#### CLEMSON OVERVIEW

- Clemson was selected as the No. 11 National Seed in the 2025 NCAA Tournament to mark the third time in four years Clemson has been a national seed and the fifth-consecutive season the Tigers have made a postseason berth.
- Clemson takes a .328 batting average. Clemson also has a .562 slugging percentage and .425 on-base percentage.
- Clemson's pitching staff holds a 2.56 ERA through 386 innings of work and has recorded 258 strikeouts.

#### TEXAS OVERVIEW

- Texas holds a .361 average with a .598 slugging percentage and .440 OBP.
- The Longhorns have a 2.69 ERA with 375 strikeouts through 366.2 innings.
- History: The Tigers met the Longhorns for the first time in 2022 in the opening weekend tournament at FGCU.

#### QUICK HITS

- Clemson has outscored opponents 422-183.
- Following the Georgia Tech series, Clemson eclipsed the 40-win milestone for the fourth time in program history. Following regionals, Clemson surpassed the 45-win milestone for the second time in program history.
- The Tigers totaled 520 hits through 59 games in 2025, including the freshman class contributing 176 of those hits and returners Alex Brown (77), Maddie Moore (75), Julia Knowler (57) and Aby Vieira (57) adding to the list.
- The Tigers have program records in hits (520), runs (422), RBIs (388), doubles (100), walks (245) and total bases (890) and home runs (82).
- Clemson takes a 119 game hit streak into the 2025 regionals that began during the UNCG matchup at regionals on May 19, 2023.

#### RING 'EM

- The 2025 Clemson Tigers made history by becoming the first team in the program's short infancy to be crowned

ACC Champions.

- Clemson defeated Florida State, 2-1, in the championship game after sophomore Kylee Johnson hit a two-run homer with one out in the top of the seventh inning.
- Senior Brooke McCubbin fended off the Seminoles in the bottom of the inning to pick up her third win of the weekend and lead Clemson to a championship.
- The Tigers advanced to the finals after coming back from a 9-2 deficit against the Virginia Tech Hokies to win, 10-9.
- Clemson scored eight runs in the bottom of the sixth inning in the rain to tie for the largest comeback in program history.
- The Tigers opened the weekend with a 7-4 comeback win against Virginia on Thursday after freshman Taylor Pipkins drove a grand slam out of the park in the bottom of the sixth.
- Pipkins was named the tournament MVP, and Maddie Moore, Aby Vieira and Brooke McCubbin joined her on the All-Tournament team.

#### REGIONAL CHAMPIONS

- The Tigers cruised to their third super regional appearance after sweeping the Clemson Regional last weekend.
- Clemson, the No. 11 National Seed, dominated the opening game of the weekend with a 10-2 run-rule victory against USC Upstate on Friday. Sophomore Kylee Johnson highlighted the matchup with her sixth home run of the year and second in as many games.
- Clemson needed nine innings to squeak out a win against Northwestern. Senior Aby Vieira came up with a clutch triple down the right field line and freshman Marian Collins executed the squeeze to bring her home for the lone run of the game.
- The Tigers advanced to supers after picking up a 5-1 win over Kentucky on Sunday. Freshman Taylor Pipkins hit her fourth home run of the year and senior Reese Basinger earned the win after throwing 5.2 innings with three strikeouts.
- Collins was the highlight of the weekend offensively batting .889 going 8-for-9 with four RBIs, two runs, two walks and a 1.000 SLG with .909 OBP.
- In the circle, Brooke McCubbin finished with a 0.00 ERA securing two wins and a save in 9.2 innings of work while only allowing five hits to limit opponents to a .147 avg.

