#### **CLEMSON. LSU SET TO OPEN 2025 SEASON IN PRIME TIME**

Clemson will open a season at home for the first time since 2019 when Clemson's Bengals of the Blue Ridge host the Bayou Bengals of LSU at Memorial Stadium on Saturday. Aug. 30. Kickoff between the two Tigers on ABC's Saturday Night Football is scheduled for 7:30 p.m. ET.

Saturday's contest will be a matchup of two of the 14 winningest programs in FBS history. The programs have combined for 1,623 wins, including 815 by LSU since 1893 (12th all-time) and 808 wins by Clemson since 1896 (13th all-time).

The game will be Memorial Stadium's seventh matchup of AP Top 10 teams since the facility opened in 1942. Clemson holds a 4-2 mark in home games between AP Top 10 squads, including wins in each of its last three such contests: a 42-36 win vs. No. 3 Louisville in 2016, a 42-17 win against No. 7 Miami (Fla.) in 2020 and a 30-20 win against No. 10 NC State in 2022.

Though the game will be Clemson's first season opener at home since 2019, Clemson will once again be opening with a marquee opponent. The game will mark the third time in five years that Clemson has opened a season against an AP Top 10 opponent.

After having freshmen play more snaps than any other power conference team in the nation in each of the last two seasons. Clemson enters 2025 with the benefit of compounded experience. The Tigers return eight primary starters on both sides of the ball for the first time in the Dabo Swinney era and the first time since 2000.

Clemson led the nation in ESPN's returning production metric published in the spring. Its 2025 squad has 36 different players (excluding long snappers) who enter the year with at least one career start at Clemson. Those 36 players alone have a combined 919 career game appearances and 393 career starts.

"We've been a young team, I feel like, every year I've been here," senior quarterback Cade Klubnik said. "We're a veteran team and very experienced. We've got a lot of guys that have played a lot of ball. That's really exciting, but we've got to go do it. We've got to go do it and take advantage of every opportunity we get."

# NOTES

#### WHAT TO WATCH FOR THIS SEASON

- Clemson attempting to win its 29th overall conference championship, which would move the Tigers past Utah (28) and tie them with Fresno State (29) for the ninthmost among current FBS programs. Clemson's 28 all-time conference titles include four SIAA championships, two Southern Conference championships and 22 ACC titles.
- Clemson attempting to become the first program to win 23 ACC titles. Since helping form the conference in 1953, Clemson leads the ACC with 22 titles all-time, including 21 outright.
- Clemson attempting to win back-to-back conference championships for the first time since winning six straight ACC titles from 2015-20.
- Clemson (seven) attempting to tie Alabama (eight) for the most College Football Playoff berths since the institution of the postseason format in 2014.
- Clemson attempting to qualify for back-to-back College Football Playoffs for the first time since qualifying for a record six-straight from 2015-20.
- Clemson attempting to win 10 games for the 14th time in 15 seasons. Clemson's current 13 seasons with 10 or more wins since the start of the 2011 season are tied for the most in the nation (Alabama).
- Clemson attempting to extend its school record by winning nine games for a 15th consecutive season. Clemson's active streak of 14 straight nine-win seasons is the nation's second-longest active streak, and a 15th consecutive season with nine-plus wins would push Clemson past the 1987-2000 Florida State Seminoles for sole possession of the third-longest streak in FBS history.
- Clemson attempting to win a postseason game (conference championship, bowl game and/or national championship game) for a 15th consecutive season. Clemson's active 14-year streak is the longest streak on record in major college football history.
- Clemson (14 straight Top 25 finishes from 2011-24) attempting to finish in the AP Top 25 for a 15th consecutive season. In doing so, Clemson would record only the sixth such streak in AP Poll history, joining Nebraska (33 from 1969-2001), Michigan (20 from 1985-2004), Florida State (19 from 1987-2005), Alabama (17 from 2008-24) and USC (16 from 1967-82). Clemson would pull into sole possession of the sixth-longest streak in AP Poll history.
- Clemson's senior class (30-11 since 2022) needing 10 wins to become the 13th Clemson senior class (and 12th class in a row) to average at least 10 wins a year over a four-year span, joining the 1990, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022, 2023 and 2024 senior groups.
- Clemson's senior class (2022 and 2024 ACC Champions) attempting to become the 13th senior class in school history to win three conference titles in a four-year span (1903, 1959, 1967, 1968, 1988, 1989, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021 and 2022).
- Clemson attempting to win at least five home games for a 20th consecutive season, dating to 2006. Clemson's active 19-year streak with five or more home wins is the nation's longest active streak.

- Clemson facing 10 power conference opponents in regular season play. During Clemson's active 14-year streak of nine-win seasons since 2011, Clemson has played 165 games against power conference foes the most in the country and leads the nation in wins against power conference teams in that span (134). The 2025 season will be Clemson's 24th consecutive season facing at least 10 power conference opponents.
- Clemson attempting to finish .500 or better in regular season conference play for the 27th consecutive season. Clemson and Boise State's 26-year active streaks are the longest in the nation and tied for the fourth-longest in the FBS since 1966.
- Clemson entering 2025 with a winning all-time record against nine of the 12 teams on its regular season schedule, including Troy (2-0), Syracuse (10-2), North Carolina (40-19), Boston College (21-9-2), SMU (1-0), Duke (37-17-1), Louisville (8-1), Furman (44-10-4) and South Carolina (73-44-4).
- Clemson entering 2025 having won its most recent meeting with eight of the 12 teams on its schedule. Clemson has active winning streaks against Furman (32), Boston College (12), Georgia Tech (nine), North Carolina (six), Syracuse (six), Troy (two), Florida State (one) and SMU (one).
- Clemson entering the 2025 season having not lost to the same team in back-to-back years since 2014, the final year of a three-game series winning streak by Florida State. Clemson can keep that streak alive with wins in 2025 against Louisville and South Carolina programs that defeated Clemson in 2024.
- Clemson playing only one home game in the month of October. It will mark the second straight season that Clemson has had only one October home game.
- Clemson playing five games in the month of November for the ninth time in school history (1911, 1918, 1929, 1933, 1957, 1958, 2008 and 2024). Clemson will seek its first five-win November in school history.
- Head Coach Dabo Swinney (180-47 entering his 18th season) sitting 15 wins shy of Tom Osborne (195) for the most wins through 20 seasons in FBS history.
- Swinney entering the season as the nation's leader among active coaches in College Football Playoff berths (seven) and CFP wins (six).
- Swinney entering the year as one of only three active coaches with an FBS national championship to his credit (Swinney, Kirby Smart and Ryan Day) and one of only two with multiple FBS national championships (Swinney and Smart).
- Swinney attempting to join Nick Saban (seven), Bear Bryant (six), Bernie Bierman (five), Woody Hayes (five), Frank Leahy (four), John McKay (four), Howard Jones (three), Walter Camp (three), Urban Meyer (three), Tom Osborne (three), Knute Rockne (three), Darrell Royal (three), Barry Switzer (three), Pop Warner (three) and Bud Wilkinson (three) as the 16th coach in FBS history to win at least three national championships.
- Swinney attempting to win nine games for a 15th consecutive season to join Tom Osborne (25 from 1973-97) and Nick Saban (16 from 2008-23) as the only coaches in major college football history to win nine or more games with one program in at least 15 consecutive seasons.
- Swinney (110-24 in regular season conference play) needing seven wins to tie or eight wins to break Bobby Bowden's ACC record for regular season conference wins (117). Swinney has already passed Bowden for the most overall wins as the head coach of an ACC program.
- Swinney entering the season as the ACC's all-time record-holder in bowl appearances (21) and bowl/CFP victories (12) by a head coach.

- Swinney (nine) needing one more championship to join Bobby Bowden (12) as the only coaches ever to win  $10\ \text{ACC}$  titles.
- Swinney (nine) attempting to become the first coach in Clemson history to win 10 conference titles.
- Swinney serving as head coach in an 18th season to match Florida State's Bobby Bowden (18) for the second-most seasons at the helm of an ACC program. Swinney will pull within one of Virginia George Welsh (19) for the most seasons coaching an ACC team.
- Clemson facing multiple SEC opponents in a season for the 19th time in the last 20 years, dating to 2006. The lone exception came in 2020 when the SEC opted out of non-conference play amid the COVID-19 pandemic.
  - Clemson entering the season having scored multiple

defensive touchdowns in 15 straight seasons, the nation's longest active streak. The last time Clemson had fewer than two defensive touchdowns in a season was 2009, Dabo Swinney's first full season as head coach, when the Tigers supplemented a single defensive touchdown with six special teams touchdowns.

- Clemson having multiple open dates for the sixth time since 2013, joining the 2013, 2014, 2019, 2020 and 2024 seasons.
- Clemson facing four head coaches for the first time: Troy's Gerad Parker, Syracuse's Fran Brown, North Carolina's Bill Belichick and Boston College's Bill O'Brien. Clemson is 169-75-3 since 1950 when facing an opposing head coach for the first time including a 52-9 mark since 2011.
- Clemson facing no new opponents in the regular season. Clemson closed the 2024 season against two teams it had never previously faced (SMU and Texas), Of the 110 different opponents Clemson has faced all-time, the Tigers enter 2025 with an active winning or unbeaten streak in 79 of those 110 series.
- Safety Khalil Barnes (seven) needing three interceptions to become the first Clemson player to reach double-digit career interceptions since Rashard Hall (14) from 2009-12.
- Barnes (three interceptions in 2023, four in 2024) attempting to become the first Clemson player to reach three interceptions in at least three different seasons since Crezdon Butler (three seasons spanning 2006-08).
- Barnes attempting to become the first player to lead Clemson outright in interceptions in three straight seasons
- Linebacker Sammy Brown (11.5) attempting to join Shaq Lawson, Clelin Ferrell, Myles Murphy and T.J. Parker as the only Clemson players under Dabo Swinney to record double-digit tackles for loss in both their freshman and sophomore seasons.
- Quarterback Cade Klubnik attempting to become the first Clemson quarterback to start every game in three straight seasons since Tajh Boyd started all 40 games the Tigers played from 2011-13. Klubnik has started each of Clemson's last 28 games, including all 27 games across the 2023-24 seasons.
- Klubnik (28) attempting to start all 12 regular season games to tie Tajh Boyd's school record for consecutive starts by a quarterback (40).
- Klubnik (19-9) needing 11 wins to join Trevor Lawrence (34-2 from 2018-20), Deshaun Watson (32-3 from 2014-16), Tajh Boyd (32-8 from 2010-13) and Rodney Williams (32-10-2 from 1985-88) as the only quarterbacks in school history to record 30 career wins as Clemson's starting quarterback.
- Klubnik (70) needing 30 combined touchdowns thrown or scored to become the fourth player in Clemson history to be responsible for 100 career touchdowns. He would be the 10th player in ACC history to reach the mark.
- Klubnik (7,180) needing 2,820 passing yards to become the fourth player in Clemson history to reach 10,000 career passing yards. He would be the 11th player in ACC history to reach the mark.
- Klubnik (1,040) needing 363 pass attempts to break Tajh Boyd's school record in the category (1,402 from 2010-13).
- Klubnik (659) needing 243 pass attempts to break Tajh Boyd's school record in the category (901 from 2010-13)
- Klubnik (57) needing 33 passing touchdowns to tie Deshaun Watson (90 from 2014-16) and Trevor Lawrence (90 from 2018-20) for the second-most passing touchdowns in Clemson history.
  - Klubnik (23) reaching 200 passing yards in 12

games to tie or in 13 games to break Tajh Boyd's school record for career 200-yard passing games (35 from 2010-13)

