QUICK HITS

- Clemson has outscored opponents 406-180.
- Following the Georgia Tech series, Clemson eclipsed the 40-win milestone for the fourth time in program history.
- The Tigers totaled 493 hits through 56 games in 2025, including the freshman class contributing 163 of those hits and returners Alex Brown (74), Maddie Moore (71), Julia Knowler (56) and Aby Vieira (54) adding to the list.
- The Tigers have program records in hits (493), runs (406), RBIs (372), doubles (94), walks (234) and total bases (849) and home runs (80) after sophomore Kylee Johnson hit a two-run bomb to lead the Tigers to their first ACC Championship.
- Clemson takes a 116 game hit streak into the 2025 regionals that began during the UNCG matchup at regionals on May 19, 2023.

CLEMSON OVERVIEW

- Clemson was selected as the No. 11 National Seed in the 2025 NCAA Tournament to mark the third time in four years Clemson has been a national seed and the fifth-consecutive season the Tigers have made a postseason berth.
- Clemson takes a .329 batting average. Clemson also has a .571 slugging percentage and .429 on-base percentage.
- Clemson's pitching staff holds a 2.70 ERA through 358 innings of work and has recorded 246 strikeouts.

USC UPSTATE OVERVIEW

- USC Upstate holds a .344 average with a .510 slugging percentage and .420 OBP.
- The Spartans have a 2.56 ERA with 253 strikeouts through 342.1 innings.
- History: The Tigers met the Spartans for the first time in 2024 during the Tuscaloosa Regional.

NORTHWESTERN OVERVIEW

- Northwestern holds a .290 average with a .464 slugging percentage and .379 OBP.
- The Wildcats have a 3.73 ERA with 225 strikeouts through 300 innings.
- History: The Tigers met for the first time in 2022 and most recently met in 2023 in McWhorter Stadium at the ACC/Big 10 Challenge.

RING 'EM

- The 2025 Clemson Tigers made history by becoming the first team in the program's short infancy to be crowned ACC Champions.
- Clemson defeated Florida State, 2-1, in the championship game after sophomore Kylee Johnson hit a two-run homer with one out in the top of the seventh inning.
- Senior Brooke McCubbin fended off the Seminoles in the bottom of the inning to pick up her third win of the weekend and lead Clemson to a championship.
- The Tigers advanced to the finals after coming back from a 9-2 deficit against the Virginia Tech Hokies to win, 10-9.
- Clemson scored eight runs in the bottom of the sixth inning in the rain to tie for the largest comeback in program history.
- The Tigers opened the weekend with a 7-4 comeback win against Virginia on Thursday after freshman Taylor Pipkins drove a grand slam out of the park in the bottom of the sixth.
- Pipkins was named the tournament MVP, and Maddie Moore, Aby Vieira and Brooke McCubbin joined her on the All-Tournament team.

TIGERS IN THE POSTSEASON

- Clemson hosts a regional for the third time in only six years as a program.
- The Tigers are the No. 11 seed in 2025 after being the No. 10 seed in 2022 and No. 16 seed in 2023.
- The two previous seasons that Clemson has hosted, the Tigers have advanced to a super regional (Stillwater Super in 2022 & Norman Super in 2023).
- The two additional years Clemson has made a postseason appearance, the Tigers have gone to the Tuscaloosa Regional.
- Clemson takes a 9-9 overall record into the 2025 postseason, including 9-5 in regional games.

SHE'S GIVING MOORE

- Senior infielder Maddie Moore is the lone all-american returning to the Clemson lineup after garnering third team honors at second base following the 2024 season.
- The Loomis, Calif., native has seen time throughout the infield during her career, she leads returners with 224 career starts and 222 career appearances.
- Defensively, she has clocked 300 putouts and 395 assists. Her 395 assists sits second all-time at Clemson trailing only Alia Logoleo (417).
- She has the program record with 40 career double plays with nine this season.
- The senior has clocked 64 RBIs during the 2025 season - a program record.
- At the plate, Moore has significantly improved during her time in the Orange and Regalia - including now holding the single-season record for RBIs and ranking third in home runs

- Earlier in 2025, Moore set the longest reached base streak in Clemson Softball history with 29. It began on March 28, 2024 against Virginia and was snapped vs. Villanova on February 21, 2025.
- This is the longest reached base streak by a Tiger, and surpassed Valerie Cagle's 25 games in 2021.

