QUICK HITS

- Clemson takes a 6-4 record into the Charlotte midweek and has outscored opponents 52-47
- The Tigers totaled 65 hits on the year with sophomore Marian Collins and freshman Mac Pavese leading the way with 11 each
- Sophomore Corri Hicks leads the way with 10 RBIs, followed by Collins (seven) and Pavese (six)
- Clemson takes a 132 game hit streak into the Charlotte game that began during the UNCG matchup at regionals on May 19, 2023. The 128 mark is a program record and surpassed the previous mark set from the inaugural game to April 15, 2022.

CLEMSON OVERVIEW

- The Tigers are in their seventh year of competition as a softball program after being crowned and have two ACC Championships under their belt with the most recent coming from the 2025 ACC Champions
- No longer 'newbies' on the softball scene, Clemson has made a postseason appearance every year eligible (2021-25 - postseason was cancelled in 2020).
- In 2026, the Tigers hold an "Attack The Moment" (A.T.M.) mantra and a "Hard 60" mindset into the year. ATM is exactly as it sounds - the team will attack every moment and opportunity presented to them.
- To embrace the A.T.M. theme, the Tigers celebrate home runs and top places by 'cashing in' to the dugout ATM machine. After each home run, players sign their name to a fake \$100 bill and deposit it into the machine.
- Clemson returns multiple starting position players from the 2025 roster, including Jamison Brockenbrough, Macey Cintron, Marian Collins, Julia Knowler and Taylor Pipkins.
- The Tigers welcome 11 newcomers to the 2026 squad, including four transfers and seven freshmen.

CHARLOTTE OVERVIEW

- Charlotte is led by head coach Courtney Breault.
- 2026 marks the seventh time the two programs have met with Clemson holding the 6-0 advantage
- Clemson Connection: Breault was a member of the Clemson inaugural staff and with the program for five seasons before taking the role at Charlotte. Her staff, including Alyssa Bilodeau, Jake Combs and Bailey Taylor all have had stints at Clemson either as a member of the Tigers' staff or as a student-athlete (Taylor)

RITTMAN RECORDS

- Clemson Softball Head Coach John Rittman is closing in on the elusive 1,000 win milestone
- Coach Rittman, who spent 18 seasons at the helm of the Stanford program and is in his seventh season at Clemson sits at 993 career victories
- Rittman reached 750 with the Cardinal and maintained a .681 winning percentage during his tenure
- Needing only seven wins, Rittman is the closest active coach to reaching the benchmark according to NCAA Stats:

- In only six years, Rittman has led the Tigers to five postseason appearances - one in each year eligible after COVID shut down the 2020 season - that has included hosting three regionals and advancing to three super regionals
- The Tigers also have an ACC Regular Season Title (2021) and ACC Championship (2025) under their belt
- Individually, Rittman has produced two ACC Player of the Years, two ACC Freshman of the Years and one ACC Pitcher of the Year alongside 30 All-ACC selections

CLUTCH COLLINS

- Sophomore Marian Collins was crucial to Clemson's success - starting at shortstop and batting sixth in the lineup as a freshman
- She transitioned to second and third base in 2026 and shifted between the third, fourth and fifth batting position
- Collins leads the team with 11 hits alongside freshman Mac Pavese and is second on the roster with seven RBIs
- During opening weekend, the sophomore drew three walks and was a perfect 2-for-2 on stolen bases that helped the Tigers set a single-game program record with eight stolen bases against Liberty
- Her 16 career doubles already sits ninth amongst Clemson's single-season records trailing only Knowler (19) and Aby Vieira (17), who set those marks in 2025

