DeAndre Hopkins picked quite a time to match Clemson's single-game record for receptions.

Even as Auburn cornerback Chris Davis was being flagged for pass interference, Hopkins hauled in a Tajh Boyd pass on a fade route in the back of the endzone for his 12th catch of the game to put #14 Clemson ahead for good in its 26-19 win over #25 Auburn in the Georgia Dome. The victory snapped Clemson's six-game losing streak in the city of Atlanta.

"Any time the ball is in the air, I feel like it's mine," said Hopkins of his four-yard touchdown catch. "No matter if there are five defenders, 10 defenders, or one, I feel like it's my ball.

"It was man-on-man. Tajh trusted me and I trusted him to put the ball on the money...and he did."

Hopkins nabbed his 13th catch of the night later in the fourth quarter to break the school record for receptions in a game, which was previously held by Airese Currie, and finished with 119 yards.

Matching Hopkins' great effort was Andre Ellington, who rushed for 228 yards on 25 carries, as the ACC Tigers beat the SEC Tigers in the rubber match of the three-game series.

"Auburn has a great football team," stated Clemson Head Coach Dabo Swinney. "I was impressed with their running game. It's been a tough series the last three years."

Hopkins' grab put Clemson ahead 23-19, and Chandler Catanzaro's fourth field goal of the night from 18 yards out with 1:24 left in the game provided the final margin. Clemson's 79-yard drive that set up Catanzaro's kick was highlighted by a 45-yard jaunt by Ellington that put him over the 200-yard mark and helped ice the victory.

Ellington's 228 rushing yards were the most by a Tiger since C.J. Spiller had 233 yards on the ground in the 2009 ACC Championship game against Georgia Tech. Ellington earned ACC Offensive Back-of-the-Week honors for his efforts. Center Dalton Freeman was also named ACC Offensive Lineman-of-the-Week.

"There's no doubt in my mind who the best player underneath this roof was tonight...without a doubt, it was Andre Ellington," said Clemson Offensive Coordinator Chad Morris. "He was on a mission. He was relentless."

Catanzaro opened the scoring with a 24-yard field goal in the first quarter. Hopkins had four catches for 60 yards on that drive, including a 25-yard connection from Boyd on third-and-10 that jumpstarted the march.

Auburn responded quickly, however, as Kiehl Frazier found Emory Blake all alone beyond the Clemson secondary for a 54-yard scoring strike on the ensuing possession.

Jonathan Willard's recovered fumble at the Clemson 46 helped set up another Catanzaro field goal, this time from 40 yards, which narrowed Auburn's lead to 7-6 early in the second quarter.

Clemson regained the advantage at 13-7, as Roderick McDowell scored Clemson's first touchdown of the season on a seven-yard burst. McDowell's run was set up by Ellington's 68-yard scamper on the previous play.

After Rashard Hall's leaping interception gave Clemson the ball at its 15, Ellington burst free outside, but appeared

corralled after picking up a first down. Instead, Ellington kept his balance, cut completely across the field, and followed his blocking deep into Auburn territory.

Cody Parkey trimmed Clemson's lead to 13-10 on the ensuing possession with a 37-yard field goal to cap a 12-play, 55-yard drive and provide the halftime score.

Another Parkey field goal opened the second-half scoring to tie the score, but Catanzaro put Clemson back on top on its ensuing possession, capping off a 13-play, 66-yard drive with a 37-yard field goal.

Boyd spun out of a potential sack on a third-and-10 play at the Auburn 30 that helped keep the drive alive and keep Clemson in field-goal range.

"That's where Tajh Boyd changed the game," explained Auburn Head Coach Gene Chizik. "We had him in our grasp several times, but he made fantastic plays to get those first downs and keep the chains moving."

Parkey again tied the score 16-16 with a 27-yard field goal to cap a 10-play, 65-yard drive for Auburn with 0:55 remaining in the third quarter.

After a turnover set up Auburn at the Clemson 35, Parkey gave Auburn its first lead since midway through the second quarter with a 36-yarder with 12:50 left in the game.

On the ensuing drive, after six straight running plays set Clemson up with first-and-goal at the four, Boyd found Hopkins in the corner of the endzone for what proved to be the game-winning score.

Catanzaro provided the final margin with an 18-yard field goal. The junior was 4-4 on field goals on the night.

Clemson finished off the win by stopping Auburn on downs, with Vic Beasley, son of former Auburn player Victor Beasley, notching a sack of Frazier on third down to key the stop. Frazier's final pass on fourth down fell harmlessly incomplete as time expired.

"We have to give Clemson a lot of credit," added Chizik. "They played a good football game tonight, hard fought on both sides. They are an extremely talented team, and they did a great job coaching."

Even without wide receiver Sammy Watkins, Clemson finished the game with 528 yards of total offense on 87 plays. Boyd was 24-34 passing for 208 yards and also rushed for 58 yards.

Dabo Swinney's mantra for his team ahead of its game against Ball State was, "set the tone."

The #12 Tigers obviously heard Swinney's message loud and clear, as they scored on five of their first six possessions and cruised to a 52-27 win over the Cardinals at Memorial Stadium.

"I thought that was the best part of the game," said Swinney. "We were coming off an emotional win and a lot of people were saying, 'They're going to have a letdown,' and you're playing a team that's obviously excited to come here and play. And our guys came to play."

The Tigers found the endzone on their first drive, as Andre Ellington scored on a four-yard run to cap a 12-play, 72-yard drive.

After forcing a three-and-out, Clemson struck quickly again, with Ellington once again finding the endzone on a two-yard plunge to put the Tigers up 13-0 with 6:36 left in the first quarter.

"The opening two drives were outstanding in every regard," stated Swinney.

After two three-and-outs to open the game, Ball State finally got its offense going, as Horacio Banks broke free and outran the Tiger secondary for a 54-yard touchdown. The Cardinals needed four plays and 1:22 to go 92 yards and cut Clemson's lead to 13-7.

The Tigers stretched their lead back out on the ensuing drive, as DeAndre Hopkins made a leaping grab at the goal line for a 13-yard touchdown catch from Tajh Boyd.

"We ran a slant and go down there at the endzone and 'Nuk' posted up like he was a center in basketball," said Boyd. "I threw the ball up there for him and he made a great play."

Hopkins' catch capped an eight-play, 68-yard drive that was highlighted by a 33-yard burst by D.J. Howard on a screen pass. After a personal-foul penalty against Ball State on the extra-point try, the Tigers opted to go for two points and Ellington plunged in to put his team up 21-7.

Ball State trimmed the deficit to 21-10 with a field goal and tried to catch the Tigers napping with an onside kick. But Lateek Townsend pounced on the loose ball, and 44 seconds later, Hopkins snagged a crossing route and raced 33 yards for a touchdown to put Clemson ahead 28-10.

After linebacker Stephone Anthony took the ball back for the Tigers with an interception, Boyd and Hopkins hooked up again, this time on a crossing route from 15 yards out to put Clemson up 35-10.

The Tigers again took the ball back on an interception on the next possession, this time by Darius Robinson. Four plays later, Roderick McDowell ran through the right side, put a move on a pair of defenders at the linebacker level, and raced 27 yards for a touchdown and a 42-10 lead.

