CLEMSON'S NCAA TOURNEY HISTORY

- Clemson played in its 42nd all-time NCAA regional when it competed in the 2017 Clemson Regional at Doug Kingsmore Stadium.
- The 42 appearances are fifth most in NCAA history, trailing only Texas (58), Florida State (55), Miami (Fla.) (45) and Oklahoma State (43).
- Clemson has been to the NCAA Tournament every year since 1987 except one (2008), or 30 of the last 31 years.
- Clemson is one of only eight schools in the country to play in the NCAA Tournament each of the last nine seasons.
- The others are Cal State Fullerton, Florida, Florida State, Rice, Texas A&M, Vanderbilt and Virginia.
- Clemson has made nine super regional appearances, with its last in 2010.
- The Tigers have made 12 trips to the College World Series, with its last in 2010.
- Clemson has a 118-91 record (.565) in NCAA Tournament games.

NCAA TOURNAMENT RECAP

- Clemson hosted an NCAA regional for the 15th time in history in 2017.
- The Tigers had a 3-2 record in the Clemson Regional, defeating UNC Greensboro twice (5-4, 6-3) and Vanderbilt (6-0).
- It was Clemson's most wins in an NCAA Tournament since 2010.
- Clemson hit .244 with 21 runs, eight doubles, a triple, four homers, two steals and a .979 fielding percentage in five games.
- Seth Beer (DH/UT), Logan Davidson (SS), Jordan Greene (2B), Tyler Jackson (P) and Kyle Wilkie (C) were named to the All-Tournament team.
- Beer was 5-for-12 (.417) with two homers, five runs, eight walks, two hit-by-pitches and a .682 on-base percentage.

- Davidson was 10-for-23 (.435) with a homer, double, four RBIs and two runs.
- Greene totaled two hits, an RBI, a run, two walks, a steal and did not commit an error in 21 chances at second base.
- Jackson tossed a two-hit shutout against Vanderbilt on June 4. It was the first shutout by a Tiger in an NCAA Tournament game since 2005.
- Wilkie was 5-for-13 (.385) with a double, an RBI, two runs, three walks and a .500 on-base percentage.

- Clemson went 0-2 in the ACC Tournament at Louisville, Ky., on May 23 and May 26.
- Duke rallied to defeat Clemson 6-3 at Louisville Slugger Field on May 23. Chase Pinder, Andrew Cox and Logan Davidson all hit solo homers.
- No. 10 Virginia scored eight runs in the first inning in its 10-2 win over Clemson at Jim Patterson Stadium on May 26.

QUICK HITS

- A total of 14 Tigers started at least 10 games in the batting order in 2017.
- Clemson only allowed 34 steals in 60 attempts. The 43-percent caught stealing rate is the best by the Tigers since in over 20 years.
- Clemson was 33-6 when totaling at least as many hits as its opponent and 9-15 when getting outthit.

ATTENDANCE

- Clemson averaged 4,625 fans per home date (39), 11th-highest figure in the nation and first in the ACC.
- Clemson has had a top-20 national figure in average attendance 24 straight seasons and a top-11 figure 16 years in a row.

POLLS

- Clemson was ranked No. 23 by Baseball America, No. 25 by Collegiate Baseball and No. 22 by USA Today in the final polls.
- Clemson has been ranked in the top 25 by at least one poll for 26 straight weeks dating to 2016.

NCAA STAT FINISHES

- Clemson finished in the top 25 in the nation in nine stat categories, while four Tigers combined to finish in the top 25 in eight.
- Clemson led the nation in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.93) and was second in walks per nine innings pitched (2.26).
- Seth Beer was second in the nation in walks (64).

ACC STANDINGS

- Clemson (17-13) finished third in the ACC Atlantic Division standings behind Louisville (23-6) and Wake Forest (19-11).
- Clemson played the top-two teams in the ACC Coastal Division standings in North Carolina (23-7) and Virginia (18-12) in the regular season.
- The Tigers finished in fifth place in the overall ACC standings.

