

Feb. 7, 2020– Clemson defeated St. John's, 6-2, in its inaugural game, which was held at UCF's Black & Gold Tournament in Orlando, Fla. Freshman RHP Logan Caymol threw out the program's first-ever pitch and earned the win in the circle, while freshman infielder Hannah Goodwin recorded the program's first home run, a three-run shot to opposite right to break a 1-1 tie in the fifth inning.



Feb. 9, 2020– After trailing 9-4 entering the top of the sixth, Clemson scored 15 straight runs in the final two innings, including 12 runs in the seventh, to defeat St. John's again by a final score of 19-9 at UCF's Black & Gold Tournament in Orlando, Fla.

Feb. 12, 2020– Clemson held its inaugural home opener in a doubleheader against Western Carolina. Senior infielder MK Bonamy recorded the first hit at Clemson Softball Stadium. The Tigers fell, 0-2, in the first contest. Freshman RHP Logan Caymol threw a complete game no-hitter in the nightcap against the Catamounts as Clemson defeated WCU, 8-0, in five innings.

Feb. 15, 2020– Clemson defeated Maryland 21-2 at Clemson Softball Stadium in the the Tigers' second game of the 2020 Big 10/ACC Challenge. The game was highlighted by the Tigers scoring 14 runs in the second inning. Junior infielder Bailey Taylor and freshman RHP/UTL Valerie Cagle both hit grand slams in the bottom of the second to make Clemson, which was in its ninth contest as a program at the time, just the seventh program in NCAA Division-I history to record at least two grand slams in a single inning.

Feb. 18, 2020– Freshman RHP/UTL Valerie Cagle and freshman RHP Logan Caymol swept ACC Player and Pitcher of the Week awards, respectively. It was the only instance in which two freshmen won both awards in the same week that season.

Feb. 22, 2020– Freshman infielder Hannah Goodwin recorded a game-winning two-run home run to break a 5-5 tie against Stetson, which gave Clemson its first-ever win in extra innings (8).

Feb. 26, 2020– Clemson earned its first-ever ranked win in a 4-1 victory over then-No. 14 Georgia at Clemson Softball Stadium. After trailing 1-0 in the third, the Tigers capitalized on a four-run fourth inning. Clemson posted six-straight singles in the inning. Freshman RHP/UTL Valerie Cagle earned the win in the circle and recorded 20-of-21 outs in the infield.

March 1, 2020– Clemson won its first-ever ACC series after sweeping Virginia at Clemson Softball Stadium. Freshman RHP/UTL Valerie Cagle hit a walk-off home run in the bottom of the seventh to win the first game of the series on Feb. 28. The Tigers won the third and final game of the series, 12-3, in just six innings.

March 3, 2020– The National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) announced Clemson received 10 votes in the fifth edition of the 2020 USA Today/NFCA Division I Top 25 Coaches Poll, marking the first time the program received votes in the poll.

March 12, 2020– The NCAA announced the cancellation of all 2019-20 championships due to the coronavirus pandemic (COVID-19). The ACC then suspended all regular-season games, but never rescheduled them.

CLEMSON SOFTBALL TIMELINE

2020— Clemson finished with a 19-8 overall record in its inaugural season that was cut short due to COVID-19. The Tigers won their opening game against St. John's and picked up the first win at home on Feb. 12, 2020 against Western Carolina. The season was highlighted by a 10-game winning streak from Feb. 22 to March 8 that included a win against Georgia inside the Clemson Softball Stadium (now McWhorter Stadium).

Feb. 5, 2021— Clemson University Board of Trustees announced the renaming of Clemson Softball Stadium to McWhorter Stadium after Stuart McWhorter '91 and Leigh Anne Hendrix McWhorter, of Nashville, Tenn., pledged a Cornerstone Partner Gift of \$2.5 million to IPTAY and Clemson Athletics.

Feb. 21, 2021— Clemson won its first true road series, also its first-ever ACC road series, in a 3-0 series sweep at Georgia Tech (Feb. 20-21).

March 1, 2021— Clemson received its first top-25 ranking coming in at No. 25, according to D1Softball.com.

March 9, 2021— Clemson cracked the USA Today/NFCA coaches poll for the first time coming in at No. 25.

March 27, 2021— Clemson earned its highest ranked win to date against then-No. 11 Duke live on ACC Network at McWhorter Stadium by a final score of 4-1. With the win, the Tigers snapped Duke's then-20 game winning streak, the second-longest winning streak by any Division I softball team at that point.

April 21, 2021— Clemson shutout in-state rival South Carolina, 6-0, in Columbia, S.C. in the first-ever meeting between the two teams. The Tigers and South Carolina were scheduled to meet for the first time in 2020, but the matchup was cancelled along with the remainder of the Tigers' inaugural season due to COVID-19.

May 9, 2021— In its final game of the 2021 regular season, Clemson clinched the ACC regular-season title with a 19-2 win at Syracuse. The Tigers became the first team in league history to earn the regular-season title in any team's first complete season, and the first Clemson program in school history to secure a regular-season conference championship in its first opportunity to do so. Redshirt freshman Alia Logoleo went 4-for-4 at the plate with three homers (grand slam, three-run and two-run homers) and a double, and tallied 10 RBIs, the most by a Division I player in a regular-season contest in 2021. Logoleo's 10 RBIs also marked the most by any player against a Power-5 opponent since May 7, 2015.

May 11, 2021— Redshirt freshman Valerie Cagle was named the 2021 ACC Player and Freshman of the Year to become the first player in softball league history to garner ACC Player or Pitcher of the Year while also being crowned ACC Freshman of the Year. Head Coach John Rittman was also tabbed the league's Coach of the Year.

May 15, 2021— Clemson made its first appearance in the ACC title game after securing a pair of 2-0 wins over Georgia Tech (May 13) and then-No. 20 Virginia Tech (May 14) in the ACC Championship quarterfinals and semifinals, respectively, at Ulmer Stadium in Louisville, Ky. The Tigers fell 1-0 to then-No. 21 Duke in the championship final.

May 16, 2021— Clemson secured its first NCAA Regional berth after being selected to the Tuscaloosa Regional. In addition to the Tigers, Alabama, Troy and Alabama State were also named to the regional site in Tuscaloosa, Ala.

May 21, 2021— Clemson secured its first NCAA Regional win in an 8-0 victory over Troy, which lasted just five innings due to the NCAA's eight-run rule. The Tigers homered four times, including two from starting pitcher Valerie Cagle, who tallied 10 strikeouts.

June 2, 2021— Redshirt freshman Valerie Cagle was named the first Tiger to become a NFCA All-American garnering second team honors.

2021— The Tigers finished with a 44-8 record on the year, including a 29-5 ACC record that led to the program being crowned the ACC Regular Season Champions in its first complete year of action. Clemson made its first appearance in the ACC Tournament Championship game and was selected to its first NCAA postseason being the No. 2 seed in the Tuscaloosa Regional. The NFCA ranked the Tigers as high as No. 18 in the final rankings. Valerie Cagle became the first softball player in league history to be crowned both the ACC Player and ACC Freshman of the Year, while John Rittman was named the ACC Coach of the Year. Cagle rounded out postseason honors by becoming the first All-American.

Feb. 7, 2022— Clemson received its first preseason rankings, being ranked in the top-15 by all major polls: USA Today/NFCA, ESPN/USA Softball, D1Softball.com and Softball America.

