CLEMSON'S NCAA TOURNEY HISTORY

- The Tigers played in their 47th all-time NCAA Tournament in 2025.
- The 47 appearances are fifth most in NCAA history, trailing only Texas (64), Florida State (61), Miami (Fla.) (50) and Oklahoma State (50).
- Clemson had made 10 super regional appearances, with its last in 2024, when it hosted the Clemson Super Regional against Florida.
- In the first 12 years (1999-2010) of the super-regional format, Clemson played in a super regional nine times.
- The Tigers have made 12 trips to the College World Series, with their last in 2010 when they defeated Alabama in the Clemson Super Regional.
- Clemson's 12 College World Series trips are tied for 12th most in the nation.
- Clemson has a 126-101 record (.555) in NCAA Tournament games.

NCAA TOURNAMENT CONNECTIONS

- Four former Clemson assistant coaches served as head coaches of a 2025 NCAA Tournament team.
- Texas Head Coach Jim Schlossnagle was an assistant coach at Clemson in 1993.
- Vanderbilt Head Coach Tim Corbin was an assistant coach at Clemson from 1994-02.
- Florida Head Coach Kevin O'Sullivan was an assistant coach at Clemson from 1999-07.
- Clemson Head Coach Erik Bakich was an assistant coach at Clemson in 2002.
- West Virginia junior catcher Logan Sauve is the son of Jeff Sauve, a standout righthander and placekicker at Clemson from 1991-95.

CLEMSON'S HOSTING HISTORY

- Clemson hosted an NCAA regional for the 19th time in history in 2025.
- Clemson joined Arkansas as the only two schools to host a regional in 2023, 2024 and 2025.

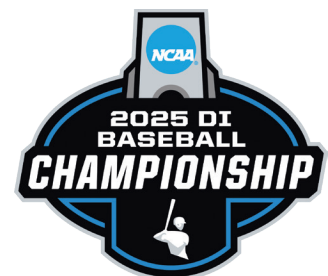

NOTES

POLLS

- Clemson was ranked as high as No. 20 in the nation by USA Today in the final polls.
- It marked Clemson's third straight year with a final top-20 ranking, as it was as high as No. 15 in 2023 and No. 9 in 2024.
- Clemson was ranked in the top 20 of at least one poll in all 18 weeks in 2025.
- Clemson has an active 44-week streak of being ranked in the top 20 of at least one poll dating to 2023.
- Clemson has played 138 consecutive games (dating to 2023) ranked in the top 12 of at least one poll.
- Clemson has played 141 consecutive games (dating to 2023) ranked in the top 20 of at least one poll.
- The Tigers have been ranked in at least one weekly poll every year since 1987, when Clemson began tracking weekly polls.

ATTENDANCE

- Clemson averaged 5,028 fans per home date (36), the 13th-highest figure in the nation and second in the ACC.
- It was Clemson's second-highest average home attendance figured in history, trailing only the 5,060 fans per home date in 2024.
- In a 5-3 win over South Carolina on Feb. 28, Clemson set a school record with 6,891 fans in attendance at Doug Kingsmore Stadium.
- Clemson has had a top-20 national figure in average home attendance for 32 straight seasons.

ACC STANDINGS

- Clemson finished in fifth place in the ACC standings with an 18-12 league mark, just one game out of first place.
- Clemson won seven of its 10 ACC series, including series wins over No. 11 Wake Forest, No. 19 Georgia Tech and No. 17 Louisville.
- Clemson's seven ACC series wins tied Georgia Tech and North Carolina for most in the conference.
- Including ACC Tournament games, the Tigers had a 21-13 record against ACC teams, tied with North Carolina for the most wins.

SHRINERS SHOWDOWN RECAP

- Clemson was one of four teams in the six-team Shriners Children's College Showdown with a 2-1 record to tie for the best record.
- The showdown at Globe Life Field in Arlington, Texas from Feb. 14-16 marked Clemson's first three games in an MLB stadium and a dome.
- It marked Clemson's first regular-season games outside the Eastern time zone since 2005.
- Clemson defeated No. 13 Oklahoma State 6-5 in the first game, then beat No. 12 Arizona 16-5 in its second game before falling to Ole Miss.
- Oklahoma State and Arizona were the top-two teams, respectively, in the Big 12 Conference coaches pre-season poll.
- All six teams in the showdown eventually made the 2025 NCAA Tournament, including three (Clemson, Ole Miss, Texas) that hosted a regional.
- The Tigers hit .324 with 10 doubles, 27 runs, a .418 on-base percentage, two steals and a .990 fielding percentage in the showdown.
- Dominic Listi was 5-for-9 (.556) with seven RBIs, four runs, two walks, two hit-by-pitches and a .643 on-base percentage in three games.

