CHARLOTTE, N.C. – No. 3 Clemson and No. 5 Georgia played only the fourth season opener between two AP Top 5 teams since 2000, as Georgia won a defensive slugfest with the Tigers, 10-3, at Bank of America Stadium in Charlotte.

James Skalski finished with a game-high 14 tackles as the Clemson held Georgia's offense to just three points. The lone touchdown of the contest came in the second quarter, when quarterback DJ Uiagalelei threw his first career interception to snap his interception-free streak of 128 consecutive passes, which Georgia's Christopher Smith returned 74 yards for a touchdown.

Clemson's stout defense allowed only 256 total yards. The 10 points surrendered also marked the eighth time in history that Clemson held an AP Top 5 opponent to 10 or fewer points. It was Clemson's first loss when holding an opponent fewer than 23 points since 2010.

Clemson was led offensively by wide receiver Joseph Ngata, who finished the game with six catches for 110 yards, and quarterback DJ Uiagalelei, who was 19-for-37 with 178 yards passing. Ngata recorded his first career 100-yard game.

Clemson was hampered offensively by a 7-1 deficit in sacks. The Tigers ultimately got the board with 9:08 left in the fourth quarter on a 22-yard field goal from B.T. Potter.

True freshman guard Marcus Tate and true freshman safety Andrew Mukuba both started, marking only the second time since 1973 that Clemson has had two true freshmen start a season opener (tight end Jeff Wells and center James Farr in 1980).

The loss concluded Clemson's streak of 127 consecutive games since losing back-to-back contests, the longest such streak in ACC history.

CLEMSON, S.C. – Five different Tigers found the end zone and Clemson amassed 262 passing and 242 rushing yards, as the sixth-ranked Tigers downed SC State, 49-3. A stadium full of 78,609 fans gathered to celebrate Clemson's first home contest of the season, as well as tributes to 9/11 first responders and C.J. Spiller's College Football Hall of Fame induction.

DJ Uiagalelei finished the day 14-for-24 for 171 yards and a touchdown while also scampering for 23 yards and two touchdowns on five carries. Will Shipley led the Tigers' ground game, carrying the ball 80 yards on eight carries for two touchdowns. Thirteen different players caught a pass, led by Justyn Ross, who scored his first touchdown since the 2019 ACC Championship Game vs. Virginia prior to missing the 2020 season.

Clemson's defense held SC State to 235 total yards of offense and held an opponent without an offensive touchdown for the second-straight game. Ruke Orhoro and Jeremiah Trotter, Jr. tied for the team lead in tackles with five each, while Trotter led the team in solo tackles with four. Clemson tallied one sack on the day but combined for 10 tackles for loss.

The bulk of the Tigers' offense came in the first quarter, when Clemson put up 28 consecutive points in the opening frame. The Tigers jumped out to a 35-0 lead with just under 7:00 left in the second quarter, before the Bulldogs got on the board just before half with a 27-yard field goal.

CLEMSON, S.C. – Clemson freshman running back Will Shipley scored two touchdowns as No. 6 Clemson Tigers used a late defensive stand to hold on for a 14-8 victory over Georgia Tech. The victory was the Tigers' 30th consecutive home victory, the 24th home winning streak of 30 or more games in FBS history.

The game saw a one hour and 52 minute lightning delay with 0:32 to play in the first half, spanning 5:03 p.m. to 6:55 p.m., including an observed halftime.

After Shipley's first touchdown in the first quarter, Georgia Tech kept the Tigers close throughout, getting on the board first with a field goal after the lightning delay. The Jackets scored all eight of their points after the delay, and recovered an onside kick with 1:19 to play in the game and the Tigers ahead by eight. However, the Clemson defense held as the Yellow Jackets were stopped on fourth-and-goal at the two-yard line, marking a third straight game for Clemson without surrendering a touchdown on defense.

The Yellow Jackets added two final points on a safety with 0:07 seconds to play in the contest.

Shipley scored the lone touchdown in the first half on a three-yard run that capped an eight-play 39-yard drive, and his second touchdown came in the fourth quarter on another three-yard run that capped a 14-play 66-yard drive.

Brent Cimaglia would make two field goals of 22 yards for Georgia Tech.

With his two rushing touchdowns in the game, Shipley became the first Clemson player to rush for multiple touchdowns in consecutive games as a true freshman since Travis Etienne in 2017. He finished the night with 21 carries for 88 yards and two touchdowns.