WINNING SEASONS THE NORM

- The Tigers have had a winning record every year since 1965.
- With its 42-21 record in 2017, Clemson had a winning record for the 53rd season in a row.
- Clemson's 53-year streak is the third-longest active streak in the nation, trailing two ACC schools (Florida State 70, Miami (Fla.) 60).
- Clemson has had a non-losing record, which includes seasons with equal number of wins and losses, every season since 1958.
- Bill Wilhelm took over as head coach of the Clemson program in 1958, therefore the Tigers have not had a losing record since he took over.

- Clemson's 60-year streak of non-losing records is tied for the second-longest active streak in the nation, trailing only Florida State (70).

MIDWEEK MOMENTUM

- A large part of Monte Lee's 67.7 winning percentage as Clemson's head coach in two seasons is due to its midweek success.
- Clemson was 14-0 in midweek games in 2017 after going 13-1 in midweek games in 2016, meaning the Tigers are 27-1 in midweek games under Lee.
- Clemson is 18-1 in home midweek games, 8-0 in road midweek games and 1-0 in neutral-site midweek games under Lee.
- Lee's only midweek loss as head coach of the Tigers came against College of Charleston on May 11, 2016.

ROAD STREAK

- Clemson had a school-record 16 wins in a row away from home that started in 2016 and ended with a loss at Georgia Tech on April 1, 2017.
- The streak included 10 road wins and six neutral-site wins.
- The Tigers won their last eight games away from home in 2016, including a 4-0 record in the ACC Tournament to win the league championship.
- The previous Tiger record for consecutive wins away from home was 12, set between the 1981 and 1982 seasons. Ten of those 12 were road wins.
- Clemson had a 13-10 record in games away from home in 2017, including an 11-8 road record and 2-2 neutral-site record.

EARLY SUCCESS

- Clemson's 42-21 record was due in large part to its success scoring runs early in games in 2017.
- The Tigers outscored the opposition 62-23 in the first inning and 44-17 in the second inning (combined 106-40 in the first two innings).
- Clemson's highest-scoring inning was the first inning by 13 runs (second was the fourth inning (49)).
- Clemson hit .303 with a .474 slugging percentage and .411 on-base percentage in the first inning.
- Jordan Greene was 6-for-13 (.462) with a double, five RBIs and two runs in the first inning.
- Chris Williams was 9-for-22 (.409) with two doubles, two homers, 13 RBIs and five runs in the first inning.
- Seth Beer was 14-for-36 (.389) with four doubles, two homers, 13 RBIs, 14 runs and 19 walks against three strikeouts in the first inning.
- The Tigers were 20-8 when scoring in the first inning and 32-11 when scoring first.
- The Tigers also had 16 come-from-behind wins in 2017.

SHUTOUTS

- Clemson had nine shutout victories in 2017, tied for third most in school history and most since recording 10 shutout wins in 1996.
- The only other years Clemson had as many shutout wins were 1977 (11) and 1996 (10) and 1980 (9).
- The shutout wins this season were against Elon (2), Notre Dame, Boston College (2), Furman, Georgia, Wake Forest and Vanderbilt.

NOTES

- Clemson registered three shutout wins in a row from March 25-28 against Boston College (2) and Furman.
- It was the first time the Tigers posted three shutout wins in a row since 1992 and the fourth time in school history.
- Six of the nine shutout wins were combined efforts, while Alex Eubanks tossed two individual shutouts and Tyler Jackson pitched the other.
- The Tigers had three games in which they allowed only unearned runs, meaning they had 12 games of allowing no earned runs in 2017.

K CLUB

- Clemson averaged 8.88 strikeouts per nine innings pitched in 2017 thanks to 562 strikeouts in 569.2 innings pitched.
- The school record for strikeouts per nine innings pitched is 9.69, set by the 1996 squad that featured Kris Benson and Billy Koch.
- The 8.88 strikeout-per-nine-innings-pitched mark in 2017 was Clemson's best since 1996.
- The Tigers allowed 143 walks, good for a national-best 3.93 strikeout-to-walk ratio, better than the previous school record of 3.16 (1996).
- Clemson's national-best 3.93 strikeout-to-walk ratio was well ahead of second-place Oregon, who had a 3.25 strikeout-to-walk ratio.
- No Tiger pitcher had more than three walks in a game in 2017.
- Charlie Barnes (113-22), Alex Eubanks (104-15), Tyler Jackson (68-10), Patrick Andrews (22-4) and Ryan Miller (11-2) all had stellar ratios.
- Charlie Barnes, Ryley Gilliam and Brooks Crawford had a school-record 23 strikeouts in the 1-0 victory over Elon in 13 innings on Feb. 24.
- Five pitchers combined for 32 strikeouts against two walks and two runs in the sweep at Boston College in Kingston, R.I., from March 24-26.