PUMP UP THE JAM

- Jamison Brockenbrough looks to cap her collegiate career on a high note, serving as the lone true senior on the Clemson roster in 2026
- A transfer prior to the 2025 season, Brockenbrough made a flawless transition into the Tigers' lineup in centerfield and brought speed to the bottom of the lineup
- Transitioning to the leadoff spot in 2026, Brockenbrough has drawn 11 walks, including three in the opening weekend finale against Michigan State
- She holds a .474 on-base percentage and is tied for the team lead with three stolen bases once on base
- Not only does the senior bring speed to the lineup, she opened the 2026 slate with a two-run homer against SE Louisiana
- She continued her power stretch with a leadoff home run in the bottom of the first inning against Furman
- A transfer from Tennessee, the Lady Vols fans have continued to show their love and support for 'Jam' or 'Brockenbrough,' teaching the Clemson fans their old cheer during opening weekend at the NFCA Leadoff Classic (video on Clemson Softball IG)
- As a junior, she finished third on the team with 44 runs scored and tied for third with eight stolen bases
- Proving to be patient at the plate, she was third on the team in 2025 with 25 walks and four hit by pitches while maintaining a .419 on-base percentage
- One of the most prevalent ways she made her impact on the Tigers last season was by stringing together a 23-game reached base streak - the third longest streak in program history

MAC ATTACK

- Freshman Mac Pavese stepped on the collegiate scene with a splash during opening weekend
- Pavese made her collegiate debut against No. 5 Oregon and started the come-from-behind rally with a solo home run in the outing
- With the home run in her collegiate debut, she became the third freshman in as many years to hit a home run in their collegiate debut joining Julia Knowler (2024) and Macey Cintron (2025)
- On the weekend, she contributed six hits over four games (.429 average) and scored a team-high five runs
- Continuing to push the envelope, Pavese stole two bases in the Liberty game that contributed to the program's then-single-game record with eight stolen bases
- She capped her opening weekend with three hits and one run scored against Michigan State
- Pavese is tied for the team high with 11 hits and is one of two Tigers with three or more multi-hit outings

MANESS MANIA

- After facing Clemson in two different postseason appearances, Sierra Maness made the jump to the Tigers' roster for her junior season (Tuscaloosa Regional in 2024; Clemson Regional in 2025)
- Maness made her Tigers debut with a 5.2 inning performance against SE Louisiana where she garnered the save behind a six strikeout performance
- The junior kept things rolling with one inning of relief against No. 5 Oregon where she struck out one en route to her second save of the year
- Continuing her strong start, she pitched 3.1 innings with two strikeouts in her first victory of the year against Liberty
- The Clemson 'Ace' has pitched 26.2 innings with 17 strikeouts
- With her opening weekend performance, Maness was named to the 2026 NFCA Leadoff Classic All-Tournament team
- While at Upstate, Maness pitched at McWhorter Stadium on May 16, 2025 during the Clemson Regional. She struck out three batters in four innings of work

ABSOLUTELY ST(D)UNNING

- Graduate student Abby Dunning is capping off her collegiate career with a single year at Clemson
- Dunning has made six appearances with two starts and picked up three victories
- Her first win came after throwing 2.1 innings of relief with three strikeouts against SE Louisiana
- She garnered her second after throwing 5.2 innings of relief against No. 5 Oregon where she struck out a season-high seven batters
- Dunning's third victory came after 1.2 innings of perfect relief work against Furman
- While at BC, Dunning pitched at McWhorter Stadium on March 29, 2024 and shut out the Tigers after allowing only three hits and striking out seven
- Dunning reflected on her career up to this point in a written feature titled 'Her Final Year' which can be found by visiting ClemsonTigers.com/her-final-year
- Looking to put a bow on her final year as a college

IN THE CIRCLE

- The Tiger pitching staff is guided by Associate Head Coach Kyle Jamieson, who was named the D1Softball Pitching Coach of the Year following the 2025 season
- Alongside newcomers Maness and Dunning, Clemson returns sophomore Macey Cintron and junior Olivia Duncan
- Cintron made 23 appearances in 2025 with eight wins, two saves, 48 strikeouts and a 2.25 ERA
- Duncan led the Tigers in 2025 with a 1.66 ERA and two wins. She struck out nine and combined for three shutouts
- Both Cintron (one) and Duncan (three) have made at least one appearance this season
- Additional pitchers come from three incoming freshmen in Lexie Hames, Keira Crosby and Maddie Johnson
- Crosby appeared in three games with her first collegiate start coming against Liberty where she threw 3.2 innings and second coming against Furman
- Crosby became the first Tiger pitcher in 2026 to throw a complete-game shutout pitching the full seven innings in the Tiger' 7-0 BYU victory
- Hames made four appearances with two starts this season and struck out a season-high two batters vs. Michigan State