RALEIGH, N.C. – No. 9 Clemson fell, 27-21, to NC State in double overtime. Clemson mounted a late touchdown drive to force overtime and led briefly in the extra session before NC State halted the Tigers on 4th-and-5 in double overtime after a touchdown.

DJ Uiagalelei started the scoring for the Tigers with a 32-yard strike to Justyn Ross, who leaped and toe-tapped in the back of the end zone. The Wolfpack answered two drives later when Devin Leary hit Emeka Emezie on a 17-yard score. Both teams remained scoreless until midway through the third quarter, when Leary hit Devin Carter to give the Wolfpack a 14-7 lead with 9:19 to play.

The Tigers answered with 10:52 to play in the fourth quarter, when Will Shipley took a handoff five yards on tie the game at 14-14. NC State kicker Christopher Dunn missed a potential game-winning 39-yard field goal wide left as time expired in regulation.

Clemson scored first in the extra session when Uiagalelei connected with Ross on a 9-yard post route. The Wolfpack answered on the ensuing possession when Leary connected with Thayer Thomas for a 2-yard touchdown.

NC State then notched the eventual game-winner when Leary and Carter connected for a 22-yard strike in the back corner of the end zone before an NC State stop on the ensuing Clemson possession.

Baylon Spector led the Tigers defense with 19 tackles, surpassing Spencer Shuey's 18 tackles against Georgia in 2013 for the most by a Clemson player in a single game under Dabo Swinney. Andrew Mukuba and R.J. Mickens also had double-digit tackles; both players had 10 stops.

CLEMSON, S.C. – Placekicker B.T. Potter accounted for 13 points, hitting all four of his field goal attempts and adding an extra point to help No. 25 Clemson hold on to a 19-13 win over Boston College.

Defensively, the Tigers tallied nine tackles for loss, four sacks and forced three turnovers, including K.J. Henry pouncing on a fumble with 49 seconds remaining deep in Clemson territory to secure the win.

Running back Kobe Pace got the Tigers on the board first with a 59-yard touchdown run in the first quarter, part of his career-high 125 rushing yards and 210 all-purpose yards.

The rest of Clemson's scoring came from Potter, who made field goals of 18, 35, 40 and 42 yards to tie his career high of four field goals set in 2020 at Notre Dame.

The Tigers held a 13-6 halftime lead after Boston College scored on two field goals by Connor Lytton. The Eagles would score their lone touchdown of the game on a 3-yard run by Patrick Garwo on their opening drive of the second half to tie up the game, the first rushing touchdown surrendered by Clemson in 2021.

The last two of Potter's four field goals gave Clemson a 19-13 lead with a little more than four minutes to play. The Tigers stopped Boston College with 2:14 to play on fourth down, but went three-and-out on the ensuing possession. The Eagles then drove deep into Clemson territory. On 2nd-and-10 from the 11-yard line, a wild snap got past Boston College quarterback Dennis Grosel. Henry fell on the loose ball to give possession back to Clemson and all but end the contest and give Clemson the homecoming victory.

SYRACUSE, N.Y. – B.T. Potter's 40-yard field goal with 9:22 remaining proved to be the difference, as Clemson held on to defeat Syracuse, 17-14. Syracuse placekicker Andre Szmyt's 47-yard game-tying field goal attempt sailed left with 38 seconds to play, allowing the Tigers to seal the victory.

Clemson controlled the clock offensively, tallying 32:59 of possession. Kobe Pace tallied 76 yards and a touchdown on 14 carries, and quarterback DJ Uiagalelei was 21-of-34 for 181 yards and a score through the air, and added 26 yards on the ground.

Defensively, Clemson forced four three-and-outs, piled up six tackles for loss, broke up eight passes and tallied two sacks. Cornerback Mario Goodrich recorded four pass breakups, one shy of the school record.

Joseph Ngata capped a 12-play 87-yard drive with 1:03 to play in the first quarter, as he hauled in an acrobatic catch in the end zone. Syracuse answered on the next drive with a 91-yard drive to tie the score at 7-7.

After trading punts, Clemson took over with 2:06 to play in the half on its own 32-yard line. The Clemson drive appeared to stall out before punter Will Spiers hit Davis Allen for 17 yards on 4th-and-5. Uiagalelei hit Justyn Ross over the middle to bring the Tigers to the two-yard line, when Pace punched it in with just nine seconds to play in the half.