PUMP UP THE JAM

- Clemson added depth to its outfield when transfer Jamison Brockenbrough signed with the program in the summer of 2024.
- A constant in centerfield, Brockenbrough provides speed to the bottom of the Tiger lineup.
- She provided a spark offensively in California to finish the three-game series against Stanford batting .600 with a .600 slugging and .750 on-base percentage.
- Following the FSU game, the junior is batting .336 with 45 hits, including four doubles, one triple and two home runs.

- She is third on the team with 43 runs scored.
- With speed, she is a perfect 8-for-8 on stolen bases this season.
- The junior finished with a 23-game reached base streak, the third longest streak in program history.

- Senior Aby Vieira is a four-year starter behind the plate.
- The quarterback of the Clemson softball program, Vieira has guided the program behind and at the plate in 187 appearances and holds a .296 average.
- Dominating at the plate offensively, Vieira maintains a .344 average in 2025 - next best season was her sophomore year in 2023 - .314.
- The senior has 54 hits, 21 more than the next closest year and 19 for extra bases.
- She has surpassed her season-high with 31 RBIs in 2025 and a .503 slugging percentage.

TO KNOWLER IS TO LOVE HER

- Julia Knowler stepped onto the collegiate scene with a splash in 2024 and hasn't looked back.
- The sophomore has a .313 average clocking 56 hits - 31 of which have been for extra bases.
- She has 14 home runs - which is fifth-most in a single season and second-most by a sophomore.

- Through her 55 appearances this season, Knowler has contributed 17 doubles - a program single-season record.
- She has four walk-off hits this season, including a home run against Ohio State, and RBI singles against Villanova (extra innings), Marshall (run-rule) and Indiana (run-rule).
- A force at the plate, she has totaled 115 bases and 57 RBIs.
- She has 16 multi-hit games and 15 multi-RBI games.
- She set the sophomore record for most RBIs and sits tied for second all-time in a single season.

- As a freshman, her first collegiate game in 2024 saw Knowler going 3-for-4 with four RBIs and three runs scored. Her hits included a solo home run in her first plate appearance and a two-run shot out of dead center (vs. Missouri State).
- She missed 20 games in 2024 due to a non-orthopedic surgery.

BROWNIE POINTS

- Senior Alex Brown joined the Clemson roster prior to the 2024 season after transferring from North Carolina.
- Starting in all 56 games and in the lead off spot in the 2025 season, she has clocked a .420 average with 74 hits, a .591 slugging percentage, a .521 on-base percentage with 10 stolen bases.
- The senior scored her 63rd run of the 2025 season against VT in the ACC Championships - a program record.

- She led off game two of the NC State series with a solo home run for her 200th career hit.
- She recorded a perfect 10-for-10 weekend against Syracuse that included two doubles, one home run, six runs, five RBIs, 1.500 slugging percentage, three walks and a 1.000 on-base percentage.
- From February 13 to March 9, Brown reached base in 19 straight games, the seventh longest streak in Clemson history.
- From February 22 to March 7, Brown also scored in 10 straight games, a school record.

BASE THIEVES

- Not only is senior Maddie Moore smart at the plate, but she has been able to lead the Tigers by stealing 49 bases over the course of her career - the Clemson program record.
- The senior was a perfect 10-for-10 during her freshman campaign and has gone on to steal an additional 15 bases in both her sophomore and junior seasons.
- Kylee Johnson joins Moore on the Top 10 list after she stole 11 bases during her freshman campaign on 13 attempts. She has stolen seven in 2025.
- Her 11-consecutive stolen bases dating from Feb. 14, 2024 to April 9, 2024 is tied for the eighth longest streak in Clemson softball history.