- Klubnik (7,964) needing 2,036 combined passing and rushing yards to become the fourth player in school history to reach 10,000 career yards of total offense.
- Klubnik (13) needing seven rushing touchdowns to become the fifth Clemson quarterback to rush for 20 career rushing touchdowns since Clemson abandoned the single wing in 1953. He would join Woodrow Dantzler (27 from 1998-2001), Deshaun Watson (26 from 2014-16), Tajh Boyd (26 from 2010-13) and Steve Fuller (22 from 1975-78).
- Klubnik (784) needing 216 rushing yards to become the seventh Clemson quarterback since 1953 to reach 1,000 career rushing yards.
- Offensive lineman Blake Miller (41) entering the season having started all 41 games Clemson has played during his Clemson career. If he were to start every game played by Clemson this season, he would be the first offensive lineman in school history to start every game played by Clemson over a four-year span since offensive linemen Jim Bundren and Glenn Rountree started all 47 of Clemson's games from 1994-97 after both redshirted in 1993
- Miller (41) starting each of the first nine games of the season to break Dalton Freeman's school record for consecutive starts by a non-specialist (49 from 2009-12)
- Miller (2,893) entering the season as Clemson's active leader in career snaps from scrimmage. He currently ranks ninth on Clemson's list of career snaps from scrimmage on record back to 1986.
- Miller (2,893) needing 862 snaps from scrimmage to move past Mitch Hyatt (3,754 from 2015-18) for the most career snaps from scrimmage on record in Clemson history
- Miller (2,893) needing 107 offensive snaps to become the seventh Clemson player on record to record 3,000 career snaps from scrimmage. He would join Mitch Hyatt (3,754), Will Putnam (3,564), Dalton Freeman (3,361), Landon Walker (3,131), Kyle Young (3,097) and Glenn Rountree (3,048).
- Miller having the opportunity to become the first Clemson player to play 950 snaps in three different seasons. With 989 offensive snaps as a freshman and 960 snaps as a sophomore, he is already one of six players on record in Clemson history (Mitch Hyatt, Jay Guillermo, Dalton Freeman, Deshaun Watson and Tajh Boyd) with multiple 950-snap seasons.
- Defensive end T.J. Parker (32.0) needing 14.0 tackles for loss to enter the Top 10 in school history in career tackles for loss.
- Parker (32.0) needing 18.0 tackles for loss to become the seventh player in school history to reach 50.0 career tackles for loss.
- Parker attempting to become the fifth player under Dabo Swinney to record three consecutive seasons with double-digit tackles for loss, joining Barrett Carter (2022-24), Myles Murphy (2020-22), Clelin Ferrell (2016-18) and Shaq Lawson (2013-15). (Note: Ricky Sapp accomplished the feat in three straight seasons from 2007-09, only the latter half of which were part of Swinney's head coaching tenure.)
- Parker (11.0 sacks in 2024) attempting to become the first Clemson player to record back-to-back seasons with double-digit sacks since Vic Beasley in 2013 and 2014
- Parker (16.5 sacks) needing four sacks to enter the top 10 in school history in career sacks.
- Parker (six) needing four forced fumbles to tie or five forced fumbles to break the school record for career

- Clemson attempting to improve to 40-35-1 all-time in home games against AP Top 25 opponents since Death Valley opened in 1942. A win would also move Clemson to 17-7 at home against AP-ranked opponents under Dabo Swinney.

- Clemson attempting to improve to 20-10 all-time in games at Death Valley in which both teams are ranked in the AP Top 25
- Clemson entering the game having won at least one home game against an AP Top 25 team in nine out of the last 10 seasons, tied with Alabama and Ohio State for the most such seasons in the nation in that span.
- Clemson attempting to improve to 13-2 against ranked opponents in Death Valley since 2015.
- Clemson attempting to improve to 45-9 in regular season non-conference games regardless of location since 2011. With a win, Clemson would improve to 42-5 in non-conference home games under Dabo Swinney.

- Clemson opening a season against an SEC opponent for the seventh time under Head Coach Dabo Swinney. Clemson is 3-3 in season openers against SEC foes in his tenure
- Clemson attempting to earn its second all-time win against LSU, joining a 25-24 win in the 2012 Chick-fil-A Rowl
- Clemson attempting to improve to 13-5 against SEC opponents in regular season play in the College Football Playoff era
- Clemson attempting to improve to 33-9 in night games since the start of the 2018 season and 54-12 in night games since 2015.
- Clemson attempting to improve to 26-4 in night games at Memorial Stadium in Dabo Swinney's tenure and move to 22-1 at home in prime-time games in the College Football Playoff era.
- Clemson playing its ninth August game all-time and its fifth under the leadership of Dabo Swinney. Clemson is 2-2 in August games under Swinney.
- Clemson attempting to improve to 38-9 in games following a loss under Dabo Swinney, including season openers following a loss in the previous season finale.
- Clemson attempting to improve to 71-5 at Death Valley in the College Football Playoff era. Clemson's current 70-5 home record is second-best in the country in that span.
- Clemson attempting to improve to 104-15 in regular season play since the start of the 2015 season.
- Clemson attempting to earn its 100th win in a home opener in school history. Presently, Clemson is 99-17-8 in home openers.

- Clemson attempting to improve to 41-28 under Swinney against AP Top 25 teams.
- Clemson attempting to improve to 35-20 under Swinney in games in which both teams rank in the AP Top 25.
- Swinney attempting to improve to 14-10 all-time in games contested between two teams ranked in the AP Top 10.
- Swinney attempting to improve to 20-14 against AP Top 10 teams all-time, regardless of Clemson's rank. He would move to 6-2 against AP Top 10 teams at home, including wins against Georgia (2013), Notre Dame (2015), Louisville (2016), Miami (2020) and NC State (2022).
- Swinney attempting to improve to 4-1 all-time against LSU Head Coach Brian Kelly, including wins against Kelly's Notre Dame squads in 2015, 2018 and 2020. - Clemson entering the game having rushed for a touchdown in 60 consecutive home games, the nation's longest active streak. The last team to hold Clemson without a rushing touchdown in Death Valley was Troy in 2016.
- Quarterback Cade Klubnik (19-9) attempting to become the 11th Clemson player to win 20 games as a starting quarterback since World War II, joining Trevor Lawrence (34-2), Deshaun Watson (32-3), Tajh Boyd (32-8), Rodney Williams (32-10-2), Charlie Whitehurst (25-15), Nealon Greene (24-16), Homer Jordan (22-6-1), DJ Uiagalelei (22-6), Mike Eppley (21-5-1) and Steve Fuller (21-11-3).
- Klubnik (seven) attempting to throw for 300 yards to tie Charlie Whitehurst (eight from 2002-05) for the fourth-most career 300-yard passing games in Clemson history.
- Klubnik (336 passing yards vs. Texas in 2024 season finale) attempting to record back-to-back 300yard passing games for the second time in his career and the first time since October 2024 against Wake Forest and Virginia.
- Klubnik (13) chasing No. 7 DJ Uiagalelei (15 from 2020-22) and No. 6 Kelly Bryant (16 from 2015-18) on Clemson's all-time leaderboard for career rushing touchdowns by a quarterback.
- Klubnik attempting to record 200 yards of total offense (combined rushing and passing yards) in a 14th straight game to take sole possession of the school record in that category. Klubnik's active 13-game streak is presently tied with Deshaun Watson's 13-game streak of games with 200 or more combined rushing and passing yards in 2016.
- Klubnik attempting to throw three touchdown passes in three consecutive games for the first time in his career. He would become the first Clemson quarterback with three or more passing touchdowns in three consecutive games since Trevor Lawrence's fourgame streak in early 2020.
- Offensive lineman Blake Miller (2,893) needing 107 offensive snaps to become the seventh Clemson

player on record to record 3,000 career snaps from scrimmage. He would join Mitch Hyatt (3,754), Will Putnam (3,564), Dalton Freeman (3,361), Landon Walker (3,131), Kyle Young (3,097) and Glenn Rountree (3,048).

- Wide receiver T.J. Moore (116 yards in 2024 season finale) attempting to become the first Clemson receiver with consecutive 100-yard receiving games since Cornell Powell against Notre Dame and Pitt in 2020.
- Moore attempting to catch a touchdown in back-toback games for the first time in his career.
- Defensive end T.J. Parker (16.5 sacks) needing four sacks to match Chester McGlockton (20.5 from 1989-91) for the 10th-most career sacks in Clemson history.
- Parker (six forced fumbles) needing one forced fumble to tie Levon Kirkland (seven from 1988-91), Keith Adams (seven from 1998-2000) and Vic Beasley (seven from 2011-14) for the seventh-most forced fumbles in a career in Clemson history.
- Wide receiver Antonio Williams entering the game having caught a pass in all 33 career games he's played at Clemson.
- Williams attempting to catch a pass in a 34th consecutive game to tie Aaron Kelly (2006-08) for the sixth-longest streak of consecutive games played with a reception in Clemson history.
- Williams (17) needing one touchdown catch to enter the Top 10 in school history in career touchdown receptions. Glenn Smith (1949-51) and TE Jordan Leggett (2013-16) are presently tied for ninth with 18 each. Artavis Scott sits at eighth (19 from 2014-16).
- Williams (153) needing nine receptions to enter the Top 10 in school history in career receptions. Terry Smith is currently No. 10 (162 from 1990-93).

#### **SEASON OPENERS**

Clemson is 30-10 in its last 40 season openers. Head Coach Dabo Swinney is 12-4 in openers in his head coaching career with three losses to Georgia and one loss to Duke in 2023. Swinney's 12 season-opening wins are second-most in school history, two ahead of Danny Ford (9) and 13 shy of Frank Howard's record of 25.

The Tigers are 95-26-8 (.767) in their first game in their previous 129 seasons.

#### **HOME OPENERS**

Even though 2025 represents the 130th season of Clemson Football, Clemson has had just 124 home openers in its history as a function of the five seasons in which Clemson did not play a game at home. Clemson has a 99-17-8 record in 124 previous home openers.

Clemson is 36-2 in home openers since 1987, and its only losses in Death Valley debuts in that span came in 1999 and 2003. Clemson has won 21 straight home openers with the last loss coming in Dabo Swinney's first year as an assistant coach in 2003.

#### **SWINNEY IN REMATCHES**

Clemson has suffered 47 losses under Head Coach Dabo Swinney. Clemson has had 34 previous opportunities to avenge its most recent loss against an opponent, going 24-10 in those contests. Including LSU, there are 13 opponents against which Swinney's squads are awaiting a rematch since Clemson's last loss in the series: Nebraska, TCU, USF, West Virginia, Ohio State, Tennessee, Duke, Miami (Fla.), Georgia, Louisville, South Carolina and Texas

#### **TOP 10 HISTORY**

- Saturday's contest against No. 9 LSU will represent the 29th matchup of AP Top 10 teams in Clemson history. Clemson is 15-13 all-time in games when both teams enter ranked in the Top 10 of the AP Poll.
- Twenty-three of Clemson's 28 previous all-time Top 10 matchups have come under Head Coach Dabo Swinney, with Swinney posting a 13-10 record in those contests. Danny Ford went 2-1 in three career Top 10 games, including the Orange Bowl to conclude Clemson's 1981 national championship season. Frank Howard and Tommy Bowden each lost their lone matchup of Top 10 teams in their Clemson tenures.
- Clemson has won 12 of its last 19 games between Top 10 teams in the College Football Playoff era. Six of the seven losses came to College Football Playoff participants, with four of them coming at the hands of that season's national champion.
- Sixteen of the 28 games have been contested at neutral sites.

#### AT HOME IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY

Clemson has been right at home in non-conference contests at Memorial Stadium in recent years, going 31-2 in its last 33 non-conference home games.

Clemson had won 26 straight prior to a one-point loss to South Carolina in November 2022. Previously, Clemson's longest unbeaten streak (including ties) in non-conference home games was a 20-game unbeaten streak from 1978-84 that saw ties against Boston College and Georgia interrupt winning streaks of 12 games, four games and two games.

Clemson is 41-5 in non-conference games at Death Valley under Head Coach Dabo Swinney.

#### MICHAEL DEAN PERRY TO BE HONORED

Former All-American Michael Dean Perry will be inducted into the Clemson Ring of Honor during Saturday's game.

Perry, who played for the Tigers from 1984-87, was a first-team All-American and ACC Player of the Year as a senior defensive tackle in 1987. He becomes the 11th football player or coach to be named to the Clemson Ring of Honor, joining players Jerry Butler, Fred Cone, Jeff Davis, Steve Fuller, Terry Kinard, Levon Kirkland, Banks McFadden and C.J. Spiller, and coaches Danny Ford and Frank Howard.

The Ring of Honor is the highest award bestowed by Clemson Athletics. Recipients must have made an outstanding contribution to the heritage of Clemson Athletics, must be a member of the Clemson Athletic Hall of Fame and be a graduate of a four-year institution for consideration.

Perry helped Clemson to a pair of ACC Championships in 1986 and 1987. In 1987, he became one of just six defensive players in the history of the ACC to earn overall ACC Player of the Year honors.

The native of Aiken, S.C. had 24 tackles for loss among his 74 tackles and 10 sacks in 1987. His 61.0 career tackles for loss remain the Clemson record 38 years after he played his final game for Danny Ford's Tigers.

Perry was a second-round draft choice of the Cleveland Browns in the spring of 1988. He was named the NFL's Defensive Player of the Year in his season in 1989, and he was named to six Pro Bowls in his 10 years in the league.

A 2005 Clemson graduate, Perry was named to Clemson's Centennial Team in 1996 and was inducted into the Clemson Athletic Hall of Fame in 2000. He was named to the ACC's 50th Anniversary Team in 2002, and was inducted into the State of South Carolina Athletic Hall of Fame in 2005 and the South Carolina Football Hall of Fame in 2016. He was honored by the Clemson football program with the Brian Dawkins Lifetime Achievement Award in 2020.

