## SERIES HISTORY

- **Overall Record:** 1-0 (2020)
- The Tigers defeated Troy, 10-1 in five innings at the Diamond-9 tournament in Orlando, Florida on Feb 20, 2020 in Clemson's inaugural season before it was cut short due to COVID-19.
- Marissa Guimbarda (2) and Cammy Pereira combined to hit three homers. Guimbarda knocked in a game-high four RBI.
- At the time, the inaugural matchup against the Trojans was the Clemson's 14th contest in program history.

## CLEMSON OVERVIEW

- Clemson enters its first NCAA Regional appearance in the program's first opportunity to do so.
- After winning the 2021 ACC regular-season championship, the Tigers are coming off their first ACC Championship (tournament) appearance, having defeated Georgia Tech and then-No. 20 Virginia Tech to advance to the title game before falling to then-No. 21 Duke.
- Clemson 22-2 in their last 24 outings.
- This season, the Tigers are averaging 5.58 runs per game, good for first in the ACC, while boasting a team ERA of 1.48, which also leads the ACC and is sixth best in the nation.

## ACC TOURNAMENT

- Clemson defeated both Georgia Tech and then-No. 20 Virginia Tech by a final score of 2-0 in both games to advance to the ACC title game. Then-No. 21 Duke defeated the Tigers, 1-0, to clinch its first-ever ACC tournament championship. The Tigers' lone run surrendered was the only one it gave up in three games (21 innings) at this year's ACC Championship.
- Valerie Cagle and Cammy Pereira were named to the ACC All-Tournament Team. Pereira hit a pair of homers - her second and

third of the year - in the Tigers' 2-0 win over Georgia Tech and led the team in slugging for the tournament. Cagle was dominant in the circle, going the distance for the whole tournament while achieving a 0.33 ERA. Cagle also homered in Clemson's 2-0 win over the Hokies, which marked the eighth victory in the circle for Cagle while also homering in the same game.

## ACC POSTSEASON AWARDS

- The Tigers were the most represented program on the ACC's postseason awards announcement. In addition to nine All-ACC selections, including three first team recipients, Clemson boasted the league's Player and Freshman of the Year in Valerie Cagle and Coach of the Year in Tigers' skipper John Rittman.
- Cagle became the first player in ACC history to garner either ACC Player or Pitcher of the Year, while also being crowned the conference's Freshman of the Year.
- Rittman claimed his third conference Coach-of-the-Year distinctions, having earned to coach-of-the-year awards in 2001 and 2004 during his stint at Stanford.

## ACC REGULAR-SEASON CHAMPIONS

- In its first complete season, Clemson won the 2021 ACC regular-season championship after achieving a league-best record of 29-5 (.853) and also had the highest overall winning percentage with a regular-season record of 40-5 (.889).
- The 2021 Clemson Softball team became the first team in league history to capture the regular-season championship in its first complete season as a program.
- The 2021 Tigers also became the first team in school history to earn a conference regular-season title in its first opportunity to do so.

## DABO SWINNEY PAYS A VISIT TO CLEMSON SOFTBALL PRACTICE

- Clemson Football Head Coach Dabo Swinney attended the team's practice on Tuesday (May 18) and gave a 30-minute speech (approximately).
- Swinney, a former wide receiver and assistant coach at the University of Alabama, offered his advice on how to prepare for postseason play.

## THE TIGERS' NCAA REGIONAL PAST EXPERIENCE

- Clemson shortstop Ansley Gilstrap, a transfer from USC Upstate, is the only member of the Tigers' roster for NCAA Regional experience. Gilstrap led the Spartans to Regional appearances in Auburn (2016) and Knoxville (2017).

- Gilstrap and the Spartans combined to go 2-4, 1-2 in both appearances, having won their opening game in each year.
- Gilstrap recalls, "the atmospheres at both regionals was bigger than anything I'd ever experienced while playing at USC Upstate, which was so fun. Games like that are why you want to play the sport in the first place."

### CLEMSON-ALABAMA CONNECTIONS

- This year's Clemson Softball roster boasts two Alabama natives, #9 Sarah Howell (Oxford) and #58 Kyah Keller (Hollywood).
- Clemson's appearance in the 2021 Tuscaloosa Regional marks the first time Clemson Softball has competed in the state of Alabama.
- Clemson infielder Bailey Taylor, the Tigers' 2020 starting third baseman, transferred to Clemson in the Fall of 2019 after a two-year stint at Troy, where she earned 57 career starts. In the spring of 2019, Taylor hit a career-best .310 with 11 doubles and seven home runs.

### THE NATIONALLY-RANKED TIGERS

- Clemson enters this weekend's series ranked No. 10 in the ESPN/USA Softball poll, which ties its highest ranking to date, and No. 13 the USA Today/NFCA coaches poll.
- As a program, Clemson debuted at No. 25 in the USA Today/NFCA coaches poll on March 9, 2021, and at No. 25 in the ESPN/USA Softball poll on March 16, 2021.
- Clemson received its first top-25 ranking on March 1, 2021 at No. 25, according to D1Softball.com.