WEEKEND ROTATION EFFECTIVE

- The weekend rotation of Charlie Barnes, Alex Eubanks and Pat Krall was one of the most consistent parts of the 2017 team.
- Overall, they were a combined 20-14 with a 3.61 ERA, .265 opponents' batting average, 62 walks and 281 strikeouts in 297.0 innings pitched.
- Overall, Charlie Barnes was 5-5 with a 3.20 ERA, Alex Eubanks was 7-6 with a 4.09 ERA and Pat Krall was 8-3 with a 3.50 ERA.
- In ACC regular-season games, they were 14-8 with a 3.22 ERA, .252 opponents' batting average and 192 strikeouts in 192.2 innings pitched.
- In ACC regular-season games, Barnes was 4-3 with a 3.53 ERA, Eubanks was 5-3 with a 3.61 ERA and Krall was 5-2 with a 2.48 ERA.

TIGERS RECOGNIZED FOR APR SCORE

- Baseball was one of six Tiger programs in the top-10 percent of their sport nationally in the eligibility, graduation and retention metric.
- It was the first time the Clemson baseball program was lauded by the NCAA for its APR.
- Clemson was the only ACC institution to earn recognition for baseball.

TWO ALL-AMERICANS

- Sophomore outfielder Seth Beer and junior outfielder Reed Rohlman were both named second-team All-Americans.
- Beer was a second-team pick by NCBWA and third-team selection by D1Baseball.
- Rohlman was a second-team pick by College Sports Madness and Collegiate Baseball.

- Beer (2016) and Rohlman (2015) were named All-Americans for the second time in their career.

SIX TIGERS NAMED TO ALL-ACC TEAM

- Reed Rohlman (OF) earned First-Team All-ACC honors in 2017 after being named Second-Team All-ACC as a freshman in 2015.
- Seth Beer (OF) and Pat Krall (SP) were Second-Team All-ACC. Beer was first-team as a freshman in 2016, while Krall was second-team in 2016.
- Charlie Barnes (SP), Andrew Cox (1B) and Chase Pinder (OF) all earned All-ACC honors for the first time as Third-Team All-ACC selections.
- Logan Davidson (SS) earned All-ACC Freshman honors.
- Clemson's six selections tied for third most in the ACC.

ALL-ACC ACADEMIC TIGERS

- Seven Tigers were selected to the All-ACC Academic Team, second most in the ACC.
- Junior Chase Pinder was named to the team for the third time.
- Junior Charlie Barnes and senior Pat Krall were named to the team for the second time.
- Graduate Andrew Cox, freshman Logan Davidson, graduate Tyler Jackson and graduate Weston Jackson were first-time selections.
- To be eligible, a student-athlete must record a 3.0 GPA the previous semester and maintain a 3.0 cumulative GPA during his academic career.

NINE TIGERS PICKED IN MLB DRAFT

- Nine Tigers were selected in the 2017 Major League Baseball draft, tied for fourth most in the nation and tied for most in the ACC.
- Charlie Barnes and Chase Pinder were drafted on day two.
- Seven Tigers (Alex Eubanks, Paul Campbell, Pat Krall, Jeremy Beasley, Chris Williams, Ryan Miller, Reed Rohlman) were drafted on day three.
- Tyler Jackson signed a free-agent contract with the Seattle Mariners.

GRADUATES

- Four Tiger players received their degrees during commencement ceremonies in Littlejohn Coliseum on May 11, 12.
- Lefthander Charlie Barnes and outfielder Reed Rohlman graduated with a degree in parks, recreation & tourism management.
- Barnes graduated in only three years.
- Lefthander Pat Krall graduated with a degree in management.
- Righthander Patrick Andrews graduated with a master's degree in mechanical engineering.
- Bullpen coordinator and former Tiger lefthander Andrew Towns graduated with a degree in economics.
- Andrew Cox already received his degree, while Tyler Jackson (USC Upstate) and Weston Jackson (Presbyterian College) were graduate transfers.