Following Potter's 40-yard fourth-quarter field goal, the Orange's Trebor Pena scored with 7:18 to play in the game on a 62-yard pass from Garrett Shrader to cut the Tigers' lead to 17-14. After a Syracuse stop, the Orange went on a 14-play, 63-yard drive to get into field goal range, but Szmyt's attempt missed left and gave the Tigers the ball to run out the final 38 seconds.

PITTSBURGH – The Tiger defense held No. 23 Pitt 21 points below its season scoring average, but Clemson fell on the road at No. 23 Pittsburgh, 27-17. The game marked Clemson's first road game at Pitt in series history and represented Clemson's first set of back-to-back games north of the Mason-Dixon Line since 1952.

The Tigers started quickly, with Phil Mafah capping an eight-play, 80-yard drive with a touchdown in the first quarter. Kenny Pickett threw two touchdowns in the final 3:18 of the first half — one each to Jordan Addison and Taysir Mack — to give Pitt a 14-7 halftime lead.

The Panthers added to the lead early in the second half when SirVocea Dennis picked off a DJ Uiagalelei shovel pass and took it back 50 yards to put the Panthers ahead, 21-7.

In the third quarter, B.T. Potter added three points for Clemson on a drive led by quarterback Taisun Phommachanh, as Potter hit a 42-yard field goal to cut the Panthers' lead to 21-10. Pitt would add field goals of 44 and 34 yards to extend the lead to 27-10.

Upon reentering the game for Phommachanh, Uiagalelei recorded his third rushing touchdown of the season on a six-yard run that capped a five-play, 72-yard drive. However, upon receiving the ensuing kickoff, Pitt ran off the remaining 7:56 with a 15-play, 49-yard clock-killing drive to end the game and give the Panthers the win.

Linebacker James Skalski led the Tigers defensively with a career-high 18 tackles.

CLEMSON, S.C. – Will Shipley capped a three-play, 58-yard drive with a 21-yard go-ahead touchdown run with 2:53 to play and Barrett Carter scored on a fumble recovery on a desperation lateral to give Clemson a 30-20 comeback win against Florida State.

Shipley recorded his first 100-yard game of his career as he finished with 128 yards rushing and two touchdowns on 25 carries.

B.T. Potter opened the scoring in the first quarter with a 47-yard field goal. Florida State answered with a one-yard touchdown pass from Jordan Travis to Jashaun Corbin, but Myles Murphy blocked the extra point, Clemson's first blocked placekick since 2020 and first blocked PAT since 2018.

Phil Mafah's 63-yard scamper set up an 11-yard touchdown from DJ Uiagalelei to Davis Allen to give the Tigers a 10-6 advantage. But on the first play of FSU's ensuing drive, Lawrance Toafili caught a wheel route for a 75-yard touchdown after Toafili rolled over a Clemson defender and kept his feet on his way to the end zone.

An 83-yard drive capped by Shipley's first touchdown of the game gave Clemson a 17-13 lead at the half.

After a scoreless third quarter, Jermaine Johnson strip-sacked Uiagalelei, recovered the fumble and ran six yards for a touchdown to give Florida State a 20-17 lead with 7:39 remaining, setting the stage for Shipley and Carter's eventual heroics.

Clemson held Florida State to just 65 yards rushing and 241 yards of total offense. Murphy led the unit with five tackles, a blocked PAT and two of the Tigers' season-high six sacks.

LOUISVILLE, Ky. – Facing first-and-goal from its own two-yard line with 1:18 to play, Clemson's defense came up with a game-winning goal line stand to earn a 30-24 road win at Louisville, giving the Tigers back-to-back fourth-quarter comeback wins for the first time since 2005.

DJ Uiagalelei scored the go-ahead touchdown on an eight-yard touchdown run up the middle with 4:12 to play, one of three touchdowns for which he was responsible. B.T. Potter's third field goal stretched the lead to six before the game-winning stand.

The teams traded touchdowns on their opening possessions. After a Louisville touchdown, Uiagalelei connected with Beau Collins for a 46-yard touchdown to culminate a three-play scoring drive. Collins finished with 106 yards on six catches, becoming the first Clemson true freshman with 100 receiving yards since Justyn Ross against Alabama to end 2018.