TIGERS SWEEP RIVAL GAMECOCKS

- Clemson swept South Carolina in three games at three different sites by a combined score of 18-6 from Feb. 28 to March 2.

- The Tigers won 5-3 at Clemson, 5-1 at Fluor Field in Greenville, S.C. and 8-2 at South Carolina.
- Clemson never trailed in the series.
- Clemson had a 1.69 ERA, .160 opponents' batting average and 36 strikeouts against nine walks in 27.0 innings pitched in the series.
- A Doug Kingsmore Stadium record crowd of 6,891 saw the Tigers outlast the Gamecocks 5-3 on Feb. 28.
- Ethan Darden received the Bob Bradley Award as Clemson's MVP of the series.
- Darden pitched 7.0 scoreless innings of three-hit ball with six strikeouts to earn the win on March 1.
- Jarren Purify was 4-for-8 with a homer, double, three RBIs, a .636 on-base percentage and two steals in three games.
- It marked the third time in four years the Tigers swept South Carolina, as they won all three games in 2022 and both games in 2024.
- It upped Clemson's winning streak in the series to five, while the Tigers have won 10 of the last 12 meetings.
- Clemson has won eight of the last 11 series since 2015.

ACC TOURNAMENT RECAP

- Clemson had a 3-1 record in the ACC Tournament at Durham, N.C., advanced to the championship game and finished in second place.
- Clemson was the only team to play four games in the ACC Tournament and tied the champion, North Carolina, for the most wins.
- Clemson trailed in all three of its wins.
- The Tigers defeated Virginia Tech 6-1 behind Dominic Listi's homer and four RBIs on May 21.
- Clemson totaled 16 hits in its 7-6 win over No. 20 NC State in the quarterfinal round on May 22.
- The Tigers rallied from a 3-0 deficit, keyed by Jacob Jarrell's grand slam, to top No. 16 Georgia Tech 9-4 in the semifinal round on May 24.
- No. 2 North Carolina downed Clemson 14-4 thanks in large part to an eight-run fifth inning to capture the tournament title on May 25.
- Clemson hit .309 with seven doubles, a triple, five homers, a .482 slugging percentage, .399 on-base percentage and six steals.
- Dominic Listi earned All-ACC Tournament honors by going 6-for-12 with a homer, double, five RBIs, four runs and a .667 on-base percentage.
- Cam Cannarella earned All-ACC Tournament honors by going 7-for-16 (.438) with a homer, double, four RBIs and three runs.
- Andrew Ciuffo was 6-for-13 (.462) with two doubles, two RBIs, four runs, a .563 on-base percentage and two steals.
- Jacob McGovern had one save and allowed one hit, no runs and one walk with six strikeouts in 6.0 innings pitched over two relief outings.

CLEMSON REGIONAL RECAP

- The Tigers had a 1-2 record in the Clemson Regional, defeating USC Upstate 7-3 before falling to No. 23 West Virginia 9-6 and Kentucky 16-4.
- Clemson was the No. 11 national seed.
- Clemson hit .267 with two homers, a triple, three doubles, 17 runs, a .361 on-base percentage and six steals in three games.
- Cam Cannarella (OF) was named to the All-Tournament team.
- Cannarella was 8-for-14 (.571) with two homers, two doubles, seven RBIs and five runs in three games.

17-GAME WINNING STREAK

- Clemson had a 17-game winning streak that started with a 6-2 win over VCU on Feb. 21 and ended with a 7-3 loss to Notre Dame on March 16.