- He made 89 career appearances, second in Tiger history, and 88 career relief appearances, second in Clemson history.
- In 2017, he had a save, 4.22 ERA and 22 strikeouts against only four walks in 21.1 innings pitched over 21 relief appearances.
- He held opponents to 6-for-29 (.207) with runners in scoring position in 2017.
- In his career, he had three saves, a 3.86 ERA, .258 opponents' batting average and 99 strikeouts against 39 walks in 116.2 innings pitched.

BARNES BALLED

- Junior lefthander Charlie Barnes solidified himself as the Tigers' Friday starter, as he was 5-5 with a 3.20 ERA in 16 starts in 2017.
- In 101.1 innings pitched, he allowed 98 hits (.261 opponents' batting average) and 22 walks with 113 strikeouts.
- His 113 strikeouts were the most by a Tiger since 1996, when Kris Benson (204), Billy Koch (152) and Ken Vining (135) all had at least 135.
- In 10 ACC regular-season starts, he had a 3.53 ERA, .246 opponents' batting average and 74 strikeouts with 17 walks in 63.2 innings pitched.
- He gave up just four hits, one run and one walk with 11 strikeouts in 6.0 innings pitched to earn the win at Boston College on March 24.
- He was named ACC Co-Pitcher-of-the-Week by totaling 11 strikeouts in 7.2 innings pitched to earn the win against Virginia Tech on April 7.
- He totaled 11 strikeouts in a game four times in 2017.
- In his career, he was 12-11 with a 3.85 ERA and 220 strikeouts against 54 walks in 220.0 innings pitched over 44 appearances (34 starts).
- His 4.07 career strikeout-to-walk ratio was third in Clemson history.

BEER GOT ON BASE AGAIN

- Sophomore Seth Beer did what he does best...finding a way to get on base.
- He had a .478 on-base percentage thanks to 64 walks (17 intentional) and 14 hit-by-pitches against only 35 strikeouts in 63 games.
- His 64 walks tied a Tiger season record.
- He was named one of 25 semifinalist for the Dick Howser Trophy.
- He earned second-team All-America accolades by NCBWA.
- He joined Logan Davidson as the only Tigers to play and start all 63 games in 2017.
- He reached base via a hit or walk in 66 consecutive games that he had a plate appearance, a streak that ended on Feb. 26.
- He then reached base in 26 consecutive games from February to April and reached base in 23 straight games from April to May.
- He has reached base in 120 of his last 123 games with a plate appearance.
- He has reached via a hit, walk or hit-by-pitch in his 78 of his 79 career games with a plate appearance against ACC (65) and SEC (13) teams.
- Beer hit .298 with 17 doubles, a triple, 16 homers, 53 RBIs, 51 runs and a .606 slugging percentage in 2017.
- He made 27 starts in right field, 18 starts in left field, 13 starts as the DH and five starts at first base in 2017.
- Beer won the Bradley Award as Clemson's MVP of the South Carolina series from March 3-5. He had two homers and seven walks in the series.
- With Clemson trailing 3-2, a 3-2 count and two outs in the ninth at No. 4 South Carolina on March 5, he hit a solo homer in the Tigers' win.

- He was 7-for-12 (.583) with three homers, a double, eight RBIs, four runs and three walks in the series at No. 25 Florida State in April.
- With Clemson trailing 8-7 and one out in the eighth inning against No. 24 Coastal Carolina on May 16, he hit a grand slam in the 11-8 win.
- In his career, he is hitting .333 with 30 doubles, a triple, 34 homers, 123 RBIs, 108 runs and a .506 on-base percentage in 123 games.
- He was invited to play for the USA Collegiate National Team this summer after playing for Team USA during the summer of 2016.

BYRD STEADY AT THIRD BASE

- Sophomore Grayson Byrd sat out in 2016 after transferring from Louisiana State. He emerged as the everyday starter at third base in 2017.
- He made 42 starts at third base and 12 starts at second base in 2017.
- He hit .284 with six doubles, a triple, homer, 20 RBIs, 22 runs and three steals in 57 games (54 starts).
- He hit .329 with runners on base and .316 with two outs.
- He had a solid .945 fielding percentage, committing only eight errors in 146 chances.
- His father, Paul, played 14 years in the majors with the Mets, Braves, Phillies, Royals, Angels, Indians and Red Sox.