A touchdown pass from Uiagalelei to tight end Davis Allen tied the game 17-17 at halftime, but Clemson trailed 24-17 entering the fourth quarter after Malik Cunningham's second touchdown run of the game. Clemson then outscored the Cardinals 13-0 in the final frame to earn the win.

Linebacker Trenton Simpson led the defense with 10 tackles and 2.0 sacks, both career highs. Offensively, Uiagalelei completed 18-of-30 passes for a season-high 220 yards with two passing touchdowns in addition to the go-ahead rushing touchdown.

Defensively, Clemson registered six sacks from six different players in holding the Huskies' offense to just 1.7 yards per play on the afternoon. Clemson held UConn to -21 yards rushing, tied for its second-fewest allowed in school history. The Tiger defense did not allow an offensive touchdown for the fourth time in 2021.

DJ Uiagalelei threw for a season-high 241 yards and a touchdown, and the Tigers ran for three more. Phil Mafah led the way rushing with 49 yards and a touchdown, while Dacari Collins had six catches for 97 yards.

UConn's Brian Brewton muffed the opening kickoff but picked up the ball and returned it 99 yards for a touchdown to give the Huskies an early 7-0 lead.

B.T. Potter connected on the 49-yard field goal to cut the score to 7-3. With fourth and goal from the six-yard line on the following possession, the Tigers faked the field goal and Will Swinney ran it in for the touchdown to put the Tigers up 10-7. A 20-point second quarter including two touchdowns and two more Potter field goals helped put the game out of reach by halftime.

Clemson held UConn to 0-of-14 on third downs, its first time holding an opponent without a third down conversion since 1992 against North Carolina.

CLEMSON, S.C. – Clemson finished with an undefeated home record for a fifth straight season, defeating Wake Forest, 48-27, at Memorial Stadium. Wake Forest entered the game 13th in the AP Poll, 12th in the Coaches Poll and 10th in the College Football Playoff rankings.

A trio of underclassmen stood out offensively. Sophomore Kobe Pace romped for 191 yards and a pair of touchdowns on the ground, while freshman Will Shipley accounted added 111 rushing yards, two rushing touchdowns and a passing touchdown. Freshman Beaux Collins added 137 yards and a score on four catches. Between Shipley and Collins, the game marked the first time on record that a 100-yard rushing game and 100-yard receiving game were recorded by Clemson true freshmen in a single game.

Clemson's defense recorded 10 tackles for loss, eight sacks and three takeaways while holding Wake Forest to just 36 yards rushing on 31 carries.

Clemson ran out to a 10-0 lead and led 17-10 at the half thanks to a touchdown run and a touchdown pass by Shipley as well as a 50-yard field goal by B.T. Potter, his school-record-setting sixth 50-plus-yarder of his career.

But Clemson took full control in the third quarter, as two Pace touchdown runs bookended a highlight-reel one-handed catch-and-run touchdown by Collins. Clemson led 38-10 after the third frame. Wake Forest was able to engineer two touchdown drives in the fourth quarter, but Clemson added another 10 points in the frame to send another senior class out undefeated at home.

COLUMBIA, S.C. – Clemson closed the regular season with a 30-0 road win against South Carolina, the Tigers' record-tying seventh consecutive win in the series. The Tigers shut out the Gamecocks for the first time since 1989 to finish the regular season with a 9-3 record.

It was the fifth time Clemson held an opponent without an offensive touchdown this season, as the Tigers held South Carolina to just 206 yards of offense and only 43 yards rushing on 20 carries.

Offensively, Clemson rushed for 265 yards on 43 carries and scored all three touchdowns on the ground. Freshman Will Shipley led the way with 128 yards on 19 carries, his second straight game with more than 100 yards rushing. Kobe Pace added 58 yards, including a 34-yard touchdown, and Phil Mafah ran for 43 yards and a score.

The Tigers set the tone early, as Shipley went 29 yards for a touchdown on the opening possession. Two drives later, Andrew Booth Jr.'s first of two interceptions on the day gave Clemson a short field, leading to a 29-yard field goal by B.T. Potter.

In the first half, Clemson outgained South Carolina, 258-75 and held the Gamecocks to just three first downs to take a 17-0 lead into the break.