- The 17-game winning streak was Clemson's longest since it won 17 games in a row during the 2023 season.
- The 17-game winning streak tied for the fourth longest in school history.
- Seven of the 17 wins during the winning streak were comeback victories.
- Clemson hit .290 with a .480 slugging percentage, .439 on-base percentage and 8.3 runs per game during the winning streak.
- Clemson had a 2.84 ERA, .186 opponents' batting average and 184 strikeouts against 57 walks in 149.0 innings pitched in the winning streak.
- Clemson held opponents to .145 with runners in scoring position during the winning streak.

NO-HITTER

- Three Tigers, Aidan Knaak, Joe Allen and Lucas Mahlstedt, combined on a no-hitter in Clemson's 6-1 win at Pittsburgh on May 15, 2025.
- Aidan Knaak pitched 7.1 innings and had 12 strikeouts, then Joe Allen pitched 1.1 innings and Lucas Mahlstedt retired the last batter.
- It was Clemson's 15th no-hitter in history, third in an ACC game and first in an ACC road game.
- It was Clemson's first no-hitter since March 18, 2009, when the Tigers no-hit USC Upstate in a 14-0 win at Doug Kingsmore Stadium.
- It was Clemson's first no-hitter in an ACC game since April 17, 1976, when Clemson no-hit Virginia in a 9-0 win at Doug Kingsmore Stadium.

SCHEDULE STRONG

- Clemson had a final RPI of No. 13.
- A big reason for the Tigers' top-15 RPI was their strength of schedule, which was No. 19 in the nation.

SERIES SUCCESS

- Clemson won 11 of its 14 weekend series (including tournaments) in the 2025 regular season.
- Clemson won its first 10 weekend series (including tournaments) in 2025, including the first six ACC series.
- In each of those 10 weekend series wins, Clemson won the weekend opener all 10 times.
- Clemson won seven of its 10 ACC series, tied for the most ACC series wins with Georgia Tech and North Carolina.

TAKING ONE FOR THE TEAM

- Clemson batters were hit-by-pitch 109 times in 63 games (1.7 per game) in 2025.
- Clemson set the Tiger record for hit-by-pitches in a season, breaking the 2021 team's mark of 80.
- The 109 hit-by-pitches along with its 359 walks (5.7 per game) were a big reason Clemson had a .406 on-base percentage.
- Dominic Listi led the team in hit-by-pitches with a school-record 30, which also set an ACC record.
- Jarren Purify was second on the team in hit-by-pitches (14).
- Andrew Ciuffo (13), Josh Paino (11) and Collin Priest (11) also had double-digit hit-by-pitches.

BULLPEN SUCCESS

- Clemson's bullpen was a big reason the Tigers had a 10-1 record in one-run games and 9-3 record in two-run games in 2025.
- The bullpen had a 30-5 record, 22 saves, a 4.68 ERA, .257 opponents' batting average and 336 strikeouts in 300.0 innings pitched.

- Tiger relievers allowed 129 walks and had a 2.60 strikeout-to-walk ratio.
- Lucas Mahlstedt led the bullpen with a 4-1 record, Tiger-record-tying 15 saves and 3.00 ERA in 27 relief appearances.
- Reed Garris was 3-0 with three saves, a 1.57 ERA and .186 opponents' batting average in 18 relief appearances.
- Joe Allen was 5-0 with a 1.84 ERA and .206 opponents' batting average in 23 relief appearances.
- Jacob McGovern was 3-1 with two saves, a 2.97 ERA and .155 opponents' batting average in 18 relief appearances.

- He ended the season on a 22-game hitting streak, tied for 10th longest in Clemson history and the longest by a Tiger since 2018.
- He hit .421 with four homers, a triple, 11 doubles, a .684 slugging percentage and .491 on-base percentage during his 22-game hit streak.
- In the last 13 games, he hit .537 with three homers, seven doubles, 18 RBIs, an .833 slugging percentage and .606 on-base percentage.
- He went 5-for-5 with an RBI and two runs in Clemson's 6-4 win over The Citadel on March 18.
- He hit a two-run triple and scored the go-ahead run on the play in the eighth inning in Clemson's victory over No. 5 Florida State on May 3.
- He was 8-for-14 (.571) with three doubles, three RBIs, six runs, three walks and two steals in three games at Pittsburgh from May 15-17.
- In his career, he hit .360 with 262 hits, 54 doubles, eight triples, 23 homers, 159 RBIs, 192 runs and 30 steals in 178 games.
- In his career, he had a .551 slugging percentage and .453 on-base percentage.