### VALERIE CAGLE, THE NATION'S BEST TWO-WAY PLAYER?

- Clemson second-year freshman ace Valerie Cagle has established herself as one of the best two-way players in the nation.
- As Clemson's ace and three-hole hitter, Cagle leads the Tigers in batting average (.414), slugging (.821), on-base percentage (.500), home runs (15), doubles (12), walks (25), ERA (1.06), wins (26), saves (5), innings pitched (197.2), batters struck out (247), appearances (36) and games started (29) this season.
- According to Softball America, Cagle was tabbed the No. 2 pitcher in the country during the month of April.
- The second-year freshman achieved a 23-game hit streak, a program record for Clemson, that began on March 27 and ended May 15 in the Tigers' ACC Championship game.
- Cagle has eight games this year in which she has recorded at least one home run and earned the win as Clemson's pitcher. All of her wins while homering have been complete games, including three shutout wins over Boston College (April 18) and at South Carolina (April 21) and Virginia Tech (May 14). Her victory over Boston College on April 18 was also a no-hitter, the first seven-inning no-hitter in program history.

### CAGLE NAMED USA SOFTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR FINALIST

- Clemson ace/utility Valerie Cagle was named a USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year Top 10 Finalist, the organization announced on May 5.
- The award is considered the most prestigious honor in Division I women's collegiate softball.

- Cagle was one of just two players on the top-10 finalist list that consistently pitches and hits. The other is UCLA's Rachel Garcia, who is a member of the USA Olympic team and a three-time All-American, and was the 2019 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year, the 2019 NFCA Pitcher of the Year and 2019 Pac-12 Player and Pitcher of the Year.

### FIVE IS THE MAGIC NUMBER

- Clemson is 42-1 all-time, and 25-1 in 2021, when scoring five runs or more.

### SWUNG ON AND THERE IT GOES!

- Clemson is 33-1 this season when hitting at least one home run.
- The Tigers are 49-3 all-time when homering at least once.
- Clemson has recorded multi-home-run efforts in 20 out of its 48 games, including three of the last five games played this season.

### STATISTICALLY SPEAKING

- Clemson leads the ACC in slugging (.509), on base percentage (.383), RBI (250), total bases (640), ERA (1.48), wins (42), runs allowed (83), and home runs allowed (17). The Tigers are second in the ACC in batting average (.298), runs scored (268), home runs (62) and fielding percentage (.973).
- RHP/UTL Valerie Cagle (26-5) leads the ACC in ERA (1.06), wins (26) and saves (5), is second the ACC in innings pitched (197.2) and batters struck out (247). Cagle is one of just two pitchers in the nation to pitch at least 175.0 innings with a 1.06 ERA or better.
- In the batter's box, Cagle leads the ACC in slugging percentage (.821), second in home runs (15), third in batting average (.414) and on-base percentage (.500), and tied for third in RBI (41) and doubles (11).
- Despite missing four games this season, Marissa Guimbarda is tied for third in the league in RBI (41) and tied for fifth in home runs (12).
- Freshman outfielder McKenzie Clark leads the ACC in runs scored (45), is second in the ACC in triples (6) and sixth in stolen bases (21).
- In addition to Cagle in the circle, lefty Millie Thompson (2.18) is good for eighth in the ACC.

### GILSTRAP, ONE OF THE NATION'S LEADERS IN STOLEN BASES

- Clemson shortstop Ansley Gilstrap is third among all active NCAA players in career stolen bases (112).
- Her 42 stolen bases at USC Upstate in 2018 were the most by any ASUN player that year and good for seventh all-time in ASUN history entering the 2021 season.
- Despite nursing a knee injury this season, Gilstrap is 13-for-14 on stolen base attempts as a Tiger.

### LOGOLEO TABBED ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Clemson infielder/outfielder Alia Logoleo was tabbed the ACC Player of the Week after putting on arguably the best single-game hitting performance of any player in the country this season.
- Logoleo helped the Tigers clinch the 2021 ACC regular-season championship after going 4-for-4 at the plate with three home runs (grand slam, three-run and two-run shots) along with a double at Syracuse on May 9.
- Logoleo drove in 10 runs, the most by any Division-I player in a single game this season, and the most against a Power-5 opponent since May 7, 2015.
- Logoleo's grand slam, which came in her second at-bat of the day, was the second grand slam of her career, having hit her first at Virginia this season.
- Her grand slam also marked the program's fifth of its existence through its first 68 games played.

### CAGLE SWEEPS NFCA, ACC PITCHER-OF-THE-WEEK HONORS

- RHP/UTL Valerie Cagle was named both NFCA and ACC Pitcher of the Week on April 20.
- Cagle is the only player in the nation this season to garner both NFCA Player (March 23) and Pitcher-of-the-Week honors this season.
- She is also the only player to earn ACC Player (March 24) and Pitcher-of-the-Week honors (April 7 & 20).

