunners to score.
- He allowed just three earned runs (1.29 ERA) in 21.0 innings pitched after the sixth inning.

EUBANKS STARTED OFF RIGHT

- Freshman righthander Alex Eubanks redshirted in the 2015 season after suffering an injury in the fall, but was effective in 2016.
- On the season, he was 6-5 with a 4.09 ERA, .283 opponents' batting average and 70 strikeouts against 21 walks in 81.1 innings pitched.
- He had three saves, second most on the team.
- In 25.1 innings pitched in relief, he was 3-2 with a 2.13 ERA, .223 opponents' batting average and 21 strikeouts versus eight walks.
- In his first career start against No. 18 South Carolina on March 6, he allowed six hits and one run with eight strikeouts to earn the win.
- He earned ACC Pitcher-of-the-Week honors for his performance against the Gamecocks in Clemson's 4-1 victory.
- In 6.2 innings pitched against No. 22 Boston College on March 20, he allowed just two runs and no walks with 10 strikeouts.
- He pitched 7.0 innings in a start, allowing seven hits, no runs and one walk with nine strikeouts to earn the win at Notre Dame on May 21.
- He pitched a complete game to earn the win against Western Carolina in the Clemson Regional on June 5.

KRALL KEPT TIGERS CLOSE

- Junior lefthander Pat Krall has been a long reliever in his two years (2015,16) as a Tiger and has kept Clemson in many games.
- He was named one of 43 semifinalists for the Gregg Olson Award in May.
- He was named to the National Pitcher-of-the-Year Watch List in April.
- In 80.2 innings pitched over 29 outings (three starts) in 2016, he was 10-2 with five saves, a 1.67 ERA and .203 opponents' batting average.
- He became the first Tiger in history to lead the team outright in wins and saves in a season.
- He allowed just 58 hits and 17 walks with 65 strikeouts.
- He was the only predominant relief pitcher to total 10 wins in 2016.

- He allowed only seven of 30 inherited baserunners to score.
- In 59.2 innings pitched in his 26 relief appearances, he was 9-1 with an 0.75 ERA and a .184 opponents' batting average.
- In 41.0 innings pitched at home, he was 5-1, allowing 23 hits, five earned runs (1.10 ERA) and nine walks with 38 strikeouts.
- He pitched 15.2 innings before allowing his first run in 2016 and then pitched the next 22.0 innings without allowing a run.

SEASON REVIEW STORY

When Monte Lee was hired as head coach in June 2015, pundits did not expect much from the 2016 Tigers. The 2015 team lost many of its leaders in the field and ACC Pitcher-of-the-Year Matthew Crowover along with the other two weekend starting pitchers. But under Lee's direction, the Tigers exceeded expectations.

Clemson roared to a 17-3 record, including a 5-1 start in ACC games, thanks to stellar pitching and timely hitting. After slumping during the middle of the season and falling to 10-13 in ACC games, the Tigers rebounded with one of their best finishes in recent history, as they won 11 of their last 13 games of the season for the first time since 1991 and were ranked No. 15 in the final USA Today coaches poll. During that stretch, the Tigers also had a 10-game winning streak. Clemson won each of its last eight games away from home as well.

With its late run, Clemson won six of its last seven league games, captured its first ACC championship in 10 years and earned a top-eight national seed in the NCAA Tournament.

The Tigers accomplished these feats while playing one of the toughest schedules in the country. A total of 37 of their 64 games (58 percent) were against teams that played in the NCAA Tournament, and Clemson had a 21-16 record in those 37 games.

A big reason for the team's success was its ability to come from behind. Of the Tigers' 44 wins, their most since 2010, 24 were come-from-behind victories. Clemson won nine games when trailing entering the seventh inning, while it lost just one game all year when leading entering the seventh inning. The Tigers also won four games when trailing entering the ninth inning.