#### **SERIES HISTORY VS. LSU**

The 2025 season opener will represent the fifth all-time meeting between Clemson and LSU but the first in regular season play. LSU presently leads the series, 3-1. LSU was the nation's No. 1-ranked team in two of the teams' previous four meetings, both of which resulted in LSU victories amid national championship seasons.

#### PREVIOUS MEETINGS WITH LSU 1959 SUGAR BOWL

Clemson, champion of the ACC at 8-2, was invited to play the nation's No. 1 team, LSU, in the 25th Sugar Bowl to conclude the 1958 season.

LSU drove deep into Clemson territory three times in the first half, but two fumbles and a thwarted fake field goal killed the drives. None of Clemson's first six drives went past midfield.

Clemson moved to the LSU 27-yard line on its first drive of the second half, but a fumble gave the ball back to the other set of Tigers. On Clemson's next possession, LSU got the break it had been looking for. On fourth down, the ball slipped out of snapper Paul Snyder's hands and hit up-man Doug Cline in the leg, and Duane Leopard recovered for LSU at the Clemson 11.

On fourth down of the ensuing drive, LSU halfback Billy Cannon hit tight end Mickey Mangham in the corner of the end zone for the only score of the game. Cannon kicked the extra point and LSU led 7-0.

Clemson had one last chance late in the fourth quarter. Clemson drove 17 plays from its own 17-yard line to the LSU 28, but Harvey White's fourth-down pass to George Usry was incomplete. LSU took over on downs and ran out the clock

Said Clemson Head Coach Frank Howard: "Louisiana State has a good team, they rate the No. 1 spot in the nation. Cannon is quite a boy. Deserves his All-American rating."

#### 1996 PEACH BOWL

Raymond Priester set a Clemson bowl record for rushing yardage with 151 yards and defensive lineman Trevor Pryce had three tackles for loss, a sack and a forced fumble but Clemson fell to LSU, 10-7, at the Georgia Dome in Atlanta.

Nealon Greene opened the scoring for Clemson on a three-yard run in the first quarter. A Harold Means recovery on a sack-fumble by Pryce set up Clemson's sole touchdown drive, which lasted 1:29 and consisted of only three runs.

LSU scored its only touchdown of the game in the second quarter on a three-yard Kevin Faulk touchdown run to tie the game. LSU scored again during the quarter with a 22-yard field goal, the final points of the contest.

Clemson got the ball back with 2:29 remaining, but a 52-yard field goal attempt by Matt Padgett with 1:02 remaining in the game was blocked and LSU hung on for its second bowl victory over Clemson.

#### 2012 CHICK-FIL-A BOWL

Trailing LSU 24-13 entering the fourth quarter, Clemson scored three times in the final stanza against one of the nation's stingiest defenses, and Chandler Catanzaro's 37-yard field goal as time expired lifted

Clemson to a 25-24 win in the Chick-fil-A Bowl in the Georgia Dome. It had been Clemson's most recent walk-off field goal in regulation until Nolan Hauser's 56-yarder in the 2024 ACC Championship Game.

Clemson pulled within two points with 2:47 remaining on a 12-yard touchdown strike from Tajh Boyd to DeAndre Hopkins but was unable to pull even when Boyd's pass on the two-point attempt fell incomplete.

The Clemson defense quickly got the ball back to its offense by forcing a three-and-out with 1:39 remaining, and Boyd, who was named the game's Most Outstanding Offensive Player, engineered a drive that covered 60 yards in 10 plays and culminated in Catanzaro's gamewinger

Boyd hit Hopkins for a 26-yard strike on fourthand-16 to get the game-winning drive rolling. He completed his last five passes of the game to set up Catanzaro's game-winning kick. The kick gave Clemson its first lead of the contest with no time remaining.

#### 2019 CFP NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

Third-seeded Clemson fell to No. 1 LSU, 42-25, in the College Football Playoff National Championship Game at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome in New Orleans. Clemson closed the year at 14-1, while LSU joined Clemson (2018) to become the second program in the modern era to finish 15-0.

The loss snapped Clemson's 29-game winning streak. The 29 consecutive wins tied for 12th-longest win streak in college football history and spanned 742 days

Quarterback Trevor Lawrence completed 18-of-37 passes and rushed for a one-yard touchdown in the first quarter. Travis Etienne finished with 78 yards on the ground and caught five passes for 36 yards. Etienne became Clemson's all-time leading rusher during the contest, passing Raymond Priester's former mark of 3.966 yards.

Clemson struck first, with Lawrence finding the end zone on the ground, capping a five-play, 67-yard drive. After an LSU scoring strike, kicker B.T. Potter put Clemson back on top with a career-long 52-yarder, which also marked the longest made field goal in CFP Championship Game history.

After a stop, Tee Higgins took his first career rushing attempt, a reverse from Etienne, 36 yards across the field and dove in for a score with 10:38 to play in the second quarter. On that drive, Clemson went 96 yards on just four plays in taking the 17-7 lead. From there, LSU closed the first half scoring three touchdowns in the final 9:17, including a 95-yard drive that gave them a 28-17 lead heading to the half.

Clemson sacked eventual MVP Joe Burrow on third down to end LSU's first drive of the second half before going 50 yards on six plays — punctuated with an Etienne rushing score and an Amari Rodgers two-point conversion — to climb back in it. However, LSU scored a pair of unanswered touchdowns to take a 42-25 lead with 12:08 to play in the contest, a lead they would hold for the remainder of the game.

#### **DEATH VALLEY HISTORY**

While Clemson and LSU fans — and even third-party observers — love to banter about which school is home to the "real Death Valley," answers to questions about which school has the "original Death Valley" are a matter of public record.

ESPN's Ryan McGee was among several to chronicle the etymology of the facilities in 2020:

"Thurman 'Crowe' Peele was born and made his name as an amateur boxer in the Carolinas, but he attended LSU, where he won the 1955 NCAA heavyweight title. He went on to post a 37-2 professional record, became the sparring partner for heavyweight legend Archie Moore and, in the 1960s, opened a gas station in Baton Rouge literally within shouting distance of Tiger Stadium. The crowds at LSU home games would shake the walls and rattle the glass of Peele's service station, so he nicknamed the stadium 'Deaf Valley.' Soon fellow LSU fans adopted the moniker.

"For some, 'Death' actually predated 'Deaf' in Baton Rouge. On Jan. 1, 1959, when LSU and Heisman Trophy winner Billy Cannon capped the school's first national title with a 7-0 victory in the Sugar Bowl, some of those fans stole 'Death' when describing the home valley. Why? Because they believed they had earned that right after defeating the team that was already using the name for its home stadium.

"Yep. Clemson.

"The first known 'Death Valley' reference tossed Memorial Stadium's way came more than 10 years before Peele's nickname. In 1945, Lonnie McMillan [sic], head coach of the rival Presbyterian College Blue Hose, had just endured a 76-0 rout at the hands of the orange-and-white Tigers. At the time, tradition held that PC and Clemson always played the season opener. And those games, in September in South Carolina, are essentially like playing football inside a pottery kiln, especially on Clemson's home field, which sits in a natural gorge, built atop bedrock and surrounded by reflective white concrete.

"According to the official Clemson history books, McMillan [sic] had visited the Mojave Desert a decade earlier en route the 1932 Summer Olympics in Los Angeles. He compared the unpleasantness of that midsummer desert experience to his September visist to play the Tigers, saying Clemson was 'college football's Death Valley.' Frank Howard, the gregarious Alabama grad who had taken over as Clemson head coach five years earlier, loved the story and repeatedly recounted it. He told it so much, it eventually stuck."

McGee's account was corroborated by an LSU historian in a 2020 article by Grace Raynor for the Charleston Post & Courier:

"According to Bud Johnson, the SID from 1966-71, LSU only started calling itself Death Valley after the SEC Tigers swiped it from the ACC Tigers following the two teams' meeting in the 1958 Sugar Bowl.

"LSU referring to itself as 'Deaf Valley' before it became Death Valley originates from a gas station in the adjacent commercial area not far from LSU's campus. Crowe Peel [sic], a former LSU boxer and 1949 national champion, named his gas station 'Deaf Valley' because of the noise that boomed from Tiger Stadium.

"'I'm an LSU fan but I side with Clemson,' Johnson

#### **CLEMSON-LSU CONNECTIONS**

Beyond both schools claiming the Tigers as their mascots and claiming Death Valley as their homes, the two programs have several historical connections:

- Nelson Stokley, Clemson's quarterbacks coach for the 1981 National Championship team, was a 1968 LSU graduate and former LSU quarterback.
- Thielen Smith played for LSU from 1974-77 and was Clemson's defensive line coach from 1999-2004 under Tommy Rowden
- Curley Hallman, the defensive backs coach on Clemson's 1981 National Championship team, went on to be the head coach at LSU from 1991-94.
- The first time Clemson faced the nation's No. 1 team was in the 1959 Sugar Bowl against LSU.
- Former Clemson Director of Athletics Dan Radakovich (2012-21) served as a senior associate

athletic director at LSU from 2001-06. He was Clemson's Director of Athletics when Clemson's home-and-home series with LSU for 2025-26 was announced in 2018

#### **NOTES FROM LAST GAME**

- Clemson concluded 2024 with a 10-4 record. The 2024 season marked Clemson's 20th season with 10 or more wins all-time and its 13th in the last 14 years, tied with Alabama for the most in the nation in that span.
  - Clemson appeared in its seventh College Football

Playoff and stands as one of only two teams ever to earn seven College Football Playoff berths since the institution of the postseason format in 2014 (Alabama, 8).

- Despite the defeat, with a win in the ACC Championship Game, Clemson will enter the 2025 season riding a 14-year active streak of consecutive seasons with at least one postseason win (conference championship games and/or bowl/CFP games), the longest streak in FBS history.
- Clemson gained 412 total yards against Texas, including 336 passing yards. At the time, Clemson's yardage outputs were the most surrendered by the Longhorns' defense that season, which entered bowl season ranked third in the nation in total defense (249.5 yards allowed per game).
- Texas entered bowl season ranked first in the nation in pass defense (143.1 yards per game). Clemson was the only team to throw for 300 yards on the Longhorns in 2024
- Clemson (6,326) produced the 10th 6,000-yard season in school history, the Tigers' first such season since 2020 (6,028). Clemson's 6,326 yards in 2024 rank seventh in a season in team history.
- Clemson threw for the most touchdown passes against Texas in 2024 and was one of only two teams in 2024 to throw multiple touchdown passes against the Longhorns. Entering the game, Texas was tied for the national lead in fewest passing touchdowns allowed this season. (four through its first 13 games before allowing three to Clemson)
- Quarterback Cade Klubnik completed 26-of-43 passes for 336 yards with three touchdowns and one interception.
- The 300-yard game was Klubnik's fourth of the season and the seventh of his career. It was his second career 300-yard passing game in postseason play, joining a 320-yard effort in the 2022 Orange Bowl against Tennessee.
- Klubnik (308) finished the season with the third-most completions in a season in Clemson history, trailing only two seasons by Deshaun Watson (388 in 2016, 333 in 2016).
- On his ninth completion of the game, Klubnik (308) surpassed his 290 completions from 2023 to set a new single-season career high.
- Klubnik finished the season with 36 touchdown passes, tying Tajh Boyd (2012) and Trevor Lawrence (2019) for the second-most touchdown passes in a single season in Clemson history.
- Klubnik (3,639) passed Charlie Whitehurst (3,561 in 2003) to finish seventh on Clemson's all-time leaderboard for passing yards in a single season.
- With the performance, Klubnik (4,102) posted the seventh individual season with 4,000 yards of total offense in school history. That feat had only been accomplished previously by Tajh Boyd (three times), Deshaun Watson (twice) and Trevor Lawrence (once).
- With his second touchdown pass of the game, Klubnik (70) passed Woodrow Dantzler (68 from 1998-2001) for fifth on Clemson's all-time leaderboard for career touchdown responsibility.
- Klubnik (4,102) passed Tajh Boyd (4,046 in 2011) to finish sixth on Clemson's all-time leaderboard for total offense yards in a single season.
- Wide receiver T.J. Moore recorded a career-high nine receptions, one off the school freshman record, as well as a career-high 116 receiving yards with one touchdown.
- Moore's 100-yard game was the first of his career and the 25th 100-yard receiving game by a Clemson true freshman since the NCAA instituted permanent freshman eligibility in 1972.
- Moore recorded his fifth receiving touchdown of the season on a seven-yard fourth-down scoring pass from

Klubnik in the fourth quarter.