#### TIGERS IN THE POSTSEASON

- Clemson hosted a regional for the third time in only six years as a program.
- The Tigers are the No. 11 seed in 2025 after being the No. 10 seed in 2022 and No. 16 seed in 2023.
- Every year that Clemson has hosted, the Tigers have advanced to a super regional (Stillwater Super in 2022, Norman Super in 2023 & Austin Super in 2025).
- The two additional years Clemson has made a postseason appearance, the Tigers have gone to the Tuscaloosa Regional.
- Clemson takes a 12-9 overall record into the 2025 postseason - the Tigers have yet to win a super regional game.

## POSTSEASON AWARDS

- Clemson set a program record with eight Tigers being named NFCA All-Region selections.
- The eight selections were highlighted by four first team honorees: Maddie Moore (2B), Reese Basinger (P), Marian Collins (SS) and Macey Cintron (DP or UTL/Non-Pitcher). Julia Knowler (1B) and Aby Vieira (C) garnered second team nods, while Alex Brown (3B) and Jamison Brockenbrough (OF) picked up third team honors.
- The Tigers also garnered ACC 'of the Year' award as Cintron was named the Freshman of the Year and Basinger was crowned the Pitcher of the Year. This was Clemson's second FOTY, while Basinger earned the first Pitcher of the Year nod in program history.
- Additional All-ACC honorees include first team selections Moore, Brown, Cintron and Basinger, third team members Brooke McCubbin and Brockenbrough and All-Freshman honorees Cintron and Collins.
- Following the ACC Tournament, freshman Taylor Pipkins was crowned the tournament MVP, while McCubbin, Moore and Vieira garnered All-Tournament Team selections.

## SHE'S GIVING MOORE

- Senior infielder Maddie Moore is the lone all-american returning to the Clemson lineup after garnering third team honors at second base following the 2024 season.
- The Loomis, Calif., native has seen time throughout the infield during her career, she leads returners with 227 career starts and 225 career appearances.
- Defensively, she has clocked 304 putouts and 397 assists. Her 397 assists sits second all-time at Clemson trailing only Alia Logoleo (417).
- She has the program record with 40 career double plays with nine this season.
- The senior has clocked 66 RBIs during the 2025 season - a program record.
- At the plate, Moore has significantly improved during her time in the Orange and Regalia - including now holding the single-season record for RBIs and ranking third in home runs

- With 11 stolen bases in 2025, Moore has claimed the Clemson's career record with 51 stolen bases.
- The senior was a perfect 10-for-10 during her freshman campaign and has gone on to steal an additional 15 bases in both her sophomore and junior seasons.
- Earlier in 2025, Moore set the longest reached base streak in Clemson Softball history with 29. It began on March 28, 2024 against Virginia and was snapped vs. Villanova on February 21, 2025.
- This is the longest reached base streak by a Tiger, and surpassed Valerie Cagle's 25 games in 2021.

## IN THE CIRCLE

- The dynamic duo of Reese Basinger and Brooke McCubbin have combined for 35 victories in the circle

and six saves.

- Pitching by committee, Basinger has been Clemson's ace leading off most weekend series with the Friday night start.
- Basinger, the ACC Pitcher of the Year, leads Clemson with 169.1 innings of work and 121 strikeouts
- McCubbin has become Clemson's primary Saturday starter and relief pitcher accounting for 129.1 innings with 78 strikeouts.
- McCubbin hit her stride in the second half of the season, accounting for all of Clemson's wins in the circle during the ACC Tournament with top 25 victories against Virginia, Virginia Tech and Florida State.
- McCubbin became the first Clemson pitcher to win five-straight games (Virginia-Northwestern) and did so all in relief.

- Joining these two in the circle has been freshman Macey Cintron, who has accumulated eight victories and two saves in her 61 innings of work.
- Additional appearances have come from Olivia Duncan (12.2 innings) and Brook Melnychuk (13.2 innings).