CIUFO FIELDED AT SHORTSTOP

CRIGHTON STRONG LATE IN SEASON

- Junior outfielder and infielder Jack Crighton has had a penchant for his hot bat late in each of his three seasons at Clemson.
- He hit .287 with a homer, two triples, six doubles, 19 RBIs, a .370 on-base percentage and five steals in 48 games (37 starts) in 2025.
- He hit .317 in ACC regular-season games.
- He was 9-for-13 (.692) with six runs, a walk and hit-by-pitch in three games at Pittsburgh from May 15-17.
- In the series at Pittsburgh, he reached base in 10 consecutive plate appearances and had a hit in eight consecutive at-bats.
- He hit a triple and three doubles at Pittsburgh on May 17 to tie a school record for doubles in a game.
- He entered that game with three extra-base hits.
- In his career, he is hitting .286 with 16 doubles, three triples, a homer, 34 RBIs, 53 runs and 12 steals in 122 games (83 starts).

DARDEN HAD HIS MOMENTS

- Junior lefthander Ethan Darden had some big moments in his junior season in 2025.
- A majority of his appearances in each of his three seasons as a Tiger have been in a starting role.
- He did pitch after April 12 due to injury.
- He was 4-2 with a 6.07 ERA, .277 opponents' batting average and 34 strikeouts against 16 walks in 40.0 innings pitched in 2025.
- Clemson had a 7-2 record in his nine starts.
- He pitched 7.0 scoreless innings of three-hit ball with six strikeouts to earn the win in Clemson's 5-1 win over South Carolina on March 1.

- He earned ACC Pitcher-of-the-Week honors and received the Bob Bradley Award as Clemson's MVP of the series against South Carolina.
- In his career, he was 12-9 with a 5.50 ERA, .281 opponents' batting average and 121 strikeouts in 162.0 innings pitched over 47 appearances.
- He made 32 starts in his career.

GAFFNEY AT HOME

- Sophomore infielder and catcher Luke Gaffney found a home at Clemson after transferring from Purdue following a standout 2024 season.
- He hit .271 with five homers, seven doubles, 39 RBIs, 26 runs, a .357 on-base percentage and two steals in 54 games (51 starts) in 2025.
- He had nine sacrifice flies, tied for second in Tiger history.
- He hit .347 with four homers, six doubles and 26 RBIs in 31 games (29 starts) at home.

GARRIS PROVIDED RELIEF

- Senior righthander Reed Garriss was a steadying influence on the bullpen for three years.
- He was 3-0 with three saves, a 1.57 ERA, .186 opponents' batting average and 30 strikeouts in 28.2 innings pitched in 2025.
- He only allowed eight walks, good for a 3.75 strikeout-to-walk ratio.
- He was 2-0 with two saves, a 1.76 ERA and 18 strikeouts against five walks in 15.1 innings pitched (11 outings) in ACC regular-season games.

SEASON REVIEW STORY

The 2025 Tigers totaled 45 wins under third-year Head Coach Erik Bakich, the third straight year the program won 44+ games, one of only two schools that could make that claim. Clemson also hosted a regional for the third year in a row, also one of only two schools that could make that claim. After a strong start during the first half of the year, the season abruptly ended with two losses in the Clemson Regional.

Of Clemson's 63 games, 31 (49 percent) were against teams that played in the 2025 NCAA Tournament. Clemson was ranked as high as No. 20 in the final polls, as it concluded the season with an active streak of 44 weeks in a row being ranked in the top 20 of at least one poll dating to 2023.

The consistency also showed in terms of series wins, as Clemson won its first 10 weekend series (including tournaments), which included the first six ACC series. In all, Clemson won 11 of its 14 regular-season series and seven, tied for most in the ACC, of 10 ACC series.

The Tigers had an 18-12 ACC mark and finished just one game out of first place. Including ACC Tournament games, Clemson totaled 21 wins over ACC teams, tied for most in the league.

A major key to the team's success was its ability to win close games. The Tigers were 10-1 in one-run games and 9-3 in two-run games thanks in large part to a 30-5 record and 22 saves by the bullpen.

