CLEMSON OVERVIEW

- Clemson is in its sixth season of competition and has made a postseason appearance in each year eligible.
- Clemson takes a .340 batting average. Clemson also has a .580 slugging percentage and .431 on-base percentage.
- Clemson's pitching staff holds a 2.80 ERA through 295 innings of work and has recorded 217 strikeouts.

BOSTON COLLEGE OVERVIEW

- Boston College is led by head coach Amy Kvilhaug.
- This season, the Eagles hold a .254 average with a .381 slugging percentage and .334 on-base percentage.
- Boston College has a 4.24 ERA with 157 strikeouts through 257.1 innings.
- Clemson holds a 9-1 record all-time against the Eagles.

- Clemson has outscored opponents 334-148.
- Through games on April 15, Clemson has an RPI of XX.
- Following two wins at Stanford, Clemson has eclipsed the 30-win milestone for the fifth-consecutive season.
- The Tigers totaled 418 hits through 46 games in 2025, including the freshman class contributing 134 of those hits and returners Alex Brown (66), Maddie Moore (61), Julia Knowler (49) and Aby Vieira (46) adding to the list.
- Clemson takes a 106 game hit streak into the Boston College series that began during the UNCG matchup at regionals on May 19, 2023.

A GAME OF NUMBERS

- Friday's series opener against NC State marked Head Coach John Rittman's 1,400 game at the helm of a college softball program.
- Rittman eclipsed a 971-426-3 record during that stretch, including 221-75 as the Clemson head coach - currently holds a 224-75 record.
- Clemson is on pace to reach 300 games in program history in the opening game of the Boston College series on April 17.
- The softball program placed itself in a position to have one of the best records through the first 200 games amongst Clemson sports (155 wins, 45 losses - .775) - the 155 wins was the most by a program through 200 games at Clemson.
- This comes after the Tigers paced themselves to tie with women's tennis for the most wins through 100 games (78 wins, 22 losses - .780).
- The softball program once again paced itself to have one of the best records at Clemson through 300 games holding a 224-75 (.749).

- In the six years of a program, the 81 doubles sit second all-time (see complete record book count below).

TO KNOWLER IS TO LOVE HER

- Julia Knowler stepped onto the collegiate scene with a splash in 2024 and hasn't looked back.
- The sophomore has a .329 average clocking 49 hits - 27 of which have been for extra bases.
- She leads the program with 13 home runs - which is tied for fourth-most in a single season and second-most by a sophomore.

- Through 45 games this season, Knowler has contributed 14 doubles to sit fourth in a single season by a Tiger.
- She has four walk-off hits this season, including a home run against Ohio State, and RBI singles against Villanova (extra innings), Marshall (run-rule) and Indiana (run-rule).
- A force at the plate, she has totaled 102 bases and 51 RBIs.
- She has 13 multi-hit games and 12 multi-RBI games.
- The sophomore has tied for the most RBIs by a sophomore and sits tied for tied for third all-time in a single season.

- As a freshman, her first collegiate game in 2024 saw Knowler going 3-for-4 with four RBIs and three runs scored. Her hits included a solo home run in her first plate appearance and a two-run shot out of dead center (vs. Missouri State).
- She missed 20 games in 2024 due to a non-orthopedic surgery.

AB(SOLUTE)Y

- Senior Aby Vieira is a four-year starter behind the plate.
- The quarterback of the Clemson softball program, Vieira has guided the program behind and at the plate in 177 appearances and holds a .298 average.
- Dominating at the plate offensively, Vieira maintains a

.362 average in 2025 - roughly .048 better than her next closest season (sophomore year, 2023 - .314).

- The senior has 46 hits, 13 more than the next closest year and has 15 doubles to tie the Clemson single-season record.
- She has surpassed her season-high with 30 RBIs in 2025 and a .551 slugging percentage (a .092 increase from 2022).

BROWNIE POINTS

- Senior Alex Brown joined the Clemson roster prior to the 2024 season after transferring from North Carolina.
- Starting in all 46 games and in the lead off spot in the 2025 season, she has clocked a .449 average with 66 hits, a .653 slugging percentage, a .534 on-base percentage with 10 stolen bases.
- She led off game two of the NC State series with a solo home run for her 200th career hit.
- The senior tied her career high with four hits in a single game against Missouri State on Feb. 9 and again in the first game against Syracuse.
- She recorded a perfect 10-for-10 weekend against Syracuse that included two doubles, one home run, six runs, five RBIs, 1.500 slugging percentage, three walks and a 1.000 on-base percentage.
- She clocked her first career grand slam in the second inning against Charleston Southern on March 5 becoming the second Tiger in 2025 to hit a grand slam.
- From February 13 to March 9, Brown reached base in 19 straight games, the fifth longest streak in Clemson history.