### CAGLE'S FIRST CAREER COMPLETE-GAME NO-HITTER

- Valerie Cagle tossed her first career complete-game no-hitter in the Tigers' first of two games against Winthrop on April 13.
- The second-year freshman pitched in all five innings, faced just two batters above the minimum and registered at least two strikeouts in each inning, finishing the game with 11 strikeouts and one walk.
- Cagle also went 2-for-2 at the plate with one RBI and one walk.

### GUIMBARDA, MATTIMORE EARN ACC POSTGRADUATE SCHOLARSHIPS

- Marissa Guimbarda and Grace Mattimore were two of 52 total individuals in the ACC to be recognized as 2021 Weaver-James-Corrigan Postgraduate Scholarship Award recipients.
- The scholarships are awarded to selected student-athletes who intend to pursue a graduate degree following completion of their undergraduate requirements. Each recipient will receive \$6,000 toward his or her graduate education. Those honored have performed with distinction in both the classroom and their respective sport, while demonstrating exemplary conduct in the community.

### CLEMSON'S SWEEP OVER BOSTON COLLEGE

- Clemson claimed its fifth ACC series sweep after defeating Boston College in four games at McWhorter Stadium (April 16-18).
- The Tigers were led by Valerie Cagle who pitched her second complete-game no-hitter of the week in the Tigers' series finale against the Eagles.
- Clemson won its third-ever game that went to extra innings in game No. 2 of its doubleheader against BC on April 17. The result of the game, which went to nine innings, brought Clemson's all-time record in extra innings to 3-0, and 2-0 in 2021.
- Offensively against BC, Clemson was led by Marissa Guimbarda (.429), McKenzie Clark (.400) and Cagle (.400), all of whom hit at least .400 for the series.

### CLEMSON DOWNS WINTHROP IN MID-WEEK DOUBLEHEADER

- Clemson defeated intrastate foe Winthrop in its first true mid-week contests (doubleheader) of the 2021 season.
- The Tigers won game No. 1 behind Cagle's first complete-game no-hitter and nine runs scored on nine hits.
- Outfielder Morgan Johnson ended game No. 1 on a walk-off home run in the bottom of the fifth, her second walk-off homer of the season, to give Clemson its 9-0 lead and ending the game due to the NCAA's eight-run rule.

- In the second game, Clemson posted home runs in back-to-back plate appearances in both the third and fifth innings. Shortstop Ansley Gilstrap went 3-for-3 with a pair of home runs to record her first career multi-home-run effort. Shortly after pitching her first career complete-game no-hitter, Valerie Cagle also blasted her eighth homer of the season to tie teammate Marissa Guimbarda for the most home runs on the team this season.

### TIGERS' SERIES AT NOTRE DAME POSTPONED

- Clemson's originally-scheduled series at Notre Dame was postponed out of an abundance of caution following positive tests, subsequent quarantining and contact tracing within the Notre Dame program.
- The series against the Fighting Irish was slated to be the first meeting between the two teams.

### SERIES SWEEP OVER NORTH CAROLINA

- With its four-game series sweep over North Carolina, the Tigers earned their sixth series sweep and fourth sweep over an ACC opponent this season.
- Against the Tar Heels, Clemson surrendered just one run in each of the four games and outscored North Carolina, 31-4, for the series.
- Four Tigers consisting of Abi Stuart (.556), McKenzie Clark, Alia Logoleo (1.000) and Kyah Keller (.571) all hit over .500. As a team, Clemson hit .417 against UNC in contrast to the Tar Heels' batting average of .125 during the series.
- In addition to Valerie Cagle, Millie Thompson also dominated in the circle for the Tigers. Thompson went 1-0 in one appearance - game No. 2 of the doubleheader on April 2 - and did not allow a single walk or earned run. The true-freshman lefty posted a career-high 10 strikeouts and had a no-hitter through 5.2 innings pitched.

### CLEMSON'S FIRST 17-GAME WIN STREAK

- Clemson's 17-game win streak came to an end on March 26 as then-No. 11 Duke defeated the Tigers in both games of last Friday's doubleheader.
- The Clemson Softball program's 17-game win streak tied for the longest winning streak by any women's program in school history.
- Over the course of the 17-game win streak, Clemson outscored its opponents 99-21 in 116 innings, out-homered its opponents 24-5, and swiped 42 stolen bases (on 45 attempts) in contrast to its opponents' 11 stolen bases.
- After dropping last Friday's doubleheader to the Blue Devils, Clemson snapped Duke's then-20 game winning streak, which at the time was the second-longest active streak in Division-I softball.