Clemson had a .406 on-base percentage, its best mark since 2002. The Tigers had 109 hit-by-pitches, which shattered the previous school record of 80, and 359 walks that were crucial to the team's success. Dominic Listi set an ACC and Clemson record with 30 hit-by-pitches, as his .507 on-base percentage was highest in the ACC and the highest mark by a Tiger since 2016 (Seth Beer).

Two Tigers earned All-America honors, reliever Lucas Mahlstedt and outfielder Cam Cannarella. Mahlstedt, a first-team All-American on the field and second-team Academic All-American, had 15 saves, tied for the school record, third most in the nation and most in the ACC. He became the first Tiger in history to be an All-American on and off the field in the same year. Mahlstedt was also the ACC Baseball Scholar-Athlete-of-the-Year. The First-Team All-ACC selection was 4-1 with a 3.00 ERA and 61 strikeouts against only eight walks in 48.0 innings pitched.

Aidan Knaak was 9-1 with a 4.18 ERA and 110 strikeouts against 29 walks in 90.1 innings pitched. His 110 strikeouts were the most by a Tiger since 2017 and Clemson was 13-3 in his 16 starts. Knaak became the first Tiger pitcher in history to be a First-Team All-ACC selection in each of his first two seasons. With First-Team All-ACC selections by Mahlstedt and Knaak, it marked the first time since 1995 that two Tiger pitchers were named to the first team.

Reed Garriss was also a valuable member of the pitching staff, as he was 3-0 with three saves, a 1.57 ERA, .186 opponents' batting average and 30 strikeouts against eight walks in 28.2 innings pitched.

Cannarella, a Second-Team All-ACC selection, led the way offensively by hitting .353 with five homers, 22 doubles, 52 RBIs, 62 runs and a .479 on-base percentage. He ended the season on a 44-game on-base streak and 22-game hitting streak, the longest by a Tiger since 2018.

Collin Priest totaled 12 homers and 52 RBIs while earning Third-Team All-ACC honors and Jarren Purify had 29 steals, the most by a Tiger since 2019. Jacob Jarrell, an NSCA Strength & Conditioning All-American, led the team in homers (15).

Clemson opened the season in the Shriners Children's College Showdown at Globe Life Field in Arlington, Texas, Clemson's first games in an MLB stadium

and a dome. It was also the Tigers' first regular-season games outside the Eastern time zone since 2005. The Tigers, who hit .324 with 27 runs in three games, defeated No. 13 Oklahoma State and No. 12 Arizona before falling to Ole Miss. In the 16-5 win over the Wildcats, Clemson scored seven runs in the first inning and eight runs in the ninth inning, while Cannarella tied a school record with three doubles.

The following weekend, the Tigers hosted the Clemson Baseball Invitational and had a 4-0 record, with two wins apiece over VCU and North Carolina A&T. The first victory of the tourney began Clemson's 17-game winning streak, tied for fourth longest in Tiger history.

In Clemson's first midweek game, the Tigers scored in all six innings in which they batted at the plate, the eighth time in school history they scored in every inning, and cruised to a 20-7 home win over Winthrop.

The Tigers then swept South Carolina in three games at three different sites by a combined score of 18-6, as Clemson never trailed in the series. The Tigers had a 1.69 ERA, .160 opponents' batting average and 36 strikeouts in the series. A Doug Kingsmore Stadium record crowd of 6,891 saw the Tigers outlast the Gamecocks 5-3 in the series opener. In the second game, Ethan Darden pitched 7.0 scoreless innings of three-hit ball to earn the win and Bob Bradley Award as Clemson's MVP.

After midweek wins over USC Upstate (7-0) and Presbyterian (11-2), with the latter resulting in Bakich's 100th win as Clemson's head coach, the Tigers swept Davidson in three home games by a combined score of 32-12. The second win was Bakich's 500th career victory as a head coach.

The Tigers continued their winning streak with two midweek wins over Liberty by scores of 6-4 and 8-2, then they opened ACC play by winning the first two home games against Notre Dame before falling in the series finale to end their 17-game winning streak. Knaak allowed just one hit with 12 strikeouts in 7.0 innings pitched to earn the win in the series opener.

Clemson swept The Citadel in two midweek home games. Cannarella went 5-for-5 and Josh Paino broke a 3-3 tie in the fifth inning with a two-run homer in the Tigers' 6-4 win in the first game.