- Between Moore and Bryant Wesco Jr., Clemson has now had multiple freshmen record at least five receiving touchdowns in a season for the first time since 2015 (Deon Cain and Hunter Renfrow).
- Receiver Antonio Williams caught four passes for 66 vards with a touchdown.
- With 11 touchdown receptions on the year, Williams tied Aaron Kelly (11 in 2007) and Mike Williams (11 in 2016) for the sixth-most touchdown receptions in a single season in school history.
- Clemson opened the scoring on the game's opening possession on a 22-yard touchdown pass from Klubnik to Williams.
- Clemson produced a touchdown on its opening drive of a game for the second straight contest, its first time doing so since scoring touchdowns on its first drives against Appalachian State, NC State and Stanford in September.
- Williams has now caught a pass in all 33 games he's played for Clemson since his debut season in 2022. His 33-game streak with a reception leads active Clemson players and is 10 shy of Hunter Renfrow's school record.
- On his first reception, Williams (153) became the 13th player in Clemson history to record 150 career receptions.
- With his fourth catch of the game, Williams (75) posted the first 75-reception season by a Clemson player since 2020 (77 by Amari Rodgers).
- Wide receiver Adam Randall contributed at running back and recorded a career-long 41-yard rush in the second quarter.
- The 41-yard rush by Randall was Clemson's longest by a player listed as a wide receiver since Sammy Watkins' 58-yard touchdown run against Furman in 2012.
- On his second reception of the game, tight end Jake Briningstool (127) became the ninth tight end in ACC history to record 125 career receptions.
- Briningstool finished the game with four catches for 69 yards.
- Briningstool (530) broke his single-season career high of 498 receiving yards, set in 2023.
- Briningstool (530) posted the sixth 500-yard receiving season by a tight end in Clemson history. His 530 receiving yards were the fourth-most by a Clemson tight end in a season in school history.
- Running back Jarvis Green recorded the first touchdown of his career on a 25-yard pass from Klubnik in the third quarter.
- Green finished the game with two receptions for 35 yards, the first two receptions of his career.
- Safety R.J. Mickens recorded his second interception of the season the seventh of his career in the second quarter.
- Mickens played his 60th career game, tying Jalyn Phillips (60 from 2019-23) and Will Putnam (60 from 2019-23) for eighth-most in Clemson history.
- Linebacker Sammy Brown led Clemson with 10 tackles (one for loss).
- Brown finished the year with 11.5 tackles for loss, trailing only T.J. Parker (12.5 in 2023) and Myles Murphy (12.0 in 2020) among true freshmen in school history.
- On his fourth point of the game on a 32-yard field goal late in the first half, placekicker Nolan Hauser (113), who already owned the Clemson record for points by a true freshman, entered the Top 10 in school history in points scored in a single season by a player of any classification.
- Hauser's 113-point 2024 season ranks tied for sixth in Clemson history in kicking points scored in a single season and tied for ninth in school history in points scored by any means in a single season.
  - On its 61st offensive play of the game, Clemson

- (1,006) reached 1,000 offensive plays in a season for the 10th time in school history.
- The teams tied the turnover margin, 1-1. Clemson finished even or better in the turnover margin in a 13th straight game for the first time since a 17-game streak across the 1989-90 seasons. Dating to last season, Clemson has lost the turnover margin only once in its last 19 games.
- Clemson faced Texas for the first time in program history.
- With back-to-back games against SMU and Texas, Clemson played consecutive games in a single season against opponents it had never previously faced for the first time since 1952, a year in which the Tigers made their series debuts against Villanova and Maryland in consecutive weeks.
- Clemson faced its 110th different opponent in program history. Clemson is now 67-39-4 all-time in its first meeting with its 110 opponents, including an 18-2 mark in first meetings since 2003.
- Texas became the 22nd opponent Clemson faced for the first time in postseason play, joining Boston College (1939), Missouri (1948), Colorado (1956), LSU (1958), TCU (1959), Pitt (1977), Ohio State (1978), Baylor (1979), Nebraska (1981), Minnesota (1985), Stanford (1986), Penn State (1987), West Virginia (1989), Illinois (1990), Cal (1991), Syracuse (1995), Louisiana Tech (2001), Texas Tech (2002), South Florida (2010), lowa State (2021) and SMU (2024).
- With December games against SMU and Texas, Clemson played multiple games against teams from Texas in a single season for the first time in school history.
- Announced attendance for the game was 101,150. It was the second-largest crowd ever to witness a Clemson football game, trailing only a 104,794-person crowd at Texas A&M in 2018.
- Clemson elected permanent captains for the 2024 season prior to the game. Clemson's official captains of record for the year and for the game were tight end Jake Briningstool, linebacker Barrett Carter, running back Phil Mafah, safety R.J. Mickens and defensive tackle Payton Page.

#### **COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF STAPLES**

From 2014-23, Clemson cemented itself as one of the College Football Playoff's powerhouses of the tournament's inaugural decade. In the 10-year history of the four-team format prior to 2024, only 15 programs earned at least one College Football Playoff berth, and Clemson ranked second in CFP berths, CFP title game appearances, total CFP wins and CFP titles.

Clemson returned to the College Football Playoff in 2024 in the format's first year of expansion to 12 teams and is one berth shy of Alabama (eight) for the most in history.

With a No. 16 ranking in the final College Football Playoff rankings in 2024, Clemson remained one of three programs (alongside Alabama and Ohio State) to finish in the CFP Top 25 in every year since the tournament's inception.

In 2020, Clemson became the first program ever to win 20 ACC Championships. That year, Clemson became the first program in the conference championship game era to win six straight conference championship games.

Two years later, Clemson's 2022 ACC title was the program's seventh in eight years, as the Tigers became the first team in an active power conference to win seven outright conference titles in an eight-year span since Alabama won eight SEC titles in nine seasons from 1971-

Including titles from its days as a member of the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Association and Southern Conference, Clemson has 28 conference championships overall, also the most of any current ACC school. Duke ranks second among the ACC's current membership with 18 overall conference titles, including 11 Southern Conference titles and seven ACC titles.

The Tigers won the 1900, 1902 and 1903 SIAA Conference championships under John Heisman, then the 1906 SIAA title under Bob Williams. Clemson also won the 1940 and 1948 Southern Conference titles under Frank Howard. Howard won eight total conference titles, including two in the Southern Conference and six in the ACC. Swinney surpassed the legend with a win in the 2024 ACC Championship Game.

For the last quarter-century, Clemson's ACC success has not been a roller-coaster ride of lofty heights and deep lows. The last time Clemson finished a season below .500 in regular season conference play was in 1998, when Tommy West's 3-8 squad went 1-7 in ACC play. Clemson's 26-year streak of being .500 or better in conference play is tied for the longest active streak in the country and tied for the fourth-longest of any streak since 1966.

#### POWER OVER POWER CONFERENCE FOES

Early in his head coaching tenure, Dabo Swinney laid out his belief to then-Clemson athletic director Terry Don Phillips that the Tigers needed to add tough non-conference challenges on top of their tests in ACC play to serve as a foundation for the program's growth.

"I had a conversation with Terry Don and said, 'Terry Don, I know we are not very good right now, but we need to play people because that is going to help me teach and help me develop the culture and the mindset that you have to have to win at the highest level," recounted Swinney. "I didn't think we had that, and that's what we committed to. That's what we've done."

That scheduling philosophy and culture change has resonated in the Clemson program, and since 2011, no team can claim more wins against power conference opponents than the Tigers.

Clemson's national-best 134 power conference wins since 2011 include at least one victory against 27 different programs, including Wake Forest (14), Boston College (12), Georgia Tech (11), Syracuse (10), NC State (10), Florida State (9), South Carolina (8), Louisville (8), Virginia Tech (7), North Carolina (6), Virginia (4), Notre Dame (4), Auburn (4), Miami (Fla.) (4), Maryland (3), Ohio State (3), Pitt (3), Alabama (2), Texas A&M (2), Oklahoma (2), Duke (2), LSU (1), Georgia (1), Iowa State (1), Kentucky (1), Stanford (1) and SMU (1).

On a year-by-year basis, Clemson has finished the season atop the country in wins against power conference opponents a national-best four times since the institution of the College Football Playoff in 2014. That includes 13 wins against power conference opponents in 2018, the first team ever to reach that figure.

#### SIGN AND DEVELOP

While proud of his incoming classes, Head Coach Dabo Swinney has long stated that a true ranking of a recruiting class cannot and should not be published until four years later when the group can be evaluated on performance rather than potential.

Much to Swinney's delight, The Athletic annually assumed that role for the classes of 2014-20, reranking each recruiting class four years later to account for on-field performance.

For its re-rankings, The Athletic uses the following

grading scale: 5 points: All-American, award winner, top-50 NFL Draft pick; 4: Multi-year starter, all-conference honors; 3: One-year starter or key reserve; 2: Career backup; 0: Minor or no contribution, left the program. The outlet also adds a bonus to each program's class average, derived from its total number of wins from 2017 through 2020 (e.g., For re-ranking the Class of 2017, Clemson won 51 games, so its class average received a bonus of 0.51).

Swinney has pointed out that Clemson often falls in rankings as its retention and its commitment to not oversigning leads to smaller recruiting classes. He also notes that much of Clemson's on-field success is a function of the program's development, citing All-Americans like former three-star Isaiah Simmons or former two-star Nolan Turner. The re-rankings illustrate Clemson's impressive track record of talent identification, culture fit, resource allocation and player development

On average, Clemson ranked 10.2 in the 247 Composite team rankings across the 2014-20 recruiting cycles. Upon re-ranking those groups, despite having little room for improvement while recruiting at a Top 15 clip in that span, Clemson ranked 4.0 on average in the re-rankings, a ratings bump of roughly six spots. Each of those Clemson classes averaged at least 10 wins a season during their careers.

#### **SENIOR SUCCESS**

Every January, Head Coach Dabo Swinney conducts his first official meeting with his new team. The first order of business in the meeting is to "reset the room," reorganizing the seating arrangement with seniors in front and all succeeding classes in order behind them in the team auditorium.

Several of Swinney's senior classes placed themselves among select company in college football history. The 2017, 2018, 2019 and 2020 Clemson seniors account for four of only 15 four-year classes in FBS history to reach 50 career wins. That includes the 2018 and 2019 groups that are tied with the 2018 Alabama seniors for the most wins in FBS history (55 wins in four years).

College Football Hall of Famer Frank Howard, known as "The Bashful Baron of Barlow Bend," compiled a 165-118-12 record in 30 seasons at Clemson from 1940-69.

With a 31-23 upset of No. 12 Notre Dame in 2023, Dabo Swinney earned his 166th career victory as Clemson's head coach, surpassing Howard to become Clemson's all-time winningest coach. Swinney accomplished the feat in his 209th career game.

#### **HEAD COACH CONTINUITY**

Over the last decade-and-a-half, Clemson became a beacon of stability in the increasingly unstable environment of college football. Clemson Head Coach Dabo Swinney is in his 23rd overall season at Clemson in 2025, including his 17th full season as head coach (and his 18th including an interim stint in 2008).

From the start of Swinney's first season as full-time head coach in 2009 through 2024, there were 498 head coaching tenures in the FBS (excluding those by interims) but only one such tenure at Clemson. Clemson is one of five schools with only one head coach in that span.

Clemson is the only school in the ACC with only one head coach since the start of the 2009 season, and among the 21 schools ever to qualify for the College Football Playoff, only Clemson has had only one head coach since 2009.

While the term "Final Four" may still be the linguistic property of college basketball, since the advent of the four-team College Football Playoff in 2014, Head Coach Dabo Swinney had Clemson among the sport's final four teams six times from 2015-20, becoming the first coach to lead a team to six consecutive College Football Playoffs since the format's institution in 2014.

The NCAA men's college basketball tournament dates to 1939. In the history of that tournament,

only John Wooden of UCLA (nine from 1967-75) and Mike Krzyzewski of Duke (five from 1988-92) coached teams to at least five consecutive Final Fours. With his sixth "Final Four" appearance in 2020, Swinney joined basketball's Wooden as the only college football or men's basketball coaches to take teams to six consecutive Final Fours in their respective sports.

Swinney is among only nine coaches in football and men's basketball to record six career Final Four berths. He is one of only six with a winning record in Final Four games.

Swinney's ability to place his team among the nation's elite quartet has also been illustrated by the polls. Clemson finished first in the AP Poll in 2016 and 2018, second in 2015 and 2019, third in 2020 and fourth in 2017. Swinney became just the fourth coach to record at least six consecutive top four finishes since the AP Poll began in 1936, an exclusive list that also includes Florida State's Bobby Bowden (13), USC's Pete Carroll (seven) and Oklahoma's Bud Wilkinson (six).