The Tigers added to the lead on a Potter field goal on the first possession of the second half. On Potter's third field goal of the day, he set the Clemson record for field goals of 40-plus yards for both a season and a career.

Mafah scored Clemson's final points from six yards out with 2:30 to play to bring the final score to 30-0.

Clemson's defense held one last time, with Jeremiah Trotter Jr. tackling Zeb Noland at the Clemson 3-yard line on a scramble as time expired to keep the Gamecocks out of the end zone and off the scoreboard.

ORLANDO, Fla. — Cornerback Mario Goodrich forced a key fumble on fourth down with 33 seconds to play as No. 19/22 Clemson withstood a late rally to claim the 2021 Cheez-It Bowl, 20-13, over Iowa State (7-6) at Camping World Stadium in Orlando, Fla. The win was Clemson's 10th of the season, marking the 11th-consecutive year in which the Tigers (10-3) have won 10 or more games. Clemson won its final six games of the season.

"It's all about how you finish," said Dabo Swinney, who won his 150th game as Clemson's head coach and became only the third head coach in FBS history to win 150 games in the first 15 seasons of career. "What an unbelievable effort by this team. Ten wins in 11 straight seasons - that's historic. People don't realize how hard that is to do. We were back-against-the-wall at 2-2, and they finished tonight."

Holding a 20-13 with less than two minutes to play, Clemson leaned on its defense to come up with a stop. Iowa State quarterback Brock Purdy scrambled to convert on a 4th-and-2 with 40 seconds to play when Goodrich poked the ball loose, sending it back behind the line to gain. Purdy recovered short of the first down, and Clemson took over in victory formation.

Goodrich, who was named the game's most valuable player, also added an interception return for a touchdown late in the third quarter, which gave Clemson its final points. The Tigers held Iowa State to 270 total yards, 66 on the ground, and just 112 total on 35 plays in the second half.

Clemson quarterback DJ Uiagalelei was 21-for-32 for 187 yards, while Clemson's ground game finished with 128 yards.

Clemson took the opening kickoff and scored on its first drive, which went a season-long 8:08 on 15 plays and 69 yards. B.T. Potter drilled his 20th field goal of the season, a 23-yarder to give the Tigers a 3-0 edge, as Clemson ran 11 times during the drive.

After trading scoreless drives, the Cyclones tied the game at 3-3 with a 22-yard field goal, capping an 11-play, 78-yard drive.

After a field goal miss from the Cyclones, Clemson took the next drive 41 yards before it stalled out, and Potter connected from 51 yards with 4:07 to play in the half. The kick was Potter's seventh career field goal of 50 yards or longer, the most in school history. He also added to his single-season (12) and career (26) school records for field goals of 40-plus yards.

Clemson had one final chance at points just before half, but Potter saw his streak of consecutive made field goals end at 13 as he missed a 36-yarder to the left.

In the first half, Clemson outgained the Cyclones 212-153, ran 44 plays and held the ball 17:19, taking a 6-3 edge into the break. Uiagalelei connected on 15 of his 24 pass attempts for 145 yards in the half, of which Dacari Collins hauled in six balls for 56 yards.

Running back Will Shipley took a delayed handoff through the right side untouched from 12 yards out with 4:54 to play in the third quarter, putting an exclamation point on Clemson's 16-play, 79-yard drive, which ate up 7:39 of game clock. Clemson gained six first downs during the drive.

Just 53 seconds later, Justin Mascoll batted a pass from Brock Purdy up in the air, before Purdy hit the deflected ball to Mario Goodrich, who took it back 18 yards across the field for a touchdown, giving Clemson a 20-3 lead with 4:01 to play in the third quarter. The interception for a touchdown was Clemson's first since the Florida State game in 2019.

After a three-and-out, Uiagalelei had a ball tipped and intercepted on the Clemson 28, but the defense held, forcing a 45-yard field goal, drawing the score to 20-6.

After a three-and-out, Iowa State drove deep into Clemson territory. Purdy hit Charlie Kolar for a six-yard score in the back of the endzone with 9:42 to play to pull the Cyclones within seven at 20-13. The Tigers came up empty on their next drive but pinned the Cyclones inside their own five yard line with just over six minutes to play, but K.J. Henry came up with a sack on 3rd-and-14 to give Clemson the ball back.

After going three-and-out, Clemson again leaned on its defense to come up with a stop. Goodrich's forced fumble halted Iowa State's late run.