The Tigers then defeated No. 11 Wake Forest twice in three home games. Knaak earned the win in the series opener by allowing just one run on two hits with 10 strikeouts in 6.0 innings pitched. In the second game, Wake Forest jumped out to a 10-0 lead and withstood a furious Tiger comeback, holding on for a 12-10 victory. In the series finale, Clemson rallied from a 6-0 deficit to win 7-6 when Tryston McCladdie scored on a wild pitch for the walkoff victory.

Clemson ended its 16-game homestand with two midweek home games, falling to No. 21 Coastal Carolina 8-2 before downing Presbyterian 9-1, then the Tigers concluded their fourth five-game week in a row with a series win at No. 19 Georgia Tech. In the series opener, the Tigers broke a 6-6 tie with two runs in the eighth inning in their 9-7 win. In the series finale, Andrew Ciufo's two-out single in the ninth inning scored the go-ahead run in Clemson's 4-3 victory.

After Clemson outlasted Georgia Southern 10-8 at North Augusta, S.C. on April 1, the Tigers traveled to the state of California for the first since 2015 to play the Golden Bears, as the Tigers swept the series. Listi hit a homer in the sixth inning and the go-ahead two-run double in the seventh inning in the series opener, then Clemson exploded for six runs in the first inning, highlighted by Priest's grand slam, and seven runs in the second inning in the second game.

Jarrell hit two homers in Clemson's 4-2 home win over Gardner-Webb, then the Tigers won two of three

home games against Stanford in the first meetings between the two programs away from Omaha, Neb.

The Tigers won another series by winning two home games against No. 17 Louisville, as Clemson improved to 35-6 on the season after its win in the second game. In the first game, Jack Crighton's three-run homer, the first long ball of his career, with two outs in the seventh inning propelled the Tigers to a 7-6 victory. Drew Titsworth tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in his first career start in the second game in Clemson's 2-1 win. The Tigers responded to a loss in the series finale with a 3-0 home win over No. 5 Georgia.

The Tigers then suffered a three-game sweep at No. 25 NC State. Following final exams, No. 5 Florida State won two of three games over the Tigers at Tallahassee, Fla. In Clemson's lone win, Cannarella's two-out triple in the eighth inning resulted in three runs scoring in the Tigers' 6-3 win.

Clemson's struggles continued with a 5-3 loss at No. 8 Coastal Carolina, which ended a streak of 11 straight games against top-25 teams, and two losses in three home games against Duke.

The Tigers concluded the regular season on a high note with a three-game sweep at Pittsburgh. In the first game, Knaak, Joe Allen and Mahlstedt combined on a no-hitter in a 6-1 win on May 15. It was Clemson's 15th no-hitter in history (first since 2009), third in an ACC game (first since 1976) and first in an ACC road game. The Tigers completed the sweep with wins by scores of 11-2 and 13-6. In the series finale, Crighton hit three doubles to tie a school record and added a triple, as he reached base in 10 consecutive plate appearances and had a hit in eight straight at-bats during the series.

Clemson had a 3-1 record in the ACC Tournament at Durham, N.C., advanced to the championship game and finished in second place. The Tigers trailed in all three wins. In the second game, Clemson scored three runs in the eighth inning to rally for a 7-6 win over No. 20 NC State, then Jarrell hit a grand slam in the 9-4 victory over No. 16 Georgia Tech. Clemson hit .309 in the tournament and was led by Listi and Cannarella, who both earned All-ACC Tournament honors.

The Tigers were the No. 11 national seed in the NCAA Tournament and hosted a regional. They defeated USC Upstate 7-3 in their opener before falling to No. 23 West Virginia and Kentucky to end the season. Cannarella was 8-for-14 (.571) with two homers, two doubles, seven RBIs and five runs in three games to earn All-Tournament honors.

Clemson averaged 5,028 fans per home date (36), the 13th-highest figure in the nation and second in the ACC. It was Clemson's second-highest average home attendance in history.

Two Tigers were selected in the MLB draft after the season. Cannarella was picked in the Competitive Balance A round (No. 43 overall) by the Miami Marlins and Mahlstedt was chosen in the seventh round (No. 199 overall) by the Los Angeles Angels.