Clemson's streak represented the fifth time a program has had a run of at least six top four finishes in the AP Poll. Miami (Fla.) had a seven-year run from 1986-92 with two different head coaches leading the program.

#### **THROUGH 200 GAMES**

The 2022 Orange Bowl was the 200th game in Dabo Swinney's head coaching career. Among coaches who qualify for the NCAA FBS record book by virtue of five years or 50 wins as a major college head coach, 17 coaches had earned at least 150 victories in their first 200 career games as head coach as of the conclusion of the 2022 season.

At 161-39 through 200 games, Swinney tied Bob Stoops and Robert Neyland (162 each) for the fifthmost wins through 200 career games in major college football history.

Dabo Swinney earned his 150th career head coaching win in only his 186th career game in the 2021 Cheez-It Bowl. He became the sixth-fastest FBS coach to 150 career wins — two games behind Fielding Yost and Joe Paterno — and the fourth-fastest in the modern era.

Four previous Clemson head coaches earned 150+ FBS wins in their careers: John Heisman (186), Jess Neely (207), Frank Howard (165) and Ken Hatfield (168). Howard, a College Football Hall of Famer, recorded his 150th victory in his 273rd career game, in a 14-10 victory against Maryland in 1966 that clinched a piece of what later became an outright ACC title. Heisman earned win No. 150 in game No. 203,

Neely earned it in game No. 268, and Hatfield did it in game 259, though none of those three won more than 43 games in their Clemson tenures.

#### FIRST 15 SEASONS // FIRST 20 SEASONS?

Dabo Swinney completed his 15th season (and his 14th full season) in 2022 with a 161-39 record. Swinney amassed the second-most wins through a coach's first 15 seasons in FBS history despite not having the benefit of a full season in his first year, as he went 4-3 on an interim basis in his first season in 2008 after taking over for Tommy Bowden in October.

#### **DEATH VALLEY ROARS**

Frank Howard Field at Memorial Stadium garnered its famous nickname in the 1940s when Presbyterian College Head Coach Lonnie McMillian, after many years of bringing his teams in for drubbings, dubbed the venue as "Death Valley."

The name stuck, and its patrons have done their part to make it live up to its name and its reputation. In the first 11 years of the College Football Playoff era from 2014-24, Clemson's home atmosphere helped draw 157 false starts by opponents, the second-most of any home venue in the country and the most by a power conference program.

Antonio Williams earned first-team Freshman All-America honors in 2022 after he caught 56 passes for 604 yards with four touchdowns over 14 games (10 starts). Injury befell Williams in his sophomore season in 2023, as he was limited by an ankle injury to only four regular season games in his second season before returning to play a pivotal role in Clemson's come-frombehind Gator Bowl win against Kentucky.

In the offseason to follow, Head Coach Dabo Swinney praised Williams' maturity and laser focus and said the now-redshirt sophomore was in for a big year in 2024.

The head coach's prognostication proved correct. Williams started every game for Clemson and developed into a bona fide top target for Clemson with career highs in every receiving category in 2024.

Clemson needed — and received — a career day from Williams in its 24-20 win at Pitt in 2024. Williams recorded career highs in receiving yards (149) and receptions (13) and matched his career high with two touchdown receptions. His 13 receptions were the most by a Clemson player since both Mike Williams (15) and Artavis Scott (13) reached the mark against Pitt in 2016, and his performance tied for the fourth-most receptions in a game in Clemson history.

Williams became the first Clemson player with double-digit touchdown receptions in a season since Tee Higgins in 2019 (13). He recorded the ninth season in school history with double-digit touchdown receptions.

#### 2024 IN REVIEW

Quarterback Cade Klubnik took a major leap in his second full season as a starter in 2024. As a junior, he completed 308-of-486 passes for 3,639 yards with 36 passing touchdowns and added career highs with 463 yards and seven touchdowns on 119 rushing attempts.

Klubnik combined for 4,100 yards of total offense and 43 total touchdowns while committing only seven turnovers. Research by ESPN.com's David Hale illustrated that Klubnik became only the eighth quarterback to reach those thresholds in the College Football Playoff era. The other seven all finished in the Top 4 in Heisman voting, including five Heisman winners.

Klubnik has helped engineer three fourth-quarter comeback wins, including two as a starter:

- vs. Syracuse (2022): Entered in relief of DJ Uiagalelei and became the first backup quarterback to engineer a fourth-quarter comeback win for Clemson since 2018 (Chase Brice vs. Syracuse).
- vs. Kentucky (2023): Went 8-for-8 as he led Clemson on a 12-play, 68-yard game-winning drive in 2:17 of elapsed game time as Clemson earned its largest fourth-quarter comeback win in a bowl game in school history in the 2023 Gator Bowl.
- at Pitt (2024): After Clemson was held to only 27 yards in the first 28 minutes of the second half, Klubnik got the ball with 1:36 remaining and engineered a three-play, 75-yard drive that he finished by rushing for a game-winning 50-yard touchdown with 1:16 remaining.

Several of Klubnik's rushing touchdowns in 2024 didn't come on run-of-the-mill short yardage plunges. Among his rushing touchdowns that season were touchdown runs of 55 yards against NC State, 34 yards against Stanford and a game-winning 50-yarder at Pitt.

Klubnik's 50-yard rushing touchdown at Pitt was Clemson's longest game-winning offensive touchdown inside the final two minutes of a game on record. Klubnik became the first Clemson player to record multiple 50-yard rushing touchdowns in a single season since Travis Etienne in 2019 (two), and he also became the first Clemson quarterback to record multiple 50-yard rushing touchdowns in a career since Woodrow Dantzler (three from 1999-2001).

#### FROM THE SIDELINE TO THE STAGE

Klubnik's national breakout came in the 2022 ACC Championship Game against North Carolina. He entered the game on Clemson's third possession and completed 20-of-24 passes for 279 yards and a passing touchdown and added seven carries for 30 yards and a rushing touchdown. His 83.3 completion percentage set an ACC Championship Game record and led to his selection as the game's Most Valuable Player in Clemson's 39-10 victory. He became the third freshman (and second true freshman) in the game's history to earn the honor.

#### **DYNAMIC DUO RETURNS**

There was no shortage of contributing factors to Clemson's leap in passing efficiency and explosiveness from 2023 and 2024, but notable among them was the arrival of T.J. Moore and Bryant Wesco Jr. in 2024. While Moore's late-season surge was a bit too belated to garner national recognition, Wesco collected Freshman All-America honors from 247Sports, PFF, ESPN, The Athletic and the FWAA.

The duo ranked in the top six nationally in receiving yards by freshmen and in the top eight in yards per catch among freshmen with at least 30 receptions.

Moore's breakout performance came in a ninecatch, 116-yard effort against Texas's then-top-ranked national pass defense in the College Football Playoff. Thanks in part to Clemson's success through the air, Texas' defense finished the season ranked seventh in passing yards allowed per game (173.8), and Moore's 116 yards were the most by any player against the Longhorns in 2024 and were 113 more than Ohio State Freshman All-American Jeremiah Smith (one catch for three yards) produced in the national semifinals.

#### **WESCO WOWS IN SECOND CAREER GAME**

Wesco recorded one catch in 12 snaps in Clemson's 2024 season opener, as missed opportunities and inefficiency by Clemson — combined with a condensed contest that featured the fewest combined snaps (112) in a Clemson game since 2006 — limited his involvement in his collegiate debut as a true freshman. Afterward, Clemson's coaches vowed to involve him more the following week.

Consider that vow fulfilled.

In his second career game, Wesco caught three passes for 130 yards and a touchdown against Appalachian State, tying the Clemson record for the fewest games needed to record a 100-yard receiving game.

#### **RUNNING BACKS**

Clemson enters 2025 with a relative rarity in the Dabo Swinney era: public unknowns at running back.

Under Swinney, the Tigers have enjoyed a run of feature backs that has included C.J. Spiller, Andre Ellington, Wayne Gallman, Travis Etienne, Will Shipley and Phil Mafah among a bevy of other substantial contributors.

With both members of the Shipley/Mafah duo from Clemson's 2021 recruiting class now having matriculated to the NFL, outside observers are curious to see who will seize Clemson's rushing attack in 2025.

Notable candidates include:

- Adam Randall: A physically imposing former wide receiver whom Dabo Swinney said in July could be "one of the great stories in college football this year." He contributed at running back in a pinch in the College Football Playoff and ripped off a 41-yard run at Texas.
- Jay Haynes: Clemson's No. 2 running back in 2024 averaged 6.86 yards per carry a year ago but spent the 2025 offseason returning from a knee injury suffered in the 2024 ACC Championship Game.
- David Eziomume: A redshirt freshman who came to Clemson as one of the nation's top 20 running backs in the class of 2024 according to most recruiting services.
- Keith Adams Jr.: A bruising bowling ball whose hard-nosed running style and penchant for seeking contact earned him the nickname "Hammerhead" from the coaching staff.
- Gideon Davidson: A true freshman who was a consensus national top 100 player and unanimous four-star prospect out of Virginia. Swinney has often referred to him as "the best back in the country" in the 2025 recruiting class.

That group will seek to continue Clemson's recent run of high-scoring backs over the last decade. Entering 2025, Clemson had a running back reach double digits in rushing touchdowns in nine of the previous 10 seasons. Clemson's nine seasons with a running back scoring 10 or more rushing touchdowns in that span are the most in the country.

#### **TIGHT ENDS**

Clemson lost its school record holder for career receptions by a tight end over the 2025 offseason when Jake Briningstool graduated and signed with the Kansas City Chiefs. Briningstool caught 127 career passes for 1.380 yards and 17 touchdowns over 48 career games.

Clemson's current group of tight ends will seek to continue the unit's production that has seen the tight end group post 60-plus catches in each of the last three seasons, a first in the Dabo Swinney era.

#### -- OFFENSIVE LINE --

#### A VETERAN UNIT IN 2025

Clemson received instant impact from the addition of veteran offensive line coach Matt Luke in his first full season at Clemson in 2024. In his second full season with the Tigers in 2025, he is expected to benefit from the return of an exceedingly veteran unit that returns four of its five primary starters and boasts seven players who have started at least one game for Clemson.

The unit includes two of Clemson's recent iron men. Blake Miller entered his senior season having played 2,893 career offensive snaps, ninth-most in Clemson annals and 862 snaps shy of Mitch Hyatt's school record as of the start of the season. The two-time All-ACC selection started every game for Clemson at right tackle from 2021-23, and he became the first offensive lineman to start every game played by Clemson during his freshman, sophomore and junior campaigns without the benefit of a redshirt year since starting center Ralph Jenkins from 1943-45.

Miller plays alongside a remarkable comeback story in Walker Parks, who started all 14 games for Clemson in 2024 after missing the majority of the 2022 and 2023 seasons with career-threatening ankle injuries. A veteran of 53 games and 42 starts prior to 2025, Parks is a self-professed Clemson lifer who said of Clemson, "If there were no eligibility, I would stay here forever," a maxim validated by his decision to utilize an extra year of eligibility for a sixth season in 2025.

Clemson's other two returning primary starters include one of the team's foremost leaders and one of its active parables of patience. Left tackle Tristan Leigh started 23 games over the two previous seasons, and his progression from five-star recruit to off-radar redshirt to trusted contributor has given him stature and respect as one of the team's most trusted leaders. Center Ryan Linthicum, meanwhile, was one of Clemson's revelations of 2024. Last spring, the then-

career backup was entering his fourth year with limited experience, and he was given spring practice to audition for the role before Clemson sought veteran help at the position. Instead, Linthicum seized the role, starting all 14 games for Clemson and playing 982 snaps from scrimmage, the most of any Clemson player in 2024.

Though depth and injuries combined to limit them to four combined starts in 2024, redshirt junior Collin Sadler and junior Harris Sewell entered 2025 with a combined 40 games and 14 starts of experience along the Tiger offensive line. Sadler provides versatility across the four tackle and guard positions, while Sewell offers tremendous value as a versatile interior piece across the center and guard spots.

Clemson had a breakout young star's trajectory take a brief detour in late 2024. As a true freshman, Elyjah Thurmon impressed when called upon to play 74 outstanding snaps in reserve on the road at Virginia Tech last year, and he earned a start the following week before being lost for the remainder of the season on the game's opening play from scrimmage. Whether as a starter or rotational piece, Thurmon stands primed to be a significant fixture on Clemson's line for the next several seasons.

Clemson's full offensive line group entered the 2025 season with a combined 249 game appearances, 135 starts and 10,403 career offensive snaps.