COX THE SENIOR LEADER

- Graduate Andrew Cox was the 2017 team leader, was solid at the plate and showed off his glove at first base.
- He hit .280 with six homers, 10 doubles, 35 RBIs, 29 runs, a .347 on-base percentage and five steals in 62 games (59 starts).
- In his career, he hit .246 with 20 doubles, a triple, eight homers, 62 RBIs, 69 runs and 14 steals in 186 games (144 starts).
- He was a four-time ACC Academic Honor Roll member.

CRAWFORD FILLED RELIEF ROLE

- Sophomore righthander Brooks Crawford turned into one of the team's most reliable relievers in 2017.
- He was 4-0 with a 1.23 ERA and .238 opponents' batting average in 22.0 innings pitched over 17 relief appearances.
- He had 22 strikeouts against only seven walks.
- He pitched the final 4.2 innings, allowing two hits and no runs to earn the win in Clemson's 6-5 win over Notre Dame on March 11.
- He was hampered by an illness and missed almost a month of action from late April to late May.
- In his career, he is 7-0 with a save, 2.88 ERA and .249 opponents' batting average in 68.2 innings pitched over 43 appearances (two starts).

DAVIDSON CAME ON AS A FRESHMAN

- Logan Davidson was Clemson's most dynamic freshman, as he had a .388 on-base percentage in starting all 63 games at shortstop.
- He was named a first-team freshman All-American, the first Tiger shortstop to earn freshman All-America honors since 2000.
- He joined Seth Beer as the only Tigers to play and start every game in 2017. He was also the only Tiger to start every game at one position.
- The switch-hitter hit .286 with nine doubles, 12 homers, 41 RBIs, 56 runs, 42 walks and 10 steals.
- He became the first Tiger shortstop to hit double-digit home runs in a season since 2007 (Taylor Harbin).
- In ACC regular-season games, he hit .266 with a .403 on-base percentage and .938 fielding percentage at shortstop.

NOTES

- He went 6-for-9 with a homer, three RBIs, seven runs, three walks and a steal in the three-game sweep of Virginia Tech from April 7-9.
- One of six participants in the College Home Run Derby in Omaha, Neb., on July 1.
- His dad, Mark, played at Clemson (1982) and played six years (1986-91) in the majors with the Twins (1987 World Series champion) and Astros.

EUBANKS IN COMMAND

- Sophomore righthander Alex Eubanks was a reliever and starter in 2016, but found a full-time home in the weekend rotation in 2017.
- He was 7-6 with a 4.09 ERA, .253 opponents' batting average, 104 strikeouts and 15 walks in 105.2 innings pitched (18 outings, 16 starts).
- In 10 ACC regular-season starts, he had a 3.61 ERA, .244 opponents' batting average, 71 strikeouts and eight walks in 67.1 innings pitched.
- He had two of the five shutouts thrown by pitchers in ACC regular-season games in 2017. No other pitcher had more than one shutout.
- He pitched 7.0 scoreless innings of four-hit ball with seven strikeouts to earn the win in a 4-0 victory over Notre Dame on March 12.
- He pitched a three-hit shutout with 10 strikeouts against no walks in Clemson's 1-0 win at Boston College in Kingston, R.I., on March 25.
- He pitched a seven-hit shutout with 12 strikeouts against no walks in Clemson's 11-0 win over No. 17 Wake Forest on April 22.
- He was named ACC Pitcher-of-the-Week for his shutouts against Boston College and Wake Forest, his second and third career ACC weekly honor.
- In his career, he was 13-11 with a 4.09 ERA and 174 strikeouts against 36 walks in 187.0 innings pitched over 41 appearances (27 starts).
- His 4.83 career strikeout-to-walk ratio was first in Clemson history.