## AB(SOLUTELY)

- Senior Aby Vieira is a four-year starter behind the plate.
- The quarterback of the Clemson softball program, Vieira has guided the program behind and at the plate in 190 appearances and holds a .298 average.
- Dominating at the plate offensively, Vieira maintains a .345 average in 2025 - next best season was her sophomore year in 2023 - .314.
- The senior has 57 hits, 24 more than the next closest year and 21 for extra bases.
- She has surpassed her season-high with 32 RBIs in 2025 and a .515 slugging percentage.

- Julia Knowler stepped onto the collegiate scene with a splash in 2024 and hasn't looked back.
- The sophomore has a .302 average clocking 57 hits - 32 of which have been for extra bases.
- She has 14 home runs - which is fifth-most in a single season and second-most by a sophomore.

- As a freshman, her first collegiate game in 2024 saw Knowler going 3-for-4 with four RBIs and three runs scored. Her hits included a solo home run in her first plate appearance and a two-run shot out of dead center (vs. Missouri State).
- She missed 20 games in 2024 due to a non-orthopedic surgery.

## BROWNIE POINTS

- Senior Alex Brown joined the Clemson roster prior to the 2024 season after transferring from North Carolina.
- Starting in all 59 games and in the lead off spot in the 2025 season, she has clocked a .418 average with 77 hits, a .582 slugging percentage, a .522 on-base percentage with 10 stolen bases.
- The senior scored her 66th run of the 2025 season against Kentucky in the regional championship - a program record.

- She led off game two of the NC State series with a solo home run for her 200th career hit.
- She recorded a perfect 10-for-10 weekend against Syracuse that included two doubles, one home run, six runs, five RBIs, 1.500 slugging percentage, three walks and a 1.000 on-base percentage.
- From February 13 to March 9, Brown reached base in 19 straight games, the seventh longest streak in Clemson history.
- From February 22 to March 7, Brown also scored in 10 straight games, a school record.

## PUMP UP THE JAM

- Clemson added depth to its outfield when transfer Jamison Brockenbrough signed with the program in the summer of 2024.
- A constant in centerfield, Brockenbrough provides speed to the bottom of the Tiger lineup.
- She provided a spark offensively in California to finish

the three-game series against Stanford batting .600 with a .600 slugging and .750 on-base percentage.

- Following regionals, the junior is batting .319 with 46 hits, including four doubles, one triple and two home runs.
- She is third on the team with 43 runs scored.
- With speed, she is a perfect 8-for-8 on stolen bases this season.
- The junior finished with a 23-game reached base streak, the third longest streak in program history.

## PIP PIP HOORAY

- Freshman Taylor Pipkins has solidified her sport in right field since the series finale at Stanford.
- She provides a strong spark in the bottom third of the lineup, contributing at least one hit, one run, one RBI or all three in 23 games this season.
- The freshman hit a two-run homer against Kentucky to help push the Tigers to supers.
- She hit the go-ahead grand slam against Virginia in the bottom of the sixth inning to push the Tigers to the ACC Championship Semifinals which helped her be named the ACC Tournament MVP.
- She came up with a crucial sac fly to score the go-ahead run against top-ranked Tennessee in the top of the ninth inning. She also clocked a hit and scored a run that game.
- She has four sac flies on the season, which ties for third most in program history in a single year.
- Her best series on the year came at NC State, where she recorded four hits over the three games, including two home runs and five RBIs.
- Additional spotlight moments came in the series finale against the Cardinal, where she broke open the no-hitter with a double into left field that went on to spur Clemson's offense to secure the series upset win.
- She has started in 28 games at either right field, third base or second.

## BOTTLE OF CINTRON

- ACC Freshman of the Year Macey Cintron has struck Clemson's lineup in a powerful way since game one.
- Becoming the second freshman in as many years to hit a lead off home run in her first collegiate at bat, Cintron continues to push Clemson's offensive prowess.
- The Cumming, Ga., native has taken over the cleanup spot in the lineup following the powerhouses of Moore and Knowler to hold a .301 average, including a .596 slugging percentage and .429 on-base percentage.
- She became the third Tiger to hit double-digit home runs with 13 and has 49 RBIs through her first 58 games (offensive only - has started all 59 games, one as a pitcher only).
- In 58 games, she has cracked Clemson's Freshman Top 5 lists alongside Marian Collins and holds the Freshman RBI record.