PIP PIP HOORAY

- Freshman Taylor Pipkins has solidified her sport in right field since the series finale at Stanford.
- She provides a strong spark in the bottom third of the lineup, contributing at least one hit, one run, one RBI or all three in 20 games this season.
- She hit the go-ahead grand slam against Virginia in the bottom of the sixth inning to push the Tigers to the ACC Championship Semifinals which helped her be named the ACC Tournament MVP.
- She came up with a crucial sac fly to score the go-ahead run against top-ranked Tennessee in the top of the ninth inning. She also clocked a hit and scored a run that game.
- She has four sac flies on the season, which ties for third most in program history in a single year.
- Her best series on the year came at NC State, where she recorded four hits over the three games, including two home runs and five RBIs.
- Additional spotlight moments came in the series finale against the Cardinal, where she broke open the no-hitter with a double into left field that went on to spur Clemson's offense to secure the series upset win.
- She has started in 25 games at either right field, third base or second.

IN THE CIRCLE

- The dynamic duo of Reese Basinger and Brooke McCubbin have combined for 32 victories in the circle and five saves.
- Pitching by committee, Basinger has been Clemson's ace leading off most weekend series with the Friday night start.
- Basinger, the ACC Pitcher of the Year, leads Clemson with 158 innings of work and 114 strikeouts
- McCubbin has become Clemson's primary Saturday starter and relief pitcher accounting for 119.2 innings with 75 strikeouts.
- McCubbin hit her stride in the second half of the season, accounting for all of Clemson's wins in the circle during the ACC Tournament with top 25 victories against Virginia, Virginia Tech and Stanford.
- Joining these two in the circle has been freshman Macey Cintron, who has accumulated eight victories and two saves in her 61 innings of work.
- Additional appearances have come from Olivia Duncan (12.2 innings) and Brook Melnychuk (13.2 innings).

BOTTLE OF CINTRON

- ACC Freshman of the Year Macey Cintron has struck Clemson's lineup in a powerful way since game one.
- Becoming the second freshman in as many years to hit a lead off home run in her first collegiate at bat, Cintron continues to push Clemson's offensive prowess.
- The Cumming, Ga., native has taken over the cleanup spot in the lineup following the powerhouses of Moore and Knowler to hold a .308 average, including a .622 slugging percentage and .437 on-base percentage.
- She became the third Tiger to hit double-digit home runs with 13 and has 48 RBIs through her first 55

CLUTCH COLLINS

- Freshman Marian Collins has been crucial to Clemson's success - starting at shortstop and batting sixth in the lineup.
- She provided both home run hits to propel the Tigers past in-state rival South Carolina inside McWhorter Stadium (the lone two runs for the Tigers that game).
- She also notched home runs in back-to-back games at Georgia Tech to secure the series sweep.
- A force at the plate, Collins has 41 RBIs on the year and 11 home runs.
- Her 12 doubles also stands sixth amongst Clemson's single-season records.
- Defensively, Collins has provided 76 putouts and 102 assists at shortstop amongst an experienced infield.

FRESH FACES

- All seven freshmen on the 2025 roster have made at least one appearance during the 2025 season.
- Macey Cintron, Marian Collins, Sam Minish, Taylor Pipkins and Ava Wilson have started in at least 25 games, with Cintron and Collins starting every game.
- During opening weekend, the freshman class provided production at the plate for the Tigers clocking 18 of

the team's 40 total hits and 15 of the 27 total RBIs.

- In total, 34 of Clemson's 80 home runs have come off the bat of a freshman, including Wilson, Collins and Pipkins recording three of the four grand slams this season.
- Freshmen have shown awareness at the plate far beyond their age, accounting for 101 of the team's 234 total walks.