Spencer Benton punctuated the Tigers' dominating performance in the first half by drilling a 61-yard field goal as time expired, breaking the school record for the longest field goal by four yards over the mark previously shared by Obed Ariri and Chris Gardocki. He also set an ACC record and was named ACC Specialist-of-the-Week.

The 45 first-half points were the most by the Tigers since they scored 49 against Wake Forest in 1981.

"Last week, we had an opportunity against Auburn, 55 or 56 yards, and I went out and hooked it left," recalled Benton. "I was thinking, 'If I could just have another go at it, I could make it.' Everything clicked, and it was awesome."

Ball State chipped away at the Tigers' lead early in the second half, as Banks scored on a 21-yard run. Steven Schott's 33-yard field goal on its following possession made the score 45-20.

But after not scoring in the third quarter, Clemson recorded its only second-half tally early in the fourth quarter, as Cole Stoudt engineered an 11-play, 81-yard drive that culminated in a 22-yard touchdown pass from Stoudt to Martavis Bryant.

Highlighting the remaining action, U.S. Army war hero and wide receiver Daniel Rodriguez made his first career catch for the Tigers, a four-yard gain, midway through the fourth quarter.

"I can't be any happier being at Clemson and being a Tiger," said Rodriguez. "Just being able to wear orange and come out here every day and practice is a great feeling."

Ball State capped the scoring on a two-yard run by Toney Williams late in the fourth quarter.

Boyd finished 19-23 passing for 229 yards and three touchdowns, all to Hopkins. The junior wideout finished with six catches for 105 yards along with his three receiving touchdowns, which tied the school record. McDowell led the Tigers in rushing with eight carries for 59 yards.

Clemson finished with 526 yards of total offense, giving it back-to-back games of at least 500 yards of offense to open a season for the first time in school history.

"Coach (Swinney) challenged us throughout the week about how we would respond after a win like Auburn, and I think we responded as well as we could," added Boyd. "We scored touchdowns on five out of the first six drives, and from an offensive standpoint, I can't ask from anything more."

Tajh Boyd passed for 310 yards and two touchdowns in leading #11 Clemson to its 30th straight win in the series against Furman with a 41-7 victory at Memorial Stadium. The Tigers took a 20-7 lead into halftime and held the Paladins scoreless in the second half to roll to the 34-point victory.

"One of the things I was disappointed in last week (against Ball State) was that we lost the second half," said Clemson Head Coach Dabo Swinney. "The challenge this week was to win all four quarters, and our guys responded and did that."

The Paladins marched 63 yards in 13 plays to open the game, but the Tiger defense stood tall and held Furman to an apparent field-goal attempt inside its own five. Instead, the Paladins shifted into a spread formation and threw a pass into the endzone, but the pass was intercepted by Rashard Hall and the Paladins' drive went for naught. It was Furman's only red-zone possession of the contest.

Andre Ellington opened the scoring with a 10-yard burst off right tackle to put the Tigers up 7-0 in the first quarter. The run capped a seven-play, 80-yard drive that featured two first-down catches apiece by Sammy Watkins and DeAndre Hopkins, who led all receivers with seven catches for 95 yards.

Watkins increased the Tigers' edge to 14-0 on 58-yard run out of the backfield just after the second quarter began. The sophomore took a handoff from Boyd and exploded down the sideline to paydirt. The run was both the longest of Watkins' career and his first career rushing touchdown.

"That was a great play," stated Watkins. "My teammates had some great blocks downfield. I was patient on the run, it opened up, and it was great timing."

Chandler Catanzaro made the score 17-0 with 9:34 left in the second quarter on a 46-yard field goal.

Hall came up with another big play to keep the Paladins off the scoreboard on their ensuing possession, as a botched field-goal snap turned into a tackle for loss by the senior safety when he blew up both the holder and kicker for a nine-yard loss on fourth down.

Furman finally broke through on its next possession, as Reese Hannon found Jordan Snellings wide open down the sideline for a 37-yard score to cap a three-play, 84-yard drive that cut the Tiger lead to 17-7.

"I thought the whole game, particularly in the first half, we were into the game, but we got bogged down there at the end," said Furman Head Coach Bruce Fowler. "We played a very good football team."

Catanzaro stretched Clemson's advantage to 20-7 with a 22-yard field goal that matched Obed Ariri's school record of 14 consecutive made field goals.

"I take it one kick at a time," said Catanzaro of matching the record. "You can't really think about those things. You do the little things right and all the big things come together later. I've taken it one kick at a time, and my confidence is sky-high right now."

Quandon Christian made the first big play after halftime, picking off a Hannon pass across the middle and returning it to the Furman 14.

"It was a game-changer," said Christian of the turnover. "I ran and shuffled, and the guy stepped into my zone on a crossing route. This game is all about opportunities, seizing the moment. I told myself if I got the chance, I would step in and seize the moment."

Five plays later, Ellington waltzed in from one yard out to put the Tigers up 27-7 early in the third quarter. Ellington's four carries accounted for all 14 yards on the five-play drive.

Clemson upped its lead to 34-7 when Brandon Ford ran free on a "wheel" route and hauled in a Boyd pass with an acrobatic, off-balance catch for a 30-yard touchdown to cap a five-play, 69-yard drive.

Boyd hooked up with Martavis Bryant on a 39-yard touchdown into tight coverage to stretch the Tigers' lead to the final margin of 41-7.

Clemson totaled 498 yards of offense on the afternoon, while the Paladins rolled up 349 yards and held the ball for 38:19.

Ahead by two touchdowns at #4 Florida State early in the second half, #9 Clemson looked like the class of the ACC. The rest of the Tigers' night, however, was significantly more humbling.

The Seminoles outscored the defending league champions 35-9 after the 11:48 mark of the third quarter and defeated the Tigers 49-37 in the ACC's first matchup of top-10 teams in five seasons.

"Obviously, we took a little bit of a step back tonight and we didn't play four quarters," said Clemson Head Coach Dabo Swinney. "It's a great game for us to learn and grow from."

Florida State rolled up 667 yards of total offense, led by 380 passing yards and 102 rushing yards by EJ Manuel, who became the first Seminole to pass for 300 yards and rush for 100 yards in one game since Heisman Trophy winner Charlie Ward did so in 1992.

"I don't remember him making a bad decision all night," said Florida State Head Coach Jimbo Fisher. "They were mixing up looks and bringing in blitzes from everywhere, and he made the plays that he had to."

The Tigers opened the game with a bang, as Tajh Boyd went over the top on the fifth play from scrimmage and hit DeAndre Hopkins for a 60-yard passing touchdown.

Florida State struck back just 2:40 later, as Lonnie Pryor burst off tackle for a 13-yard touchdown to even the score.

Clemson regained the lead at 14-7 when Andre Ellington rumbled in from six yards out on the ensuing possession to cap a 10-play, 79-yard drive. The Seminoles then missed a chance to narrow the gap when Dustin Hopkins' 44-yard field-goal attempt sailed wide-right.

After a Tiger punt, Florida State needed just four plays to cover 74 yards and tie the score at 14-14 with a five-yard run over right tackle by James Wilder, Jr.