Feb. 20, 2022— Clemson upset then-No. 6/5 Washington in Clearwater, Fla. at the St. Pete/Clearwater Elite Invitational for the first top-10 win in program history. Valerie Cagle struck out 10 batters in the circle and hit a solo home run as the Tigers shutout the Huskies, 2-0.

Feb. 22, 2022— Clemson earned its first-ever single-digit ranking, clocking in at No. 9 on ESPN/USA Softball's weekly poll.



Feb. 26, 2022— Sophomore McKenzie Clark hit Clemson's first inside the park home run against Akron in the morning game of the Clemson Classic. Clark dropped a ball into right center and was able to round the bases to cross home two strides before the ball was thrown in to the catcher.

March 1, 2022— Clemson extended its home-winning streak to 21 games at McWhorter Stadium with a 6-0 victory against Gardner-Webb. The streak dated back to March 27, 2021 against Duke (4-1).

March 8, 2022— Seniors Marissa Guimbarda and Cammy Pereira were named two of the 30 Senior CLASS Award candidates. Clemson was one of two programs to have multiple athletes selected as candidates.

March 13, 2022– Clemson softball played its 100th game in program history. Clemson shutout Illinois behind a then-career high 11 strikeouts from sophomore left hand pitcher Millie Thompson. Softball paced itself to tie the best start by any program at Clemson tying women's tennis with a 78-22 record.

March 19, 2022– The then-No. 17/15 Clemson Tigers upset then-No. 13/8 Duke Blue Devils in run-rule fashion defeating Duke in five-innings with a 10-2 victory.

May 1, 2022– Clemson defeated Georgia Tech on Senior Day, 3-2, for the program's 100th victory, accomplishing the feat in only 130 games. Softball was the second-fastest program at Clemson to reach the milestone, trailing only women's tennis (128 games).

May 13, 2022– The Tigers earned their highest ranked victory to date by upsetting then-No. 2/2 Virginia Tech, 4-1, in the ACC Semifinal in Pittsburgh, Pa.

May 14, 2022– Clemson made its second appearance in the ACC title game in as many years after securing wins over Notre Dame (7-3 on May 12) and then-No. 2/2 Virginia Tech (4-1 on May 13) in the ACC Championship quarterfinals and semifinals, respectively, at Vartabedian Field in Pittsburgh, Pa. The Tigers fell, 8-6, to then-No. 3/3 Florida State in the championship final.

May 15, 2022– Clemson and McWhorter Stadium were selected to host a NCAA Regional for the first time as the No. 10 National Seed hosting Louisiana, Auburn and UNCW in the Clemson Regional.

May 20, 2022– Sophomore left hand pitcher Millie Thompson pitched a no-hitter to open the 2022 Clemson Regional in front of a then-record-setting 1,760 crowd at McWhorter Stadium. Thompson threw only 49 pitches in the 9-0 run-rule victory against UNCW.

May 22, 2022– Clemson advanced out of its first NCAA Regional after run-ruling Louisiana, 8-0, in the Clemson Regional Championship. The victory completed the regional sweep with wins after the Tigers also picked up wins over Auburn (1-0) and UNCW (9-0).

May 26, 2022– Clemson appeared in its first NCAA Super Regional playing the No. 7 National Seed Oklahoma State Cowgirls at the Stillwater Super Regional.

June 1, 2022– Redshirt sophomore Valerie Cagle was named softball's first Tiger to become a NFCA First Team All-American, earning All-America honors in back-to-back seasons.

June 7, 2022– Graduate transfer Sam Russ was selected as a Third Team Academic All-America softball team by CoSIDA to become the first Clemson softball player to earn Academic All-America honors.


June 21, 2022– John Rittman and Clemson reached a new five-year contract agreement, keeping him at Clemson through the 2027 season.

2022– Continuing to take strides forward, the Clemson Tigers finished the 2022 season with a 42-17 record and ranked as high as No. 16 in the NFCA poll. The Tigers put up a 14-10 ACC record during the regular season and defeated No. 2 Virginia Tech in the ACC Semifinals to advance to their second ACC Title game in two years. With eight victories against top 25 opponents, Clemson garnered its first postseason hosting berth after being selected as the No. 11 seed where they cruised to three victories against UNCW, Auburn and Louisiana to advance to the program's first super regional. The 2022 season saw the 100th game in program history as well as the 100th victory as a team, both occurring in McWhorter Stadium. Sophomore Millie Thompson threw the program's first postseason no-hitter, while sophomore McKenzie Clark hit the program's first inside the park home run earlier in the season. Valerie Cagle continued to make postseason history by earning NFCA First Team All-America honors, while graduate transfer Sam Russ was named the program's first Academic All-American.

February 10, 2023– Clemson tallied a program-record 19 hits in the 11-2 victory against Georgia State in the second game of the 2023 season. 11 Tigers contributed to Clemson's record with junior McKenzie Clark leading the way going 4-for-4 with a home run. Redshirt junior Alia Logoleo followed by going 3-for-4, and graduate Caroline Jacobsen hit two home runs.

February 17, 2023– The No. 7/6 Tigers welcomed a then-record setting 1,982 fans to McWhorter Stadium when Clemson run-ruled No. 14/11 Northwestern, 15-2, in five innings to open the 2023 home slate. The game was the seventh-straight game with double-digit hits after recording 15 during the game.

February 18, 2023– The Clemson Tigers tied a program-record with seven stolen bases against UIC. The Tigers had set the record the previous week by stealing seven against Ohio State. Junior McKenzie Clark tied the individual program record against UIC by stealing three.

March 8, 2023– Redshirt junior Valerie Cagle threw the program's first perfect game. She retired all 15 batters she faced, including eight strikeouts, for a five-inning perfect game. The righty threw just 51 pitches with 40 strikes and never reached a three-ball count during the contest. Clemson won the game, 18-0. She became the eighth Division I player to throw a perfect game in 2023.

March 24, 2023– Redshirt junior Valerie Cagle threw an immaculate inning tossing only nine pitches to strikeout all three batters in the second inning at Georgia Tech – one of the rarest feats to ever happen in baseball and softball as it had only happened 114 times in MLB history as of this date.


April 17, 2023– Graduate Caroline Jacobsen was drafted in the fifth round (20th overall pick) by the USSSA Pride during the Women's Professional Fastpitch Draft to become the first Clemson softball player to be drafted professionally.

May 10, 2023– For the second time of her career, redshirt junior Valerie Cagle was named the ACC Player of the Year. It was her fourth postseason ACC nod. She also finished the regular season as a six-time ACC Player/Pitcher of the Week (three at player, three at pitcher). Caroline Jacobsen, Alia Logoleo, Ally Miklesh and Millie Thompson joined her as All-ACC selections.

May 14, 2023– Clemson was selected as the No. 16 National Seed and hosted Auburn, Cal State Fullerton and UNC Greensboro in the Clemson Regional. This marked the second time in the program's short history that Clemson was selected as a host, and the third-consecutive year (every year the program has been eligible) the Tigers have made a postseason appearance.

May 21, 2023– Clemson defeated Auburn to be crowned Regional Champions and advance for the second-consecutive year to a Super Regional.

May 30, 2023– Redshirt junior Valerie Cagle was crowned the 2023 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year. She became the fourth ACC player to earn the award and gave the league its first selection since 2014. She is also the 14th Clemson student-athlete to earn a National Player of the Year honor and the second woman, joining Brianna Rollins from track and field. She finished the season with numerous honors that can all be found using her bio here.