GILLIAM PROVIDED RELIEF

- Sophomore righthander Ryley Gilliam became the Tiger closer in 2017.
- He was 3-1 with four saves, a 2.57 ERA and 50 strikeouts versus 14 walks in 35.0 innings pitched over a team-high 27 relief outings in 2017.
- He allowed only 29 hits and had a .225 opponents' batting average, while opponents were 6-for-45 (.133) with two outs.
- In the 1-0 win over Elon on Feb. 24, he allowed just one hit, no runs and no walks with nine strikeouts in 4.1 innings pitched in relief.
- He combined with Charlie Barnes and Brooks Crawford for a school-record 23 strikeouts against no walks versus Elon on Feb. 24.
- He gave up two hits and one earned run with four strikeouts in 3.1 innings pitched in two Tiger wins over No. 4 South Carolina on March 4, 5.
- In his career, he has a 4.23 ERA, four saves, a .227 opponents' batting average and 66 strikeouts in 66.0 innings pitched over 42 outings.
- He was invited to the USA Collegiate National Team training camp during the summer.

GREENE SECOND TO NONE

- Sophomore Jordan Greene exhibited a consistent glove at second base, committing only six errors for a .977 fielding percentage in 2017.
- He hit .263 with nine doubles, 18 RBIs, 21 runs, a .332 on-base percentage and five steals in 59 games (51 starts) in 2017.
- He hit .300 with 13 RBIs and a .993 fielding percentage (one error) in 29 ACC regular-season games.

- He hit .297 with two outs, and 12 of his 18 RBIs came with two outs.
- He was fifth on the team in multiple-hit games (17) and tied for the team lead in sacrifice bunts (5).
- In his career, he is hitting .254 with 13 doubles, a homer, 25 RBIs, 43 runs and a .362 on-base percentage in 97 games (78 starts).

GRIFFITH CAME ON LATE IN SEASON

- Freshman righthander Owen Griffith did not make his first appearance until March 19 and made his second appearance on April 7.
- He emerged as one of the top pitchers out of the bullpen, as he allowed only two earned runs (1.23 ERA) in 14.2 innings pitched in 2017.
- He allowed eight hits (.151 opponents' batting average) overall and one hit in 25 at-bats with runners on base in 12 relief appearances.
- He stranded all nine of his inherited runners on base in 2017.
- He pitched 4.1 scoreless innings of one-hit ball with five strikeouts in a win against UNC Greensboro in the Clemson Regional on June 4.

HENNESSY PITCHED OFTEN

- Freshman lefty Jacob Hennessy pitched 26 games, second most on the team, and had a 3.82 ERA in 30.2 innings pitched.
- Hennessy gave up 11 walks with 37 strikeouts and had three saves.
- He recorded his first career save by tossing 2.0 scoreless innings in Clemson's 3-0 win over Elon on Feb. 26.

JACKSON SHOWED VALUE ON MOUND

- Graduate righthander Tyler Jackson transferred from USC Upstate for his one and only season at Clemson in 2017.
- He was a big reason the Tigers were 14-0 in midweek games, as he made all 12 of his regular-season starts in midweek contests.
- He was 9-1 with a 3.56 ERA, .249 opponents' batting average and 68 strikeouts against 10 walks in 83.1 innings pitched over 19 appearances.
- His 1.08 walks per nine innings pitched set a Tiger single-season record.
- He made his 13th start of the year in the Clemson Regional versus Vanderbilt on June 4 and pitched a two-hit shutout in the Tigers' 6-0 win.
- He became the first Tiger since 2005 to toss a shutout in an NCAA Tournament game.

JOLLY GOOD TIME

- Junior catcher Robert Jolly had one of his best seasons as a Tiger, mainly as the designated hitter and as a reserve catcher.
- He became a predominant DH during the second half of the season and hit .280 with nine doubles and a .371 on-base percentage.
- In 40 games (26 starts) in 2017, he totaled 26 runs and two steals.
- He hit .345 with two outs.
- He hit a pinch-hit home run, the first long ball of his career, in the sixth inning to tie the score at Florida State on April 17.
- In his career, he is hitting .273 with 15 doubles, a homer, 35 RBIs, 48 runs and a .370 on-base percentage in 116 games (58 starts).

SEASON REVIEW STORY

In Monte Lee's second season as head coach at Clemson in 2017, the Tigers hosted a regional for the second year in a row and totaled 42 wins. It marked the first time Clemson amassed 40+ victories in back-to-back years since 2010,11.