- From February 22 to March 7, Brown also scored in 10 straight games, a school record.

SHE'S GIVING MOORE

- Senior infielder Maddie Moore is the lone all-american returning to the Clemson lineup after garnering third team honors at second base following the 2024 season.
- The Loomis, Calif., native has seen time throughout the infield during her career, she leads returners with 212 career starts and 214 career appearances.
- Defensively, she has clocked 276 putouts and 375 assists. Her 375 assists sits second all-time at Clemson trailing only Alia Logoleo (417).
- She has tied the program record with 38 career double plays with seven this season - tied with Logoleo (38).
- At the plate, Moore has significantly improved during her time in the Orange and Regalia.

- Earlier in 2025, Moore set the longest reached base streak in Clemson Softball history with 29. It began on March 28, 2024 against Virginia and was snapped vs. Villanova on February 21, 2025.
- This is the longest reached base streak by a Tiger, and surpassed Valerie Cagle's 25 games in 2021.

BASE THIEVES

- Not only is senior Maddie Moore smart at the plate, but she has been able to lead the Tigers by stealing 47 bases over the course of her career.
- With 47 career stolen bases, Moore holds the Clemson program record
- The senior was a perfect 10-for-10 during her freshman campaign and has gone on to steal an additional 15 bases in both her sophomore and junior seasons, and is 5-for-5 so far in 2025.
- Kylee Johnson joins Moore on the Top 10 list after she stole 11 bases during her freshman campaign on 13 attempts. She has stolen seven in 2025.
- Her 11-consecutive stolen bases dating from Feb. 14, 2024 to April 9, 2024 is tied for the eighth longest streak in Clemson softball history.

PUMP UP THE JAM

- Clemson added depth to its outfield when transfer Jamison Brockenbrough signed with the program in the summer of 2024.
- A constant in centerfield, Brockenbrough provides sweep to the bottom of the Tiger lineup.
- She provided a spark offensively in California to finish the three-game series against Stanford batting .600 with a .600 slugging and .750 on-base percentage.
- Following the South Carolina midweek, the junior is batting .336 with 36 hits, including three doubles, one triple and two home runs.
- She is third on the team with 37 runs scored and has drawn the fourth-most walks (20).
- With speed, she is a perfect 7-for-7 on stolen bases this season - tied for second-most.

CLUTCH COLLINS

- Freshman Marian Collins has been crucial to Clemson's success - starting at shortstop and batting sixth in the lineup.
- Most recently, she provided both home run hits to propel the Tigers past in-state rival South Carolina inside McWhorter Stadium (the lone two runs for the Tigers that game).

- A force at the plate, Collins has 33 RBIs on the year and leads the freshman class with nine home runs - which ties McKenzie Clark for second most.
- Defensively, Collins has provided 60 putouts and 83 assists at shortstop amongst an experienced infield.

BOTTLE OF CINTRON

- Freshman Macey Cintron has struck Clemson's lineup in a powerful way since game one.
- Becoming the second freshman in as many years to hit a lead off home run in her first collegiate at bat, Cintron continues to push Clemson's offensive prowess.
- The Cumming, Ga., native has taken over the cleanup spot in the lineup following the powerhouses of Moore and Knowler to hold a .287 average after the South Carolina midweek, including a .527 slugging percentage and .404 on-base percentage.
- She has eight home runs and 36 RBIs through her first 45 games (offensive only - has started all 46 games, one as a pitcher only).
- In 45 games, she has cracked Clemson's Freshman Top 5 lists alongside fellow freshmen Marian Collins and Ava Wilson.

FRESH FACES

- All seven freshmen on the 2025 roster have made at least one appearance during the 2025 season.
- Macey Cintron, Marian Collins, Sam Minish, Taylor Pipkins and Ava Wilson have started in at least 15 games, with Cintron, Wilson and Collins starting over 30 games each.
- During opening weekend, the freshman class provided production at the plate for the Tigers clocking 18 of the team's 40 total hits and 15 of the 27 total RBIs.
- In total, 26 of Clemson's 65 home runs have come off the bat of a freshman, including Wilson hitting the first grand slam of the 2025 season against No. 16 Missouri.
- Freshmen have shown awareness at the plate far beyond their age, accounting for 81 of the team's 183 total walks.
- Cintron has earned seven wins in the circle.