"When you can't stop the run, you're going to have a long night against a team like that," stated Swinney.

Clemson soon capitalized on the game's first big mis-cue, a muffed punt by Rashad Greene at his own 30 that was recovered at the 31 by Phillip Fajgenbaum, and scored four plays later.

Boyd found tight end Brandon Ford along the sideline for a 17-yard score to give the Tigers a seven-point lead with 10:06 left in the second quarter.

Clemson stretched its lead to 14 points early in the third quarter after forcing a Seminole punt to open the second half. On a second-down play, Boyd threw a quick lateral to Sammy Watkins at his wide-receiver post. Watkins gathered himself and fired a strike across the field to a wide-open Ellington for a 52-yard touchdown that gave the Tigers a 28-14 lead with 11:48 left in the third quarter.

Tiger center Dalton Freeman said after the game that there were positives the team could take from its performance up to that point, even if there were few afterward.

"There were several opportunities that we left out there," admitted Freeman. "In the first half, they didn't really slow us down, but we sputtered a little in the third quarter, and that led to bad things in the fourth quarter. There were a lot of good things, but we have to correct the mistakes."

Florida State quickly cut the deficit back to seven points when Chris Thompson waltzed in from nine yards out on an option pitch from Manuel. After the Tigers had seemingly seized control, the Seminoles needed just three plays and 1:39 to go 75 yards to paydirt.

Clemson stretched its lead back to double-figures on its next possession, as Chandler Catanzaro booted a 50-yard field goal that made the score 31-21 with 7:07 left in the third quarter.

With the kick, Catanzaro broke Obed Ariri's school record for consecutive field goals made with his 15th in a row. Ariri's record had stood since 1980.

The Tigers' momentum was short-lived, however, as Lamarus Joyner returned the ensuing kickoff 90 yards to the Tiger 10. Two plays later, Manuel found Greene in the corner of the endzone to cut the deficit to 31-28.

"Joyner's kickoff return was a huge momentum swing in the game," said Swinney. "It lit a fire for them."

After Clemson failed to move the first-down sticks, the Seminoles took their first lead of the game with a pass from Manuel to Rodney Smith in the corner of the endzone for a 29-yard touchdown.

After another Tiger three-and-out, the Seminoles stretched their lead to 42-31 when Wilder rumbled in from five yards out for a touchdown. He carried three straight times for 44 yards to cap a seven-play, 77-yard drive.

Florida State led by as many as 18 points after a Thompson 27-yard touchdown run, but Boyd and Ford hooked up again with 2:11 left in the game for a three-yard score on fourth down to provide the final margin.

It was another record-setting day for Clemson's tandem of Tajh Boyd and DeAndre Hopkins, and more importantly for the #16 Tigers, in a crucial win in an environment that had not been kind in recent years.

Boyd, who received the Leather Helmet Award as the game's MVP, threw three touchdown passes and Hopkins set a school record with 197 receiving yards in the Tigers' 45-31 win at Boston College.

"Our guys responded all game long, so I'm really proud of them," said Head Coach Dabo Swinney. "We did a lot of good things individually. I thought we really grew up defensively in the second half."

As Swinney alluded to, the Clemson defense made two crucial stops late, an interception by reserve cornerback Garry Peters and then a pass breakup by Travis Blanks on the Eagles' final possession, to seal the win.

"Coach (Brent) Venables told me I was going to start the second half, and I was nervous," admitted Peters. "But, I went out there and I knew the defense had my back and I made some plays."

It was not all positive for Clemson's defense, but it always seemed to make the plays that mattered most. The unit recorded three sacks, two interceptions, and held the Eagles to a combined 7-21 on third and fourth-down attempts.

As has often been the case it was the offense that set the tone. Clemson rolled up 576 yards of total offense, led by Boyd, who threw for 367 yards to go along with the three passing touchdowns. Hopkins totaled 197 receiving yards, which broke the previous Tiger record of 182 by Rod Gardner against North Carolina in 2000.

"That was a goal on my list," said Hopkins. "I have to give thanks to Coach (Chad) Morris for calling the plays and putting the ball in my hands and giving me the chance to make those plays."

Boston College opened the scoring at the 10:16 mark of the first quarter, as Andre Williams found a hole and outran the Tigers for a 30-yard touchdown scamper.

However, the Tigers got on the scoreboard less than three minutes later on a 28-yard field goal by Chandler Catanzaro to cap a 12-play, 77-yard drive.

After Clemson's defense stopped Boston College three-and-out, the Tigers took their first lead of the day with 3:02 left in the first quarter on a six-yard run by Boyd, then they extended their lead to 17-7 when Boyd hit tight end Sam Cooper for a 15-yard touchdown on the opening play of the second quarter.

Boston College trimmed Clemson's lead to 17-14 midway through the second quarter, going 92 yards in eight plays and finding the endzone on a three-yard pass from Rettig to Johnathan Coleman.

After a Tiger three-and-out, Boston College regained the lead, as Rettig found Alex Amidon across the middle on fourth down. The junior wideout raced into the endzone for a 31-yard score to give the Eagles a 21-17 lead with 4:04 remaining in the second quarter.

Clemson responded by marching 76 yards in 13 plays, capped by a Boyd-to-Brandon Ford four-yard touchdown pass with 23 seconds remaining before halftime.

Roderick McDowell opened the second-half scoring with a 16-yard burst to put Clemson ahead 31-21. Three Tiger possessions later, Andre Ellington extended Clemson's lead to 38-21 on a one-yard dive over the top, made possible by Rashard Hall's interception inside Boston College territory.

The Eagles struck back quickly, as Rettig connected with Amidon for a 42-yard scoring strike that narrowed Clemson's lead to 10 points late in the third quarter.

The Tigers responded in short order when Boyd went deep to Hopkins for a 35-yard touchdown pass and a 45-28 lead.

Nate Freese cut the deficit back to 45-31 with 9:18 left on a 39-yard field goal. After the Eagles stopped Clemson on downs on the ensuing possessions, they drove as far as the Tiger 14 and looked poised to cut the lead back to one score.

Instead, Peters stepped in front of a Rettig pass at the nine-yard line for a crucial interception.

"My first career interception...it felt real good," said Peters. "The D-line got some great pressure. Their receiver beat me on that route earlier, and I felt like I couldn't let him get me again, so I jumped it and I caught it and it felt really good."

Hopkins broke Gardner's record on the second play of the ensuing drive, dragging his foot near the sideline for a 17-yard grab.

After a Tiger turnover, Blanks put the finishing touch on the victory, batting away a pass on fourth down at the Clemson 28, allowing the Tiger offense to run out the clock.

The win was just Clemson's second-ever at Alumni Stadium.

Tajh Boyd passed for 397 yards and set the Clemson career record for passing touchdowns, as the #15 Tigers scored the game's final 17 points and rolled to a 47-31 win over Georgia Tech at Memorial Stadium.

"This was a great, great win and a complete game," said Head Coach Dabo Swinney. "We won the fourth quarter, and that's where football games are won. All three phases had huge contributions."