- Defensively, Collins has provided 81 putouts and 106 assists at shortstop amongst an experienced infield.

- All seven freshmen on the 2025 roster have made at least one appearance during the 2025 season.
- Macey Cintron, Marian Collins, Sam Minish, Taylor Pipkins and Ava Wilson have started in at least 28 games, with Cintron and Collins starting every game.
- During opening weekend, the freshman class provided production at the plate for the Tigers clocking 18 of the team's 40 total hits and 15 of the 27 total RBIs.

# HEAD COACH JOHN RITTMAN



John Rittman, a longtime head coach and member of the USA Softball Women's National Team coaching pool, was named the first Head Coach of Clemson Softball on Nov. 3, 2017. Rittman came to Clemson after serving as the Associate Head Coach at the University of Kansas from 2015-17. Rittman joined the Jayhawks after 18 seasons as the Head Coach at Stanford University and 10 years on the United States National Team coaching staff (2001-08, 2016-18). He returned to the USA Women's National Team staff in 2023 when he served as the head coach for the Japan All-Star Series.

The 2024 campaign had Rittman leading the Tigers to a 35-19 overall record. As a program, Clemson opened the season with its 200th game in history (held a 155-45 overall record at this time) that was eclipsed with a 12-0 run-rule against Missouri State. The Tigers also reached their 100th victory in program history at McWhorter Stadium with a 12-0 shutout against Fordham. Rittman continued to show his excellence at the helm of the program by guiding a program-record number of student-athletes to postseason honors, including two NFCA All-Americans, three NFCA All-Region selections and six All-ACC honorees. Most notable on this list is Rittman's guidance of pitcher/utility Valerie Cagle, who was crowned a First Team All-American for the third time of her tenure, as well as being a First Team NFCA All-Southeast selection and earning All-ACC Third Team honors. Cagle was joined by first-time All-American infielder Maddie Moore, who posted a team-high .368 average after contributing 10 home runs, eight doubles and two triples to the Tiger offense. Moore was joined on the All-ACC First Team by infielder Alia Logoleo, who clocked a .319 average, while fellow infielder Alex Brown garnered Second Team accolades with a .328 average. As a team, the Tigers set single-season records in triples (15), sac flies (25) and sac hits (18). Additionally, Clemson's pitching staff finished with a 2.32 ERA, ranked No. 24 in the NCAA at the end of the year, while the 3.72 strikeout-to-walk ratio ended the year at No. 8. For the second-consecutive season, the Clemson pitching staff allowed only 56 extra-base hits while holding opponents to a .245 batting average behind the efforts of All-ACC selections Regan Spencer (Second Team), Millie Thompson (Third Team) and Cagle. Senior center fielder McKenzie Clark rounded out the All-ACC and NFCA All-Region honorees with a .365 average following 10 home runs, eight doubles and four triples. Clemson capped its season with its fourth-straight NCAA Regional appearance where the Tigers won their ninth NCAA Tournament game with an 8-0 run-rule against USC Upstate.

During the fourth season at the helm of the program, Rittman guided the Tigers to a 49-12 overall record that started with a perfect 14-0 run to open the season before the Tigers posted a 37-1 record through the first week of April for another program best. Clemson capped the regular season with a 5-4 victory to mark the 150th of the program and Rittman's 900th-win of his coaching tenure. He became the 44th collegiate softball coach to reach the 900-win benchmark. Hosting the second regional in program history, Clemson went on to defeat UNGC and Auburn to make the second-consecutive super regional appearance. The Tigers took the next step as a program by surpassing previous team bests in multiple categories. Offensively, Clemson tallied 488 hits with a .313 average. The Tigers led the ACC in On-Base Percentage (.409) and Scoring (6.08 per game) and finished in the top 25 of the NCAA in eight offensive categories. Defensively, Clemson finished with a .980 fielding percentage to lead the ACC and finish seventh in