### CLEMSON NAMED POTENTIAL NCAA REGIONAL HOST SITE

- On April 30, the NCAA Division I Softball Committee announced that Clemson was one of 20 predetermined preliminary round sites for this year's Division I Softball Championship.
- Due to the health and safety protocols surrounding the COVID-19 pandemic, it was deemed necessary to conduct NCAA championship competition at predetermined sites.
- Of the 20 selected sites, the committee will choose 16 to host regional round games. Eight of those 16 regional sites will be in contention to host Super Regionals.

### CLEMSON SPLITS SERIES VS. THEN-NO. 11 DUKE

- The Tigers' split their series against then-No. 11 Duke in what was Clemson's highest ranked opponent in program history.
- After dropping the first two contests of the series, Clemson closed out the final two games of the series with a win.
- Offensively, the Tigers were led by McKenzie Clark, who hit .417 with a pair of doubles and two RBIs.
- In the circle, Valerie Cagle and Millie Thompson held Duke to just 2.25 runs per game, despite the fact that Duke was averaging nearly seven runs per game entering last week's series.

### SERIES SWEEP AT LOUISVILLE

- With its four-game series sweep at Louisville (March 19-21), the Tigers earned its fifth consecutive series sweep, third straight ACC series sweep and improved to 11-0 all-time in ACC road games.
- The Tigers won their first game of the season that saw extra innings. Valerie Cagle went the distance in an 11-inning complete-game shutout over the Cardinals on March 19.
- Cagle then went 3-for-3 at the plate to help the Tigers secure the sweep on March 21 after belting a pair of home runs and a double.
- For the series, Cagle hit .643 and led the team with six RBIs.

### DON'T STEAL MY MOJO

- Clemson outfielder Morgan Johnson (aka "MoJo"), who tore her ACL in Clemson's fifth game last season against St. John's (Feb. 9), has worked her way back into the Tigers' starting lineup in right field.
- Johnson hit her second career home run in Clemson's third game at Virginia. Johnson's homer proved to be the game-winning hit on a three-run shot to center field with two outs in the top of the sixth.
- Johnson hit her first career homer in the bottom of the fifth against Elon on Feb. 28 in walk-off fashion to end the game via the NCAA's eight-run rule.

### RIVER CITY LEADOFF TOURNAMENT (FEB. 12-14)

- Clemson went 2-0 to open the season at the River City Leadoff in Jacksonville, picking up a pair of wins over Illinois State and North Florida.
- With its 4-3 comeback win over UNF, Clemson secured its first true road win in program history. In 2020, the Tigers only competed in two true road games at UCF and at UNCG.
- Second-year freshman Valerie Cagle was the hero for the Tigers after pitching a complete-game (5 inn.) one-hit shutout in Clemson's season opener against Illinois State, followed by a two-run home run performance the next game at UNF.
- With the Tigers trailing 3-2 entering the seventh inning against the Ospreys, Cagle hit her second two-run home run of the day to give Clemson the lead 4-3. She then entered the circle in the bottom of the seventh to earn her second career save with ease. All four of Clemson's runs scored against UNF were RBIs from Cagle's homers.

### McWHORTER STADIUM

- On Feb. 5, 2021, Clemson University Board of Trustees announced the renaming of Clemson Softball Stadium to McWhorter Stadium after Stuart McWhorter '91 and Leigh Anne Hendrix McWhorter pledged a Cornerstone Partner Gift to IPTAY and Clemson Athletics.
- Clemson University Board of Trustees approved the initial construction then-Clemson Softball Stadium on Oct. 6, 2017.
- The 50,000-square-foot project is adjacent to Clemson Baseball's Doug Kingsmore Stadium (DKS) and includes over 1,000 fixed chair-back seats in addition to berm seating.
- The facility consists of a team clubhouse with over 12,000-square-feet of player operations space which holds a team lounge, locker rooms for the team players, coaches, umpires and visiting team, sports medicine room, equipment room and coaches' offices.
- The complex also includes an indoor player development hitting facility that spans over 6,000-square-feet with additional accommodations to stadium that includes a press box with three broadcast booths and a video board.

### HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE IN 2020

- In 2020, Clemson was fourth nationally in total attendance (24,860) and fifth nationally in average attendance (1,544).
- Clemson finished its inaugural season with a 14-2 record in true home games.

### COVID-19 POLICIES & PROCEDURES

- All Clemson Softball players and staff are complying with the policies set forth by the ACC's Medical Advisory Group.
- All Clemson Softball players are required to test at least two times per week, each week throughout the entirety of the 2021 season.
- McWhorter Stadium reduced its total capacity from 1,616 to 366 spectators in order to safely social distance spectators this season.

### ACC PRESEASON HONORS

- Clemson's Valerie Cagle, Hannah Goodwin and Marissa Guimbarda were named to the 2021 Preseason All-ACC Team based on a vote by the league's head coaches.
- Cagle was tenth in the nation in home runs (10), the only freshman in the nation to record double-digit home runs. She was also third in the nation last season in RBIs. In the circle, she tossed a team-best eight complete games and was instrumental in the Tigers' ranked win over then-No. 14 Georgia.
- Goodwin led the team and was second in the ACC in batting average (.385). She recorded game-winning home runs on two occasions and hit the program's first-ever home run in Clemson's first-ever contest.
- Guimbarda hit .355 last season and tied for fourth in the nation with an ACC-leading 11 home runs. She was also 12th in the nation and second in the ACC (behind Cagle) in RBIs (31).