May 31, 2023– Redshirt junior Valerie Cagle became a two-time NFCA First Team All-American, a unanimous selection, and the first Rawlings Gold Glove (pitcher) recipient for the program.

June 6, 2023– Graduate Caroline Jacobsen became the second Academic All-American in program history being crowned by College Sports Communicators (CSC).



June 22, 2023– Head Coach John Rittman and Valerie Cagle were selected to represent Clemson with the USA Softball Women's National Team at the 2023 Japan All-Star Series

2023 – Climbing as high at No. 9 in the final NFCA rankings, Clemson made its second super regional appearance in as many years during the 2023 season. With a final record of 49-12, including 18-6 in ACC action, the Tigers positions themselves as a powerhouse on the national stage. After expanding McWhorter Stadium, the Tigers welcomed in record-breaking fans game after game during the year to once again sit at the top of the ACC in total and average attendance. In postseason play, Clemson advanced to the ACC Semifinals for the third-consecutive season and were chosen by the NCAA as the No. 16 national seed where they went on to defeat UNCG and Auburn twice to advance to the Normal Super Regional. Individually, redshirt junior Valerie Cagle was crowned the ACC Player of the Year as well at the USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year to mark the 14th Tiger to earn National Player of the Year honors and only the second woman at Clemson to do so. She strung together the first perfect game in program history and threw an immaculate inning needing only nine pitches to strike out the side against Georgia Tech. She was also crowned the first Rawlings Gold Glove (pitcher) recipient for the program and a NFCA All-American for the third time. Graduate transfer Caroline Jacobsen rounded out postseason honors by being the second Academic All-American in the program's short infancy.

February 8, 2024– Clemson opened the season with the 200th game in program history against Missouri State (12-0 in five) – held a 155-45 record through 200 games. Freshman Julia Knowler tallied two home runs in the game, including a solo shot in her first plate appearance.

March 10, 2024– Clemson won its 100th game at McWhorter Stadium with a 12-0 win against Fordham – held a 100-18 (.847) at McWhorter through that game.

May 8, 2024– Clemson had the most athletes to date selected to the All-ACC team with six honorees (Maddie Moore – 1st, Alia Logoleo – 1st, Alex Brown – 2nd, McKenzie Clark – 2nd, Regan Spencer – 2nd, Valerie Cagle – 3rd and Millie Thompson – 3rd).

May 12, 2024– Clemson punched its fourth-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance making a return to the Tuscaloosa Regional as the No. 2 seed.

May 14, 2024– Valerie Cagle was drafted No. 1 during the 2024 Athletes Unlimited draft.

May 19, 2024– Redshirt senior Valerie Cagle, senior McKenzie Clark and junior Maddie Moore all garnered NFCA All-Region accolades to mark the most Tigers selected to an All-Region team to date.

May 29, 2024– Redshirt senior Valerie Cagle (1st) and junior Maddie Moore (3rd) earned NFCA All-America honors to mark the most

All-Americans in a single season in the program's short infancy. This was Cagle's fourth honor and Moore's first.

2024— For the fourth consecutive season, the Clemson Tigers made a postseason berth. The Tigers, who finished with a 35-19 record on the year and 15-9 record in ACC action, had three Tigers garner NFCA All-Region accolades and two earn NFCA All-America status with Valerie Cagle earning the honor for the fourth time and Maddie Moore garnering her first honor. The team played its 200th game in program history to open the 2024 campaign, landed six players on an All-ACC team – the most to date and had Valerie Cagle become the No. 1 overall draft pick by Athletes Unlimited. Clemson advanced to its fourth ACC Semifinal and made its fourth postseason appearance as the No. 2 seed at the Tuscaloosa Regional. The Tigers had five players competing at the professional level during the 2024 summer with Caroline Jacobsen, McKenzie Clark and Cagle playing with AU, while Ally Miklesh played for the Florida Vibe and Alia Logoleo competed for the Chattanooga Steam.


January 29, 2025— Clemson Softball alumni Caroline Jacobsen and McKenzie Clark were drafted during the inaugural Athletes Unlimited Softball League (AUSL) Draft. Jacobsen (outfield – 2023) was drafted by the Talons in the 10th round as the 38th overall pick, while Clark (outfield – 2024) was picked up by the Volts in the 11th round as the 42nd overall pick.

February 28, 2025— Clemson won its 200th game in program history with an 11-3 run-rule victory vs. Lafayette at McWhorter Stadium. Softball became the second-fastest program at Clemson to surpass the 200 win milestone, achieving the feat in 270 games (200-70). The only program to reach the mark sooner was men's soccer (200-44-15 – 259 games). Head Coach John Rittman also became only the second active head coach at Clemson to reach the benchmark, joining men's basketball head coach Brad Brownell, who reached the milestone in 347 games during the 2020-21 season.

April 17, 2025— Clemson played its 300th game in program history. The Tigers defeated Boston College 6-2 at McWhorter Stadium. Softball maintained a 225-75 record to pace Clemson programs for the best record through that 300 games.

April 22, 2025— The Tigers upset No. 1 Tennessee for the highest ranked win in program history. Clemson defeated the Lady Vols, 4-3, in nine innings in Knoxville. Freshman Taylor Pipkins delivered the go-ahead run in the top half of the ninth with a sac fly into left field that scored freshman Ava Wilson from third. Softball's win in Knoxville is the 39th all-time win over a top-ranked team for any Clemson team, the fifth for any women's team, and the first on the road by a women's program in history.

April 26, 2025— Clemson defeated Georgia Tech, 19-0, in five innings for the largest shutout in program history and tied for the largest margin of victory. The Tigers combined for 15 hits, including freshman Macey Cintron notching four. In total, 12 Tigers scored during the five-inning contest. The team also drew a then single-game record 11 walks with seniors Alex Brown and Aby Vieira drawing three.




April 27, 2025— Clemson won its 100th ACC game in program history with an 8-2 victory at Georgia Tech to conclude the 2025 regular season. The Tigers held a 100-36 ACC record from 2020-25 during that stretch.

May 7, 2025— Senior Reese Basinger and freshman Macey Cintron won ACC yearly awards. Basinger became the first Tiger in program history to be crowned ACC Pitcher of the Year, while Cintron is only the second Tiger to garner Freshman of the Year accolades. The Tigers also had seven All-ACC selections with Maddie Moore and Alex Brown joining Basinger and Cintron on the First Team. Senior Brooke McCubbin and junior Jamison Brockenbrough earned their first ACC honors with third team nods, and freshman Marian Collins joined Cintron on the All-Freshman squad. The Tigers' seven selections in 2025 tied for the most players to receive post-season conference accolades in the program's six-year existence, while the four first-team honorees are the most in a single year.

May 8, 2025— The Tigers completed their first of three comebacks during the 2025 ACC Championship with a 7-4 victory against Virginia. The win was sealed after a sixth-inning grand slam off the bat of freshman Taylor Pipkins. With the win, the Tigers advanced to their fifth ACC Championship Semifinals.

May 9, 2025— Clemson tied its largest comeback in program history and won its 10th straight game away from home following an eight-run sixth inning through the pouring rain against Virginia Tech. After trailing 9-2 in the bottom of the sixth, the Tigers rallied to take the team. The offense strung together a program record 13 walks during the outing, including freshman Macey Cintron drawing a program-record four during the contest. The win secured Clemson's third ACC Championship berth in program history.