the NCAA. The Tiger defense also turned 31 double plays (.510 per game), which ranked sixth in the nation. With Rittman's tutelage, redshirt junior Valerie Cagle was named the 2023 USA Softball Player of the Year, a Rawlings Gold Glove (pitcher) recipient, the ACC Player of the Year and a NFCA First Team All-American for the second time of her career after she led the ACC in seven categories and ranked in the top 25 of the NCAA in 11. As a team, the Tigers clocked their highest individual ranking climbing as high as No. 4 and finished the season at No. 9 in both major polls. Clemson finished with five All-ACC honorees and 15 on the All-Academic Softball Team, while Cagle was tabbed the ACC Softball Scholar-Athlete of the Year. After posting a 3.68 team GPA, 17 student-athletes received Easton/NFCA All-America Scholar Athlete distinctions while the team maintained the 12th-highest team GPA in Division I.

In the third year of the program, Rittman continued to guide Clemson to new heights by making the program's first Super Regional appearance after earning the program's first national seed and hosting a Regional. Early in the season, the Tigers upset then-No. 6 Washington, 2-0, at the St. Pete/Clearwater Elite Invitational for the program's first top-10 win. Clemson followed that by playing its 100th game in program history against Illinois on March 13. The Tigers won with a 4-0 victory to tie Clemson women's tennis for the most wins through a program's first 100 games with a 78-22 record. With that record, Rittman solidified himself as the winningest coach among active head coaches at Clemson surpassing Dabo Swinney (football), who held a 74-26 record. The Tigers continued to reach new levels by winning their 100th game in only 130 games on May 1 with a 3-2 win against Georgia Tech on Senior Day to become the second-fastest program at Clemson to reach 100 wins trailing only women's tennis (128). The Tigers were ACC Tournament Runner-Ups after defeating then-No. 19 Notre Dame, 7-3, and then-No. 2 Virginia Tech, 4-1, in the first two rounds before falling in the championship game, 8-6, to then-No. 3 Florida State. The upset win over Virginia Tech marks Clemson softball's highest victory over a ranked opponent in program history. The hot streak continued for Clemson entering postseason as the Tigers earned the No. 10 national seed for the NCAA softball tournament. The Tigers welcomed No. 17 Auburn, Louisiana and UNCW for the Clemson Regional and made a clean sweep in three games by shutting out all three programs and run-ruling UNCW and Louisiana to advance to the Stillwater Super Regional. Clemson finished the year with five All-ACC team selections, and Valerie Cagle was named an NFCA First Team All-American. Behind Rittman's efforts, Clemson climbed as high as No. 14 in the NFCA national rankings and earned its first single digit ranking from ESPN/USA Softball rankings coming in at No. 9.

Rittman graduated from New Mexico State with a degree in journalism in 1986. He was a three-year letterwinner in baseball as an outfielder at NMSU after transferring from Yavapai Junior College in Prescott, Arizona.

Rittman and his wife, Lorie, a former softball player at the University of Oklahoma, are the parents of Justin, a UCLA graduate and former fullback for the Bruins, and Jake, a Notre Dame graduate and former punter for the Fighting Irish.

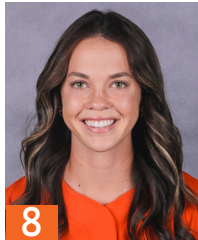

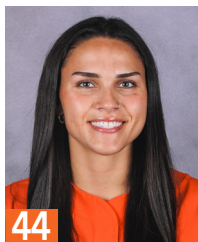

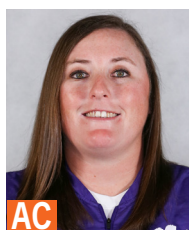
