### QUICK HITS

- Clemson takes a 32-20 record into regionals, and has outscored opponents 289-210.
- The Tigers have totaled 384 hits on the year with freshman Mac Pavese (.325 - 55 hits), sophomore Marian Collins (.340 - 54 hits) and senior Jamison Brockenbrough (.342 - 54 hits) leading the way
- Sophomore Corri Hicks leads the way with 38 RBIs, while Pavese follows with 37 and Collins (34), Jamison Brockenbrough (31) and Sarah Breaux (26) follow close behind
- Clemson takes a 174 game hit streak that began during the UNCG matchup at regionals on May 19, 2023. The 174 mark is a program record.

- On the season, Clemson has 10 top 25 victories (Oregon, Liberty, Georgia, Mississippi State, South Carolina, Virginia Tech, three against Virginia and Duke)
- As a team, Clemson has strung together an ACC-leading 12 shutout victories with the most recent coming vs. Presbyterian on April 21

### CLEMSON OVERVIEW

- The Tigers are in their seventh year of competition as a softball program after being crowned and have two ACC Championships under their belt with the most recent coming in 2025
- No longer 'newbies' on the softball scene, Clemson has made a postseason appearance every year eligible (2021-25 - postseason was cancelled in 2020).
- In 2026, the Tigers hold an "Attack The Moment" (A.T.M.) mantra and a "Hard 60" mindset into the year. ATM is exactly as it sounds - the team will attack every moment and opportunity presented to them.
- To embrace the A.T.M. theme, the Tigers celebrate home runs and top places by 'cashing in' to the dugout ATM machine. After each home run, players sign their name to a fake \$100 bill and deposit it into the machine.
- Clemson returns multiple starting position players from the 2025 roster, including Jamison Brockenbrough, Macey Cintron, Marian Collins and Taylor Pipkins.
- The Tigers welcome 11 newcomers to the 2026 squad, including four transfers and seven freshmen.

### UNC GREENSBORO OVERVIEW

- UNCG is led by head coach Janelle Breneman.
- Clemson has met Spartans four times prior, including three times during the 2023 season
- The Tigers last met UNCG in the 2023 Clemson Regional where Clemson captured a 17-2 run-rule victory
- Clemson Connection: Former Tiger, JoJo Hyatt (2020-24), is an assistant coach with the Spartans

- The Tigers and the Bulldogs have met six times prior to the 2026 postseason, including earlier this season in Athens where Pavese, Collins and K. Johnson all tallied home runs
- Clemson Connection: Clemson graduate assistant Ben Blizzard was an undergraduate manager with Georgia prior to this season

### PIP PIP HOORAY

- Sophomore Taylor Pipkins entered college as an infielder, but made her impact as a freshman in right field
- Prior to South Carolina, Pipkins had recorded one home run in five-straight games dating back to April 3 at Virginia Tech
- In a nine game stretch (VT on 4/3 to UVA on 4/19), Pipkins recorded six home runs and is currently second on the team with eight homers
- Offensively, Pipkins has been on a tear the last 14 games of the season compared to the first 38 of the season

- during her freshman year, including 17 multi-base hits
- The freshman got the nod during opening day as Clemson's starting designated player and has since transitioned to the starting third baseman
- She has drawn 19 walks and holds a .558 slugging percentage and .394 on-base percentage
- Breaux became the third Tiger in program history to hit a grand slam as her first collegiate home run with a homer in the bottom of the first inning against Louisville on March 13 - the only other Tigers to accomplish the feat were Ava Wilson (2025) and Aby Vieira (2022)
- On the year, she has eight homers, all of which but one have been multi-run bombs with seven of those homers coming in an 11-game stretch between the VT, Pitt and Virginia series and the Presbyterian midweek
- She has hit her stride in the last 16 games of the regular season, clocking 15 hits and 17 RBIs during the stretch

### PUMP UP THE JAM

- Jamison Brockenbrough looks to cap her collegiate career on a high note, serving as the lone true senior on the Clemson roster in 2026
- A transfer prior to the 2025 season, Brockenbrough made a flawless transition into the Tigers' lineup in centerfield and brought speed to the bottom of the lineup
- Transitioning to the leadoff spot in 2026, Brockenbrough has drawn 32 walks, including three in the opening weekend finale against Michigan State which tied for the second most in a single game at Clemson
- She cracked the season top-10 list for walks, while Macey Cintron (28) and Corri Hicks (27) just cracked the top 10

- She holds a .462 on-base percentage and adds a .538 slugging percentage
- Through the Presbyterian midweek, Brockenbrough held a 24-game reached base streak, which was the third-longest streak in program history
- After getting on base, Brockenbrough has stolen seven bases this year to contribute to her 15 as a Tiger, which cracks Clemson's top 10 where current junior Kylee Johnson resides

- She continued her power stretch with home runs against Furman, Georgia Southern, at Notre Dame and two at Pitt
- Brockenbrough is one of six players to have six or more multi-RBI games and one of three players with 13 or more multi-hit games

### MAC ATTACK

- Freshman Mac Pavese stepped on the collegiate scene with a splash during opening weekend
- Pavese made her collegiate debut against No. 5 Oregon and started the come-from-behind rally with a solo home run in the outing
- With the home run in her collegiate debut, she became the third freshman in as many years to hit a home run in their collegiate debut joining Julia Knowler (2024) and Macey Cintron (2025)
- Continuing to push the envelope, Pavese stole two bases in the Liberty game that contributed to the then-program's then-single-game record with eight stolen bases
- She capped her opening weekend with three hits and one run scored against Michigan State
- Pavese has made a statement against top 25 opponents notching a two-run shot at No. 15 Georgia in the first innings
- Following her contributions to upset wins against Georgia and No. 12 Mississippi State, Pavese became the first Tiger to earn ACC Freshman of the Week honors after the award began in 2026
- Pavese powers the offense with 55 hits and is one of three Tigers with 13 or more multi-hit outings with a team-high 17
- Contributing in any way possible, Pavese has cracked Clemson's top-5 Freshman RBI list this season