May 10, 2025— Clemson secured its first ACC Tournament Championship with a 2-1 win against Florida State after Kylee Johnson hit a two-run homer in the top of the seventh inning. This game capped a three-game comeback streak with wins over Virginia (7-4) and Virginia Tech (10-9) in Brighton, Mass. Freshman Taylor Pipkins was named Tournament MVP, while Brooke McCubbin, Maddie Moore and Aby Vieira were named to the All-Tournament Team.



May 11, 2025— Clemson was selected as the No. 11 National Seed and hosted Kentucky, Northwestern and USC Upstate in the Clemson Regional. This was the third time in four years the program hosted a regional and the fifth year Clemson made a postseason appearance – the Tigers have made an appearance every year eligible.

May 15, 2025— The Tigers had a program-record eight players selected to the NFCA All-Region Mid-Atlantic team. It was highlighted by four players garnering first team nods including: Maddie Moore (2B), Reese Basinger (P), Macey Cintron (Utility/DP)

non-pitcher) and Marian Collins (SS). Julia Knowler (1B) and Aby Vieira (C) earned second team honors, while Alex Brown (3B) and Jamison Brockenbrough (OF) were named to the third team.

May 18, 2025— Clemson advanced to its third Super Regional in program history after going 3-0 during the Clemson Regional. The Tigers allowed just three runs during the NCAA Regional stretch with victories against USC Upstate (10-2 in five), Northwestern (1-0 in nine) and Kentucky (5-1) and improved to 9-1 all-time in home NCAA games.

May 22, 2025— The Tigers upset No. 6 Texas, 7-4, during the opening game of the Austin Super Regional for the first super regional victory in program history. Senior Alex Brown led Clemson with three hits, while senior Maddie Moore added two hits and an RBI. Julia Knowler picked up a critical two-run double in the sixth inning to help give Clemson a cushion, and Brooke McCubbin was able to work the final 3.0 innings in relief of Reese Basinger, who improved to 18-5 on the season. McCubbin tied Clemson's single season saves record after earning her fifth of her senior campaign.

May 28, 2025— Senior Maddie Moore was named an NFCA First Team All-American at second base following her senior campaign. It was her second career All-America accolade after earning third team honors in 2024. It marked the sixth All-America selection in program history.

May 28, 2025— Associate Head Coach Kyle Jamieson was named the 2025 D1Softball Pitching Coach of the Year.

June 17, 2025— Senior Reese Basinger was named a CSC Third Team Academic All-American. She joined Russ (2022) and Jacobson (2023) as the third softball player at Clemson to garner the distinction.

July 10, 2025— Senior Reese Basinger was crowned the ACC Softball Scholar Athlete of the Year. Basinger was the second Clemson softball player in three years to garner the distinction. In total, 11 players were named to the All-ACC Academic Team, including senior Aby Vieira for the fourth time in her career.

July 17, 2025— John Rittman and Clemson reached a contract agreement keeping him at Clemson through the 2031 season.

2025— The Tigers accomplished more 'firsts' as a program during the 2025 campaign that included being crowned the ACC Champions and the first super regional victory. After starting 3-6 on the year, the Tigers went on a 36-6 stretch during the year to ultimately conclude the season with a 48-14 overall record (19-5 ACC) and clock in at No. 11 on the NFCA final poll. Clemson finished second in the ACC during the regular season and completed three comeback victories during the ACC Tournament to be crowned the ACC Champions for the first time in program history. Freshman Taylor Pipkins was crowned the tournament MVP, while seniors Maddie Moore, Brooke McCubbin and Aby Vieira made the All-

Tournament Team. During the regular season, the Tigers defeated top-ranked Tennessee in Knoxville to highlight a program-record 10 victories against top 25 opponents. Clemson won both its 200th overall game and 100th ACC game in program history during the year which helped senior Reese Basinger become the first Tiger to earn ACC Pitcher of the Year honors and helped freshman Macey Cintron become the second ACC Freshman of the Year for the program. The Tigers picked up a program-high eight All-Region honorees, and Maddie Moore continued Clemson All-America streak by garnering First Team accolades. Following the ACC Championship, Clemson was selected as the No. 11 national seed to mark the third time in four years Clemson hosted a regional. The Tigers defeated USC Upstate, Northwestern and Kentucky to advance to super regionals and went on to win its first super regional game in program history. Clemson averaged over 1,600 fans and welcomed over 50,000 into McWhorter Stadium during the 2025 campaign to lead the ACC for the sixth-straight season in both categories.

December 1, 2025— Clemson Softball alumni Caroline Jacobsen (Talons) and McKenzie Clark (Blaze) were retained by their 2025 teams for the 2026 AUSL season, while Maddie Moore (infield - 2025) was drafted in the fourth round as the No. 21 overall pick in the Allocation Draft, and Valerie Cagle (utility - 2024) was drafted by the Blaze in the fourth round as the No. 23 overall pick. Clemson has had 10 players play professionally in only six years of competition.

IN THE ACC...

Since becoming a program in 2020, the Tigers have proved to be steadfast in their pursuit of greatness. In 2021, their first year of eligibility after the 2020 season was cut short due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the softball program captured the regular-season title—making them the only program in school history to win a regular-season conference championship in its first opportunity to do so.

Clemson has been a consistent contender in the ACC Tournament, advancing to the semifinals every year eligible (2021–25) and reaching the championship game three times (2021 vs. Duke, 2022 vs. Florida State, and 2025 vs. Florida State). Their persistence paid off in 2025, when the Tigers won their first ACC Tournament Championship by defeating Virginia (7-4), Virginia Tech (10-9) and Florida State (2-1) in three come-from-behind victories.

Through the first six seasons, the Tigers have posted a 100-36 (.735) overall record. Individually, Clemson has tallied 34 total All-ACC honors, including 11 first team, five second team, 11 third team and seven all-freshman selections. 17 athletes have been credited with All-ACC honors with **Valerie Cagle** and **Alia Logoleo** each garnering five with a first-, second- or third-team selection on four occasions, as well as both being named to the all-freshman team in 2021. Key All-ACC selections returning to the 2026 lineup include **Macey Cintron** (FotY, 1st & All-Freshman), **Jameson Brockenbrough** (3rd) and **Marian Collins** (All-Freshman).

On top of the All-ACC awards, Cagle was crowned the ACC Player of the Year in both 2021 and 2023. Continuing to set the standard, she became the first softball player in ACC history to be crowned both ACC Player of the Year and ACC Freshman of the Year in 2021. Head Coach **John Rittman** joined Cagle by being crowned the ACC Coach of the Year in the program's first complete season. In 2025, **Reese Basinger** and Cintron continued to put Clemson on top as Basinger was crowned the first ACC Pitcher of the Year in program history while Cintron was named ACC Freshman of the Year.

Additional ACC accolades come in from 10 Preseason All-ACC honors, 11 All-ACC Tournament selections - including **Taylor Pipkins** being named the 2025 Tournament

MVP - and 23 ACC honors split between Player (12) and Pitcher (11) of the Week.

Off the field, the Tigers have had 53 All-ACC Academic selections, including 15 during the 2023 season that saw Cagle earning Scholar Athlete of the Year. Basinger became the second Tiger in three years to earn Scholar Athlete of the Year honors, receiving the honor in 2025. Clemson has also landed 127 student-athletes on the ACC Academic Honor Roll.