Despite Boyd's heroics, it was Clemson's defense that helped swing the momentum. After the Tigers took a 38-31 lead with 10:29 left in the game, Chris Milton slipped and fell on the ensuing kickoff at his own two, where the Yellow Jackets began their drive.

Spencer Shuey came up with a big play two snaps later as he hauled down Orwin Smith in the endzone for a safety that gave Clemson a 40-31 lead. It was the junior's first career tackle for loss.

"We had been preparing for that play all week," said Shuey. "Once I saw the kickoff team pin them down (deep), I knew they had a pretty good chance to run the ball. I got a good read and a good jump on the ball and was able to make the play."

However, Boyd was intercepted on the ensuing possession and the Yellow Jackets looked poised to make for a close finish after they picked up 32 yards on a pass from Tevin Washington to Smith on the first play of the ensuing drive.

Instead, the Tiger defense held and forced a 37-yard field-goal attempt by placekicker David Scully. Josh Watson penetrated the line and got a hand on Scully's kick, denying the Yellow Jackets points and setting the Tigers up for 13-play, 80-yard, game-clinching drive.

"We knew he was kicking low line drives, and we knew we could get our hands on it at the beginning of the game," said Watson. "So, Grady (Jarrett) helped me out. We had two guys on one of the guards, and I put my hands up and blocked it."

While Shuey's and Watson's plays helped the Tigers pull away, it was the play of Boyd and the offense that put them in position to win.

Boyd rushed for 63 yards, including 49 yards in the fourth quarter, to give him 460 yards of total offense. Boyd connected with DeAndre Hopkins for touchdowns of 58 and 35 yards for his 50th and 51st career passing touchdowns, breaking Charlie Whitehurst's Tiger record of 49. For his efforts, Hopkins was named ACC Receiver-of-the-Week.

Boyd chalked up his statistical achievements to being a product of the Tigers' offensive system, which produced 601 yards. Offensive guard Tyler Shatley, who earned ACC Offensive Lineman-of-the-Week honors, had a team-high four knockdowns to lead the way to the 601-yard effort.

"Every record is meant to be broken," said Boyd. "It's an exciting opportunity, but a great guy had it in Charlie. We're trying to build legacies here, and it feels like we're breaking records every week. But the main thing we need to focus on is continuing to win."

The Clemson defense made the game's first momentum-changing play on the Yellow Jackets' first drive, as

Quandon Christian and Jonathan Willard stopped Washington on a fourth-and-one play to give the Tigers the ball at the Georgia Tech 37.

Boyd then scored the game's first points on a one-yard dive in the first quarter.

Georgia Tech struck back in short order, as it needed just four plays to go 83 yards and find the endzone on a 16-yard pass from Washington to Jeff Greene.

Clemson regained the lead on its next drive with a 23-yard field goal by Chandler Catanzaro, then Georgia Tech took its first lead of the game late in the first quarter on a 13-yard touchdown run by Smith.

The Tigers responded by going 75 yards in 13 plays and regained the advantage on a two-yard touchdown run by Roderick McDowell with 12:21 left in the first half.

Clemson got the ball back by forcing its first three-and-out of the game, as Tavaris Barnes and Jarrett tackled Washington for a loss on third down.

Nine plays later, Catanzaro extended Clemson's lead to 20-14 on a 20-yard field goal, but Georgia Tech responded again with a march of its own, as Washington capped a seven-play, 85-yard drive with a one-yard touchdown plunge to put the Yellow Jackets ahead 21-20 with 5:04 remaining in the first half.

The Tigers took the lead right back, as Boyd scrambled and found Hopkins all alone near the sideline for a 58-yard touchdown and a 27-21 lead, which was the score at half-time.

Georgia Tech seized the lead back on the first possession of the second half, as Washington's four-yard touchdown run made the score 28-27.

After the teams traded turnovers, with Jarrett recovering a fumble at the Clemson seven on fourth down to spoil a potential Georgia Tech scoring drive, the Tigers moved back in front on a 21-yard field goal by Catanzaro that capped a 14-play, 90-yard drive and took 5:27 off the clock.

Georgia Tech moved back in front 31-30 on the ensuing possession on Scully's 26-yard field goal with 13:03 left in the fourth quarter.

The Tigers responded quickly and went 75 yards in eight plays, finding the endzone on a leaping grab by Hopkins for a 35-yard touchdown from Boyd. Clemson went for two points and pulled off a nifty gadget play, snapping to Ellington, who pitched to Hopkins, who threw to Boyd for the conversion and a 38-31 lead.

After Shuey's play that led to the safety and Watson's blocked kick, McDowell scored on a one-yard plunge with 50 seconds left in the game to cap a 13-play, 80-yard drive that provided the final margin of 47-31.

"That was a huge, huge win for our team," said Swinney. "It was a momentum win. That was something we talked a lot about. We were really trying to build some momentum going into the open date. I'm really proud of them."

In a game where Clemson's offense uncharacteristically struggled, its defense rose to the occasion, coming up with three interceptions and holding Virginia Tech to just seven second-half points in a 38-17 win at Memorial Stadium.

"We improved today," said Defensive Coordinator Brent Venables. "I'm really happy for the guys. This is the first time we feel like it wasn't just one quarter...we played well enough for four quarters to give ourselves a chance to win."

The win marked the 11th straight at home for the #13 Tigers, who tied a school record that was last accomplished in 1991.

"The reason that's a big deal is that it's step in the right direction toward creating a culture that you have to have if you're going to be a great program and a consistent program," stated Swinney. "You have to win at home."

After Clemson's offense went three-and-out to open the contest, the Hokies found the endzone seven plays later when Logan Thomas connected with Corey Fuller for a 29-yard touchdown and a 7-0 lead with 10:28 left in the first quarter.

The Tigers dented the scoreboard on the final play of the first quarter, as Chandler Catanzaro made a 27-yard field goal to cap a 13-play, 73-yard drive. The defense helped set up the score by stopping the Hokies on a fourth-down play at the Clemson 18.

Clemson took its first lead with 9:29 remaining in the second quarter when Tajh Boyd dove over the line from one yard out for a touchdown and a 10-7 lead. The Tigers caught a break to set up the score when Spencer Benton's punt bounced off a Virginia Tech player and was recovered by Tony Steward at the Hokie 26. Six plays and 1:53 later, Boyd reached paydirt.

"Creating that turnover on special teams was huge," said Swinney, whose team had a 43-23 advantage in average starting field position. "We talk about that all the time, making an impact on special teams, and we did that."

The Clemson defense then added to the lead, as Jonathan Meeks picked off a Thomas pass at the Tiger 26 and raced 74 yards for a touchdown to make the score 17-7. The interception was Meeks' second of the day.

"The two receivers ran some underneath, shallow routes and Thomas overthrew the receiver," said Meeks, who was named ACC Defensive Back-of-the-Week. "I was able to get a good break on it. The guys blocked for me and helped me take it to the house."

Virginia Tech pulled back within one score before half-time, as Cody Journell made a 40-yard field goal with three seconds left to cap a nine-play, 52-yard drive.

The Tigers stretched their lead back out to 24-10 with 4:30 left in the third quarter on a 12-yard touchdown run by Andre Ellington, who started outside, cut back inside, and beat a pair of Hokie defenders to the goal line for a touchdown.

