QUICK HITS

- Clemson takes a 23-13 record into the midweek against Gardner-Webb, and has outscored opponents 189-128.
- The Tigers have totaled 266 hits on the year with freshman Mac Pavese (.371 - 43 hits) and sophomore Marian Collins (.351 - 39 hits) leading the way
- The duo also lead Clemson with 29 (Collins) and 28 (Pavese) RBIs, respectively, while Corri Hicks (24) and senior Jamison Brockenbrough (23) follow close behind
- Clemson takes a 158 game hit streak that began during the UNCG matchup at regionals on May 19, 2023. The 158 mark is a program record and surpassed the previous mark set from the inaugural game to April 15, 2022.

- On the season, Clemson has five top 25 victories (Oregon, Liberty, Georgia, Mississippi State and South Carolina)
- As a team, Clemson has strung together 11 shutout victories with the most recent coming at South Carolina on March 25

CLEMSON OVERVIEW

- The Tigers are in their seventh year of competition as a softball program after being crowned and have two ACC Championships under their belt with the most recent coming from the 2025 ACC Champions
- No longer 'newbies' on the softball scene, Clemson has made a postseason appearance every year eligible (2021-25 - postseason was cancelled in 2020).
- In 2026, the Tigers hold an "Attack The Moment" (A.T.M.) mantra and a "Hard 60" mindset into the year. ATM is exactly as it sounds - the team will attack every moment and opportunity presented to them.
- To embrace the A.T.M. theme, the Tigers celebrate home runs and top places by 'cashing in' to the dugout ATM machine. After each home run, players sign their name to a fake \$100 bill and deposit it into the machine.
- Clemson returns multiple starting position players from the 2025 roster, including Jamison Brockenbrough, Macey Cintron, Marian Collins and Julia Knowler.
- The Tigers welcome 11 newcomers to the 2026 squad, including four transfers and seven freshmen.

GARDNER-WEBB OVERVIEW

- Gardner-Webb is led by head coach Bailey Wigness.
- The two teams have met five times, all at McWhorter Stadium
- Clemson holds a 5-0 advantage, including three run-rule victories, in the series

CLUTCH COLLINS

- Sophomore Marian Collins was crucial to Clemson's success during the 2025 slate and leads the way in 2026
- She has played at least one game at second base, third and shortstop and has shifted between the third, fourth and fifth batting position
- Through 36 games, Collins has 39 hits, including 13 for extra bases
- Her 24 career doubles already sits seventh amongst Clemson's records, while her 16 last season stands third amongst Clemson's single-season records trailing only Knowler (19) and Aby Vieira (17), who set those marks in 2025

- Jamison Brockenbrough looks to cap her collegiate career on a high note, serving as the lone true senior on the Clemson roster in 2026
- A transfer prior to the 2025 season, Brockenbrough made a flawless transition into the Tigers' lineup in centerfield and brought speed to the bottom of the lineup
- Transitioning to the leadoff spot in 2026, Brockenbrough has drawn 26 walks, including three in the opening weekend finale against Michigan State which ties for the second most in a single game in Clemson

- A transfer from Tennessee, the Lady Vols fans have continued to show their love and support for 'Jam' or 'Brockenbrough,' teaching the Clemson fans their old cheer during opening weekend at the NFCA Leadoff Classic (video on Clemson Softball IG)
- As a junior, she finished third on the team with 44 runs scored and tied for third with eight stolen bases

MAC ATTACK

- Freshman Mac Pavese stepped on the collegiate scene with a splash during opening weekend
- Pavese made her collegiate debut against No. 5 Oregon and started the come-from-behind rally with a solo home run in the outing
- With the home run in her collegiate debut, she became the third freshman in as many years to hit a home run in their collegiate debut joining Julia Knowler (2024) and Macey Cintron (2025)
- During opening weekend, she contributed six hits over four games (.429 average) and scored a team-high five runs
- Continuing to push the envelope, Pavese stole two bases in the Liberty game that contributed to the then-program's then-single-game record with eight stolen bases
- She capped her opening weekend with three hits and one run scored against Michigan State
- Pavese has made a statement against top 25 opponents notching a two-run shot at No. 15 Georgia in the first innings
- Following her contributions to upset wins against Georgia and No. 12 Mississippi State, Pavese became the first Tiger to earn ACC Freshman of the Week honors after the award began in 2026
- Pavese powers the offense with 43 hits and is one of two Tigers with 10 or more multi-hit outings with a team-high 15
- Contributing in any way possible, Pavese is on pace to crack Clemson's top-5 Freshman RBI list in the coming games

NEXT LEVEL NELLY

- Clemson picked up junior transfer Kiley Channell (Nelly) in the summer of 2025
- A true shortstop, Channell has been a fantastic addition for the Tigers on the left side of the infield
- Appearing in 35 games, the junior has 48 putouts and 75 assists - her 75 assists lead the Tigers in 2026
- A natural at the position, Channell has turned eight double plays and been a vocal leader to help guide freshman Sarah Breaux at third base
- Showing up at the plate, Channell is fourth on the team with a .320 average after recording 31 hits and scoring 17 runs
- She has drawn 14 walks and only struck out twice to assist with her .417 on-base percentage
- The junior leads the team with a .333 average in conference play