### GILSTRAP'S CLEMSON DEBUT --> [Watch more](#)

- Clemson infielder Ansley Gilstrap, the Tigers' longest member of the current roster, made her Clemson debut in the Tigers' 2021 season opener after missing the 2020 season due to season-ending surgery for a non-softball related condition, Chiari malformation.
- Gilstrap's absence from playing in an official collegiate softball contest spanned 1,007 days as her previous official appearance in a collegiate game was on May 12, 2018.

### TIGERS ACROSS THE COUNTRY

- Clemson's roster, which consisted of 18 players in its inaugural season, increased to 25 players in 2021.
- The Tigers boast players from Georgia (9), South Carolina (5), North Carolina (4), Virginia (3), Alabama (2), Florida (1) and Alabama (1).

### CLEMSON NCAA STATISTICAL RANKINGS IN 2020

- Clemson finished its inaugural season ninth in the nation with 45 doubles on the year, and tied for 14th in home runs with 32.

### A GRAND OLE TIME

- Last season, Clemson belted four grand slams from three different players [Bonamy, Taylor and Cagle (2)].
- On Feb. 15, 2020, in the program's ninth-ever contest, Clemson tied the NCAA Division-I record after recording two grand slams in a single inning against Maryland.

# HEAD COACH JOHN RITTMAN



John Rittman, a longtime head coach and member of the USA Softball Women's National Team coaching pool, was named the first Head Coach of Clemson Softball on Nov. 3, 2017. Rittman came to Clemson after serving as the Associate Head Coach at the University of Kansas from 2015-17. Rittman joined the Jayhawks after 18 seasons as the Head Coach at Stanford University and 10 years on the United States National Team coaching staff (2001-08, 2016-18).

In its inaugural season, Rittman transcended Clemson into a nationally-respected program. Rittman guided Clemson, which was predicted to finish in 10th in the conference, according to the 2020 ACC preseason poll, to a 19-8 overall record, including 5-1 in ACC play. The Tigers, who won both of their ACC series against Virginia and Pitt, won 11 of their final 12 games before the 2020 season was cut short due to the coronavirus pandemic (COVID-19). Additionally, Clemson went 14-2 at Clemson Softball Stadium, which included a 13-game home win streak that spanned 25 days. Rittman and the Tigers generated plenty of enthusiasm among the Clemson faithful as the first-year program ranked fourth nationally in attendance (24,860) and fifth in average attendance (1,544/game) in 2020. On March 3, the National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) announced the first-year program received votes (10) in the fifth edition of the 2020 USA Today/NFCA D1 Top 25 Coaches Poll. The announcement came after Clemson defeated then-No. 14 Georgia, 4-1, on Feb. 26 at Clemson Softball Stadium before sweeping the Cavaliers to win its first-ever ACC series. Under the direction of Rittman, three Tigers in Valerie Cagle (twice), Marissa Guimbarda and Logan Caymol earned ACC weekly honors on four occasions, the most by any ACC program in 2020. Cagle, a true freshman in 2020, was second in the nation in RBIs (36), while Guimbarda finished the season fourth nationally in home runs (11). Both Cagle and Guimbarda led the ACC in RBIs and home runs, respectively.

At Stanford, Rittman and the Cardinals recorded 18-consecutive winning seasons, made 16-straight NCAA appearances, notched 13 40-win seasons and produced at least one All-American in 15 of his last 17 seasons. As head coach, Rittman accumulated a 750-351-3 overall mark, coached a national player of the year, 16 All-Americans, earned five Super Regional appearances, two Women's College World Series appearances and maintained a spot in every regular-season NFCA top-25 poll for more than a decade.

Rittman served on the staff of the USA Softball team which won gold at both the 2016 Women's Softball World Championship and the 2017 Pan Am Qualifier. He also worked with Team USA from 2001-08, coaching the 2004 Olympic gold medal winners in Athens and the 2008 silver medalists in Beijing. Team USA also won gold medals at the 2002 and 2006 World Championship and the 2003 and 2007 Pan Am Games.

Prior to being named head coach at Stanford, Rittman spent four seasons as an assistant coach at the University of Washington, focusing on hitting and defense. Rittman helped start the program and, within just four seasons, the Huskies had earned a No. 1 national ranking, won the 1996 Pac-10 Championship, made three NCAA Tournament appearances and notched a runner-up finish in their first trip to the Women's College World Series. Washington became the first team since Texas A&M (1983) to advance to the championship game in its first appearance at the WCWS.