"He doesn't lose a lot of yards, and it seems like he is always moving," said Swinney of Ellington.

The touchdown was set up by a 27-yard connection from Boyd to Sammy Watkins two plays earlier.

After the Tiger defense forced a three-and-out, Boyd hit DeAndre Hopkins for a 37-yard touchdown pass just three plays and 50 seconds later to extend the Clemson lead to 31-10 with 0:50 left in the third quarter.

Clemson was forced to punt after just one first down on its next drive, then Thomas scored on a 19-yard run four plays later to cap a 61-yard drive and make the score 31-17 with 9:52 remaining in the game.

The Hokies forced a three-and-out and tried to throw a wrinkle at the Tigers in hopes of making it a one-score game. Thomas threw a lateral to wideout Marcus Davis, who gathered himself and threw across the field. Davis' pass was picked off by Xavier Brewer to set Clemson up at the Virginia Tech 41.

From there, Clemson drained most of the clock with a nine-play drive that lasted 5:22, culminating in a one-yard touchdown by Boyd on fourth down to put the game out of reach.

"This was big for our team," said Meeks of the defense's effort. "This will make the team bond a little better and know we have each other's backs."

Clemson's defensive performance was highlighted by Meeks' two interceptions and fellow safety Rashard Hall, who had 13 tackles. Spencer Shuey added a game-high 15 tackles and 2.5 tackles for loss as well.

"Our defense is continuing to get better," said Swinney. "Anyone who's really paid attention to us, especially the last three games, has seen that we've improved and we're getting better. They're playing with great energy."

"They're taking pride in knowing what to do. They're starting to really understand it and apply the lessons that they're learning from week to week, and it's showing up."

Dabo Swinney is quick to debunk what he calls “voodoo,” the strange phenomenon that leads to things such as Clemson being 1-9 all-time in ESPN Thursday night games. It appears the Tiger head coach has turned his team into staunch nonbelievers, too.

“Thursday night is just Thursday night to us,” said Jonathan Meeke in the aftermath of the #13 Tigers’ 42-13 win over Wake Forest in Winston-Salem, NC.

Clemson emphatically exorcised those demons on this particular Thursday night, as Tajh Boyd set a school record with 428 passing yards and five touchdowns, all in the first half, in the rout of the Demon Deacons, the Tigers’ fourth straight victory in the series. For his efforts, he was named ACC Offensive Back-of-the-Week.

“Everyone has been reminding me all week that Clemson is 1-9 in Thursday night games,” admitted Swinney after the Tigers improved that mark to 2-9. “So maybe we can start a new tradition now of winning those games.”

The night also served as a 2012 coming-out party of sorts for Sammy Watkins, as the sophomore became the first player in Clemson history to accumulate 200 receiving yards in a game. He finished with eight receptions for 202 yards, eclipsing the century mark for the first time in 2012 and topping his previous career high of 155 receiving yards prior to halftime with 177 yards.

“I played within the system and got great balls from Tajh,” explained Watkins, who earned ACC Receiver-of-the-Week honors. “I’m getting back in the groove.”

After punts on its first two possessions, Clemson finally got rolling on its third drive. On a second-down play, Boyd found a wide-open Watkins on a 57-yard pass down the sideline to set the Tigers up at the Wake Forest 10. Three plays later, Boyd connected with Brandon Ford on third down for a nine-yard touchdown and a 7-0 lead.

On the first play of the second quarter, Boyd and Watkins hooked up for another big play, this time a 61-yard touchdown pass, as Watkins ran a deep out route, outran a pair of defenders, and tiptoed down the sideline to put the Tigers up 14-0.

“Coach (Chad) Morris called the plays aggressive this week, and I played aggressive,” said Watkins. “We came out and executed all the plays he called.”

After Jonathan Willard helped force a Wake Forest punt with a third-down sack, Clemson added to its lead in short order, going 80 yards in seven plays. Boyd hit Sam Cooper over the middle for an 11-yard touchdown strike.

The Tigers added to the lead and Boyd to his touchdown-pass tally on their next possession, as DeAndre Hopkins caught a 12-yard scoring pass to cap a six-play, 68-yard drive that put Clemson up 28-0.

The Tigers got the ball right back, as Josh Watson recovered a Wake Forest fumble caused by Cortez Davis on the Demon Deacon 19. Four plays later, Boyd threw his fifth touchdown pass of the first half to a fifth different receiver, this time a two-yard fade route to Charone Peake.

“Charone has been awesome since last spring and has had a heck of a year,” said Swinney. “It was really good to see that from him. We gave him the opportunity there, and it was a well-executed route.”

Wake Forest finally dented the scoreboard with 12 seconds left in the first half when Tanner Price hit Tommy Bohanon for an eight-yard touchdown pass to make the score 35-7.

Price and Bohanon hooked up again to open the second-half scoring with an 18-yard touchdown with 7:45 left in the third quarter that trimmed the deficit to 35-13.

D.J. Howard stretched the Tigers’ lead back out to 42-13 with a one-yard touchdown run that capped a 13-play, 86-yard drive and provided the final score.

Clemson’s good work was not limited solely to its offense. The defense also turned one of its best performances of the season, as it recorded five sacks.

Boyd stayed in the game just long enough to surpass Charlie Whitehurst’s school record of 420 passing yards, set against Duke in 2002. The recordbreaker came on a 37-yard pass to Martavis Bryant midway through the fourth quarter.

“I wasn’t really going for the record,” said Boyd. “I’m not going to lie, I wanted to go for 400 (passing yards). To break the record topped it off, but the major part about it is we won, and that’s all we really worry about.”

Broken records are becoming a bit like, well, a broken record for the Clemson offense.

Tajh Boyd threw five first-half touchdown passes and DeAndre Hopkins hauled in three of them in the first quarter alone, as #9 Clemson rolled up 718 yards of offense in thumping Duke 56-20 at Wallace Wade Stadium. It was the first-ever night game in the history of the series.

Along the way, Boyd broke Woodrow Dantzler's school record for career touchdown responsibility and Hopkins did the same to receiving touchdown marks both on a career and season basis, as the Tigers amassed 33 first downs and 384 passing yards.

"We believed if they were going to play man coverage in the secondary, we could be successful like we were against Wake Forest," said Tiger Head Coach Dabo Swinney. "Tajh was terrific in the first half, and 'Nuk' (Hopkins) continues to set records."

And so does the Clemson offense. It was just the second time in Tiger history that Clemson reached the 700-yard mark, while the 56 points were the most ever by the Tigers at Wallace Wade Stadium.

The Tigers wasted little time getting on the scoreboard, as they marched 76 yards on their opening drive and found the endzone on a five-yard fade route from Boyd to Hopkins for a 7-0 lead.

Duke's first possession also netted points, as the Blue Devils drove 54 yards in 12 plays, capped by a 46-yard field goal by Ross Martin.

Boyd and Hopkins hooked up again for a touchdown just four plays later to build the lead to 14-3. Hopkins beat his man down the middle of the field for a 58-yard touchdown reception.