Clemson started the season on a tear with a 30-5 overall record, 14-2 ACC mark and top-five ranking. However, the Tigers faced their toughest opponents late in the season, including No. 17 Wake Forest, No. 3 North Carolina and No. 2 Louisville, and finished with a 42-21 overall record, 17-13 ACC regular-season mark and top-25 final ranking, including a high mark of No. 22 in the USA Today poll. The Tigers hosted a regional for the 15th time in school history, as they recorded their most wins (3) in an NCAA Tournament since 2010.

A key factor in Clemson's success was its 14-0 record in midweek games and 22-4 mark in regular-season non-conference contests. The Tigers had nine shutout victories, third most in school history and most since 1996. Clemson also capped their winning streak in games away from home at a school-record 16 games, a streak that started in 2016.

The Tigers had a .282 batting average, .446 slugging percentage and .381 on-base percentage thanks to 302 walks and 60 hit-by-pitches. Clemson slugged 73 home runs, including double digits by Seth Beer (16), Chris Williams (14) and Logan Davidson (12). The Tigers also had a .970 fielding percentage, their best mark since 2013, and allowed just 34 steals in 60 attempts, good for an outstanding 43-percent caught stealing rate.

Leading the way at the plate was Reed Rohlman, who was a second-team All-American. Rohlman was Clemson's lone First-Team All-ACC selection, while Beer, who was a Dick Howser Trophy semifinalist and second-team All-American, and Pat Krall were Second-Team All-ACC picks. Charlie Barnes, Andrew Cox and Chase Pinder were Third-Team All-ACC selections. Davidson earned All-ACC Freshman honors as well.

Rohlman hit a team-high .361 with 21 doubles, a triple, six homers, 34 RBIs and a .448 on-base percentage. He had a 20-game hitting streak from March to April, tied for 18th longest in school history, and a 38-game on-base streak, the longest by a Tiger in 2017.

Pinder was second on the team in batting average (.305) with 16 doubles, seven homers, 32 RBIs, 59 runs, a .419 on-base percentage and team-high 13 steals. Beer batted .298 and led the team in home runs (16) and RBIs (53) along with 51 runs, a school-record-tying 64 walks, 14 hit-by-pitches and a team-high .478 on-base percentage. Beer played for the USA Collegiate National Team during the summer for the second year in a row as well.

The unquestioned team leader was graduate Andrew Cox, who had his best season as a Tiger in 2017. He hit .280 with six homers, 35 RBIs and countless run-saving defensive plays at first base. Davidson, a first-team freshman All-American, hit .286 with 12 homers, 41 RBIs, 42 walks and 10 steals, as he became the first Tiger shortstop with double-digit home runs since 2007.

The Tigers were set back by two Chris Williams injuries, one at the beginning of the year and one at the end, that were instrumental in Clemson's struggles. Williams amassed 14 doubles, 14 homers and 51 RBIs in only 49 games (42 starts). The Tigers were 28-8 when he started at catcher and only 14-13 when he did not start at catcher.

The pitching staff was one of the most consistent areas of the team. The weekend rotation of Barnes, Alex Eubanks and Krall were big reasons the Tigers had a 3.59 ERA, .257 opponents' batting average and 562

strikeouts against only 143 walks. The Tigers' 3.93 strikeout-to-walk ratio was easily best in the nation and set the school record. Clemson's 8.88 strikeouts-per-nine-innings-pitched mark was its best since 1996 as well.

Barnes accumulated 113 strikeouts, most by a Tiger since 1996, against just 22 walks and had four 11-strikeout games along with a 3.20 ERA in 101.1 innings pitched. Eubanks also had triple-digit strikeouts, as he was 7-6 with a 4.09 ERA and 104 strikeouts against only 15 walks in a team-high 105.2 innings pitched. Eubanks had a team-high two shutouts, two of the five thrown by league pitchers in ACC regular-season games in 2017.

Krall, a Senior CLASS Award finalist, had an 8-3 record, a save and 3.50 ERA in 90.0 innings pitched. Tyler Jackson had a 9-1 record, 3.56 ERA and 68 strikeouts against only 10 walks. Clemson had a 13-0 record in Jackson's 13 starts, 12 of which came during midweek games. Ryley Gilliam added a 3-1 record, team-high four saves, 2.57 ERA and 50 strikeouts in 35.0 innings pitched as the closer.

Wright State handed the Tigers two losses in a three-game series to open the season, but they quickly rebounded to win 29 of the next 32 games, started by Clemson's late come-from-behind win against Western Carolina.