Though he did not garner first-team all-conference honors from the ACC, Parker earned All-America honorable mention recognition from Phil Steele after he broke the Clemson single-season school record for forced fumbles in a season (six), surpassing Brandon Maye's five from 2009. Parker's record day powered Clemson's season highs with eight sacks and 16 tackles for loss in the contest. Clemson's 16 tackles for loss tied for fourth-most in program history and its eight sacks tied for eighth.

#### WE SEE YOU, T.J. ●●

Parker emphatically announced his arrival as a freshman in 2023 when he set a Clemson true freshman record with 12.5 tackles for loss. That total tied for the national lead in tackles for loss among freshmen.

Parker initially committed to Penn State but coveted a Clemson offer. He decommitted from the Nittany Lions in hopes of soliciting Clemson, and Clemson's 2023 recruiting class immediately went to work.

"CV [Christopher Vizzina], Peter [Woods] and a few other guys on the team, they hit me up with the eyes emoji on Instagram," Parker said. "It was like, 'You know what time it is.' I texted Coach Ski [Then-Clemson Defensive Ends Coach Lemanski Hall] the eyes emoji, the same thing they sent me, and from there we got in contact and a few days later they offered and I committed."

#### -- NO. 17 LB WADE WOODAZ --

#### **OPENING A CAN OF WOODAZ**

In each of linebacker Wade Woodaz's first three seasons at Clemson, the Tampa product has watched as one of his linebacker counterparts earned All-America recognition, including honors for Barrett Carter in 2022 and 2024 and for Jeremiah Trotter Jr. in 2022 and 2023. Head Coach Dabo Swinney was quick though to warn observers not to overlook Woodaz.

"He's a baller," Swinney said. "The kid is tough, physical, he can really run. He really understands the game at a high level. He played most of his [prep] career as a quarterback and as a safety, so he has a great understanding of the game. He plays really, really hard; he's a great effort guy, he's a great preparer and he loves it. He's a fun guy to coach and a fun guy to watch play because he plays the way you want everybody to play."

Though Clemson's linebacker corps in 2024 included All-American Barrett Carter and ACC Defensive Rookie of the Year Sammy Brown, it was Woodaz who led the team in tackles, a feat he accomplished despite missing two games with a leg contusion. Coaches credited Woodaz with 89 stops, 10 tackles for loss, 3.0 sacks, six pass breakups, three forced fumbles and an interception.

Woodaz was one of six power conference players to record double-digit tackles for loss, three or more forced fumbles and an interception in 2024 (Texas' Anthony Hill Jr. and Colin Simmons, Indiana's Jailin Walker, UCLA's Kain Medrano and Texas Tech's Jacob Rodriguez). He also became the first Clemson player credited with at least 75 tackles and at least three forced fumbles since Isaiah Simmons in 2018.

#### -- NO. 47 LB SAMMY BROWN --

#### SAMMY'S SENSATIONAL START

Linebacker Sammy Brown arrived at Clemson in January 2024 as a consensus Top 30 player in his recruiting class and as the nation's reigning High School Butkus Award winner.

Head Coach Dabo Swinney praised Brown as an "alpha," but spoke frequently about Brown's learning curve at the linebacker position after playing both running back and linebacker at Jefferson High School in Commerce, Ga. The linebacker tabbed as 247Sports' No. 1 "freak athlete" in the 2024 recruiting class proved to be a quick study, appearing in all 14 games for Clemson with six starts.

After Clemson opened its first eight games in twolinebacker sets, Brown earned his first start at Virginia Tech on Nov. 9 as Clemson opened the game with three linebackers. The former five-star prospect delivered, recording a team-high eight tackles (per the gameday stat crew) with 2.5 tackles for loss and a sack.

"Sammy's been getting better and better and better and it was awesome to see him have that type of game," Swinney said after Brown's performance at Virginia Tech. "He's just a confident young man, and, boy, he's got a bright future ahead of him. He's going to be a great one."

Despite playing only 444 defensive snaps over 14 games in 2024, Brown ranked second in the nation in tackles for loss among freshmen.

#### **MEET THE NEW GUYS**

- WR Tristan Smith (signed Dec. 18):  $\mbox{Smith}\ \mbox{joined}$ 

Clemson after playing the 2024 season at Southeast Missouri State, helping the Redhawks to a first-place finish in the Big South-OVC Football Association and a berth in the Football Championship Subdivision playoffs. The 2024 all-conference honoree played in SEMO's final 11 games of the season, catching 76 passes for 934 yards and six touchdown receptions in addition to rushing for one touchdown.

- **DE Will Heldt (signed Dec. 19):** Heldt signed with Clemson after playing his first two collegiate seasons at Purdue, appearing in all 24 games for the Boilermakers from 2023-24. As a sophomore in 2024, gameday stat crews credited Heldt with 56 tackles (10.0 for loss), 5.0 sacks and a fumble recovery he returned 16 yards for a touchdown. He recorded 2.5 sacks and the 16-yard scoop-and-score in back-to-back games against ranked opponents Illinois and Oregon in October.
- LB Jeremiah Alexander (signed Jan. 8): Alexander played his first three collegiate seasons at Alabama from 2022-24. Following a redshirt year in 2022 in which he appeared in three games, Alexander played in 24 of the Crimson Tide's 27 games across the 2023-24 seasons and was credited with eight tackles in those contests. In high school, he led Alabama's Thompson High School to the 2021 state championship (alongside current Clemson defensive lineman Peter Woods) as a consensus five-star recruit across most major outlets and ranked among the nation's top 50 players in his class.

Head Coach Dabo Swinney expounded on Clemson's strategy for the three winter transfer additions:

"As I've always said, we do what's best for Clemson. We'll use the portal whenever we need it and we'll be strategic with it. We needed it four years ago; we needed a backup quarterback and we got one. The next year, we needed a backup quarterback and we got one and he was here for two years.

"This year, we didn't anticipate signing a defensive line portal guy. We had two great ones committed and we were taking two. But as y'all know, things can change in recruiting. We had a young man back out and decide to go somewhere else, so there wasn't anybody left to recruit that could fill the need. Now we [had] a gap so we had to go use the portal and we needed a high-level guy and we got the guy I wanted to hit [Heldt].

"From a receiver standpoint, we had two guys go in the portal, and so we had a gap. We needed to go get a guy, and we needed somebody that could come in and help us with our depth and come in and compete and we found a great kid in Tristan out in Southeast Missouri. We were looking for a little length, and high school recruiting was over; there was nobody to get. We needed to go get a guy.

"And then the linebacker situation, honestly, we weren't really going to take a 'backer. We knew we needed another guy. Logan Anderson, our signee, tore his ACL. Kobe [McCloud], his situation [rehabbing from a knee injury]. We knew we probably needed another guy, but we were going to wait until May. And then Jeremiah popped up. We knew all about him, obviously recruited him hard, knew his family. That was a really good situation that worked out for us.

"That's really it. Nothing different. I know everybody likes to write about it, but our process is still the same. We're going to recruit high school kids as long as we can get the best of the best. As long as we can get the Gideon Davidsons of the world and the Sammy Browns of the world and the T.J. Parkers and Peter Woods and Cade Klubniks, that's what we're going to do, and we're going to develop... And then we have to respond if we have a situation and we have a gap in our roster or we have kids that leave. For us, that's how we use the

portal, but the process isn't any different. They've still got to be the right fit, they've got to check all the boxes, they can't *just* be a good player. No different than our high school recruiting."

#### -- DEFENSE --

#### **CFP-ERA DEFENSIVE TRACK RECORD**

Clemson has a track record of producing one of the nation's top defenses in most seasons since the advent of the College Football Playoff in 2014.

Clemson ranked in the Top 30 in the country in total defense in each of the first 10 seasons of the CFP era and also ranked among the Top 30 in scoring defense in those 10 campaigns (including five Top 5 finishes in the category).

Clemson's defensive anomaly in 2024 led to a change in leadership, as the Tigers plucked Penn State Defensive Coordinator Tom Allen for Clemson's defensive coordinator position immediately following the Nittany Lions' exit from the College Football Playoff. Allen now leads a Clemson defense that tied for the national lead in Top 10 finishes in average yards allowed per game in the College Football Playoff era.

#### **ALLEN IS ALL IN**

Clemson officially announced Tom Allen as its new defensive coordinator on Jan. 14.

"Tom checked every box that I was looking for," Head Coach Dabo Swinney said. "We've got a great football coach — and a great leader of men — coming to Clemson... He brings a ton of experience and was highly recommended by some of the best people in this business. He is obviously coming off of a great year as the defensive coordinator at Penn State, and we're excited to welcome him as our defensive coordinator here at Clemson."

Allen joined the Tigers with more than three decades of coaching experience. In 2024, he helped Penn State to a school-record 13 wins and a College Football Playoff berth. His defense recorded two pick-sixes in Penn State's 38-10 win against SMU in the College Football Playoff First Round, and in the following game, his unit bottled up Heisman runner-up Ashton Jeanty, holding the star running back to a season-low 3.47 yards per carry and no touchdowns in a 31-14 Penn State victory in the CFP Quarterfinal at Fiesta Bowl.

Penn State finished seventh in the nation in total defense (294.8 yards per game) and eighth in the nation in scoring defense (16.5 points per game) under

Allen's guidance in 2024.

#### **300 OR FEWER YARDS**

Clemson has held opponents under 300 yards of offense 50 times since the start of the 2018 season, tied for the second-most in the country.

#### WHO'S YOUR HAUSER?

Placekicker Nolan Hauser arrived at Clemson in January 2024 as the national high school record-holder for career field goals made (66) during his career at Hough High School in Cornelius. N.C.

Hauser (pronounced HOO-zer, not HOW-zer) opened his career with a streak of 25 consecutive made kicks (five field goals & 20 PATs) before a blocked PAT against Stanford in game four accounted for his first miss.

A week later at Florida State, Hauser made five field goals and accounted for 17 total points in Clemson's 16-point road win. The five-field-goal performance by Hauser was Clemson's first since Chandler Catanzaro went 5-for-5 on field goal attempts against Boston College in 2011.

Hauser's six points against Virginia Tech in Novemebr 2024 gave him the school record for points in a true freshman season, breaking the previous mark of 78 set by Sammy Watkins in 2011. In the ACC Championship Game, he reached the century mark to post the first 100-point season by a true freshman in Clemson history.

Hauser's 113-point 2024 season ranked tied for sixth in Clemson history in kicking points scored in a single season and tied for ninth in school history in points scored by any means in a single season.

Hauser is a second-generation Clemson student-athlete. His mother, Sheri Hauser (née Bueter), was an All-American soccer player at Clemson from 1994-97, and his father, Scott, played baseball at Clemson in from 1995-97 and was 6-2 as a pitcher on Clemson's College World Series team of 1996. His sister, Ella, was also a member of Clemson's women's soccer team from 2021-24

#### HAUSER'S HIGHLIGHT

Though the pronunciation of his last name often trips up observers, Hauser made his name much more nationally recognizable with the seminal highlight of the 2024 ACC Championship Game.

In what Clemson Head Coach Dabo Swinney called "the biggest kick in Clemson history," the true freshman booted a 56-yard game winning field goal as time expired to give Clemson its 22nd ACC title, its 10th win of the season and its seventh College Football Playoff berth. Of note:

- Hauser's field goal gave Clemson the first walk-off win in ACC Championship Game history.
- Hauser became the first Clemson player to kick a game-winning walk-off field goal since Chandler Catanzaro hit a 37-yard field goal to beat LSU to end the 2012 Chick-Fil-A Bowl.
- Hauser's 56-yard field goal was the longest gamewinning field goal as time expired in Clemson history.
- Hauser's career-long 56-yard field goal was the fourth-longest field goal in Clemson history but its longest away from Death Valley. It was also the longest field goal in postseason play in Clemson history.
- Hauser became the first FBS player ever to win a conference championship game by kicking a field goal of 50 or more yards as time expired.
- The game-winning field goal came in Hauser's home metro area, as his hometown of Cornelius, N.C. is roughly 20 miles north of Bank of America Stadium in Charlotte.

#### THE OTHER SWINNEY DYNASTY

Like the Colquitt family punting at Tennessee, the Swinney family holding for placekicks at Clemson has become a dynasty of its own.

Head Coach Dabo Swinney's oldest son, Will, arrived at Clemson in 2017 and immediately earned Clemson's starting holder position on placekicks. He played five seasons and a record-tying 69 games at Clemson through 2021. In those five seasons, Clemson scored 565 points on placekicks, including field goals and PATs, and he held for 555 of those 565 points. The only 10 Clemson kicking points not held by Will in his career were instead held by his brother, Drew, who was Clemson's starter at the position in 2022.

Will and Drew were succeeded by the youngest of the three Swinney boys, Clay, a redshirt junior in his third season as Clemson's starting holder in 2025. Clay's presence creates a plausible scenario in which every

Clemson placekick in a full 10-year span from 2017-26 could be held by a Swinney.