In his typically humble fashion, Boyd deflected the credit for his achievements.

"There are not too many quarterbacks who can say they have the type of receivers that I have here," stated Boyd, who was named ACC Offensive Back-of-the-Week. "Even beyond 'Nuk' and Sammy, all of those guys are unbelievable players. They have been working hard, and it's always fun to see those guys come out and make plays."

Duke struck right back, as Sean Renfree found Jamison Crowder just two plays and 17 seconds later on a 77-yard touchdown pass that made the score 14-10 with 7:02 left in the first quarter.

Hopkins hauled in his third touchdown of the quarter on the ensuing drive, breaking open down the sideline and coasting into the endzone for a 45-yard reception that made the score 21-10. The touchdown reception was the 13th of the season for Hopkins, which set a Clemson single-season record, and also put the junior over the 1,000-yard mark on the season.

"Records are just records," said Hopkins, who finished with four receptions for 128 yards. "They are meant to be broken. And one day, someone is going to break my records. It feels good for the time being that I have them, but that's not my main goal or my focus."

Watkins got into the act on the Tigers' next drive, hauling in a 30-yard touchdown to cap a seven-play, 80-yard drive with 16 seconds left in the first quarter.

Duke cut Clemson's lead to 28-17 early in the second quarter when Brandon Connette hit tight end David Reeves for a 17-yard touchdown.

Boyd soon threw his fifth touchdown pass of the first half, this time hitting Martavis Bryant for a 41-yard score to give Clemson a 35-17 lead.

Boyd accounted for another touchdown late in the first half, this time with his feet, as he darted in from 21 yards out one play after Watkins set Clemson up in Duke territory with a 30-yard grab down the sideline.

For the second contest in a row, Boyd threw five touchdowns in the first half, which matched the school record for an entire game, but he was unable to add to that tally after halftime on either occasion to set another record. Clemson also amassed 487 yards of total offense in the first half.

"Tajh was awesome tonight," said Tiger center Dalton Freeman. "He made all the right calls. We knew we could hit some big plays to 'Nuk' and Sammy."

The scoring slowed down after halftime, but Clemson built its lead to 49-17 on a one-yard touchdown run by D.J. Howard that capped a 10-play, 69-yard drive in the third quarter.

Martin split the uprights on a 47-yard field goal for Duke on the ensuing possession to trim its deficit to 49-20 late in the third quarter.

Backup signal-caller Cole Stoudt picked up where Boyd left off and threw a touchdown pass early in the fourth quarter, as he found Charone Peake for a 12-yard score on a fourth-down play that capped an 11-play, 86-yard drive and provided the final score of 56-20.

"It was great to get some action with the second team on both sides of the ball," said Swinney.

Clemson won its fourth game away from home for just the second time in the last 15 years thanks in large part to the offensive line. Brandon Thomas was named ACC Offensive Lineman-of-the-Week for his efforts.

"Overall, we continue to respond and play as a team," said Swinney. "It feels great to get a fourth win away from home. This was a dominant performance, and I am proud of our team."

Clemson set an ACC record with its eighth straight game with at least 37 points. It was also just the second time in history that Clemson totaled at least 300 rushing yards and 300 passing yards in one game.

Facing a Maryland team ravaged by injuries, #8 Clemson showed little sympathy at Memorial Stadium.

The Tigers scored the game's first two touchdowns just 12 seconds apart and rolled up 35 points before halftime for the third straight game on the way to a 45-10 win on Homecoming.

"There is no doubt we came ready to play," said Head Coach Dabo Swinney. "We were ready from the opening snap."

With the victory, Clemson set a school record with its 12th straight win at Memorial Stadium, dating to the 2011 season-opener against Troy.

On their fifth starting quarterback this season and without their leading rusher, receiver, and tackler, the Terrapins were no match for a Tiger team that won its sixth straight game in ACC play by a margin of at least 14 points.

The Tigers opened the scoring on their second offensive possession with a diving 13-yard grab in the endzone by Adam Humphries for his first career touchdown and a 7-0 lead.

"It was a little crossing route, and thankfully Tajh (Boyd) put it out in a hole for me," recalled Humphries. "I was hidden behind a linebacker and didn't really see the ball until the last second. I was thankful that I was in the right place."

Clemson added to its lead on the next play from scrimmage. The ball slipped out of quarterback Shawn Petty's hand as he attempted to throw, and defensive end Corey Crawford scooped up the fumble and returned it 16 yards for a touchdown and a 14-0 lead with 7:07 left in the first quarter.

"Those don't come every day," said Crawford of his first career score. "The feeling is indescribable. I'm so happy right now."

The two Tiger touchdowns came just 12 seconds apart, which established the shortest interval between touchdowns in Clemson history. The previous record was 14 seconds, which was the time span between two Derrick Hamilton touchdowns against Duke in 2003.

After Xavier Brewer caused a fumble and Malliciah Goodman recovered the ball later in the first quarter, Boyd hooked up with DeAndre Hopkins for a 28-yard touchdown seven plays and 53 yards later to extend the Clemson lead to 21-0.

Clemson stretched its lead to 28-0 on its next possession, as Boyd hit Brandon Ford for a 22-yard touchdown down the sideline to cap a seven-play, 60-yard drive.

Maryland finally dented the scoreboard after recovering a muffed punt at the Tiger 18. Two plays later, Petty found Devonte Campbell wide open for a 17-yard touchdown.

Andre Ellington added another touchdown for the Tigers on their next possession, scampering in from six yards to make the score 35-7 after he had bulled over a tackler en route to a 13-yard gain on the previous play. The score marked the third straight game the Tigers scored at least 35 points in the first half, a first in program history.

"We wanted to come out strong early," said center Dalton Freeman. "Traditionally, Clemson football hasn't been very consistent, and we're trying to put all that to bed. We

were glad to be able to come out and jump on them early like we did."

Chandler Catanzaro made the score 38-7 with a 22-yard field goal on Clemson's first possession of the second half after Martavis Bryant's 48-yard reception along the sideline set the Tigers up deep in Terrapin territory.

Maryland got those three points back with a field goal of its own, a 39-yard kick by Brad Craddock that was set up by a 74-yard return of a missed field-goal attempt by the Tigers. Craddock's field goal made the score 38-10 with 3:24 left in the third quarter.

Clemson built its lead to 45-10 early in the fourth quarter, as Cole Stoudt directed a 16-play, 76-yard drive that took 6:38 off the clock and culminated in a four-yard touchdown strike to Stanton Seckinger. The score was the first of Seckinger's career.

"I've told my players that now is the time when top-10 teams separate themselves from the pack," said Swinney. "The end of November is when it matters. We need to play our best football down the stretch."

The Tiger defense played one of its best games of the season, as it held the Terrapins to 180 yards, including only 41 passing yards. Maryland was just 1-13 on third-down conversions, as its one successful third-down conversion came on its first attempt of the game.

Even as well as Clemson had been playing, some still wondered how it might respond to adversity. Facing its largest deficit at home this season (24-13) to N.C. State, the Tigers showed them by scoring 42 consecutive points.

The 62-48 win over the Wolfpack at Memorial Stadium gave #9 Clemson its first 10-win regular season since the 1981 National Championship season.