NOTES

MADNESS IN McWHORTER

- The Clemson community latched onto the softball program as soon as the sport was announced as an addition in 2017.
- With an original capacity of 1,616 for the 2020-22 seasons, Clemson expanded the outfield berm seating in the summer of 2022 to move the capacity to 2,116.
- For the previous two seasons, Clemson has averaged over 1,500 fans, including 1,877 during the 2024 home slate.
- In 2025, Clemson has averaged 1,580 fans for its 25 total home games.
- With 48,809 fans entering McWhorter Stadium in 2024, Clemson finished 13th nationally and led the ACC in overall attendance. The Tigers' average attendance also led the ACC and ranked seventh nationally.
- Clemson has ranked in the top 10 in either overall attendance and/or average attendance in 2020, 2022, 2023 and 2024. *Note that in 2021, Clemson had attendance restrictions coming off the COVID-19 Pandemic.

MISCELLANEOUS VICTORIES

- In only its sixth year of competition, Clemson has racked up numerous run-rule victories and winning streaks that have become noteworthy in the record book.

- When it comes to run-rules, the Tigers have amassed 74, including 12 in 2024 and 14 in 2025.
- The largest margin of victory in a run-rule came back in the inaugural season against Maryland inside McWhorter Stadium (then the Clemson Softball Stadium). Clemson claimed a 21-2 win on Feb. 15, 2020 for a 19-run margin.
- In 2025, Clemson's largest margin of victory came against Syracuse after Clemson recorded eight runs in the third and seven in the fourth to take the game 15-0.

John Rittman, a longtime head coach and member of the USA Softball Women's National Team coaching pool, was named the first Head Coach of Clemson Softball on Nov. 3, 2017. Rittman came to Clemson after serving as the Associate Head Coach at the University of Kansas from 2015-17. Rittman joined the Jayhawks after 18 seasons as the Head Coach at Stanford University and 10 years on the United States National Team coaching staff (2001-08, 2016-18). He returned to the USA Women's National Team staff in 2023 when he served as the head coach for the Japan All-Star Series.

The 2024 campaign had Rittman leading the Tigers to a 35-19 overall record. As a program, Clemson opened the season with its 200th game in history (held a 155-45 overall record at this time) that was eclipsed with a 12-0 run-rule against Missouri State. The Tigers also reached their 100th victory in program history at McWhorter Stadium with a 12-0 shutout against Fordham. Rittman continued to show his excellence at the helm of the program by guiding a program-record number of student-athletes to postseason honors, including two NFCA All-Americans, three NFCA All-Region selections and six All-ACC honorees. Most notable on this list is Rittman's guidance of pitcher/utility Valerie Cagle, who was crowned a First Team All-American for the third time of her tenure, as well as being a First Team NFCA All-Southeast selection and earning All-ACC Third Team honors. Cagle was joined by first-time All-American infielder Maddie Moore, who posted a team-high .368 average after contributing 10 home runs, eight doubles and two triples to the Tiger offense. Moore was joined on the All-ACC First Team by infielder Alia Logoleo, who clocked a .319 average, while fellow infielder Alex Brown garnered Second Team accolades with a .328 average. As a team, the Tigers set single-season records in triples (15), sac flies (25) and sac hits (18). Additionally, Clemson's pitching staff finished with a 2.32 ERA, ranked No. 24 in the NCAA at the end of the year, while the 3.72 strikeout-to-walk ratio ended the year at No. 8. For the second-consecutive season, the Clemson pitching staff allowed only 56 extra-base hits while holding opponents to a .245 batting average behind the efforts of All-ACC selections Regan Spencer (Second Team), Millie Thompson (Third Team) and Cagle. Senior center fielder McKenzie Clark rounded out the All-ACC and NFCA All-Region honorees with a .365 average following 10 home runs, eight doubles and four triples. Clemson capped its season with its fourth-straight NCAA Regional appearance where the Tigers won their ninth NCAA Tournament game with an 8-0 run-rule against USC Upstate.