NATIONAL AWARDS & HONORS

VALERIE CAGLE WAS NAMED THE 2023 USA SOFTBALL COLLEGiate PLAYER OF THE YEAR, BECOMING CLEMSON'S 14TH ATHLETE AND SECOND WOMAN TO GARNER NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE YEAR HONORS.



Valerie Cagle (2020-24) made history in 2023 as the first player in Clemson history to be named the USA Softball Player of the Year, which is considered the most prestigious honor in Division I women's collegiate softball. She continued her dominant junior campaign by being named the Rawlings Gold Glove award recipient at pitcher.

Cagle made an impact on a national level as soon as she stepped on campus. During her redshirt freshman season in 2021, she was a top three finalist for NFCA National Freshman of the Year as well as being a top 10 finalist for USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year. Alongside winning the award in 2023, Cagle was a top 25 finalist (2022) and top 50 watchlist selection (2024) during her collegiate campaign.

In conjunction with being in consideration for player of the year, Cagle is a four-time NFCA All-American - three first team and one second team - as a pitcher/utility. This also made her a four-time NFCA First Team All-Region Southeast selection. She was recognized on three different occasions as a NFCA Player of the Week and has been selected to participate with the USA Softball Women's or Junior National Team on three separate occasions.

Joining Cagle on the national stage was **Maddie Moore** (2022-25). A two-time All-American and a USA Softball Collegiate Top 25 Finalist, she earned her first All-American honor in 2024 with a third team nod at second base after leading Clemson with a .368 average that season that included 10 home runs, 57 hits and 39 RBIs. She added to her accolades in 2025 when she garnered first team honors at second base with a .411 average, a program-record 71 RBIs and 79 total hits behind a .771 slugging percentage.


McKenzie Clark (2021-24) was a two-time NFCA All-Region Southeast selection at Clemson. She earned her first honor in 2021 in the outfield after finishing with a .355 average with 60 hits, including nine doubles and nine home runs with 29 RBIs. She scored 47 runs and stole 23 bases while finishing with a .639 slugging percentage and .431 on-base percentage. Clark earned her second all-region nod as a senior in 2024 after posting a .365 average with a team-high 61 hits, including 10 home runs, eight doubles and four triples. She notched 41 RBIs and maintained a .641 slugging percentage and .477 on-base percentage.

In total, Clemson has produced 15 NFCA All-Region selections over the first six years as a program, including a program-record eight during the 2025 season led by Moore, **Macey Cintron** (DP/Non-Pitcher Utility), **Marian Collins** (SS) and **Reese Basinger** (P) all garnered first team honors.

Off the field, **Alia Logoleo** was named a 2024 NSCA Strength and Conditioning All-American, while **Sam Russ** (2022), **Caroline Jacobsen** (2023), and **Basinger** (2025) were named CoSIDA/CSC Academic All-America Third Team members.

On Dec. 1, 2018, a fence was built and the site was cleared as construction began on a new stadium for the Clemson Softball program. Two months later, on Feb. 1, 2019, the coaching staff, staff members from the administration and IPTAY and staff from the construction team gathered on the grounds of the stadium for an official site visit in preparation for the first home game in February 2020.

The site visit was to officially commemorate the construction of then-Clemson Softball stadium, which features over 1,000 fixed chairback seats, in addition to berm seating. The facility includes a team clubhouse with over 12,000 square feet of conditioned space that houses a team lounge, locker room, sports medicine room, equipment room and coaches' offices. The facility also features locker rooms for the coaches, umpires and visiting team.

"Myself, our staff and players are so truly appreciative of all the generous people who have given their time and money to make this dream a reality. Words alone cannot

express our sincere gratefulness," said Head Coach John Rittman, who began his tenure as the first head softball coach in Clemson history in November 2017.

"Seeing our stadium construction underway brings an extreme amount of excitement. The fact that our administration has allowed us to be a part of the entire process gives us even more of a sense of gratitude, appreciation and pride."

Included in the complex is an indoor player development hitting facility that will span over 6,000 square feet. Additional accommodations of the stadium include a press box with three broadcast booths and a videoboard.

The facility was designed by Goodwyn Mills Cawood Architects while DPR Construction served as the contractor for the \$13 million project, which had an anticipated completion date of Fall 2019. *NOTE: The naming rights to the stadium had not been selected at this time.*

"There is such a direct correlation in seeing the stadium being built right before our eyes, as construction takes place behind where we are currently practicing and what we are doing in the classroom, on the field and in



the weight room," noted Rittman. "Just like the builders are laying the foundation for our stadium, we are laying the foundation for our program with the seven players and coaches working daily on not only the fundamentals of playing softball, but even more importantly, our culture and core values."

The Clemson Softball Stadium was officially renamed



after Stuart McWhorter and Leigh Anne Hendrix McWhorter pledged a \$2.5-million-dollar Cornerstone Partner Gift to IPTAY, Clemson Athletics and, more specifically, the softball program. On Feb. 17, 2021, "McWhorter Stadium" signage was officially installed above the stadium's scoreboard, press box and along the backstop to honor the generous gift from the McWhorter family.

Originally built to welcome 1,616 fans on game days for the inaugural season, Clemson Athletics expanded the outfield berm seating area in McWhorter Stadium in the summer of 2022 following the third season of play to extend grass and lawn chair seating from left field to right-center to move the capacity of McWhorter to 2,116 (an increase of 500 fans per game).

Since opening its doors, Clemson Softball has welcomed over 241,000 fans into McWhorter Stadium and hosted the Clemson Regional in 2022, 2023 and 2025, as well as over nine tournaments that have welcomed two or more teams in the facility per weekend. Clemson softball fans continue to prove it's a program worth supporting by elevating the student-athlete experience by making McWhorter Stadium one of the best places to play college softball in the country as recognized by McWhorter Stadium being named the 2025 Netting Professionals/NFCA Field of the Year.

John Rittman, a longtime head coach and member of the USA Softball Women's National Team coaching pool, was named the first Head Coach of Clemson Softball on Nov. 3, 2017. Rittman came to Clemson after serving as the Associate Head Coach at the University of Kansas from 2015-17. Rittman joined the Jayhawks after 18 seasons as the Head Coach at Stanford University and 10 years on the United States National Team coaching staff (2001-08, 2016-18). He returned to the USA Women's National Team staff in 2023 when he served as the head coach for the Japan All-Star Series.

The 2025 season was highlighted by more 'firsts' as the program claimed its first ACC Tournament Championship and won its first super regional game. Finishing with a 48-14 record, the Tigers reached new heights by surpassing 300 games as a program with a home win against Boston College on April 17, surpassing the 200 win mark with an 11-3 victory against Lafayette and reaching 100 wins in ACC play with an 8-2 win at Georgia Tech to conclude the regular season. Following the conclusion of the regular season, Rittman led the Tigers to their first ACC Tournament Championship with three comeback victories against Virginia (7-4), Virginia Tech (10-9) and Florida State (2-1). Clemson went on to earn its third national seed in four years being a No. 11 seed and won three games to make its third Super Regional appearance in program history. The Tigers continued to make program history by defeating No. 6 Texas, 7-4, in the opening game

pitching staff allowed only 56 extra-base hits while holding opponents to a .245 batting average behind the efforts of All-ACC selections Regan Spencer (Second Team), Millie Thompson (Third Team) and Cagle. Senior center fielder McKenzie Clark rounded out the All-ACC and NFCA All-Region honorees. Clemson capped its season with its fourth-straight NCAA Regional appearance where the Tigers won their ninth NCAA Tournament. Off the field, Clemson finished with a 3.50 spring GPA and had 14 athletes be named NFCA All-America Scholar-Athletes and 13 be named to the All-ACC Academic Team. For the third consecutive season, Clemson finished with at least one CSC Academic All-District selections as Thompson and Brooke McCubbin led the charge – this was Thompson's second-consecutive year as an Academic All-District selection.