Before his appointment at Washington, Rittman spent two seasons as an assistant at the University of Minnesota. During his second year, the Golden Gophers won the Big Ten Conference with a 20-4 league record. The Gophers set team and individual records in almost every offensive category. The Minnesota squad led the nation in hits and total bases en route to a No. 15 national ranking. Rittman also helped produce two Golden Gopher All-Americans.

From 1988-90, Rittman was an assistant coach at the University of Oregon. During his stay, the Ducks played in the 1989 Women's College World Series, set several team and individual offensive records and produced an All-American.

Rittman graduated from New Mexico State with a degree in journalism in 1986. He was a three-year letterwinner in baseball as an outfielder at NMSU after transferring from Yavapai Junior College in Prescott, Arizona.

Rittman and his wife, Lorie, a former softball player at the University of Oklahoma, are the parents of Justin, a UCLA graduate and former fullback for the Bruins, and Jake, a junior punter at Notre Dame.

# SEASON OUTLOOK

For the Clemson softball team, last season — its inaugural season — was supposed to be special. It was supposed to be celebrated and remembered forever. And it will be remembered forever but not for the reasons it was supposed to be remembered for.

The Tigers opened the 2020 season with a 19-8 overall record, having won 11 of their final 12 contests, including a ranked win over No. 14 Georgia and a pair of ACC series against Virginia and Pitt. They were blistering hot. They had found their groove. But the fairy tale plot that had transpired midway through the season was proceeded by a twisted turn. The coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic not only abruptly halted Clemson softball's inaugural season but also the world's existing perception of normalcy.

On March 12, 2020, the Tigers' bags were packed, and the team bus waited in front of Clemson Softball Stadium, but no one boarded. Instead of taking a short trip to Atlanta to play in its first-ever ACC road series, Head Coach John Rittman informed his players, initially, that the Tigers were not going to be heading to Georgia Tech. Shortly after the team meeting was dismissed, the news broke over social media. The NCAA had canceled all remaining 2019-20 championships. The ACC then proceeded to cancel all outstanding contests as well, effectively ending Clemson's first season.

"That was a very somber moment, especially for our one senior and, really, all of our players to kind of comprehend," said Rittman to a group of reporters during a virtual press conference on March 20. "We were getting ready to get on the bus, and then, our season was over ... I think shock is the best word I can use right now — we were literally in shock. Certainly, at the time, we didn't know everything that we know now, but we understand that those decisions were made for the best interest of everybody involved."

It was a tough, but necessary, pill to swallow. But fast-forwarding almost one year from then, Clemson softball is poised to make its return to the field in February of 2021.

The Tigers return 16 of the 18 players from the 2020 roster. Clemson will look to fill the void left by MK Bonamy, who graduated in the summer of 2020. Bonamy started in all 27 games at first base and was the team's leader inside the dugout. However, the Tigers look forward to the addition of Ansley Gilstrap, a senior infielder who was sidelined last year due to a season-ending surgery. Gilstrap, who transferred to Clemson in the summer of 2018, brings three years of playing experience and was also one of the Tigers' leaders inside the locker room, despite not competing last season. Joining Gilstrap in the senior class is Casey Bigham, a transfer from Furman University, where she earned all-conference honors. Bigham started in all 26 games at second base for the Paladins in 2020 and will add depth, most likely in the infield, for Clemson.

The Tigers' senior class was supposed to consist of four players this season in Marissa Guimbarda, Grace Mattimore, Cammy Pereira and Bailey Taylor. However, on March 30, 2020, the NCAA Division I Council Coordination Committee voted to grant all 2020 spring student-athletes an extra year of eligibility after COVID-19 forced the cancellation of all spring sports. As a result, each returner from last season maintains the same eligibility status from

the 2020 season. The upcoming year is likely to be Pereira's last as a collegiate softball player, as she intends to pursue her dreams of becoming a doctor. Pereira led off in all 27 games for the Tigers at second base and was second on the team in runs scored (21). In 2020, Guimbarda tied for fourth in the nation with an ACC-leading mark of 11 home runs. She also led the conference in slugging (.868) and was 12th in the nation and second in the ACC with 31 RBIs. Mattimore, who played two seasons of collegiate softball at Army West Point in 2018 and 2019, proved to be one of the most effective hitters for the Tigers last season. She hit .333 in 66 at-bats and led the ACC with 10 doubles on the season. She was also second in the league in walks (22) and fourth in on-base percentage (.494), both of which were team bests last year. Taylor made 25 appearances, including 24 games started at third base. In addition to leading the team in assists (41), Taylor recorded Clemson's first run, hit by pitch, double and sacrifice fly. She also recorded her third career grand slam against Maryland on Feb. 15, helping Clemson become just the seventh program in NCAA Division I history to record two grand slams in a single inning.