Clemson's last hold by any player outside the Swinney family was on the final point of Clemson's 2016 national championship, as Seth Ryan, coincidentally also the son of a famous long-time coach (Rex Ryan), held the PAT following Hunter Renfrow's game-winning touchdown with one second remaining.

Clemson's 2024 win against Stanford marked Clemson's 100th consecutive game with a Swinney as holder, a game that ironically resulted in Dabo Swinney's 100th career home win at Memorial Stadium. The family crossed 800 kicking points held for in the contest as well.

#### **TURNOVER TURNAROUND**

Amid Clemson's frustrating 4-4 start to the 2023 season, Head Coach Dabo Swinney was running out of descriptors to explain Clemson's maddening penchant for turning the ball over — and doing so catastrophically.

A year later, Clemson was one of the nation's best teams at protecting the football. The Tigers ranked fourth in the nation in turnover margin (+16) in 2024.

#### **EXPLOSIVENESS IS BACK**

From 2018-20, Clemson strung together its three best seasons in school history in yards per play while accumulating a 39-3 record and three College Football Playoff berths. In the three years to follow, Clemson's explosiveness dropped from an average of seventh nationally to an average of 91st.

The Tigers took a significant jump nationally in yards per play and scrimmage plays of various distances in 2024.

Clemson's 6.29 yards-per-play average in 2024 ranked seventh in a season in school history.

#### **DEFEATS IN REVIEW**

Clemson has lost 21 games since 2015, the third-fewest in the nation in that span. Nine of Clemson's 21 losses since 2015 — greater than 42 percent — have come against AP Top 5 teams.

The opponents to whom Clemson has lost since 2015 have a combined final record of 211-66, a winning percentage of .762. Clemson has not lost to a team that finished with a losing record since 2017 and has not lost to a team with a losing record at the time of the game since losing to 2-5 Boston College in 2010, Dabo Swinney's second full season as head coach.

Clemson was undefeated when exceeding both 200 rushing yards and 200 passing yards — 58-0 under Swinney and 108-0-1 all-time — until opening the 2023 season with a loss at Duke in which the Tigers reached the double-century mark in both categories. The defeat was also a statistical anomaly nationally, as from 2014 through that 2023 season opener, FBS teams who passed for 200-plus yards, rushed for 200plus yards and gave up 28 or fewer points in a single gam were a combined 1748-41 (97.7 percent).

The anomaly struck again in 2024 when Clemson reached 200 yards in both categories in a loss to Louisville. After Clemson's loss in that game, FBS teams who, like Clemson, reached 200 passing yards and 200 rushing yards while also producing 30+ first downs and no turnovers were a combined 326-21 (93.9 percent) since 2000.

#### **GROUND GAME**

The approach to creating functional depth and rewarding players ready to play has been a key philosophy for Head Coach Dabo Swinney, whose own collegiate playing career was hatched as a walk-on fighting for playing time in Alabama's receiving corps.

"We're fully committed to playing guys who deserve to play," Swinney said. "You commit to a guy early in the season, and even if a guy has only played 10 percent of the snaps, when you get to game eight or nine, they've got some good experience."

In a statistic unlikely to be challenged in the wake of upcoming NCAA roster limits, Clemson has played 100+ players in a game six times under Dabo Swinney.

#### **FINISH**

In 2018, Clemson debuted a new version of its "This is Why We Work" fourth quarter video at Death Valley, a hype video imploring the team to finish and featuring Director of Strength and Conditioning Joey Batson bellowing:

"Let me tell you something right now: they don't put championship rings on smooth hands! You gotta go earn it! You gotta go earn it six seconds at a time! You win championships when the stadium is empty, when the band ain't playing, when the cheerleaders ain't cheering, when it's just you and your brothers right beside you. That's when you win championships! In the fourth quarter, that is when we shine!"

The video and the speech became a part of Clemson lore, buoyed by its playing during Clemson's comeback win against Syracuse that year en route to a 15-0 national championship season. Over the years, the video has changed but the speech remains the same, with many Clemson fans yelling it in unison as it plays.

Clemson holds a 145-5 record since 2011 when leading after three quarters. And though Head Coach Dabo Swinney frequently reiterates the phrase, "There is nothing less important than the score at halftime," Clemson ranks first since 2017 in both A) number of games leading at halftime and B) winning percentage in those games.

#### ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

- Entering the 2025 fall semester, of the 410 eligible players who completed their athletic eligibility at Clemson and/or graduated early in Dabo Swinney's 16+ full years as head coach, 404 (98.5 percent) have earned a degree during their time at Clemson.
- Clemson earned the AFCA Academic Achievement Award for 2024. The award was Clemson's fourth in the last seven years, but it was Clemson's fourth in the last five years that the honor was actually awarded, as the organization did not name recipients during a two-year period amid the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Clemson broke program multi-year NCAA Academic Progress Rate (APR) records in three straight years from 2017-19 (987 in 2016-17, 992 in 2017-18 and 993 in 2018-19) before the NCAA suspended APR reporting during the COVID-19 pandemic. Upon reinstatement of APR reporting in June 2022, Clemson shattered its multi-year APR record with a 999 covering the 2017-18 through 2020-21 academic years. Clemson has posted a 995 multi-year APR in each of the last three cycles.

- Most recently, Clemson posted a 995 multi-year APR covering 2020-21 through 2023-24, tied for fifth-best in the FBS. Clemson's lofty academic success in that period coincided with 40 wins in a four-year span and two ACC titles.

- Prior to the suspension of APR Public Recognition Awards following the COVID-19 pandemic, the NCAA recognized Clemson with its annual honor, which is bestowed upon programs ranking in the Top 10 percent of their respective sports, for nine of the award's last 10 reported academic cycles. Only 37 FBS programs earned at least one APR recognition across the 2009-10 through 2018-19 academic years. Only 30 programs earned it multiple times. Clemson, Duke and Northwestern were the only ones to earn the award 9+ times in that 10-year span.
- With its award for the 2018-19 academic year, Clemson became the only FBS program since the NCAA created the APR metric in 2003 to win a national championship and an APR Public Recognition Award in the same year multiple times. Alabama is the only other school to accomplish the title/APR double in a single year once (2011-12 academic year).
- A program-record 98 individuals earned a 3.0 GPA or better in Fall 2024. That included program-record 20 perfect 4.0s.
- Clemson set a record in Fall 2024 with the highest single-semester GPA in program history with a 3.19 team GPA. Clemson followed that up with a 3.18 spring semester.
- Entering the 2025 fall semester, Clemson has had 75+ individuals earn a 3.0 or better GPA in eight consecutive semesters.

#### HISTORIC GRADUATION SUCCESS RATE

Aided in part by historically elite academic performance by Clemson Football, Clemson Athletics tied for best in the NCAA among public Power Five institutions in Graduation Success Rate (GSR) with a 96 percent mark for the 2014-17 cohort in data released by the NCAA in November 2024.

Football reached a 99 percent mark for the second year in a row, again tying the highest GSR score for any Power Five football program, and tying the highest ever recorded among public Power Five football programs in the 20 years the NCAA has tracked the metric. Football trailed only Air Force and LIU (100 percent) in this release, and tied Columbia, Harvard and Northwestern.

#### CHURNING OUT NFL TALENT

Since assuming the head role midseason in 2008, Head Coach Dabo Swinney has produced 86 NFL draft picks during his head coaching tenure. His 86 draft picks produced are the most by any active coach in the nation since the 2009 NFL Draft, and his 18 first-rounders are the fourth-most overall and second-most of any active coach in that span.

Additional nuggets on Clemson's recent success in the NFL Draft are included below:

- Clemson has had at least one player selected in 23 consecutive drafts since 2003, representing the second-longest streak in school history behind a 24year streak across the 1951-74 NFL Drafts.
- Clemson is one of only six schools to have produced multiple draft picks in each of the last 23 NFL Drafts (LSU, Michigan, Oklahoma, Ohio State and USC).
- Clemson has had at least three selections in 16 of its 17 drafts since Dabo Swinney was elevated to head coach. Clemson is one of six schools to have produced three or more picks at least 16 times in that span alongside Alabama, LSU, Ohio State, Oklahoma and USC.
- Including two defensive picks in the 2025 NFL Draft, Clemson has produced multiple defensive draft picks in 14 of the 17 drafts of the Dabo Swinney era. Clemson, LSU, Alabama, Ohio State and Georgia are the only programs to produce multiple draft picks from their defenses in at least 14 drafts in that span.
- Clemson has had at least one player chosen by 30 of the 32 NFL franchises since 2003. The lone exceptions in that time frame are the Patriots, who last selected a Tiger in 1991, and the Panthers, who have never selected a Clemson player despite playing their first season in franchise history in Death Valley.
- Head Coach Dabo Swinney has produced a draft pick for 28 of the 32 NFL teams in his head coaching tenure; the only NFL teams not to select a Clemson player in Swinney's head coaching tenure are the Chicago Bears, Denver Broncos, New England Patriots and Carolina Panthers.
- Though Clemson did not have a player selected in the first round of the 2025 NFL Draft, Clemson has had at least one first-round draft choice in 10 of the last 13 years, standing alongside Alabama, Florida, Georgia and Ohio State as the only programs to produce a first-round pick in at least 10 of the last 13 years.
- Since 2013, Clemson has produced first-round picks from the QB, RB, WR, DE, DT, LB and DB position

groups. The only other school with at least one first-rounder at all those positions in that span is Alabama.

- Linebacker Barrett Carter's selection in the 2025 NFL Draft represented the fourth consecutive draft in which Clemson had a linebacker selected. Clemson and Alabama are the only programs in the nation to produce at least one linebacker in each of the last four NFL Drafts.
- Safety R.J. Mickens' selection in the 2025 NFL Draft gave Clemson at least one drafted defensive back in 13 of Clemson's 17 drafts in the Dabo Swinney era.

ATLANTA — No. 1 Georgia used a 28-3 second half run to pull away from No. 14 Clemson, 34-3, in the Aflac Kickoff Game at Mercedes-Benz Stadium in Atlanta

Linebacker Wade Woodaz led Clemson with a career-high eight tackles (seven solo, one for loss), while sophomore defensive lineman Peter Woods added a career-high 2.5 tackles for loss. Antonio Williams led Clemson's offense with six receptions for 76 yards.

The game was scoreless after the first quarter, as the teams traded punts on each of the game's first five possessions. Second-quarter field goals of 30 and 55 yards by Peyton Woodring gave Georgia a 6-0 halftime edge. The tightly contested first half featured only 50 combined plays from scrimmage, 10 combined first downs and eight combined punts.

Georgia extended its lead to 13-0 on the opening possession of the second half when Carson Beck found Colbie Young for a seven-yard touchdown. Clemson scored on its first possession of the second half when freshman Nolan Hauser made a 26-yard field goal, the first of his collegiate career, to cut the lead to 13-3. However, Georgia extended its advantage to 20-3 with 3:15 remaining in the third quarter on a one-yard touchdown run by Nate Frazier.

Georgia's London Humphreys added a 40-yard touchdown reception on a pass from Beck with 9:57 to play in the fourth quarter to make the score 27-3 in favor of the Bulldogs. An interception by Georgia's Malaki Starks — the game's lone takeaway — set up Cash Jones to cap the ensuing Georgia drive with a 15-yard rushing touchdown, pushing the final score to 34-3.

CLEMSON, S.C. — Clemson scored a touchdown on each of its first eight possessions of the first half to ride a 35-0 first quarter lead and 56-13 halftime edge to a 66-20 win against Appalachian State in Death Valley.

Cade Klubnik earned Walter Camp National Offensive Player of the Week and Davey O'Brien National Quarterback of the Week for his performance in which he completed 24-of-26 passes for 378 yards and five passing touchdowns and rushed for two additional touchdowns in only one half of play. According to ESPN, he became the only FBS player win the last 25 years to record five passing touchdowns, two rushing touchdowns and a completion rate of 90 percent or better in a game.

Clemson's 712 yards of offense were the sixth-most in school history. That total included a school-record 525 yards in the first half. Clemson's 35 first-quarter points were the most in a first quarter in school history, and its 56 first-half points were a modern record for the program.

Clemson recorded its first game with a 300-yard passer (Klubnik), a 100-yard rusher (Phil Mafah) and two 100-yard receivers (Bryant Wesco Jr. & Jake Briningstool) since 2012 against NC State when Clemson had a 300-yard passer (Tajh Boyd), two 100-yard rushers (Andre Ellington and Tajh Boyd) and two 100-yard receivers (Sammy Watkins and Brandon Ford).