During the fourth season at the helm of the program, Rittman guided the Tigers to a 49-12 overall record that started with a perfect 14-0 run to open the season before the Tigers posted a 37-1 record through the first week of April for another program best. Clemson capped the regular season with a 5-4 victory to mark the 150th of the program and Rittman's 900th-win of his coaching tenure. He became the 44th collegiate softball coach to reach the 900-win benchmark. Hosting the second regional in program history, Clemson went on to defeat UNGC and Auburn to make the second-consecutive super regional appearance. The Tigers took the next step as a program by surpassing previous team bests in multiple categories. Offensively, Clemson tallied 488 hits with a .313 average. The Tigers led the ACC in On-Base Percentage (.409) and Scoring (6.08 per game) and finished in the top 25 of the NCAA in eight offensive categories. Defensively, Clemson finished with a .980 fielding percentage to lead the ACC and finish seventh in

the NCAA. The Tiger defense also turned 31 double plays (.510 per game), which ranked sixth in the nation. With Rittman's tutelage, redshirt junior Valerie Cagle was named the 2023 USA Softball Player of the Year, a Rawlings Gold Glove (pitcher) recipient, the ACC Player of the Year and a NFCA First Team All-American for the second time of her career after she led the ACC in seven categories and ranked in the top 25 of the NCAA in 11. As a team, the Tigers clocked their highest individual ranking climbing as high as No. 4 and finished the season at No. 9 in both major polls. Clemson finished with five All-ACC honorees and 15 on the All-Academic Softball Team, while Cagle was tabbed the ACC Softball Scholar-Athlete of the Year. After posting a 3.68 team GPA, 17 student-athletes received Easton/NFCA All-America Scholar Athlete distinctions while the team maintained the 12th-highest team GPA in Division I.

In the third year of the program, Rittman continued to guide Clemson to new heights by making the program's first Super Regional appearance after earning the program's first national seed and hosting a Regional. Early in the season, the Tigers upset then-No. 6 Washington, 2-0, at the St. Pete/Clearwater Elite Invitational for the program's first top-10 win. Clemson followed that by playing its 100th game in program history against Illinois on March 13. The Tigers won with a 4-0 victory to tie Clemson women's tennis for the most wins through a program's first 100 games with a 78-22 record. With that record, Rittman solidified himself as the winningest coach among active head coaches at Clemson surpassing Dabo Swinney (football), who held a 74-26 record. The Tigers continued to reach new levels by winning their 100th game in only 130 games on May 1 with a 3-2 win against Georgia Tech on Senior Day to become the second-fastest program at Clemson to reach 100 wins trailing only women's tennis (128). The Tigers were ACC Tournament Runner-Ups after defeating then-No. 19 Notre Dame, 7-3, and then-No. 2 Virginia Tech, 4-1, in the first two rounds before falling in the championship game, 8-6, to then-No. 3 Florida State. The upset win over Virginia Tech marks Clemson softball's highest victory over a ranked opponent in program history. The hot streak continued for Clemson entering postseason as the Tigers earned the No. 10 national seed for the NCAA softball tournament. The Tigers welcomed No. 17 Auburn, Louisiana and UNCW for the Clemson Regional and made a clean sweep in three games by shutting out all three programs and run-ruling UNCW and Louisiana to advance to the Stillwater Super Regional. Clemson finished the year with five All-ACC team selections, and Valerie Cagle was named an NFCA First Team All-American. Behind Rittman's efforts, Clemson climbed as high as No. 14 in the NFCA national rankings and earned its first single digit ranking from ESPN/USA Softball rankings coming in at No. 9.

Rittman graduated from New Mexico State with a degree in journalism in 1986. He was a three-year letterwinner in baseball as an outfielder at NMSU after transferring from Yavapai Junior College in Prescott, Arizona.

Rittman and his wife, Lorie, a former softball player at the University of Oklahoma, are the parents of Justin, a UCLA graduate and former fullback for the Bruins, and Jake, a Notre Dame graduate and former punter for the Fighting Irish.

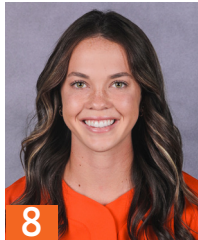

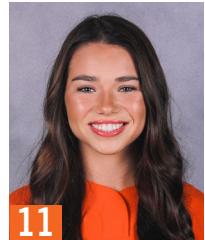

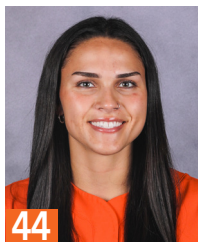