Twelve of Clemson's 25 players classify as either redshirt freshmen or double-redshirt freshmen, which serves as a reminder that like the program itself, the 2021 roster is still very young. Among those freshmen, perhaps no individual stands out more than Valerie Cagle. Cagle is both an ace in the circle and one of the top hitters, if not the top hitter, on the Tigers' roster. In 2020, she started in all 27 games, including a team-high 13 starts and eight complete games in the circle. As a true freshman, she hit .376 and tallied 10 home runs and five doubles in just 93 at-bats. The Yorktown, Va., native was the only freshman in the country to hit at least 10 homers, which put her 10th in the nation among all players and second in the ACC only to Guimbarda. Cagle was also the only player in the conference to earn ACC Player of the Week more than once in 2020. Cagle, who hit the Tigers' first of two grand slams against the Terrapins on Feb. 15, was just one of four players in the country to record eight RBIs in a single game in 2020. Additionally, she allowed just three hits and recorded 20-of-21 outs within the infield against the No. 14 Bulldogs in Clemson's first-ever ranked win.

In addition to Cagle, Clemson returns Logan Caymol, its first-ever signee, and Emma Whitfield in the circle. Caymol went 7-2 on the year and threw a no-hitter in Clemson's first win inside Clemson Softball Stadium against Western Carolina (Feb. 12). Whitfield went 3-0 and saw a steady decrease in ERA as the 2020 season progressed. She also threw her first career complete game in Clemson's 11-2 win over Charlotte.

JoJo Hyatt and Abi Stuart are the team's returning catchers. Hyatt was a workhorse for the Tigers in 2020, starting behind the plate in all 27 games. She also recorded the program's first triple and sacrifice bunt. Stuart appeared in 14 games, including four starts at the designated player position. Stuart proved to be clutch in the batter's box on a number of occasions, most notably in Clemson's Feb. 9 contest against St. John's, as she homered in the top of the sixth to kick start 15 unanswered runs in the Tigers' 19-9 comeback rout over the Red Storm.

In addition to Pereira and Taylor, Hannah Goodwin and Kyah Keller are returning infielders. Goodwin was one of the Tigers' most reliable hitters in 2020.

She led the team in batting average (.385), which was also good for second in the ACC, and was ninth in the league in on-base percentage (.448). Goodwin recorded the program's first home run in its first-ever game against St. John's on a game-winning shot to the opposite field. She then delivered yet another game-winning homer against Stetson in the Tigers' only game of the season to reach extra innings. The West Columbia, S.C., native also orchestrated a nine-game hitting streak, which spanned Feb. 22-March 9, and recorded at least one hit in 22-of-26 games played. Keller served as Bonamy's backup at first base last year but will likely see her role increase this season. A power hitter from Hollywood, Ala., Keller has had a stellar offseason, according to Rittman, and will compete for the starting job at first base.

Perhaps, where the Tigers have the most depth is in the outfield. Clemson returns five redshirt freshmen who played in the grass last year, including Alia Logoleo, Arielle Oda, Carlee Shannon, Morgan Johnson and Madison May. Logoleo, who missed the first six games last year due to a torn labrum, recovered nearly two months ahead of schedule and was arguably the most improved player over the course of the abbreviated season. She hit .345 and posted four doubles and a team-high two triples. Logoleo also recorded a seven-game hitting streak and posted seven stolen bases on the year, good for second on the team. Oda, a lefty slap hitter, made 24 appearances, including nine starts, and can play both infield and outfield. In 2020, she achieved an on-base percentage of .476. Shannon serves as the team's primary pinch runner. Last year, she recorded a team-high nine stolen bases, which tied for ninth in the ACC. Both Johnson and May missed the bulk of 2020 due to season-ending surgeries. Johnson had started in all four appearances before suffering an ACL tear in Clemson's fifth game of the season, while May had appeared in six games, including four starts, before undergoing an upper-body surgery.

Rittman and the Tigers also welcome the addition of seven true freshmen in Jaden Cheek (INF/UTL), McKenzie Clark (OF), Ansley Houston (INF), Sarah Howell (C/UTL), Carsten Puckett (RHP/IF), Regan Spencer (RHP) and Millie Thompson (LHP/INF). Collectively, the incoming freshman class, which was ranked 14th in the nation by [ExtralNningSoftball.com](http://ExtralNningSoftball.com) and No. 24 by [FloSoftball.com](http://FloSoftball.com), includes three top-100 prospects in Cheek, Clark and Howell. Additionally, Clemson was the second-highest rated class in the ACC and one of four ACC programs in the top 25, according to [ExtralNningSoftball.com](http://ExtralNningSoftball.com).

"We are extremely excited to get back on the field again and compete," Rittman said. "We know this is a new team with new challenges and opportunities that lie in front of us, and we can't wait to get started on our journey. We have to take it one day at a time and focus on the task at hand. If we can do that, we absolutely have the ability to be successful on the field, but it starts with our mindset each and every day."

## Feb. 9, 2020

After trailing 9-4 entering the top of the sixth, Clemson scored 15 straight runs in the final two innings, including 12 runs in the seventh, to defeat St. John's again by a final score of 19-9 at UCF's Black & Gold Tournament in Orlando, Fla.