'SUP BREAUX

- Freshman Sarah Breaux (Bro) leads the Tigers after the second weekend of action with a .385 average
- The freshman got the nod during opening day as Clemson's starting designated player and has since transitioned to the starting third baseman
- She has five hits, including two for multiple bases and has drawn five walks to bring her slugging percentage to .538 and her on-base percentage to .579
- The Miami Springs, Fla. native was a D1Softball D100 Freshman to Watch
- Her father, Michael, played football at Nevada-Reno and was a First Team All-Big West offensive guard and 2014 Hall of Fame Athletic Inductee

TO KNOWLER IS TO LOVE HER

- Julia Knowler returns to the lineup for her junior year after being an NFCA Second Team All-Region selection and setting two records (doubles and putouts) last year
- On her career, she maintains a .285 average with 96 hits, including 30 doubles and 20 home runs. She has added 93 RBIs and scored 47 runs with a .552 slugging percentage and .372 on-base percentage
- Two year ago, Knowler opened her collegiate career with a home run in her first-ever at bat before finishing the opening game with two home runs and four RBIs
- Her freshman season was cut short after missing 20 games in the middle of the year due to injury
- She returned for her sophomore campaign with a vengeance by clocking 19 doubles for the single-season Clemson record and added 15 home runs to tie for the most homers by a sophomore in program history
- Entering the third week of 2026, Knowler is tied for fifth for the most doubles by a player in program history (see full breakdown under Collins section).
- She made her presence known as the three-hole hitter in 2025 with 62 RBIs - the second-most in a single season ever by a Tiger
- Defensively, she notched a program-record 381 putouts last season

BOTTLE OF CINTRON

- Macey Cintron returns to the lineup for her second year as a Tiger after being crowned the ACC Freshman

of the Year in 2025

- Becoming the second freshman in as many years to hit a lead off home run in her first collegiate at bat, Cintron pushed Clemson's offensive prowess last season
- The Cumming, Ga., native took over the cleanup spot in the lineup following the powerhouses of Moore and Knowler to hold a .292 average, including a .584 slugging percentage and .417 on-base percentage last season
- She was the third Tiger to hit double-digit home runs and finished the year with 14 and had 51 RBIs which is the most by a freshman in program history
- The NFCA First Team All-Region selection cracked Clemson's Freshman Top 5 lists last season alongside Marian Collins

RING 'EM

- The 2025 Clemson Tigers made history by becoming the first team in the program's short infancy to be crowned ACC Champions.
- Clemson defeated Florida State, 2-1, in the championship game after then-sophomore Kylee Johnson hit a two-run homer with one out in the top of the seventh inning.
- Former Tiger Brooke McCubbin fended off the Seminoles in the bottom of the inning to pick up her third win of the weekend and lead Clemson to a championship.
- The Tigers advanced to the finals after coming back from a 9-2 deficit against the Virginia Tech Hokies to win, 10-9.
- Clemson scored eight runs in the bottom of the sixth inning in the rain to tie for the largest comeback in program history.
- The Tigers opened the weekend with a 7-4 comeback win against Virginia on Thursday after then-freshman Taylor Pipkins drove a grand slam out of the park in the bottom of the sixth.
- Pipkins was named the tournament MVP, while Maddie Moore (2025), Aby Vieira (2025) and Brooke McCubbin (2025) joined her on the All-Tournament team.

PIP PIP HOORAY

- Sophomore Taylor Pipkins entered college as an infielder, but made her impact as a freshman in right field
- She provided a strong spark in the bottom third of the lineup, contributing at least one hit, one run, one RBI or all three in 26 games last season
- As a freshman, she came up with multiple offensive plays for the Tigers to secure crucial victories down the stretch for Clemson including:
- Hitting a two-run homer against Kentucky to help push the Tigers to supers

- The Clemson community latched onto the softball program as soon as the sport was announced as an addition in 2017.
- With an original capacity of 1,616 for the 2020-22 seasons, Clemson expanded the outfield berm seating in the summer of 2022 to move the capacity to 2,116.
- For five of Clemson's six seasons, the Tigers have average over 1,500 fans (the lone season below that was 2021 due to capacity restrictions following COVID).
- With 50,464 fans entering McWhorter Stadium in 2025, Clemson finished 12th nationally and led the ACC in overall attendance.