During the fourth season at the helm of the program, Rittman guided the Tigers to a 49-12 overall record that started with a perfect 14-0 run to open the season before the Tigers posted a 37-1 record through the first week of April for another program best. Clemson capped the regular season with a 5-4 victory to mark the 150th of the program and Rittman's 900th-win of his coaching tenure. He became the 44th collegiate softball coach to reach the 900-win benchmark. Hosting the second regional in program history, Clemson went on to make the second-consecutive super regional appearance. The Tigers took the next step as a program by surpassing previous team bests in multiple categories. The Tigers led the ACC in On-Base Percentage (.409) and Scoring (6.08 per game) and finished in the top 25 of the NCAA in eight offensive categories. Defensively, Clemson finished with a .980 fielding percentage to lead the ACC and finish seventh in the NCAA. The Tiger defense also turned 31 double plays (.510 per game), which ranked sixth in the nation. With Rittman's tutelage, redshirt junior Valerie Cagle was named the 2023 USA Softball Player of the Year, a Rawlings Gold Glove (pitcher) recipient, the ACC Player of the Year and a NFCA First Team All-American for the second time of her career after she led the ACC in seven categories and ranked in the top 25 of the NCAA in 11. As a team, the Tigers clocked their highest individual ranking climbing as high as No. 4 and finished the season at No. 9 in both major polls. Clemson finished with five All-ACC honorees and 15 on the All-Academic Softball Team, while Cagle was tabbed the ACC Softball Scholar-Athlete of the Year. After posting a 3.68 team GPA, 17 student-athletes received Easton/NFCA All-America Scholar Athlete distinctions while the team maintained the 12th-highest team GPA in Division I. Five Tigers were named CSC Academic All-District honorees, and graduate Caroline Jacobsen earned CSC Academic All-America Third Team honors.

In the third year of the program, Rittman continued to guide Clemson to new heights by making the program's first Super Regional appearance after earning the program's first national seed and hosting a Regional. Early in the season, the Tigers upset then-No. 6 Washington, 2-0, at the St. Pete/Clearwater Elite Invitational for the program's first top-10 win. Clemson followed that by playing its 100th game in program history against Illinois on March 13. The Tigers won with a 4-0 victory to tie Clemson women's tennis for the most wins through a program's first 100 games with a 78-22 record. With that record, Rittman solidified himself as the winningest coach among active head coaches at Clemson surpassing Dabo Swinney (football), who held a 74-26 record. The Tigers continued to reach new levels by winning their 100th game in only 130 games on May 1 with a 3-2 win against Georgia Tech on Senior Day to become the second-fastest program at Clemson to reach 100 wins trailing only women's tennis (128). The Tigers were ACC Tournament Runner-Ups. The hot streak continued for Clemson entering postseason as the Tigers earned the No. 10 national seed for the NCAA softball tournament. The No. 10 Tigers made a clean sweep in three games to advance to the Stillwater Super Regional. Clemson finished the year with five All-ACC team selections, and Valerie Cagle was named an NFCA

First Team All-American, the second NFCA All-America honor of her career. Behind Rittman's efforts, Clemson climbed as high as No. 14 in the NFCA national rankings and earned its first single digit ranking from ESPN/USA Softball rankings coming in at No. 9 for two weeks. Off the field, Clemson posted a 1,000 APR and 3.38 GPA in the spring. Graduate Sam Russ was named to CoSIDA's Academic All-America Third Team to become softball's first Academic All-American. Cammy Pereira was awarded the 2022 Weaver-James-Corigan-Swofford Postgraduate Scholarship Award from the ACC marking the third Clemson softball player to earn the honor in two years.

During the second season and first complete year, Rittman propelled Clemson to even higher heights by becoming the ACC Regular Season Champions after posting a 29-5 ACC record and winning seven ACC series, including six series sweeps. The Tigers were ACC Tournament Runner-Ups. The Tigers finished the season with a 44-8 record and the sixth-best WL Percentage in the NCAA (.846). Rittman was named ACC Coach of the Year and guided Valerie Cagle to being the first softball player in league history to be named both the ACC Freshman and Player of the Year in the same season. Clemson finished with six individuals earning nine All-ACC team selections following the regular season, including three on the first team. Cagle and freshman McKenzie Clark were named to the NFCA All-Region team. The honors continued to roll in for Cagle as she became the first Clemson softball All-American garnering second team honors from the NFCA, a Top-Three Finalist for the NFCA's National Freshman of the Year and a Top-10 Finalist for USA Softball's Collegiate Player of the Year. Behind Rittman's efforts, Clemson climbed as high as No. 13 in the NFCA national rankings and No. 10 in the ESPN/USA Softball rankings before finishing the season at No. 18 in the NFCA poll. Rittman led the Tigers to their first postseason appearance traveling to the Tuscaloosa Regional that capped off a historic second season.

In its inaugural season, Rittman transcended Clemson into a nationally-respected program. Rittman guided Clemson, which was predicted to finish in 10th in the conference, according to the 2020 ACC preseason poll, to a 19-8 overall record, including 5-1 in ACC play. The Tigers, who won both of their ACC series against Virginia and Pitt, won 11 of their final 12 games before the 2020 season was cut short due to the coronavirus pandemic (COVID-19). Additionally, Clemson went 14-2 at Clemson Softball Stadium (now McWhorter Stadium), which included a 13-game home win streak that spanned 25 days. Rittman and the Tigers generated plenty of enthusiasm among the Clemson faithful as the first-year program ranked fourth nationally in attendance (24,860) and fifth in average attendance (1,544/game) in 2020. On March 3, the National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) announced the first-year program received votes (10) in



the fifth edition of the 2020 USA Today/NFCA D1 Top 25 Coaches Poll. The announcement came after Clemson defeated then-No. 14 Georgia, 4-1, on Feb. 26 at Clemson Softball Stadium before sweeping the Cavaliers to win its first-ever ACC series. Under the direction of Rittman, three Tigers in Valerie Cagle (twice), Marissa Guimbarda and Logan Caymol earned ACC weekly honors on four occasions, the most by any ACC program in 2020. Cagle, a true freshman in 2020, was second in the nation in RBIs (36), while Guimbarda finished the season fourth nationally in home runs (11). Both Cagle and Guimbarda led the ACC in RBIs and home runs, respectively.

At Stanford, Rittman and the Cardinals recorded 18-consecutive winning seasons, made 16-straight NCAA appearances, notched 13 40-win seasons and produced at least one All-American in 15 of his last 17 seasons. As head coach, Rittman accumulated a 750-351-3 overall mark, coached a national player of the year, 16 All-Americans, earned five Super Regional appearances, two Women's College World Series appearances and maintained a spot in every regular-season NFCA top-25 poll for more than a decade.