Another major key was Clemson's school-record 14 one-run wins against only six one-run losses and 5-1 record in extra-inning games. The Tigers also had a 13-1 record in non-conference midweek games and a 22-4 record in all non-conference games, their best mark since 2011.

The Tigers batted .273 but had a solid .388 on-base percentage thanks to 359 walks, second most in the nation, and 72 hit-by-pitches. Clemson slugged an ACC-high 75 home runs, which tied for seventh most in the nation and more than doubled its previous year's total, and scored 7.2 runs per game.

Leading the way at the plate were two of Clemson's three first-team All-Americans in 2016. Seth Beer and Chris Okey were both named first-team All-Americans by NCBWA. Beer became the first Tiger freshman in history to be a first-team All-American. Lefthander Pat Krall was a first-team All-American by Perfect Game and the ACC Scholar-Athlete-of-the-Year. It marked the first time Clemson had three first-team All-Americans in one season.

Beer received the Dick Howser Trophy as national player-of-the-year, Clemson's third player (Kris Benson, Khalil Greene) to win the award. Beer, who was the first freshman to win the Dick Howser Trophy, was named ACC Player-of-the-Year, also the first freshman to win that honor.

Beer, who graduated high school a semester early to enroll at Clemson in January, hit .369 with an ACC-high 18 homers (most by a Tiger freshman in history and most by any Tiger since 2010), 13 doubles, 70 RBIs and a .535 on-base percentage. He led the team in batting average, homers, slugging percentage (.700), walks (62), hit-by-pitches (15) and on-base percentage, while his slugging percentage was the best mark by a Tiger since Khalil Greene slugged .877 in 2002. Beer, who was third in the nation in walks and fourth in on-base percentage, reached base via a hit or walk in each of the last 60 games he had a plate appearance

and had a 26-game hitting streak, the longest by a Tiger freshman in history.

Okey was one of the hottest Tigers late in the year and ended with a .339 batting average, 16 doubles, two triples, 15 homers, an ACC-high 74 RBIs (third most in the nation), a .611 slugging percentage, 51 walks and a .465 on-base percentage. He started all 64 games at catcher and was the catcher for 549.1 of the Tigers' 575.0 innings pitched (96 percent) in 2016.

Chase Pinder added 11 home runs and a .412 on-base percentage as the leadoff batter, while Eli White ended the season on a tear while totaling a team-high 24 steals.

The pitching staff had a 4.43 ERA and .268 opponents' batting average, led by Krall. The lefty became the first Tiger in history to lead the team outright in wins (10) and saves (5) in a season. He was 10-2 with an ACC-best 1.67 ERA, .203 opponents' batting average and 65 strikeouts against 17 walks in 80.2 innings pitched over 29 appearances (three starts). He was also seventh in the nation in ERA.

Lee's first game as Tiger head coach saw the Tigers come up short, as Maine edged the Tigers 4-3 at Doug Kingsmore Stadium. But Clemson answered back to win the series, then it swept James Madison the following weekend at home.

After blanking Wofford, Clemson defeated No. 18 South Carolina twice in three games. The Tigers allowed just one combined run in the final two games, as Clate Schmidt, who recovered from nodular sclerosing Hodgkin's lymphoma after being diagnosed in the summer of 2015, and Alex Eubanks made stellar starts on the mound. Pinder won the Bob Bradley Award as Clemson's MVP of the series.

Clemson edged Winthrop at home, the first of six walkoff wins in 2016, before winning two of three games at Wake Forest to begin ACC play. Trailing 8-6 in the seventh inning in game three, Okey blasted a grand slam to propel the Tigers to victory. Beer erupted for four homers in the series, becoming the first Tiger since 2006 with four long balls in a series.

The Tigers stayed on the road to win two games at The Citadel before sweeping No. 22 Boston College at home. Beer's walkoff homer in the 10th inning of game three completed the sweep.