MISCELLANEOUS VICTORIES

- In only its sixth year of competition, Clemson has racked up numerous run-rule victories and winning streaks that have become noteworthy in the record book.
- When it comes to run-rules, the Tigers have amassed 75, including 12 in 2024 and 15 in 2025.
- The Tigers originally set the largest margin of victory in a run-rule during the inaugural season against Maryland inside McWhorter Stadium (then the Clemson Softball Stadium). Clemson claimed a 21-2 win on Feb. 15, 2020 for a 19-run margin.
- In the final weekend of the regular season in 2025, Clemson tied this record with a 19-0 run-rule victory at Georgia Tech on April 26, 2025.
- Prior to the 19-run victory, Clemson's largest margin of victory came against Syracuse after the Tigers recorded eight runs in the third and seven in the fourth to take the game 15-0.

- As of the RPI on May 11, Clemson had won 20 games against opponents in the top 50 RPI, including nine against top 25 opponents.

MADNESS IN McWHORTER

- The Clemson community latched onto the softball program as soon as the sport was announced as an addition in 2017.
- With an original capacity of 1,616 for the 2020-22 seasons, Clemson expanded the outfield berm seating in the summer of 2022 to move the capacity to 2,116.
- For the previous two seasons, Clemson has average-over 1,500 fans, including 1,877 during the 2024 home slate.
- In 2025, Clemson has averaged 1,575 fans for its 28 total home games.
- With 48,809 fans entering McWhorter Stadium in 2024, Clemson finished 13th nationally and led the ACC in overall attendance. The Tigers' average attendance also led the ACC and ranked seventh nationally.
- Clemson has ranked in the top 10 in either overall attendance and/or average attendance in 2020, 2022, 2023 and 2024. *Note that in 2021, Clemson had attendance restrictions coming off the COVID-19 Pandemic.

Clemson celebrates the 50th year of varsity women's athletics at Clemson during the 2024-25 seasons.

HEAD COACH JOHN RITTMAN



John Rittman, a longtime head coach and member of the USA Softball Women's National Team coaching pool, was named the first Head Coach of Clemson Softball on Nov. 3, 2017. Rittman came to Clemson after serving as the Associate Head Coach at the University of Kansas from 2015-17. Rittman joined the Jayhawks after 18 seasons as the Head Coach at Stanford University and 10 years on the United States National Team coaching staff (2001-08, 2016-18). He returned to the USA Women's National Team staff in 2023 when he served as the head coach for the Japan All-Star Series.

The 2024 campaign had Rittman leading the Tigers to a 35-19 overall record. As a program, Clemson opened the season with its 200th game in history (held a 155-45 overall record at this time) that was eclipsed with a 12-0 run-rule against Missouri State. The Tigers also reached their 100th victory in program history at McWhorter Stadium with a 12-0 shutout against Fordham. Rittman continued to show his excellence at the helm of the program by guiding a program-record number of student-athletes to postseason honors, including two NFCA All-Americans, three NFCA All-Region selections and six All-ACC honorees. Most notable on this list is Rittman's guidance of pitcher/utility Valerie Cagle, who was crowned a First Team All-American for the third time of her tenure, as well as being a First Team NFCA All-Southeast selection and earning All-ACC Third Team honors. Cagle was joined by first-time All-American infielder Maddie Moore, who posted a team-high .368 average after contributing 10 home runs, eight doubles and two triples to the Tiger offense. Moore was joined on the All-ACC First Team by infielder Alia Logoleo, who clocked a .319 average, while fellow infielder Alex Brown garnered Second Team accolades with a .328 average. As a team, the Tigers set single-season records in triples (15), sac flies (25) and sac hits (18). Additionally, Clemson's pitching staff finished with a 2.32 ERA, ranked No. 24 in the NCAA at the end of the year, while the 3.72 strikeout-to-walk ratio ended the year at No. 8. For the second-consecutive season, the Clemson pitching staff allowed only 56 extra-base hits while holding opponents to a .245 batting average behind the efforts of All-ACC selections Regan Spencer (Second Team), Millie Thompson (Third Team) and Cagle. Senior center fielder McKenzie Clark rounded out the All-ACC and NFCA All-Region honorees with a .365 average following 10 home runs, eight doubles and four triples. Clemson capped its season with its fourth-straight NCAA Regional appearance where the Tigers won their ninth NCAA Tournament game with an 8-0 run-rule against USC Upstate.