Rittman served on the staff of the USA Softball team which won gold at both the 2016 Women's Softball World Championship and the 2017 Pan Am Qualifier. He also worked with Team USA from 2001-08, coaching the 2004 Olympic gold medal winners in Athens and the 2008 silver medalists in Beijing. Team USA also won gold medals at the 2002 and 2006 World Championship and the 2003 and 2007 Pan Am Games.

Prior to being named head coach at Stanford, Rittman spent four seasons as an assistant coach at the University

of Washington, focusing on hitting and defense. Rittman helped start the program and, within just four seasons, the Huskies had earned a No. 1 national ranking, won the 1996 Pac-10 Championship, made three NCAA Tournament appearances and notched a runner-up finish in their first trip to the Women's College World Series. Washington became the first team since Texas A&M (1983) to advance to the championship game in its first appearance at the WCWS.

Before his appointment at Washington, Rittman spent two seasons as an assistant at the University of Minnesota. During his second year, the Golden Gophers won the Big Ten Conference with a 20-4 league record. The Gophers set team and individual records in almost every offensive category. The Minnesota squad led the nation in hits and total bases en route to a No. 15 national ranking. Rittman also helped produce two Golden Gopher All-Americans.

From 1988-90, Rittman was an assistant coach at the University of Oregon. During his stay, the Ducks played in the 1989 Women's College World Series, set several team and individual offensive records and produced an All-American.

Rittman graduated from New Mexico State with a degree in journalism in 1986. He was a three-year letterwinner in baseball as an outfielder at NMSU after transferring from Yavapai Junior College in Prescott, Arizona.

Rittman and his wife, Lorie, a former softball player at the University of Oklahoma, are the parents of Justin, a UCLA graduate and former fullback for the Bruins, and Jake, a Notre Dame graduate and former punter for the Fighting Irish.

Kyle Jamieson, who previously served as head coach at Furman University, was named Associate Head Coach of Clemson Softball on Dec. 4, 2017. Jamieson primarily works with the Tigers' pitchers.

The 2025 season was highlighted by more 'firsts' as the program claimed its first ACC Tournament Championship and won its first super regional game. Finishing with a 48-14 record, the Tigers reached new heights by surpassing 300 games as a program with a home win against Boston College on April 17, surpassing the 200 win mark with an 11-3 victory against Lafayette and reaching 100 wins in ACC play with an 8-2 win at Georgia Tech to conclude the regular season. Jamieson guided senior Reese Basinger to be crowned the first ACC Pitcher of the Year in program history and assisted with freshman pitcher/designated player Macey Cintron being crowned ACC Freshman of the Year. Following the ACC Tournament, Jamieson saw senior Brooke McCubbin be named to the ACC All-Tournament Team after securing three comeback victories in the circle against. Continuing to develop a strong pitching staff, Jamieson guided both Basinger and McCubbin to 18 victories each which tie for the third-most in a single season for the program and led the ACC. On the national level, McCubbin finished 13th in the NCAA with a program-record five saves on the year, while Basinger started in 35 games which ranked sixth in the NCAA. Both Basinger and Cintron earned NFCA All-Region First Team honors, and McCubbin went on to pitch professionally in the AUSL. Jamieson put a cap on the 2025 campaign by being named the D1Softball Pitching Coach of the Year – the first national coaching honor of his career.

The 2024 campaign had Jamieson contributing to Clemson finishing with a 35-19 overall record. Jamieson guided the Clemson pitching staff to producing three All-ACC selections in Regan Spencer (Second Team), Valerie Cagle (Third Team) and Millie Thompson (Third Team). The staff finished with a 2.32 ERA, which ranked No. 24 in the NCAA at the end of the year, while the 3.73 strikeout-to-walk ratio finished the season at No. 8. For the second-consecutive season, the Clemson pitching staff allowed only 56 extra-base hits while holding opponents to a .245 batting average. Thompson led the ACC in three categories (hit batters – 3, strikeout-to-walk ratio – 7.50, walks allowed per 7.0 IP – 0.77), while also sitting sixth in the NCAA in both strikeout-to-walk ratio and walks allowed per 7 IP. Spencer had a breakout season in the circle to be named an ACC Pitcher of the Week twice during the 2024 campaign and garnered a team-high 11 victories. Under Jamieson, Spencer set the program career record with a 1.52 ERA, while Cagle holds the title with most career strikeouts (819). In total, Jamieson helped lead two Tigers to NFCA All-America honors, including Cagle, who was named a First Team All-American for the third time of her career.

In his fourth season, the Clemson pitching staff boasted a 1.59 ERA and 19 shutouts, including the program's first perfect game, to finish fourth and 11th in the NCAA, respectively. Jamieson helped redshirt junior Valerie Cagle to being named the 2023 USA Softball Player of the Year, a Rawlings Gold Glove (pitcher) recipient and the

ACC Player of the Year for the second time in her tenure. Jamieson also called Cagle's and Clemson's first perfect game calling only 52 pitches as the Tigers defeated Mercer in five innings on March 8. That was topped as Cagle tossed an immaculate inning needing only nine pitches to strikeout the side against Georgia Tech on March 24. Joining Cagle in the circle, was sophomore Brooke McCubbin who posted a 1.34 ERA to finish 14th in the nation. Helping out on the defensive side, the Tigers clocked a .980 fielding percentage to lead the ACC and finish seventh in the NCAA. The Tiger defense also turned 31 double plays (.510 per game) to finish sixth in the NCAA.

In the third year, Jamieson continued to help guide Clemson to new heights as the program made its first super regional appearance after earning the first national seed and hosting a regional. Under the guidance from Jamieson, Clemson's pitching staff posted 20 shutouts during the year (13 solo, seven combined) and struck out 345 batters while limiting opponents to a .219 batting average. The pitching staff finished seventh in the NCAA for lowest ERA (1.78), sixth in Shutouts (20) and 19th in Strikeouts-to-Walk Ratio (3.75). Sophomore Millie Thompson had a breakout season in the circle with Jamieson's help and finished the season 17th in the NCAA in Strikeout-to-Walk Ratio (6.11), 18th in ERA (1.58) and 19th in Walks Allowed Per Seven Innings (1.06). The pitching staff posted three no-hitters that began with Regan Spencer and Thompson tossing a combined no-no against Kent State.

During the second season and first complete year, Jamieson helped propel Clemson to even higher levels as the team became ACC Regular Season Champions after posting a 29-5 ACC record and winning seven ACC series, including six series sweeps. The Tigers were ACC Tournament Runner-Ups after Jamieson's pitching staff shut out both Georgia Tech and then-No. 20 Virginia Tech in the first two rounds. Clemson continued to have a historic start making its first postseason appearance at the Tuscaloosa Regional. The Tigers finished the season with a 44-8 record and the sixth-best WL Percentage in the NCAA (.846). With the guidance from Jamieson, Clemson's pitchers combined for 16 shutouts in 2021 (12 solo, two combined) and struck out 369 batters while limiting opponents to a .198 batting average and allowing less than 100 earned runs (96). The pitching staff finished fifth in the NCAA for lowest ERA (1.50) and 11th in Strikeout-to-Walk Ratio (3.80). Jamieson was an integral part of redshirt freshman Valerie Cagle being named ACC Freshman and Player of the Year (the first softball player in league history to garner both honors). Jamieson also coaches freshmen Millie Thompson and Regan Spencer to a combined 15-1 record in 33 appearances.