After a midweek win over Presbyterian College, which upped Clemson's record to 17-3, No. 4 Miami (Fla.) stopped the Tigers' momentum by handing them a three-game sweep in Coral Gables. The first two setbacks were walkoff losses. Clemson hit eight homers in the series, but only scored 10 runs on those long balls. Okey was 9-for-14 with two homers, while Pinder was 7-for-14 with three homers in the series.

Without Beer, Clemson defeated Furman and Western Carolina in road midweek games, then the Tigers won two of three home games against Pittsburgh in early April.

The Tigers rallied for an 11-6 win at Georgia thanks in large part to Beer's long home run that tied the score in the eighth inning, then they fell twice in three games at Duke in low-scoring contents at Jack Coombs Field.

Another comeback win came in the form of a 7-6 victory in 10 innings over Western Carolina, but No. 6 Louisville stymied the Tigers all weekend with a three-game sweep in Kentucky.

Clemson began a 13-game homestand with a 12-0 win over Georgia, then Georgia Tech won two of three games over the weekend.

After five days off for final exams, a rejuvenated Tiger team topped a top-five Florida State squad twice in three games. Krall tossed 7.0 scoreless innings of three-hit ball with eight strikeouts in relief to earn the win in the series finale.

Beer's second walkoff hit lifted the Tigers to an 11-inning win over Furman before Clemson downed No. 9 NC State twice in three games. In his first career start, Krall allowed just one run on five hits in a complete-game victory in the Tigers' series-clinching 2-1 win.

Clemson won back-to-back series against No. 3/4 Florida State and No. 9 NC State, meaning Clemson won two top-10 series in a row. It marked the first time since 1994 and just the second time since the ACC went to a three-game series format in 1990 that Clemson accomplished the feat.

The Tigers concluded the homestand by splitting a pair of midweek games against Lee's former team, College of Charleston, before winning two of three games at Georgia Southern and downing Charleston Southern at home.

With its postseason status uncertain, Clemson travelled northward and swept Notre Dame. In the opener, Chris Williams belted a home run in the 11th inning, arguably Clemson's most significant moment of the season, in the Tigers' 2-1 win, then the Tigers won the last two games to finish with a 16-14 conference mark and earn the No. 6 seed in the ACC Tournament at Durham (N.C.) Bulls Athletic Park.

Clemson won close games over No. 8 Virginia (5-4), No. 3 Louisville (5-3) and Wake Forest (5-4) to advance to the ACC title game against No. 11 Florida State. The Tigers jumped out to an 18-1 lead early in a game filled with long rain delays and held on for the win. It was Clemson's first tourney championship since 2006 and 10th overall, most among ACC teams.

Mike Triller, who had only made two starts during the regular season, was named ACC Tournament MVP by going 6-for-13 with three doubles, two homers and four RBIs in three games. Krall, who was 2-0 with one save in finishing all four games, and Schmidt, who pitched 8.2 effective innings against Louisville, joined Triller on the All-ACC Tournament team.

With its strong finish, Clemson was awarded the No. 7 national seed in the NCAA Tournament, marking the first time the Tigers hosted a regional since 2011.

Clemson tied a Tiger NCAA Tournament record with 24 runs and set the tourney record with seven homers in its 24-10 win over Western Carolina in the opener. But the Tigers ran into a red-hot Oklahoma State team, who beat them twice sandwiched around Clemson's 15-3 win over the Catamounts.

The Tigers hit .312 with 43 runs and 12 homers in the four regional games. Okey led the way by going 6-for-12 with three homers, eight RBIs, seven runs, seven walks and a .684 on-base percentage. Beer, Okey and Williams were all named to the Clemson Regional All-Tournament team.

Six Tigers were selected in the major league draft after the season, tied for 15th most in the nation. Okey was a second-round selection on day one, while Alex Bostic was a 10th-round pick on day two. White (10th round), Weston Wilson (17th round), Schmidt (20th round) and Krall (28th round) were drafted on day three.