NOTES

MANESS MANIA

- After facing Clemson in two different postseason appearances, Sierra Maness made the jump to the Tigers' roster for her junior season
- Maness made her Tigers debut with a 5.2 inning performance against SE Louisiana where she garnered the save behind a six strikeout performance
- The junior kept things rolling with one inning of relief against No. 5 Oregon where she struck out one en route to her second save of the year
- Contributing to four of Clemson Top-25 wins, Maness pitched a complete game with eight strikeouts at No. 15 Georgia and followed it with a complete-game shutout against No. 12 Mississippi State three days later
- She also notched the victory with a seven-inning shutout at No. 23 South Carolina
- Her two top 15 victories in one week led to her garnering ACC Pitcher of the Week honors
- Maness was also named to the 2026 NFCA Leadoff Classic All-Tournament team
- She leads the pitching staff with 14 victories, including four solo shutouts
- While at Upstate, Maness pitched at McWhorter Stadium on May 16, 2025 during the Clemson Regional. She struck out three batters in four innings of work and faced the Tigers during the Tuscaloosa Regional in 2024
- Off the field, Maness is an avid line dancer and coordinated multiple group outings last fall

BOTTLE OF CINTRON

- Macey Cintron returns to the lineup for her second year as a Tiger after being crowned the ACC Freshman of the Year in 2025
- Becoming the second freshman in as many years to hit a lead off home run in her first collegiate at bat, Cintron pushed Clemson's offensive prowess last season
- The Cumming, Ga., native holds a .552 slugging percentage and .410 on-base percentage through 93 career games
- Patient at the plate, she has drawn 52 career walks
- She was the third Tiger to hit double-digit home runs in 2025 and finished the year with 14 and had 51 RBIs which is the most by a freshman in program history (See chart reference under Mac Pavese for comparison)
- The NFCA First Team All-Region selection cracked Clemson's Freshman Top 5 lists last season alongside Marian Collins
- Cintron returned to the Clemson lineup with international playing experience after being on the Puerto Rico National Team that won bronze in the summer of 2026
- Bringing a 'dog' mentality to every approach, Cintron is looked at as one of the main leaders amongst the program that will look to Attack The Moment every game

ABSOLUTELY ST(D)UNNING

- Graduate student Abby Dunning is capping off her collegiate career with a single year at Clemson
- Dunning has made 17 appearances with 10 starts and picked up six victories
- Her first win came after throwing 2.1 innings of relief with three strikeouts against SE Louisiana
- She garnered her second after throwing 5.2 innings of relief against No. 5 Oregon where she struck out a season-high seven batters
- She pitched her first complete game in shutout fashion against Coastal Carolina in five innings
- On the year, she has three solo shutouts and two combined in her 56 innings of work
- Highlighting her 2026 campaign is a no-hitter performance on March 7 against Georgia Tech. This was the program's eighth no-hitter

- While at BC, Dunning pitched at McWhorter Stadium on March 29, 2024 and shut out the Tigers after allowing only three hits and striking out seven
- Dunning reflected on her career up to this point in a written feature titled 'Her Final Year' which can be found by visiting ClemsonTigers.com/her-final-year
- Looking to put a bow on her final year as a college athlete, find Dunning sporting a bow in her hair every game this season

IN THE CIRCLE

- The Tiger pitching staff is guided by Associate Head Coach Kyle Jamieson, who was named the D1 Softball Pitching Coach of the Year following the 2025 season
- Alongside newcomers Maness and Dunning, Clemson returns sophomore Macey Cintron and junior Olivia Duncan
- Cintron has made 26 appearances during her career with eight wins, two saves, 49 strikeouts and a 2.65 ERA
- Duncan led the Tigers in 2025 with a 1.66 ERA while picking up two wins. She struck out nine and combined for three shutouts
- Both Cintron (three) and Duncan (five) have made at least three appearances this season
- Additional pitchers come from three incoming freshmen in Lexie Hames, Keira Crosby and Maddie Johnson
- Crosby appeared in 12 games with her first collegiate start coming against Liberty where she threw 3.2 innings and second coming against Furman
- Crosby became the first Tiger pitcher in 2026 to throw a complete-game shutout pitching the full seven innings in the Tiger' 7-0 BYU victory
- She has made three appearances in ACC action, pitching 4.2 innings with four strikeouts
- Hames has made 10 appearances with five starts this season
- Hames' best outing came with a 10 strikeout performance in the Clemson Classic opener against Lipscomb
- Johnson has pitched 1.1 innings during the 2026 season

CATCHING CORRI

- Corri Hicks joined the Clemson roster in the fall of 2025 after spending a year at Oklahoma
- The catcher has 21 hits on the year, including nine for extra bases
- She is also a perfect 3-for-3 on stolen bases and drawn 18 walks (the third-most on a team)
- Highlighting Hicks season is her walk-off homer in the second game of the series against Georgia Tech. With two outs and 0-0 score, Hicks sent the ball out of left center to clinch the series win for the Tigers
- She leads the Tigers with six home runs and has added 24 RBIs
- Behind the plate, Hicks has caught five runners attempting to steal

- Freshman Sarah Breaux (Bro) has clocked 19 hits during her freshman year, including seven multi-base hits

- Two years ago, Knowler opened her collegiate career with a home run in her first-ever at bat before finishing the opening game with two home runs and four RBIs
- Her freshman season was cut short after missing 20 games in the middle of the year due to injury
- She returned for her sophomore campaign with a vengeance by clocking 19 doubles for the single-season Clemson record and added 15 home runs to tie for the most homers by a sophomore in program history
- In her junior year, Knowler has hit the fourth-most doubles by a player in program history (see full breakdown under Marian Collins' section).
- She also is tied for the fifth-most walks by a Tiger on her career (see season breakdown under Brockenbrough)