CLEMSON, S.C. — Clemson earned its 800th victory in program history with a 59-35 victory against NC State at Memorial Stadium. Clemson became the 14th FBS program and first ACC team ever to reach 800 wins.

Quarterback Cade Klubnik completed 16-of-24 passes for 209 yards with three passing touchdowns and added four carries for a career-high 70 rushing yards and one rushing touchdown. Running back Phil Mafah rushed seven times for 107 yards with a touchdown. Clemson's first-team offense scored points on eight of its nine drives, including seven touchdowns and one field goal.

Clemson raced out to a 28-0 first-quarter lead, becoming the first FBS team in 20 years of accessible ESPN data to hold a lead of 28 or more points after the first quarter of consecutive games. NC State would add 21 points against Clemson's backups in the fourth quarter to pull the final score to 59-35.

CLEMSON, S.C. - Head Coach Dabo Swinney earned his 100th home win as Clemson defeated Stanford, 40-14, at Death Valley in the teams' first matchup as conference foes.

Quarterback Cade Klubnik completed 15-of-31 passes for 255 yards with four passing touchdowns and added seven carries for 48 yards with a rushing touchdown. Wide receiver Bryant Wesco Jr. caught two passes for a team-high 104 yards and a touchdown.

Defensively, Clemson recorded four sacks while adding three takeaways and three turnovers on downs. Linebacker Barrett Carter tied his career high with 3.5 tackles for loss, while linebacker Sammy Brown recorded 2.0 sacks for his first career multi-sack game.

After Clemson turned Stanford over on downs on the game's opening possession, the Tigers opened the scoring on a 34-yard touchdown scramble by Klubnik. Red zone interceptions by Avieon Terrell and Jeadyn Lukus and a 20-yard Nolan Hauser field goal gave Clemson a 10-0 first-quarter lead. The teams traded secondquarter touchdowns to make the game 17-7 at the half.

Clemson pulled away in the second half thanks to three of Klubnik's four passing touchdowns on the day. Wide receiver Cole Turner and tight end Olsen Patt-Henry each recorded their first career receiving touchdowns, as the former rose up to haul in a 43-yard pass from Klubnik and the latter snagged a two-yard Klubnik throw in the end zone. Wesco scored on a 34-yard catch-and-run and joined Sammy Watkins as the only players in Clemson history to record multiple 100-yard receiving games in the first four games of a career.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. — Phil Mafah ran for 154 yards as the No. 15 Tigers defeated Florida State in Doak Campbell Stadium. The victory was the 174th career head coaching win for Clemson Head Coach Dabo Swinney, who broke College Football Hall of Famer Bobby Bowden's conference record for career victories as an ACC head coach.

Quarterback Cade Klubnik finished 19-for-33 for 235 passing yards and a pair of first-half touchdowns and added 62 rushing yards on 11 carries. Wide receiver Antonio Williams tallied career-bests in receiving yards (84), rushing yards (36) and all-purpose yards (157). Freshman Nolan Hauser hit five field goals, becoming the first Clemson kicker to hit five in a game since Chandler Catanzaro in 2011.

Clemson jumped out to a 17-0 lead on the 1-4 Seminoles, as the Tigers supplemented Hauser's first field goal with Klubnik touchdown passes to Williams and T.J. Moore. The 17 points pushed Clemson's edge in first quarters through five games to 90-0.

A Brock Glenn touchdown pass cut the Clemson lead to 17-6, but a pair of Hauser field goals in the final two minutes brough the halftime score to 23-7.

Florida State scored early in the fourth quarter, but a two-point conversion attempt to try to cut the lead to eight fell incomplete. The Tigers leaned on their running game to close out the victory, as the Tigers gained 109 yards on 11 carries - with zero pass attempts— in the final frame to tack on two more Hauser field goals and earn the 29-13 win.

Cade Klubnik completed 31-for-41 passes for 309 yards and three touchdowns. Phil Mafah ran for 108 vards and a pair of touchdowns, and tight end Jake Briningstool hauled in seven catches for 104 yards and

Additionally, Antonio Williams became the first Tiger since C.J. Spiller in 2009 to throw and catch a touchdown in a game, hauling in a 22-yarder from Klubnik in the second quarter and hitting Briningstool on a 28yard double pass in the third quarter.

The Tigers rolled up 566 yards of offense and 37 first downs -third-most in school history - and held possession for a season-best 36:29 while holding Wake Forest to just 233 yards of offense and 16 first downs.

Wake Forest opened the scoring on the game's fifth possession, when quarterback Hank Bachmeier found Horatio Fields for a 31-yard touchdown late in the first quarter. The touchdown represented the first points surrendered by Clemson in a first quarter this season. The Tigers would outscore Wake Forest 49-7 over the next three quarters.

Six different Tigers (two by Mafah, one each by Williams, Troy Stellato, Adam Randall, Briningstool and Keith Adams Jr. scored touchdowns in the contest. Safeties Kylon Griffin and Khalil Barnes recorded interceptions, and Barrett Carter notched a sack in a third consecutive game.

PITTSBURGH - With the Tigers trailing 20-17 and on their own 25-yard line with 1:36 to play, junior quarterback Cade Klubnik scored on a 50-yard draw with 1:16 left to lift Clemson (8-2, 7-1 ACC) to a 24-20 win at Pittsburgh (7-3, 3-3 ACC) at Acrisure Stadium. Clemson's defense sealed the win as Khalil Barnes recorded an interception on the final play.

Clemson's defense registered season highs with 16.0 tackles for loss and 8.0 sacks, including a schoolrecord-tying 4.0 sacks from T.J. Parker. Antonio Williams had career bests of 13 receptions and 149 yards and a pair of first-half touchdowns.

Clemson opened the scoring on its second possession, using an eight-play, 93-yard drive capped by a 14-yard Klubnik touchdown pass to Williams to take a 7-0 lead. Pitt responded with a two-yard touchdown run by Daniel Carter. In the second quarter, a 28-yard Klubnik strike to Williams gave Clemson a 14-7 lead. Nolan Hauser's career-long 51-yard field goal with three seconds remaining in the first half made the score 17-7.

Pitt cut into Clemson's lead with 10:55 to play with a field goal after the Tiger defense held at the goal line. Pitt tied the game on its next drive on a Nate Yarnell touchdown pass to Gavin Bartholomew. Clemson drove into Pitt territory on the following drive, but was stopped on 4th-and-1 to give the Panthers the ball with 4:17 remaining. Pitt took a 20-17 lead on a Ben Sauls 47-yard field goal with 1:36 remaining in the contest.

After initially being held to 27 yards in the second half, Clemson then went 75 yards in three plays, capped by Klubnik's game-winning 50-yard run with 1:16 to play. Pitt's final drive covered 73 yards in 10 plays, but Barnes' pick as time ran out ended the game.

CLEMSON, S.C. - Running back Jay Haynes ran for 118 yards and two touchdowns on just five carries as Clemson cruised past The Citadel on Senior Day and Military Appreciation Day. The win gave Clemson nine wins in 14 consecutive seasons, tying Florida State for the third-longest streak in major college football history.

The Tigers scored three touchdowns of 55 yards or longer in the first half. Defensive tackle Payton Page intercepted a pass and took it 57 yards for a touchdown, freshman wide receiver Bryant Wesco Jr. scored on a 55-yard pass, and Haynes broke free for a 70-yard rushing score. The Tigers established a 42-0 lead with 13:13 to play in the second half before removing the majority of its first unit.

Linebacker Barrett Carter found his way into the end zone on a running play with 6:25 to play to go along with six tackles. Freshman linebacker Sammy Brown added a team-high 11 stops.

Clemson scored touchdowns on each of its first five possessions and added a 32-yard Nolan Hauser field goal on its sixth possession. The Tigers held a 45-7 lead after three quarters.

The Citadel opened the fourth guarter with a blocked field goal followed by a 66-yard touchdown reception by Javonte Graves-Billips on a flea flicker to cut the score to 45-14. The Tigers answered with a nine-play, 70-yard touchdown drive, with Carter rushing four yards into the end zone on the first offensive snap of his career to bring the final score to 51-14.

CLEMSON, S.C. - Cade Klubnik led No. 12 Clemson (9-3) inside the 20-yard line with less than a minute to play, but a deflected pass was intercepted by Demetrius Knight Jr. to seal a 17-14 win for No. 14 South Carolina (9-3) at Memorial Stadium.

Klubnik completed 24-for-36 passes for 280 yards and added 10 carries for 62 yards and both of Clemson's touchdowns on the ground. Clemson had six tackles for loss, three sacks and forced three turnovers.

After a scoreless first quarter, Clemson opened the game's scoring on the Tigers' third drive. Klubnik scampered 13 yards to give Clemson a 7-0 lead. The Gamecocks responded on their ensuing possession with a 25-yard touchdown run by LaNorris Sellers. The six-play, 75-yard drive evened the score at 7-7 as the teams remained tied heading into halftime.

On Clemson's first drive of the second half, Klubnik capped an 11-play, 80-yard drive with his second touchdown run of the day, this time covering 18 yards.

After a T.J. Parker strip-sack in the first quarter, Clemson recorded its second and third takeaways of the day in the second half. Avieon Terrell forced a thirdquarter fumble that was recovered by Barrett Carter, and Khalil Barnes ended a scoring threat with a fourthquarter interception as Clemson carried a 14-7 lead into the fourth quarter.

South Carolina notched back-to-back scoring drives late in the contest when kicker Alex Herrera converted a 42-yard field goal to cut the lead. A 20-yard touchdown rush by Sellers with 1:08 left in the fourth quarter ended a nine-play, 75-yard drive by putting the Gamecocks ahead, 17-14.

Klubnik then led a seven-play, 45-yard drive to put the Tigers inside the 20, but South Carolina secured the win with Knight's interception with 12 seconds left on the clock.

CHARLOTTE, N.C. - Freshman Nolan Hauser made a 56-yard field goal as time expired as No. 17 Clemson won the ACC Championship Game and earned its seventh College Football Playoff berth with a 34-31 victory over No. 8 SMU at Bank of America Stadium.

Clemson led 31-14 after three quarters, but SMU scored 17 in a row and tied the game 31-31 with 16 seconds remaining. But Clemson responded as Adam Randall's 41-yard kickoff return got the Tigers to the Clemson 45-yard line. After quarterback Cade Klubnik hit Antonio Williams for 17 yards, Hauser put the 56-yarder down the middle to capture the title. It was the longest game-winning field goal in Clemson history and the first game-winning field goal of 50-plus yards in conference championship game history.

Klubnik went 24-of-41 passing for 262 yards and an ACC Championship Game record-tying four passing touchdowns to earn Most Valuable Player honors. He became only the third player ever to win multiple ACC Championship Game MVP honors (Deshaun Watson and Tyrod Taylor, two each).

Freshman wide receiver Bryant Wesco Jr. had eight catches for 143 yards and two touchdowns, and junior tight end Jake Briningstool recorded four catches for 23 vards and two touchdowns. Defensively, Clemson forced two first-half turnovers, a strip sack by sophomore defensive end T.J. Parker, who also recorded eight tackles (3.5 for loss), and an interception by sophomore safety Khalil Barnes. Sammy Brown led the defense with 14 tackles (0.5 for loss).

The conference title was Clemson's 28th all-time and its 22nd as a member of the ACC.

AUSTIN, Texas - No. 12-seed Clemson cut a 21-point deficit to a touchdown early in the fourth quarter, but fifth-seeded Texas held off a pair of potential scoring drives late to hold on for a 38-24 win in the College Football Playoff First Round.

The Tigers had two fourth-quarter drives stall as they made a bid to cut into the lead again, including a fourth-down stop on the one-yard line. Texas ran 48 times for 292 yards and four touchdowns, averaging 6.1 yards per carry, including a 77-yard touchdown run two plays after the Tigers cut the lead to 31-24.

Quarterback Cade Klubnik, playing in his hometown, threw for 336 yards and three touchdowns, while freshman wideout T.J. Moore had career highs of nine receptions and 116 yards, and added a touchdown. Linebacker Sammy Brown led Clemson with 10 tackles.

Clemson got out to a 7-0 on its opening possession, capping a 12-play, 75-yard drive with a 22-yard touchdown pass from Klubnik to Antonio Williams. But Texas responded with touchdown runs on each of its first three drives and added a 19-yard Quinn Ewers touchdown pass in the final minute of the half to carry a 28-10 lead into halftime.

After a Texas field goal midway through the third quarter, Clemson touchdowns by Jarvis Green and Moore late in the third quarter and early in the fourth quarter trimmed the Texas advantage to 31-24. However, Clemson surrendered a 77-yard touchdown run on the second play of Texas' ensuing possession, and two Clemson turnovers on downs — including one at the Texas one-yard line — secured the victory for Texas. Clemson finished the season 10-4.