- She has started every game in 2026, playing second,

- Through 52 games, Collins has 54 hits, including 18 for extra bases
- Her 27 career doubles already sits seventh amongst Clemson's records, while her 16 last season stands third amongst Clemson's single-season records trailing only Knowler (19) and Aby Vieira (17), who set those marks in 2025

## NEXT LEVEL NELLY

- Clemson picked up junior transfer Kiley Channell (Nelly) in the summer of 2025
- A true shortstop, Channell has been a fantastic addition for the Tigers on the left side of the infield
- Appearing in 51 games, the junior has 65 putouts and 105 assists - her 105 assists lead the Tigers in 2026 and sits 10th on Clemson's single-season list
- A natural at the position, Channell has turned 10 double plays and been a vocal leader to help guide freshman Sarah Breaux at third base
- Showing up at the plate, Channell is fifth on the team with a .299 average after recording 43 hits and scoring 23 runs
- She has drawn 18 walks and only struck out 10 times to assist with her .387 on-base percentage
- The junior also leads the team with 13 sac hits which is a single-season record and sits second on the career list

## MANESS MANIA

- After facing Clemson in two different postseason appearances, Sierra Maness made the jump to the Tigers' roster for her junior season
- Maness made her Tigers debut with a 5.2 inning performance against SE Louisiana where she garnered the save behind a six strikeout performance
- The junior kept things rolling with one inning of relief against No. 5 Oregon where she struck out one en route to her second save of the year
- Winning six of Clemson Top-25 wins, Maness pitched a complete game with eight strikeouts at No. 15 Georgia and followed it with a complete-game shutout against No. 12 Mississippi State three days later
- She also notched the victory with a seven-inning shutout at No. 23 South Carolina, the win at No. 11 VT and Sunday finale against No. 18 Virginia
- Her two top 15 victories in one week led to her garnering ACC Pitcher of the Week honors
- She leads the pitching staff with 16 victories, including four solo shutouts
- While at Upstate, Maness pitched at McWhorter Stadium on May 16, 2025 during the Clemson Regional. She struck out three batters in four innings of work and faced the Tigers during the Tuscaloosa Regional in 2024

## BOTTLE OF CINTRON

- Macey Cintron returns to the lineup for her second year as a Tiger after being crowned the ACC Freshman of the Year in 2025
- Becoming the second freshman in as many years to

hit a lead off home run in her first collegiate at bat, Cintron pushed Clemson's offensive prowess last season

- The Cumming, Ga., native holds a .546 slugging percentage and .413 on-base percentage through 109 career games
- Patient at the plate, she has drawn 67 career walks which sits fourth all-time
- During the Pitt series, Cintron picked up two victories in the circle, including a complete-game in the Tigers' run-rule win where she also notched a homer at the plate
- She picked up two additional wins in the circle during the Virginia series by leading the Tigers to victories on both Friday night and Saturday for the series upset win
- On the season, Cintron has appeared in the circle in 10 games for 18 innings with seven strikeouts
- The 2025 NFCA First Team All-Region selection returned to the Clemson lineup with international playing experience after being on the Puerto Rico National Team that won bronze in the summer of 2026

## ABSOLUTELY ST(D)UNNING

- Graduate student Abby Dunning is capping off her collegiate career with a single year at Clemson
- Dunning has made 27 appearances with 16 starts and picked up eight victories
- Her first win came after throwing 2.1 innings of relief with three strikeouts against SE Louisiana
- She garnered her second after throwing 5.2 innings of relief against No. 5 Oregon where she struck out a season-high seven batters
- She pitched her first complete game in shutout fashion against Coastal Carolina in five innings
- On the year, she has three solo shutouts and three combined in her 87 innings of work
- Highlighting her 2026 campaign is a no-hitter performance on March 7 against Georgia Tech. This was the program's eighth no-hitter
- While at BC, Dunning pitched at McWhorter Stadium on March 29, 2024 and shut out the Tigers after allowing only three hits and striking out seven

## CATCHING CORRI

- Corri Hicks joined the Clemson roster in the fall of 2025 after spending a year at Oklahoma
- The catcher has 33 hits on the year, including 18 for extra bases
- She is also a perfect 3-for-3 on stolen bases and drawn 27 walks
- Highlighting Hicks season is her walk-off homer in the second game of the series against Georgia Tech. With two outs and 0-0 score, Hicks sent the ball out of left center to clinch the series win for the Tigers
- She leads the Tigers with 11 home runs and has added 38 RBIs
- The sophomore was a home run shy of hitting for the cycle in the second game of the Pitt series - she hit the home run in her first plate appearance of the series finale against the Panthers
- Behind the plate, Hicks has caught eight runners attempting to steal

## KILLER KYLEE

- Kylee Johnson's name will be etched in Clemson's history forever after powering the Tigers to their first ACC Championship with a two-run shot against Florida State in 2025
- She returns as a junior and appeared in 50 games, starting 33, in 2026
- Continuing to go the distance, Johnson has three homers and eight total extra-base hits
- One extra-base hit this year was a grand slam in the second game of the series at Pitt
- Not only can she hit for power, keep an eye out for her

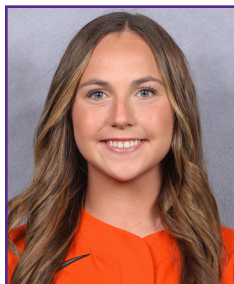