During the fourth season at the helm of the program, Rittman guided the Tigers to a 49-12 overall record that started with a perfect 14-0 run to open the season before the Tigers posted a 37-1 record through the first week of April for another program best. Clemson capped the regular season with a 5-4 victory to mark the 150th of the program and Rittman's 900th-win of his coaching tenure. He became the 44th collegiate softball coach to reach the 900-win benchmark. Hosting the second regional in program history, Clemson went on to defeat UNGC and Auburn to make the second-consecutive super regional appearance. The Tigers took the next step as a program by surpassing previous team bests in multiple categories. Offensively, Clemson tallied 488 hits with a .313 average. The Tigers led the ACC in On-Base Percentage (.409) and Scoring (6.08 per game) and finished in the top 25 of the NCAA in eight offensive categories. Defensively, Clemson finished with a .980 fielding percentage to lead the ACC and finish seventh in

the NCAA. The Tiger defense also turned 31 double plays (.510 per game), which ranked sixth in the nation. With Rittman's tutelage, redshirt junior Valerie Cagle was named the 2023 USA Softball Player of the Year, a Rawlings Gold Glove (pitcher) recipient, the ACC Player of the Year and a NFCA First Team All-American for the second time of her career after she led the ACC in seven categories and ranked in the top 25 of the NCAA in 11. As a team, the Tigers clocked their highest individual ranking climbing as high as No. 4 and finished the season at No. 9 in both major polls. Clemson finished with five All-ACC honorees and 15 on the All-Academic Softball Team, while Cagle was tabbed the ACC Softball Scholar-Athlete of the Year. After posting a 3.68 team GPA, 17 student-athletes received Easton/NFCA All-America Scholar Athlete distinctions while the team maintained the 12th-highest team GPA in Division I.

In the third year of the program, Rittman continued to guide Clemson to new heights by making the program's first Super Regional appearance after earning the program's first national seed and hosting a Regional. Early in the season, the Tigers upset then-No. 6 Washington, 2-0, at the St. Pete/Clearwater Elite Invitational for the program's first top-10 win. Clemson followed that by playing its 100th game in program history against Illinois on March 13. The Tigers won with a 4-0 victory to tie Clemson women's tennis for the most wins through a program's first 100 games with a 78-22 record. With that record, Rittman solidified himself as the winningest coach among active head coaches at Clemson surpassing Dabo Swinney (football), who held a 74-26 record. The Tigers continued to reach new levels by winning their 100th game in only 130 games on May 1 with a 3-2 win against Georgia Tech on Senior Day to become the second-fastest program at Clemson to reach 100 wins trailing only women's tennis (128). The Tigers were ACC Tournament Runner-Ups after defeating then-No. 19 Notre Dame, 7-3, and then-No. 2 Virginia Tech, 4-1, in the first two rounds before falling in the championship game, 8-6, to then-No. 3 Florida State. The upset win over Virginia Tech marks Clemson softball's highest victory over a ranked opponent in program history. The hot streak continued for Clemson entering postseason as the Tigers earned the No. 10 national seed for the NCAA softball tournament. The Tigers welcomed No. 17 Auburn, Louisiana and UNCW for the Clemson Regional and made a clean sweep in three games by shutting out all three programs and run-ruling UNCW and Louisiana to advance to the Stillwater Super Regional. Clemson finished the year with five All-ACC team selections, and Valerie Cagle was named an NFCA First Team All-American. Behind Rittman's efforts, Clemson climbed as high as No. 14 in the NFCA national rankings and earned its first single digit ranking from ESPN/USA Softball rankings coming in at No. 9.

Rittman graduated from New Mexico State with a degree in journalism in 1986. He was a three-year letterwinner in baseball as an outfielder at NMSU after transferring from Yavapai Junior College in Prescott, Arizona.

Rittman and his wife, Lorie, a former softball player at the University of Oklahoma, are the parents of Justin, a UCLA graduate and former fullback for the Bruins, and Jake, a Notre Dame graduate and former punter for the Fighting Irish.