"That's the first time we've faced adversity in awhile," said senior center Dalton Freeman, who was named ACC Offensive Lineman-of-the-Week. "I think that speaks a lot about this team and the character we have. We've been taking care of business pretty early these past few games, and it was good for us to go out there, face some adversity, and overcome it."

The game was the most prolific in Memorial Stadium history from an offensive standpoint, both in terms of yardage and scoring. The two teams combined for 1,351 yards and 110 points, both totals that bested marks set in Clemson's memorable 82-24 win over Wake Forest in 1981.

Tajh Boyd, who was named ACC Offensive Back-of-the-Week, totaled 426 passing yards and five touchdowns along with 103 rushing yards and three more touchdowns on the ground to lead the Tigers. He became the first player in ACC history to account for eight touchdowns in a game.

Andre Ellington went over the century mark with 124 rushing yards, while Sammy Watkins (110) and Brandon Ford (101) reached the century mark in receiving yards.

Clemson got on the scoreboard with a field goal on the opening drive of the game, as Chandler Catanzaro made a 46-yarder. After the defense forced a three-and-out, Clemson added to its lead on a four-yard touchdown run by Boyd to make the score 10-0.

The Tiger defense again held N.C. State without a first down on its next possession, and Catanzaro added another field goal, this time from 43 yards out.

But the Wolfpack struck back on the next play from scrimmage. Mike Glennon hit Tobais Palmer down the sideline for a 77-yard touchdown pass.

After the Clemson offense went three-and-out, N.C. State again scored on the first play of its ensuing possession, as Glennon and Palmer hooked up again, this time on a post pattern for a 49-yard touchdown and a 14-13 lead. Just 1:12 after the Tigers went up 13-0, they suddenly found themselves trailing.

After another Tiger punt, N.C. State extended its lead to 21-13 on an 18-yard touchdown pass from Glennon to Rashard Smith. Juston Burris intercepted a Boyd pass, then Niklas Sade made a 32-yard field goal to stretch the Wolfpack's lead to 24-13 early in the second quarter.

The 11-point deficit at that point was the largest Clemson had faced since its only loss of the season at Florida State on September 22.

The Tigers cut into the deficit on the ensuing drive, as Boyd hit Brandon Ford for a seven-yard score that made it 24-19 before they failed on a two-point conversion try.

The Tigers got the ball back on a fourth-down stop, which was led by Corey Crawford and Grady Jarrett. Four plays later, Boyd hooked up with Watkins for a 27-yard

catch-and-run for a touchdown. This time, the Tigers converted the two-point try for a 27-24 lead. Less than four minutes after Clemson faced its largest deficit at home all season, it already had the lead back.

The Wolfpack looked poised to regain the lead on the ensuing possession, but after driving 83 yards in 11 plays to the Tiger nine, Rashard Hall picked off Glennon in the endzone to keep Clemson on top.

Five plays later, Boyd found a wide-open DeAndre Hopkins streaking down the N.C. State sideline for a 62-yard touchdown that gave the Tigers a 34-24 lead with 2:22 left before halftime. Hopkins became Clemson's all-time leader in career receiving yards on the catch.

"We really don't panic as an offense, because we know we can put up points against anyone," said Hopkins. "We knew there were a couple of things we needed to draw up in the dirt and a couple of things they were doing that we hadn't seen on film. We had to come out and play our game and do what we do best."

On the next play from scrimmage, Malliciah Goodman sacked Glennon and forced a fumble, which was recovered by Crawford to set the Tigers up at the N.C. State 32. Four plays later, Boyd sprinted in from nine yards out to give the Tigers a 41-24 lead, which was the halftime score.

Clemson needed four minutes of the third quarter to find the endzone again, as Boyd hit a wide-open Martavis Bryant in the middle of the field for a 40-yard touchdown.

With the touchdown, Boyd broke his own ACC record for touchdown responsibility with his 39th of the season, surpassing the previous mark of 38 that he set in 2011.

Boyd added to that total on the Tigers' next drive, as he kept the ball on an option play and took it in from nine yards out. After trailing 24-13 in the second quarter, the Tigers had scored the next 42 points to take a 55-24 lead.

N.C. State finally broke its scoring drought with 3:55 left in the third quarter when Shadrach Thornton reached the endzone on a 16-yard run.

N.C. State wasted little time in scoring again, as Earl Wolff intercepted a Boyd pass three plays later and returned it 19 yards to the Clemson six. On the next play, N.C. State scored on its fourth one-play drive of the night when Glennon connected with Mario Carter to cut the Tigers' lead to 55-38. Glennon was 29-53 passing for 493 yards and five touchdowns in the game.

Clemson needed just three plays to respond. Boyd hit Ford, and the tight end broke into the open field, rumbling 69 yards for a touchdown to tie Dwayne Allen's single-season record for a Tiger tight end with his eighth touchdown reception of the season.

N.C. State struck back by marching 56 yards in 10 plays and finding the endzone on another Glennon-to-Palmer connection, this time a 29-yarder that made the score 62-45 inside the opening minute of the fourth quarter.

N.C. State pulled back within 14 points at 62-48 on a 40-yard field goal by Sade with 7:35 remaining, but that turned out to be the last score of the game.

Vic Beasley led the Tiger defense with three of the team's four sacks, as he earned ACC Co-Defensive Line-man-of-the-Week honors for his efforts.

For the first time all season, an opponent figured out how to keep Clemson's offense under 20 points.

The #9 Tigers scored just three points after the first quarter and totaled only 19 plays after halftime, as they saw their school-record 13-game home winning streak come to an end at the hands of #12 South Carolina by a score of 27-17 at Memorial Stadium.

"We got off to a good start by scoring two touchdowns in the first quarter, but they started to control the ball after that," said Head Coach Dabo Swinney. "Give them credit... they did a great job. Their ability to put pressure on Tajh (Boyd) was key."

That pressure was led by sophomore defensive end Jadeveon Clowney, who finished with seven tackles and a Memorial Stadium record 4.5 sacks.

Clemson finished the game with 328 yards of total offense, while Boyd completed just 11-24 passes for 183 yards and two interceptions.

After the two teams traded punts to start the game, Clemson opened the scoring by methodically marching 85 yards to find the endzone on a three-yard run by Boyd on a third-and-goal play.

The Gamecocks answered with their own touchdown on the ensuing drive, as Dylan Thompson hit Bruce Ellington for a 13-yard touchdown pass to cap a seven-play, 63-yard drive to tie the score.

The Tigers needed just two plays and 24 seconds to respond. Roderick McDowell sprinted 32 yards down the sideline to open the drive. On the next play, Boyd passed down the same sideline to DeAndre Hopkins, who beat a pair of Gamecock defenders to the ball for a 43-yard touchdown and a 14-7 lead. The score marked the ninth consecutive game with a touchdown catch for Hopkins, who matched the ACC record set by Herman Moore (Virginia) in 1990.

South Carolina cut into the deficit with a 27-yard field goal by Adam Yates with 2:40 left in the second quarter that made the score 14-10.