## Feb. 12, 2020

Clemson held its inaugural home opener in a doubleheader against Western Carolina. Senior infielder MK Bonamy recorded the first hit at Clemson Softball Stadium. The Tigers fell 0-2 in the first contest. Freshman RHP Logan Caymol threw a complete game no-hitter in the nightcap against the Catamounts as Clemson defeated WCU 8-0 in five innings.

## Feb. 15, 2020

Clemson defeated Maryland 21-2 at Clemson Softball Stadium in the Tigers' second game of the BIG/ACC Challenge. The game was highlighted by 14 Tiger runs scored in the second inning. Junior infielder Bailey Taylor and Freshman RHP/UTL Valerie Cagle both hit grand slams in the bottom of the second to make Clemson, which was in its ninth contest as a program at the time, just the seventh program in NCAA Division-I history to record at least two grand slams in a single inning.

## Feb. 18, 2020

Freshman RHP/UTL Valerie Cagle and freshman RHP Logan Caymol swept ACC Player and Pitcher of the Week awards, respectively. It was the only instance in which two freshmen won both awards in the same week.

## Feb. 22, 2020

Freshman infielder Hannah Goodwin recorded a game-winning two-run home run to break a 5-5 tie against Stetson, which gave Clemson its first-ever win in extra innings.

## Feb. 26, 2020

Clemson earned its first-ever ranked win in a 4-1 victory over then-No. 14 Georgia at Clemson Softball Stadium. After trailing 1-0 in the third, the Tigers capitalized on a four-run fourth inning. Clemson posted six straight singles in the inning. Freshman RHP/UTL Valerie Cagle earned the win in the circle and recorded 20-of-21 outs in the infield.

## March 1, 2020

Clemson won its first-ever ACC series after sweeping Virginia at Clemson Softball Stadium. Freshman RHP/UTL Valerie Cagle hit a walkoff home run in the bottom of the bottom of the seventh to win the first game of the series on Feb. 28. The Tigers won the third and final game of the series, 12-3, in just six innings.

## March 3, 2020

The National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) announced Clemson received 10 votes in the fifth edition of the 2020 USA Today/NFCA Top 25 Coaches Poll, marking the first the program received votes in the poll.

## March 12, 2020

The NCAA announced the cancellation of all 2019-20 championships due to the coronavirus pandemic (COVID-19). The ACC then suspended all regular-season games, but never rescheduled them, effectively ending Clemson's inaugural season after the Tigers achieved a 19-8 overall record.

## Feb. 5, 2021

Clemson University Board of Trustees announced the renaming of Clemson Softball Stadium to McWhorter Stadium after Stuart McWhorter '91 and Leigh Anne Hendrix McWhorter, of Nashville, Tenn., pledged a Cornerstone Partner Gift of \$2.5 million to IPTAY and Clemson Athletics.

## Feb. 12, 2021

Clemson earned its first true road win in program history in a 4-3 comeback win over North Florida at the River City Leadoff tournament in Jacksonville, Fla. Second-year freshman RHP/UTL Valerie Cagle recorded a pair of two-run homers, including the game-winning hit in the top of the seventh to give the Tigers a go-ahead 4-3 lead. After hitting the game-winning homer in the top of the seventh, Cagle entered the circle and earned her second career save with ease.

## Feb. 21, 2021

Clemson won its first true road series, also its first-ever ACC road series, in a 3-0 series sweep at Georgia Tech (Feb. 20-21).

## March 1, 2021

Clemson received its first top-25 ranking at No. 25, according to D1Softball.com.

## March 9, 2021

Clemson cracked the NFCA/USA Today coaches poll for the first time at No. 25.

## March 27, 2021

Clemson earned its highest ranked win against then-No. 11 Duke live on ACC Network at McWhorter Stadium by a final score of 4-1. With the win, the Tigers snapped Duke's then-20 game winning streak, the second-longest winning streak by any Division-I softball team at that point in time.

## April 21, 2021

Clemson shutout in-state rival South Carolina, 6-0, in Columbia, South Carolina in the first-ever meeting between the two teams. The Tigers and South Carolina were supposed to meet for the first time in 2020, but the matchup was cancelled along with the remainder of the Tigers' inaugural season due to COVID-19.

## May 9, 2021

In its final game of the 2021 regular season, Clemson clinched the ACC regular-season title with a 19-2 win at Syracuse. The Tigers became the first team in league history to earn the regular-season title in any team's first complete season, and the first Clemson program in school history to secure a regular-season conference championship in its first opportunity to do so. Alia Logoleo went 4-for-4 at the plate with three homers (grand slam, three-run and two-run homers) and double, and tallied 10 RBI, the most by a Division I player in a regular-season contest in 2021. Logoleo's 10 RBI also marked the most by any player against a Power-5 opponent since May 7, 2015.