In its inaugural season, Jamieson helped transcend Clemson into a nationally-respected program. Jamieson helped Clemson, which was predicted to finish in 10th in the conference, according to the 2020 ACC preseason poll, to a 19-8 overall record, including 5-1 in ACC play. The Tigers, who won both of their ACC series against Virginia and Pitt, won 11 of their final 12 games before the 2020 season was cut short due to the coronavirus pandemic (COVID-19). After winning its first two ACC series, the National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA)

announced the first-year program received votes (10) in the fifth edition (March 3) of the 2020 USA Today/NFCA D1 Top 25 Coaches Poll. Under the direction of Jamieson, freshman right-hander Valerie Cagle was one of two freshmen in the ACC in 2020 to garner nine wins, which tied for fourth in the ACC among all players. Cagle was also third in the league in innings pitched (89.2), strikeouts (87), appearances (19) and games started (13), and tied for third in complete games (eight).

The 2017 Southern Conference Coach of the Year, Jamieson led Furman to three-consecutive 30-win campaigns the final three seasons and a share of the 2017 Southern Conference Championship, a first for the Paladins in 22 years. His 2017 squad featured both the SoCon Pitcher of the Year and Freshman of the Year.

In the summer of 2017, Jamieson joined the USA Softball staff and helped the Americans claim gold at the WBSC Softball World Championship in Surrey, British Columbia. He was a part of the U.S. National Team staff for the World Cup of Softball and also participated in several training camps with the program during 2016.

Jamieson took the reins of the Paladin softball program after serving as assistant coach at Fordham University during the 2011 season where he helped guide the Rams to a 32-26 overall record, 14-6 league mark, second place finish in the Atlantic 10 Conference and an 8-5 victory over eventual national champion Alabama in the regular season finale. Under Jamieson's guidance, the Rams paced the Atlantic 10 with 54 home runs.

Jamieson's pitching staff at Fordham posted a 2.35 ERA, ranked second in the Atlantic 10 with 466 strikeouts and issued a league-low 84 walks. The Rams placed five players on the All-Atlantic 10 First Team, including pitcher Jen Mineau, who fashioned a league-best 1.62 ERA under Jamieson's tutelage and earned third team Capital One Academic All-America honors.

Prior to joining the coaching staff at Fordham in the fall of 2011, Jamieson spent two seasons helping to rebuild the University of Arkansas softball program. In his first season in Fayetteville, he helped the Razorbacks lower the team ERA from 4.75 the previous season to 3.67 in 2010.

Jamieson grew up playing men's fast pitch softball and helped pitch the Canadian National Team to the 1993 World Championship in Auckland, New Zealand. He was named the Male Gold Card Athlete of the Year by Softball Ontario in 1993, and was named one of Ontario's Elite Athletes by that organization. The next year, he was inducted into the Goulbourn Township Sports Wall of Fame. Jamieson was also a member of the 2003 Kemptville Thunder Fastpitch squad that claimed the silver medal at the ISC World Championships.

Jamieson earned a bachelor's degree in physical education from Brock University in 1997 and a bachelor's degree in education from Nipissing University in 1998.

The Tigers made program history with three comeback wins during the ACC Tournament, was selected as a national seed for the third time in four years and won the program's first super regional game with a 7-4 victory at Texas. The Tigers had seven players garner All-ACC honors and a program-record eight be named to an NFCA All-District team. Working with the Clemson defense, the Tigers finished with a program-record 1,227 putouts with sophomore first baseman Julia Knowler 381 putouts in 2025. Offensively, Clemson put up program records in 12 categories.

Repole joins the staff after previously serving as an assistant coach at South Carolina where she was the recruiting coordinator, a defensive coordinator and camp director. With the Gamecocks, she secured back-to-back nationally ranked recruiting classes, specifically the 11th ranked incoming freshman class in 2024 and the No. 2 ranked transfer portal class. Under her guidance, South Carolina made two-consecutive NCAA Regional finals,

as well as finished in the top 10 defensively in fielding percentage (2023) and doubles plays (2024). Last season, Repole helped develop one All-American, one All-Region, one All-SEC and two SEC Player of the Weeks while helping South Carolina to a Top 25 RPI finish.

Before her time with the Gamecocks, Repole had a two-year stint with Texas A&M where she served as the recruiting coordinator, outfield coach, assistant infield and hitting coach. She helped the Aggies ink nine Top 100 players over the two years and developed one All-American, two All-Region, three All-SEC and two SEC Player of the Weeks. Familiar with the ACC, Repole was an assistant coach at Virginia from 2016-19. With her guidance, the Cavaliers set all-time single-season records for home runs, extra base hits and slugging percentage, while placing in the top 10 for doubles, hits, total bases and RBIs. The Cavaliers won the second-most ACC games in a single-season in program history while she was on staff, and she developed two First Team All-Region selections, three All-ACC Academic players and six ACC Player of the Weeks.

Repole graduated Manga Cum Laude from Louisiana in 2016 with a bachelors in general studies.

Clemson Softball Head Coach John Rittman announced the addition of Ryan Wieligman to the 2024-25 staff on July 26, 2024. Wieligman joins the staff after previously serving as an assistant coach/recruiting coordinator at Creighton. He worked primarily with hitters and on recruiting efforts with additional duties coming from data analysis, film and scouting. He utilized Synergy, Trumedia, 6-4-3 Charts, Valoden Motor Preferences, Rapsodo and Blast to help develop student-athletes. He was a member of the 2024 Big East Coaching Staff of the Year and helped the Bluejays to the third largest RPI increase in the country jumping 133 spots. With his guidance, Creighton had five First Team and two Second Team All-Big East selections with both the conference pitcher and defensive players of

the year in 2024. Additional accomplishments came from 20 school records and individual accolades being set for hitters, as well as increases for the program in batting average, doubles, home runs, runs scored and slugging percentage.

In his first year with the program, Clemson claimed more 'firsts' as the program won its first ACC Tournament Championship and won its first super regional game. Finishing with a 48-14 record, the Tigers reached new heights by surpassing 300 games as a program with a home win against Boston College on April 17, surpassing the 200 win mark with an 11-3 victory against Lafayette and reaching 100 wins in ACC play with an 8-2 win at Georgia Tech to conclude the regular season. The Tigers made program history with three comeback wins during the ACC Tournamen

Assisting with Clemson's hitters, Wieligman helped the Tigers produce program records in 12 offensive categories including: games played (62), batting average (.325), at bats (1688), hits (549), doubles (105), home runs (85), RBIs (404), slugging percentage (.553), on-base percentage (.420), runs scored (439), walks (255) and total bases (933).

Before Creighton, Wieligman held positions at Texas State, University of Texas-Tyler and Henderson State, while also assisting with camps at Ole Miss, Kansas and Arkansas. He spent the 2022 season at Texas State where he worked primarily with the outfielders and included data analysis, film and scouting. He helped develop the Sun Belt Conference Freshman of the Year and four SBC All-Conference honorees. During his time at the University of Texas-Tyler, Wieligman assisted with hitters, infielders and outfielders while also overseeing film. The staff was named the South Central Region Coaching Staff of the Year and LSC Regular Season Conference Champions. With his guidance, the Patriots produced four NFCA All-South Central selections, six LSC All-Conference players, two LSC Gold Glove winners, the 2021 LSC Newcomer of the Year and 2021 LSC Pitcher of the Year. He served as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Henderson State, for one year following graduation in 2020.