The Gamecocks took their first lead of the game on the first possession of the second half, as Thompson found Ace Sanders for a 34-yard touchdown on a third-and-16 play. The drive covered 85 yards in 10 plays and put South Carolina ahead 17-14.

On the night, Thompson threw for 310 yards and three scores on 23-41 passing, while he also rushed for 38 yards.

"We couldn't disrupt him (Thompson)," admitted Swinney. "He threw the ball incredibly well. He was the difference in the game."

Yates extended the Gamecocks' lead to 20-14 with a 43-yard field goal later in the third quarter.

Clemson got those three points right back, however, as Chandler Catanzaro made a 37-yard field goal to pull the Tigers back to 20-17. Jaron Brown's leaping 38-yard grab over a Gamecock defender on the opening play of the drive was key in Clemson moving the ball 56 yards.

Xavier Brewer made sure the score stayed that way on the next drive. After two pass-interference penalties, one on fourth down and the other on third down, extended South Carolina's drive, Brewer came up with a sack to force

another third down. He then picked off a Thompson pass in the back of the endzone to squelch a 15-play, 50-yard march and give the Tigers the ball back with 13:23 left in the game.

Brewer, who was named ACC Defensive Back-of-the-Week, had a game-high 12 tackles, three tackles for loss, one sack, an interception, and two pass breakups.

"After that interception in the endzone, we felt like we could reclaim the lead, but they made some big plays to keep us off balance and we couldn't turn the table," said Swinney.

The Gamecocks came up with an interception on the ensuing possession, and their offense then marched 65 yards in 13 plays and found the endzone with a six-yard pass from Thompson to a wide-open Ellington to give South Carolina a 10-point lead with just 4:17 remaining and provide the final margin. The drive was extended on a 20-yard run by Thompson on third-and-19 deep in Tiger territory.

"Nineteen plays in the second half...it makes it that much more important to take advantage of the opportunities you do have," said Boyd. "It was a learning lesson here and a life lesson as well, and we have to come back and get ready for a bowl game."

Talk about responding to adversity. And talk about ringing in the New Year with a bang.

Clemson must have thought it was in for a long night after what could only be called the most inauspicious of starts. Instead, Clemson showed the mettle to produce one of its most meaningful wins in recent history.

Trailing 24-13 to #7 Louisiana State entering the fourth quarter, Dabo Swinney's team came off the mat to score three times in the final stanza against one of the nation's staunchest defenses. Chandler Catanzaro's 37-yard field goal as time expired lifted #13 Clemson to a 25-24 victory in the Chick-fil-A Bowl in the Georgia Dome.

Clemson won the game despite never leading at any point of the game until the clock read 0:00 in the fourth quarter.

"This is a landmark win," said Swinney. "An 11th win for the first time in 31 years and only the fourth time ever (1948, 1978, 1981). The 2012 team now hitches their saddle up with those three elite teams in our program's history."

After Clemson pulled within two points with 2:47 left in the game on a 12-yard touchdown strike from Tajh Boyd to DeAndre Hopkins, it was unable to pull even when Boyd's pass on the two-point attempt fell incomplete.

But the Clemson defense quickly got the ball back to its offense by forcing a three-and-out with 1:39 remaining, and Boyd engineered a drive that covered 60 yards in 10 plays and culminated in Catanzaro's game-winner.

"It was unbelievable," stated Catanzaro. "I have to thank the team for setting me up. It seemed like that last drive was meant to be."

However, things got off to a rocky start for Clemson.

Clemson turned the ball over on the second play from scrimmage, as Sammy Watkins was hit by Barkevious Mingo after taking a handoff and fumbled the ball.

Two plays later, Louisiana State cashed in. Jeremy Hill burst off tackle and cruised into the endzone for a 17-yard touchdown run and a 7-0 lead. Making matters worse, Watkins was lost for the night after suffering an injury on the play.

"We knew we were going to have some adversity hit us in the face; we just didn't know it was going to be the second play of the game," said Offensive Coordinator Chad Morris. "We had a huge gameplan built around Sammy, so we had to do a lot of cutting and pasting and adjusting. But what a great job our guys did of stepping up against an unbelievable defense."

With things already looking bleak, the ACC Tigers mustered a big-time response against the vaunted Louisiana State defense, marching 75 yards in 11 plays and finding the endzone on an 11-yard run by Boyd to tie the score 7-7.

Clemson also stiffened on defense and recorded four sacks in the first quarter, the most by the ACC Tigers in a quarter in 2012.

Louisiana State jumped back on top early in the second quarter, however, as it capped an eight-play, 65-yard drive with a six-yard touchdown pass from Zach Mettenberger to Jarvis Landry and led 14-7.

Later in the quarter, Clemson marched the ball 70 yards in eight plays and found the endzone on an 11-yard touchdown pass from Boyd to Hopkins to make the score 14-13 before Catanzaro's point-after attempt was blocked.

Clemson's defense continued to provide its offense chances, forcing its fourth three-and-out of the first half on the ensuing possession and later coming up with an interception by Travis Blanks.

Clemson could not cash in and it trailed at halftime for the first time all season despite outgaining Louisiana State 248-106 and rolling up 18 first downs to the SEC Tigers' six.

As badly as the first half started for Clemson, the second half followed suit. Michael Ford returned the second-half kickoff 43 yards, and on the next play, Hill rumbled 57 yards to paydirt for a touchdown and a 21-13 lead just 17 seconds after halftime.

Louisiana State added to its lead with 4:49 left in the third quarter on a 20-yard field goal by Drew Alleman after it took over at the Clemson 29 on a fumble.

By that point, Louisiana State's pass rushers had begun to assert their will against a Clemson offensive line that had lost one of its starting tackles (Gifford Timothy) to an injury in the first half.

The ACC Tigers got their offense back on track on their first drive of the fourth quarter, marching 63 yards in 13 plays before settling for a 26-yard Catanzaro field goal that pulled Clemson back within eight points.

Clemson's defense continued to do its part and got the ball right back to its offense, as Malliciah Goodman and Grady Jarrett combined for Clemson's sixth sack of the game on third down.

Goodman, one of the seniors playing his last game, finished with a career-high three sacks on the night.

"I had to sell-out," said Goodman. "I knew it was my last game. I had to be that senior leader. It felt great out there. It was a great environment, a great game, top-10 teams, and it was intense."

The offense took advantage of the opportunity, as Boyd engineered an 11-play, 77-yard drive and hit Hopkins in the back of the endzone for a 12-yard touchdown pass to make the score 24-22 with 2:47 left in the game.

The two-point try failed, but Clemson's defense once again did its job by forcing a quick three-and-out. A touchback on the ensuing punt gave Clemson the ball at its own 20 with 1:39 left in the game.

At that point, Boyd worked his magic, hitting Hopkins for a 26-yard strike on fourth-and-16 to get the drive rolling. He eventually completed his last five passes of the game to set up Catanzaro's game-winning kick.

"That drive (that lasted 1:39) was like 10 to 15 minutes to us," stated Boyd, who was named Chick-fil-A Bowl Offensive Most Outstanding Player. "When I saw that clock and that we had three timeouts, I said, 'Let's get it.' It didn't look promising after the first few plays, but it became a special moment."