In the series opener against Elon on Feb. 24, Barnes, Gilliam and Brooks Crawford combined for a school-record 23 strikeouts against no walks in Clemson's 1-0 win in 13 innings, which propelled the Tigers to a three-game sweep.

After a midweek victory over Wofford, the Tigers won the series against No. 4 South Carolina for the third year in a row. After a 2-0 loss at home in game one, Patrick Cromwell's solo homer in the ninth inning broke a 5-5 tie in the Tigers' 8-7 win in Greenville. In the series finale in Columbia, Clemson trailed 3-2 with a 3-2 count and two outs in the ninth inning before Beer belted a solo homer to tie the score. The Tigers went on to win 5-3 in 11 innings, as Beer won the Bob Bradley Award as Clemson's MVP of the series.

Another win in Greenville, this time over Michigan State, a three-game sweep of Notre Dame and a two-game, midweek sweep of Yale at home were part of an eight-game winning streak before No. 11 Virginia stopped it with a 2-0 win on March 17. However, Clemson responded with victories, including a 12-1 drubbing in the finale, over the Cavaliers to win the series.

The Tigers hit the road for a Spring Break trip to College of Charleston and Kingston, R.I., to face Boston College, as Clemson won all four games. The Tigers blanked the Eagles in the last two games and held Furman scoreless on March 28. It marked the first time since 1992 that Clemson registered three shutout wins in a row and just the fourth time in school history.

Rohlman's walkoff single in the 11th inning lifted Clemson to a midweek win over Winthrop, then the Tigers won two of three games at Georgia Tech. In the series finale, Rohlman went 3-for-5 with two homers, a double and seven RBIs in Clemson's 13-6 victory.

Clemson recorded another perfect week when it shut out Georgia on the road 4-0 before sweeping Virginia Tech at home by a combined score of 26-7. The Tigers then defeated Charleston Southern 6-5 in 11 innings on Cox's walkoff single. The Tigers opened the series at No. 25 Florida State with a wild 12-10 win, their 30th victory of the year, but the Seminoles rallied for victories in the final two games of the series.

After Clemson outlasted Georgia 9-7 in a midweek home contest, the Tigers beat No. 17 Wake Forest twice in three games. In the series opener, Clemson scored three runs in the ninth inning in its 8-7 walkoff victory,

then it blanked the Demon Deacons 11-0 before they salvaged the series in game three.

The Tigers downed College of Charleston 7-2, then they suffered three close losses at No. 3 North Carolina in late April. The Tigers had late leads in all three contests during the competitive series.

After five days off for final exams, Clemson won two of three home games against Nevada before topping Furman in Greenville. No. 2 Louisville then won three two-run games at Clemson.

Beer ended the three-game skid with a grand slam in the eighth inning to give the Tigers an 11-8 win over No. 24 Coastal Carolina in their final non-conference game of the season before NC State defeated Clemson twice in close games in a three-game series to conclude the regular season.

The Tigers went 0-2 in the ACC Tournament at Louisville, Ky., but they had just enough on their resumé to host a regional at Doug Kingsmore Stadium, where they totaled their most wins (3) in an NCAA Tournament since 2010.

Clemson topped UNC Greensboro in its regional opener before falling to Vanderbilt in the winners' bracket game. After another victory over UNC Greensboro in an elimination game, Jackson pitched a two-hit shutout in the Tigers' 6-0 win over Vanderbilt. It was the first shutout by a Tiger in an NCAA Tournament game since 2005. But the Commodores ended Clemson's season a day later in the regional's winner-take-all game. Beer, Davidson, Jordan Greene, Jackson and Kyle Wilkie were named to the Clemson Regional All-Tournament team.

Nine Tigers were selected in the major league draft after the season, tied for fourth most in the nation and tied for most in the ACC. It was also the most Tigers drafted since 2009 and tied for third most in school history. Barnes (fourth round) and Pinder (seventh round) were chosen on day two, while Eubanks (14th round), Paul Campbell (21st round), Krall (28th round), Jeremy Beasley (30th round), Williams (31st round), Ryan Miller (31st round) and Rohlman (35th round) were selected on day three. Jackson signed a free-agent contract with the Seattle Mariners a well.
